St. Patrick's Day Parade to step off Saturday in Wappingers Falls

Beale grand marshal of annual event

He was always behind the scenes. Now, William "Bill" Holohan Beale will get to see what it's like to lead one of Dutchess County's, biggest events from the front.

Beale is as recognizable a name as there is in Dutchess County for his work on the radio with K104, with the county as the Director of Emergency Management, and as a Town of Wappinger councilman. Beale will be this year's grand marshal of the 2023 Saint Patrick's Day Parade in the village of Wappingers Falls on March 4 at 1 p.m.

"Bill is part of the fabric of Dutchess County," said Jack Fedigan, a former grand marshal himself and now one of the committee members for the parade. "He's done so much for this parade, that it was a no brainer."

Indeed, Beale has done copious amounts of work on behalf of the parade, including the MC of the Emerald Ball, which is held about a week before the event. Beale has been the parade's Master of Ceremonies for the past 25 years.

"We figured we'd give him off from that this year," Fedigan quipped.

Instead, another local radio personality, Joe Daily, hosted the ball on Feb. 18.

"Billy does a lot for the Irish community and does a lot for the county in general," Fedigan remarked.

Beale, 46, is a hometown guy with roots deep in Dutchess County. He grew up in the town of Wappinger and went to schools in the Wappingers Central School District. He even graduated from Marist College in the town of Poughkeepsie. Beale and his wife, Erin, have two sons, Liam and Sean. Beale's father, John Beale, has deep and long connections to the parade.

"I like to say that his father married a

Holahan," Fedigan said, "So, Billy is Irish through and through." Scholarships are awarded in honor of Beale's mother, Katherine Holohan Beale, by the parade committee.

Beale said, "This incredible honor means so much to me, having been involved with this gala parade since its inception and serving as its Master of Ceremonies for the past 25 years. I take great pride in my Irish roots and this parade has truly been a family affair for decades. As many know, my late mother had a passion for all things Irish, loved visiting the motherland – Ireland, and couldn't get enough of this parade! She spent many years co-chairing the committee's Emerald Ball with her sister Trish Holahan-Costello, and was very involved in the annual scholarship awards. I will proudly march in her honor on this great day! My father continues his involvement as a parade marshal each

year handling logistics and line-up on Parade Day."

The younger Beale was first elected a councilman in the town of Wappinger in 2006 and has been re-elected eight times. He is also serving his fourth term as Deputy Town Supervisor. He still actively serves the town with the Hughsonville Fire Department after 30 years.

But most people know him as the news voice for the number one morning radio show in Hudson Valley.

"I had no idea I was even ever nominated," Beale said of being named Grand Marshal of the parade. "To say that I am honored, would be an understatement."

Rogers is a former New York State Deputy District Attorney for Social Justice, a former Deputy Commissioner for Worker Protection with the New York State Department of Labor, and a

resident of the Village of Red Hook. When Rogers was president of the Association of Legal Aid Attorneys, he initiated a campaign to change the law and cap the number of cases of law guardians in family court take on at any one time. This law drastically improved the quality of representation of children in family court.

Bees, birds, healthy soil need protection from toxic neonic pesticides

To the Editor:

Thirty years ago, when I joined the Biology faculty at Vassar College, flowering plants and trees decorated by floating butterflies and bees hummed in the spring. Now, with the surge in use of toxic neonicotinoid pesticides on farms and home gardens, a dramatic shift has occurred. It's clear to see that there are far fewer pollinators and butterflies visiting the local flora.

When seeds (like corn, wheat, soybean) are coated with neonics, the poison distributes throughout the growing plant and cannot be washed off. Neonics are extremely potent poisons to all insects, including honeybees and butterflies. They persist for weeks in the environment and are responsible for the collapse of pollinator populations. Neonics also threaten other wildlife and human health.

Insects aren't the only casualties of these poisons. I conducted research with a partner biologist at Marist College in 2020 which led to the surprising discovery that minute amounts of a household neonic-containing pesticide wreaked havoc on tiny soil organisms called nematodes—essential composting critters that make the soil healthy and rich, benefitting agriculture.

Lawmakers in Albany have the opportunity to save our pollinators and wildlife by passing the Birds and Bees Protection Act (S1856-Hoyleman-Sigal). Banning the unnecessary use of neonic-coated seeds on NY farms, gardens, and lawns will make our neighborhoods and outdoor spaces safer for all of us.

And, one day, we might again hear our trees and gardens hum with bees in the spring and summer. Please urge your NY senator and assemblymembers to support this bill.

