BOE committee to meet on possible holiday name change

The Beacon City School District discussed a Holiday Name Changing Committee at its Feb. 6 meeting.

"The committee will be made up of community stakeholders and our Superintendent, Matt Landahl, will moderate the conversation," said Meredith Heuer, president of the Beacon City School District Board of Education, via email.

"Currently we will only be reviewing the name of the Columbus Day Holiday. The board will review the recommendations of the committee at a June board meeting," explained Heuer.

The public, she said, is always welcome to offer their comments, either at public comment at the BOE's meetings. The comment period occurs at the very beginning of the meeting or through email (bcsd-boe@beaconk12.org).

"The goal of the committee is to review the history of [Christopher] Columbus and the name of the holiday and make a recommendation to the board as to whether or not the name should be kept on the district calendar," said Heuer.

Celebrating 25 years of 'Freezin' for a Reason'

Take part in "Freezin' for a Reason" Polar Plunge in Fishkill on February 18 and celebrate the 25th year of this local event that raises funds for the athletes of Special Olympics NY.

Organizers suggest all teams and individuals schedule a time to arrive at Sharpe Reservation, at 436 Van Wyck Lake Road, Fishkill and take the plunge.

"It is going to be exciting! We are celebrating our 25th Anniversary this year. Retired officer Chris Hamel started this local event 25 years ago with 18 participants raising a couple of thousand dollars. Now the event has over 400 participants who raised over \$220,000 in 2022," said Teresa Gilli, Director of Development, Special Olympics NY.

Gilli remarked, "Today, Chris is still our Chair for the Plunge and along with his family continues to make this event a success." Gilli said she and Hamel "are both so appreciative to our community. We are heartfelt for the love all have shown through the years. The love of our athletes is just priceless! We know we will see and are seeing again this year. We cannot wait!"

Hamel recalled during a recent phone interview that a Special Olympics athlete dared him to participate in the Polar Plunge while he was in Alaska. That is when he had the idea to bring the Polar Plunge to the Hudson Valley.

Hamel said he could not have done the Polar Plunge event every year without the

support of his family and Special Olympics NY.

"This year is dedicated to Neal Johnson, former Special Olympics NY CEO," said Hamel. Hamel said Johnson's mission and drive, along with his own mission and drive, enabled the Fishkill Polar Plunge to get to where it is today.

The goal that organizers are aiming to reach this year is \$250,000. The funds go to support the Athletes of Special Olympics NY in the Hudson Valley Region.

"We are seeking brave souls this year to help us make this happen. The \$250,000

will sponsor 500 athletes in one season – so this would be tremendous for us," Gilli explained. "We want everyone to have fun! Challenge your co-workers, friends, rivals – wear team colors – wear costumes. We also have some great incentives. Raise \$100 and get an official 25th Anniversary hooded sweatshirt. Raise more, get another incentive."

Athlete Will Smith, who is a member of the staff of Special Olympics NY Hudson Valley Region, said, "It is great to see the community get together and plunge into the freezing cold waters for our awesome

Largest onsemi facility now located in East Fishkill

A ribbon-cutting ceremony took place in East Fishkill touting onsemi (ON Semiconductor) acquiring Global Foundries' (GF) 300 mm fabrication facility, certain intellectual property and site in East Fishkill, off of Route 52. The acquisition was effective Dec. 31, 2022.

"I think today is very, very exciting. The Town is hopeful in more investment in the County," said Nicholas D'Alessandro, East Fishkill Town Supervisor, before the morning ceremony began on February 10.

This acquisition now makes the facility in East Fishkill onsemi's largest manufacturing site in America.

"The transaction includes an exclusive commitment to supply GF with differentiated semiconductor solutions and invest in research & development as both companies collaborate to build on future growth," according to information from onsemi.

"The local facility contributes to the community by retaining more than 1,000 jobs. With the recent passage of the Federal CHIPS and Science Act as well as the New York Green CHIPS Program,

onsemi will continue to evaluate opportunities for expansion and growth in East Fishkill and its contribution to the surrounding community," stated onsemi officials.


U.S. Senate Majority Leader Charles Schumer said "it is official."

"The acquisition of this facility by onsemi from GlobalFoundries has been a long journey," he said.

According to onsemi's announcement, the company put in work over the past three years, "specifically focusing on securing a long-term future for the [East Fishkill] facility and its employees, making significant investments in its 300mm capabilities to accelerate growth in the company's power, analog and sensing products, and enabling an improved manufacturing cost structure."

A group of employees watched the ceremony and announcement. Schumer stated that their "jobs are safe" and noted "we're looking to the future here."

Schumer remarked, "This is the jolt of electricity that the Hudson Valley needs."

He showed a wafer that is made on the site. He later signed one with a congratulatory message.

