'Everyone's Sheriff' Kirk Imperati takes oath

Even though he has worked with the Dutchess County Sheriff's Office for 30 years, Kirk Imperati says he "never dreamed of becoming Sheriff."

Imperati was elected Sheriff in November and took the Oath of Office in ceremonies on New Year's Day at the Villa Borghese banquet hall in Wappingers Falls. After working as Under-Sheriff for 14 years, he served the last 15 months as Acting Sheriff after the passing of Sheriff Adrian "Butch" Anderson.

"It was an honor to be Sheriff Anderson's Under-Sheriff and be responsible for the day-to-day operations of the Sheriff's Office," said Imperati. "I am truly honored and humbled that the residents of Dutchess County have elected me as their Sheriff."

All of that being said, the role of Sheriff was never in the plans for the 53-year-old native of Poughkeepsie. "I was planning to retire at the age of 55 and pursue something in the private sector," said Imperati. "God had other plans for me and here I am as 'Everyone's Sheriff.'

He added that he is "planning on remaining Sheriff as long as the men and women I work with and the residents of Dutchess County elect me as their Sheriff. I hope it is for many years."

He is in charge of the office that includes six divisions. His successor as Under-Sheriff will be Chief Deputy Jason

"Jason is a 31-year veteran with the Dutchess County Sheriff's Office. He was a road patrol deputy, detective, detective sergeant then Chief Deputy," said

Imperati. "He has the drive and desire to run the day-to-day operations of our office and the desire to always become better tomorrow than what we are today.'

Sheriff Imperati said the Patrol Division handles over 60,000 calls for service each year. Twelve School Resource Officers are assigned to eight different school districts in the county. The office has a Detective Division to

conduct and follow through on investigations and the K-9 Division works with both Road Patrol and Corrections. The Community Outreach Program also works with both Road Patrol and Corrections. The Explorer Program is designed to encourage youth to pursue a career in law enforcement.

"The men and women assigned to these

Local leaders discuss goals for municipalities in 2023

Looking forward in 2023, municipality leaders have a variety

City of Beacon 'moving forward' with two capital projects

As for 2023 in the City of Beacon, Mayor Lee Kyriacou said there will be "continued discussions about requiring new construction to reduce environmental/ climate change impacts from energy use."

Kyriacou noted there will be a "presentation of the results of the Community Facility and Program Report, which provides the City feedback from nearly 1,000 survey respondents as to desired recreational and community service facilities and program (including evaluation of a possible expanded or new community center)."

The mayor remarked about the approval of proposed solar PV installation on the City's Highway Garage, which will help the City get closer to its policy goal of using 100 percent locally-generated renewable electricity for municipal buildings.

There is also the "development of preliminary planning for the Beacon-Hopewell Rail Trail, which Dutchess County will fund and lead with the participation and support of Beacon, Fishkill (Town and Village), and Town of East Fishkill," said Kyriacou.

Kyriacou said, "The City is finally moving forward on two major capital projects which have been many years in the making. The City will be going to construction on the Fishkill Avenue/Teller Avenue rehabilitation, which started more than 20 years ago. In 2022, we wrapped up the engineering design and right-of-way acquisition to move this project to construction. The Tompkins Hose Fire Station will be fully rehabilitated and expanded to allow for the completion of the consolidation of the City's previous three fire station footprint to one

consolidated station."

Town of East Fishkill hiring police officers

"We're very cognizant of public safety," said East Fishkill Supervisor Nicholas D'Alessandro. "We are increasing our police department. We hired two police officers [in December 2022] and

Thousands of violations given for passing stopped school buses

A reminder as 2023 begins, schools are back in session after their winter breaks. School buses are back on the road. When a school bus is stopped with its red lights on and stop sign out, do not pass it... even if one is driving on Route 9 on the

As part of her jobs, Village of Wappingers Falls program coordinator and assistant to the Village judges, Lori Jiava watches videos of vehicles passing school buses. Jiava remarked, "The Village of Wappingers Falls has the smallest area in mileage. But Route 9 holds 21.5 percent of tickets for passing buses in Dutchess County." The Town of Poughkeepsie has the most roadways with 22 percent and the Town of Wappinger and Town of LaGrange have 17.5 percent and 17 percent respectively.

"As of October 1, 2022, more than 1,200 tickets have been issued since March," noted Jiava.

Countywide, according to the County Executive's Office, as of November 30, 2022, there have been 7,498 violations.