The Dutchess County Office for the Aging (OFA) invites veterans of all ages and their families to its Veterans Resource Forum on Tuesday, March 14th at the Pavilion at Brookmeade, 34 Brookmeade Drive in Rhinebeck, from 1 to 4 p.m. This free event will offer veterans and their families important information and connections to various agencies, including the County's Division of Veterans' Services, and service providers. Spots are limited; veterans can reserve their seat by calling the OFA at 845-486-2555.

Representatives from Mental Health America of Dutchess County, Rhinebeck at Home and the County's Department of Behavioral and Community Health's (DBCH) Mental Health Subcommittee are among the participating organizations that will be available to meet with veterans and their families and provide information on a wide range of topics, including mental health resources and veterans' benefits. Attendees will have the opportunity to learn about the services available to them, ask questions and connect with other veterans and their families.

OFA Director Todd Tancredi said, "While many of our local heroes are Office for the Aging clients, they may not know their service makes them eligible for other local providers' programs that can serve their various needs. Our Veterans Resource Forum will inform

veterans of every age and era, as well as their loved ones, about the benefits available to them through their service to our nation. We invite all Dutchess County veterans to register today to attend this important event."

The County's Division of Veterans Services ensures Dutchess County veterans and their families receive their maximum eligible benefits from the Department of Veterans Affairs and other agencies at all levels of government. In 2022, the Division rendered 20,212 contact services to Dutchess County Veterans and their families regarding services and entitlements available from federal, state and local government.

Mental Health America of Dutchess County offers numerous programs for veterans – including the Vet2Vet; Housing, Employment, Reintegration and Outreach Program (HERO); Veterans Employment Training & Transitions Assistance Program (VET-TAP) and Weekend 4 Warriors programs – that offer local veterans emotional support, educational information, referrals to useful services, information about support groups, Social Events, advocacy and short-term care management.

Rhinebeck at Home is a locally based, non-profit organization with members dedicated to helping each other to remain in their own homes and stay connected to their community as they grow older.

CAMO to flush hydrants in Wappinger

Residents of the United Wappinger Water District East of All Angels Hill Rd., including the Royal Ridge Development, in the Town of Wappinger are being advised to limit water use.

CAMO Pollution Control, Inc. will be flushing hydrants between the hours of 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. beginning Monday, March 6th through Friday, March 31.

During the flushing, residents may experience erratic water pressure and turbid water conditions. This condition will only be temporary. According to CAMO, at all times the water will meet satisfactory sanitary quality. The flushing will bring about long-term improvements in water quality.



Lundberg explained, "To add another element to the somewhat 63 or so images, visitors who attend the opening night will experience two special performances by singer-song writers Jeffrey Lewis and Indigo Sparke. In short, visitors can expect a dynamic range of imagery paired with musical immersion during the opening March 4th."

Lundberg said he has "always been a keen observer of my surroundings, but it wasn't until I made the move from Boston to Brooklyn that I picked up the camera for serious endeavors." He explained, "Being in a new city with tons of visual stimuli, I started immersing myself in this new environment and its

culture, the camera was the best tool to record my experiences. That was late 2016. Due to a few fortuitous interactions in 2017, I was off in running taking on music assignments for Paste Magazine and showing my first image in Chelsea that same year. So, now it's been about 5 or 6 years of photographic work, wow time honestly flies."

Asked how he would describe his technique when capturing his subjects, Lundberg responded, "To be honest, I've never really articulated my process too much, as I've always just dove into creating. However, to give a bit of insight into my ethos when creating images with the lens there are actually a few underlying structural rules I attempt to apply. For



instance, generally from the start I've attempted to strictly use natural or available light sources, as I find it more interesting on a technical level to adjust to the residing light sources that exist on location. Which lends itself towards the naturalistic, raw, and real output I seek within my work."


He noted, "Conversely, there have been a few occurrences in which I had to use external lighting or flash, as in such sce-

narios the environment was basically pitch black. Additionally, I tend to always seek out deep shadows and blacks, I guess in ode to noir films and cinema in general."

As far as his thoughts about the upcoming show at the Howland, Lundberg said, "I'll tell you one thing, after the opening I hope to catch up on much-needed sleep. However, it's been an honor to work with the Howland Cultural Center and I'm super excited to see my work live in such a beautiful and unique space. The challenge has been how do I present my visual narrative and my vision of the work within the provided physical space ie: a sectional (bookcase style) gallery as the Howland of course was a library in its previous life."