Hassane El-Khoury, who is the CEO of onsemi, said during his remarks, the company has five different plants in America. He said of the East Fishkill plant, "It's not only the largest, it's also the most advanced for us."

The facility is "going to bring in the technology of the future," said El-Khoury.

Stance Mason is the head for logistics at the East Fishkill site. He is a resident of Wappingers Falls who was born in Mount Vernon in Westchester County and raised in Mount Vernon and the Bronx.

Mason said it is the team at onsemi and his wife who made this possible for him. He said he is excited.

"That's what's possible. He's (Mason) an example of what's possible" at onsemi, said El-Khoury.

J.D. Grom, Senior Advisor to the Commerce Secretary for CHIPS Implementation, said the current administration is "committed to revitalizing American manufacturing."

Schumer noted that IBM first opened its East Fishkill campus in 1963. In 2014, IBM sold its 300mm chip fab in East Fishkill to GlobalFoundries. In April of 2019, according to Schuler's office, GlobalFoundries announced it would sell the plant to onsemi.

The company information states it has "a focus on automotive and industrial end-markets, the company is accelerating change in megatrends such as vehicle electrification and safety, sustainable energy grids, industrial automation, and 5G and cloud infrastructure."

Asked what having this announcement by onsemi today said to other businesses, D'Alessandro replied, "This shows specialized chip manufacturing and that we have the skilled labor force that they need to continue their business and expand their business."

The county clerk's office operates the Motor Vehicle Department, files and records county legal and land records, and provides passport, notarizing services, and business certificates. As County Clerk Kendall has:

- Introduced online accessibility to the records of the Clerk's Office.
- Launched electronic filing in the Supreme Courts of Dutchess County, making the courts more accessible to the public while reducing costs and

eliminating paper.

- Provided for electronic recording of land documents, expediting the recording process, cutting costs and eliminating paper.

- Streamlined services at the Department of Motor Vehicles while minimizing wait times.

- Created the "Return the FAVOR" program, which partners with the Division of Veterans Affairs to provide services to veterans and recognize their service.

- Partnered with former County Executive Marc Molinaro to re-establish the County Historian's Office, which has completed nine grants to digitize Dutchess County's early court records, leading to collaboration with numerous towns and local historical societies to preserve our early history.

- Been responsible for the county's records management, working with a local non-profit to digitize departmental records and reduce long-term costs.

- Serves in the New York State Association of County Clerks and is past President.

Kendall, a resident of Dover Plains since 1984, has been married to Barbara Kendall since 1978. Together, they have two adult sons and a daughter-in-law. Kendall was educated in the Arlington School District and holds a bachelor's degree from Williams College.

Office for the Aging begins 'Friendly Calls' Program to promote senior socialization

The Dutchess County Office for the Aging (OFA) has begun a pilot "Friendly Calls" program to alleviate the feelings of loneliness and isolation some seniors feel. "Friendly Calls" connects these older adults with volunteers who call them weekly, speaking for 20-30 minutes and providing all-important social interaction, helping OFA achieve its mission of helping older adults remain active, age with dignity and live independently as long as possible.

An adaptation of the New York State Office for the Aging's "Friendly Calls" service, the County program has already trained two dozen volunteers to connect with local, pre-screened older adults who have identified an interest in fostering connections with others and reducing social isolation through weekly telephone conversations that cultivate relationships between participants. Nearly 40 local seniors who already receive services, case management and/or home-delivered meals from the Dutchess County OFA, have registered to be part of the program, having been surveyed to determine their level of loneliness and interest in participating.

Volunteer callers, many of whom already donate their time and talents to other OFA programs, are similarly eager to participate and improve the mental and physical health of the older adults they call. The program runs in eight-week periods, and following an initial introductory conversation, volunteers will spend 20-30 minutes each week talking with the older adults with whom they're matched, based on mutual interest. If both participants express interest, they can extend their calls past the initial eight weeks.

County Executive William F.X. O'Neil said, "The safety and well-being of Dutchess County's older adults is a top priority, and we know feeling isolated can have adverse effects on a senior's physical health, including higher risk for high blood pressure, heart disease, obesity and dementia. Our Office for the Aging has begun its 'Friendly Calls' program to increase socialization for older adults

who need it and decrease those adverse effects related to loneliness. We look forward to expanding this program, based on its anticipated success, and enhancing as many Dutchess County seniors' lives as possible."

"Friendly Calls" volunteers report to an OFA Program Manager, designated to oversee the operation of the program. To qualify for the program, prospective volunteers must be:

- at least 18 years old;
- an active listener, a good conversationalist and able to speak clearly and slowly, if needed; and
- interested in meeting a new friend and open to hearing new ideas.

Training includes teaching volunteers conversation starters, meaningful and appropriate topics, active listening, problem-solving guidance and how to respect boundaries, among other topics.