"The safety cameras have been very helpful in identifying vehicles that illegally pass school busses when they are loading or unloading. Since the inception of the program in January of 2022, over 3,195 vehicles have been cited for violating this law within the Wappingers Central School District (WCSD)," said Dr. Dwight Bonk, WCSD Superintendent

If one receives a ticket in the village of Wappingers Falls, and decides to go to court, rather than paying the fine, Jiava reviews the evidence with the owners of the vehicles. The evidence includes videos of the vehciles passing the stopped school buses.

"In this case, there is no negotiating. The fine is the fine," said Jiava. Jiava said the registered owner is charged. The first offense is \$250. The second offense is \$275. The third offense, well, Jiava said, "I haven't seen a third offense yet, but I have seen many repeat offenders."

Dutchess County adopted the program, said Jiava, and 10 percent of the fine goes to the municipality, 40 percent goes to the County, and the rest goes to the program to keep it continuing.

'When I review evidence with the registered owners of the vehicles, we give them an opportunity to see it together," stated Jiava. "We always say they are entitled to a trial or hearing but what they just saw is what they judge will see. The law still states one has to stop for a school bus even on a divided highway.

Most people, according to Jiava, state they did not know they needed to stop on a divided highway.

'Sometimes (on the videos) we look for the arms on the bus and then see if someone was not speeding how long it takes them to stop," she explained.

we'll hire one more. All are coming in 2023." D'Alessandro continued, "The public is very happy with our police department. They get a lot of support."

As far as challenges in 2023, "Inflation as a whole," said the supervisor. "If the economy slows down, the slowdown will affect our sales tax and mortgage tax revenues.'

D'Alessandro said, "The Town of East Fishkill has been very successful because of the Town Board working together and because of the staff."

Park improvement planned in Village of Fishkill

Kathy Martin is the mayor of the Village of Fishkill.

"In 2023, I look forward to the completion of the Village's Wastewater Treatment Facility," said Martin.
Sarah Taylor Park will also be on

Martin's to-do list for the new year.

"One special project that I planned for 2023 is the improvement and rededication of Sarah Taylor Park. Sarah Taylor was the first female mayor of the Village of Fishkill, and she was a remarkable woman," said Martin.

Veterans, history on Town of Fishkill agenda

The planned adoption of the Town of Fishkill Comprehensive Plan is what Fishkill Town Supervisor Ozzy Albra will

have on the agenda for 2023.

It was stated that Albra intends to pursue significant promotion of veterans and Fishkill's military history.

"For starters, the Town intends to lobby the State to name Route 9 in the Town of Fishkill as the Elijah Briggs Memorial Highway, in honor of Elijah Briggs, who won the Medal of Honor during the Civil War and is buried in the Fishkill Rural Cemetery," said Albra via email. "Likewise, the Town intends to lobby for Route 82 to be named for Derick Brinckerhoff, who was killed in combat in the Korean War; Route 9D for Sydney Scofield, who was killed in the Spanish-American War; and Route 52 for Sachem Daniel Nimham.'

The Town also intends to have its veterans committee operational in 2023 to further advocate for veterans, it was stated.

"The Town will continue its investment in Town park spaces, including the installation of a sensory park at Doug Phillips Park. Additionally, the Town recently removed an abandoned water storage tank on the Route 9D corridor, and the Town will explore making that property into a Town park," said Albra.

The Supervisor noted that the town of Fishkill "is shifting from a municipality which was pro-high-density development, to one which promotes its history for historical tourism and economic development." He said, "The Town of Fishkill anticipates groundbreaking for a

new warehouse at the old Dutchess Mall site, which is expected to bring significant revenue and employment opportunities to the Town. In addition, Creodent, located on Route 52 near the Town line, should be fully operational in 2023. This site will create around 100 new jobs. Further, there will be a new self-storage facility in the Westage campus, and on the Route 9D corridor a site which needs remedial action will see new mixed-use commercial development south of Dutchess Stadium.'

Albra continued, "While the Town is

shifting from high-density housing to commercial and historical, we certainly recognize the need for housing. Across the Town, we see the potential for as many as 200 new residential units in the next year or two, based on existing zon-

Town of Wappinger leaders look to expand services

Town of Wappinger Supervisor Richard Thurston said the Town's core focus will be on: sustainable economic development; highway congestion mitigation along the Route 9 and 9D corridors; continued expansion of the Town's municipal sewer and water services for its residences and businesses, including a new water-source protection legislation; additional improvements to the Town's parks and recreation facilities, including Spook Hill Park, Robinson Ball Fields, Rockingham soccer fields, and Carnwath Farms; expanded services for seniors and veterans in the Town; and "last but by no means least, we will start implementation of the 9 Element improvement plans for the Wappinger Creek and Sprout

Thurston noted, "During 2023 we will intensify our focus on preserving our environment (such as water sources, farmland protection) while attempting to achieve sustainable economic development, increasing services for our seniors, veterans and disadvantaged residents is a top priority" of his and the Wappinger Town Board.