He said, "All in all, I'm both elated and a bit nervous to show this "work" that has taken hold of my early to mid-thirties. In comparison, it's like opening up my personal visual journal of this past half decade to the general public. With this, there's a lingering tension between vulnerability and the need to show this "extension of self" that won't dissipate, until everything comes to fruition. It's both a surreal and an intangible feeling at this point, though once I see all the pieces hung, and the night kicks off I intend to soak in the moment and just try to enjoy this special opportunity."

Residents advised to take precautions and avoid encounters with coyotes

The Dutchess County Department of Behavioral & Community Health (DBCH) continues to advise residents to be aware of continued reports of coyotes exhibiting bold/aggressive behavior in the Towns of Poughkeepsie and Hyde Park, notably in areas just north of the Mid-Hudson Bridge to the Hyde Park Drive-In Theater, as well as the City of Poughkeepsie.

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYS DEC) has determined that these behaviors are consistent with coyotes being fed intentionally or unintentionally, creating an increase in coyote encounters. Residents should not leave out food (including for pets) or otherwise attempt to feed coyotes or other animals outdoors.

Additionally, the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYS DEC) coyote conflict guidance advises that January through March is the breeding season for coyotes in New York State. Pup-rearing season extends beyond that into the summer. Coyotes are more territorial during this period and there are increased risks for conflicts.

DBCH reminds residents to avoid contact with wild animals. Do not approach!

The NYS DEC recommends the following precautions:

- DO NOT approach or have contact with wild animals, as they may be rabid.
- Do not feed coyotes.
- Make garbage inaccessible.
- Remove outside food sources including pet food and bird seed. Pet food and

garbage attract coyotes and other wildlife, including rodents, and increase risks to people and pets.

- Be alert of your surroundings and take precautions such as carrying a flashlight or a walking stick to deter coyotes.
- Be mindful of children and pets while outdoors. Do not let pets run free.
- Do not allow coyotes to approach people or pets. If you see a coyote, be aggressive in your behavior: stand tall and hold your arms up or out to look as large as possible. If a coyote lingers for too long, make loud noises, wave your arms and throw sticks and stones.

Report coyotes exhibiting bold behaviors (approaching people for food, attacking leashed pets with owners, chasing joggers or bikers, etc.) or repeatedly seen during the daytime in a human-populated area or near residences to the NYS DEC Bureau of Wildlife at 845-256-3098. Please note that seeing a coyote occasionally is not evidence of bold behavior.

Residents should contact their local police department in the case of an emergency.

If there is any physical contact between a coyote and a person or pet, report the incident to DBCH as soon as possible at: 845-486-3404 Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. 845-431-6465 on nights/weekends/holidays.

To receive help, it's as easy as picking up the phone and dialing 2-1-1 to schedule an appointment through United Way's Hudson Valley Region 2-1-1 Helpline (or by dialing 1-800-899-1479) from 9am to 4pm Monday through Friday. A call specialist will review eligibility, make an appointment, and provide directions to the appropriate tax site. This free tax preparation service is provided to all those who are eligible by AARP Foundation Tax-Aide, Hudson Valley CA\$H Coalition members, United Way of the Dutchess-Orange Region, Community Action Partnership for Dutchess County and many other community partners.

"Last year, \$5.4 million was returned in the form of tax credits and refunds to people who need it most in our community," noted Jeannie Montano, President, and CEO of United Way of the Dutchess-Orange Region. "Part of the mission of United Way is fighting for the financial stability of every person in our community. We hope that individuals, families, and seniors will take advantage of this free

help and call 2-1-1 to schedule an appointment."

"We know that people in our community are working diligently, but finding it hard to survive," Jeannie Montano explained. "Many of these are the people identified in United Way of New York's ALICE (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed) Report. They're our friends. They're the people who greet us with a smile and help us every day at restaurants, day care centers, dental clinics, and offices. The refunds and EITC that they receive thanks to the AARP Tax-Aide volunteer tax-preparers truly make the difference in their very day-to-day survival, and help pay rent, medical bills, buy food and fulfill other basic needs. We proudly support the Hudson Valley CA\$H Coalition and its partner organizations with grants from the United Way Community Fund. The more than 30 tax preparation locations are conveniently located throughout Dutchess, Orange, and Putnam Counties and will be staffed by AARP Tax-Aide volunteers, six days-a-week, including evenings and weekends from February 1st through April 14, 2023. Assistance will be available for the hearing-impaired. The tax service is open to area residents of all ages who meet eligibility guidelines. AARP membership is not required.


Sudoku requires no arithmetic skills.


Each row of 9 numbers must include all digits 1 through 9 in any order.