Notes from the Town of Wappinger Supervisor Looking back at 2022 and ahead to 2023

First and most important, my wife, Yvonne, and I hope that each of you, your families and friends have been having a wonderful holiday season, and that you will have a most blessed, healthy and prosperous

Second, looking back on 2022 and all of the positive things that we have done together for Our Town, there are several accomplishments, out of many, that I bring to your attention:

 Intensified code enforcement of longstanding issues, which initiative focuses on writing more tickets, reining in developers, and court enforcement.

• Completion of the Old Hopewell Road Reconstruction and the completion of the New Hackensack Roundabout construction, both with minimal disruption. A special shout-out to NYSDOT and Dutchess County DPW. Most particularly, Commissioner Balkind was extremely helpful and responsive on Old Hopewell Road. I am working with the Commissioner on several other projects that will benefit Our Community.• Enhancing and expanding our Recreation Department programs which also benefited from significant improvements to our parks and recreation facilities.

Third, Our Town's financial condition is the best that it has been since the global financial meltdown in 2007-2008. While I take great pride in providing leadership in achieving this result, it could never happen by one individual alone. Rather, it is the direct result of our Town residents and businesses and other organizations, Our Staff; and especially our Town Board's tremendous efforts in working together as a team. Constructive engagement has been a cornerstone of our Town Government.

The Town's finances are extremely solid, benefiting from our conservative fiscal management. Our fund balances are the strongest they have been in a long time. We passed a 2023 Budget that stays below the Tax Levy Cap while continuing to keep the tax impact to our constituents amongst the lowest rates anywhere in Southern Dutchess Communities. Our debt ratings remain strong.

Fourth, a snapshot of Our 2023 plans. In this, the first of several columns on 2023, a core focus will be placed on:

(i) Intensified and strengthened code enforcement including amendment of our code-established penalties. We have been remediating many code non-compliant situations throughout the Town since we started a few years ago with review and analysis. We have discovered several prevalent conditions including: lack of code clarity; absence of adequate process and procedures; a void in appropriate authority and a weakness in fines and penalties. As concerns the latter point, briefly, the penalties are too light – creating a situation where violators would rather pay the penalty than fix the issue. I will discuss these issues in more detail in a future column. Also, Our Town Board will hold a workshop on Code Changes in February.

(ii). Remediating many drainage issues created by: poor drainage systems taking water to the creeks and Rivers before 2000; deteriorating infrastructure such as culverts; and changing climate factors. When most of our developments were constructed decades ago, the drainage systems were inadequate under today's standards. Furthermore, what then existed has disappeared or is the victim of deteriorating infrastructure. Now that we are finalizing a major study in this area, we will be able to create an implementation plan. more discussion will be found in future columns.

(iii) Intensifying our focus on preserving our environment (such as new water-source protection legislation, farmland protection, etc.). Also, we will start implementation of the 9 Element improvement plans for the Wappinger Creek and Sprout Creek areas. I hope that we will be able to protect even more farmland than just Obercreek Farm.

Other items to be discussed in the future include: continued expansion of our municipal sewer/water services; additional

improvements to our parks/recreation facilities including Spook Hill Park, Robinson Ball Fields, Rockingham Soccer fields, and Carnwath Farms; expanded services for our seniors, veterans, and disadvantaged residents; and highway congestion mitigation along the Route 9 and 9D corridors, etc.

I assure you that I will continue to dedicate and bring my many years of experience to the benefit of Our Community. I have no other political goals whatsoever. This is not a one-person effort and especially not one by any 'emperor without clothes," but rather a team effort of Our entire community.

Dutchess County crews deploy to assist in storm-ravaged Buffalo

Last week, Dutchess County Public Works (DPW) highway crew members headed to Buffalo to help the region dig out from an historic series of storms that have buried Erie County. According to news reports, at least 28 people have died.

Blizzard conditions have dumped several feet of snow on the region, with snow and wind conditions causing power outand impassable roadways. Emergency response, utilities and public works crews have been dealing with impossible conditions and weather conditions continue to make recovery challenging as a new storm hits the region.

The New York State Office of Emergency Management has been coordinating mutual aid deployments from various counties and municipalities across the state to assist with snow removal operations in the City of Buffalo, where many locations have been inaccessible and without power since the early stages of the storm. Loaders and dump trucks with operators have been requested to assist local and Erie County crews to cut paths through unplowed streets to open access for utility restoration crews and emergency service providers.

DPW responded with eight crew members and multiple equipment including front end loader and dump trucks. The DPW team traveling to Buffalo included Matt Shaw, Rich Whispell, Paul Falso,

Chris Eastwood, Chris Orlik, Jesse Cortes and Shawn Graybill. They departed Poughkeepsie on Dec. 27 and were scheduled to begin work on Dec. 28, gathering with other crews from around the state at SUNY's Buffalo State College. The team was there through the end of the week and was scheduled to travel back to Dutchess County on Saturday, Dec. 31.

Medical Examiner/coroner staff have also been overwhelmed in the City of Buffalo and Erie County, resulting in requests for assistance with morgue and medical examiner services. Dutchess County Medical Examiners' Office is currently coordinating assistance response.

Following the deployment of Dutchess County Public Works (DPW) highway crew last week, four Dutchess County Public Safety Dispatchers (PSDs) headed to Buffalo on December 29 to provide relief coverage in the Erie County 911 Communication Center.

The request for coverage came from the Erie County Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Services. Dutchess County PSDs will cover live calls in the Erie County 911 center in the Town of Cheektowaga from Friday until Monday to allow Erie County staff some time to rest and decompress. Public Safety Dispatchers, known as the "thin gold line," are an integral part of the emergency response

and law enforcement system and often handled tens of thousands of calls the unseen heroes who work in the background of emergencies. Erie County Public Safety Dispatchers have

Staying ahead of current cyber threats can make a significant difference when protecting sensitive data and maintaining constituents' trust."

At the summit, industry experts includ-

ing representatives from Dutchess County, New York State, and Federal Government agencies will discuss topics



Thousands of violations given for passing stopped school buses

Ninety-five percent of the tickets are given on Route 9 by the Double O restaurant area, said Jiava.

The Bus Patrol program was a trial in February and went live in March, said Jiava. "It's not about the money; it's about keep-

ing the children safe," said Jiava.

According to the Dutchess County
Executive's Office, the following school
districts in Dutchess County have an active
status with the program:

Arlington Central School District, BOCES, Hyde Park Central School District, Pawling Central School District, Pine Plains Central School District, Red Hook Central School District.

Spackenkill Union Free School District went live January 1 and Beacon City School District is in the process of going live,

according to the County Executive's Office.

In discussions still, according to the County Executive's Office, are Dover Union Free School District, Millbrook Central School District and Webutuck Central School District. Rhinebeck Central School District opted out, according to the County Executive's Office.

"The use of the cameras have certainly led to a much safer environment for our students and drivers. I am surprised by the number of violations that have occurred to this point and remain hopeful that since the inception of the program more individuals are aware of the law and the importance of stopping when busses are loading or unloading students!" said Dr Bonk

When a local district opts into the program and the on-board cameras are installed, an initial, month-long warning period goes into effect; motorists who illegally pass a stopped school bus equipped with the cameras will receive a warning in the mail. When that warning period expires, violators who pass a stopped school bus will receive a citation and fine in the mail, according to the County Executive's Office.

Dutchess BOCES opted into the County's partnership with Bus Patrol since its inception in late 2021, with the Pine Plains Central School District being the first to opt into the program in Dec. 2021.

New York State Vehicle and Traffic law requires drivers to stop from either direction, even on a divided highway, any time a school bus's red lights are flashing. Passing a school bus with red lights is not only dangerous, but it is illegal and punishable with fines ranging from \$250 to \$1,000; a motorist may also be assessed five points on his driver's license, and penalties can include possible imprisonment (up to 30 days for first

offense and 180 days for a third or subsequent conviction), it states.

Before resigning as County Executive and to be sworn in as a member of the U.S. Congress, former Dutchess County Executive Marc Molinaro said about the program, "Every motorist has a role to play in keeping our students safe, and Dutchess County's safety program is effectively educating drivers: It is never permissible to pass a stopped school bus with its red lights flashing and its STOP sign extended. We thank our partner districts for joining us in this life-saving collaboration, and we look forward to having more districts join our efforts. I encourage students, parents and all residents to encourage local districts and municipalities to participate in the important efforts to project our kids and keep our roads safe."

The new year is when we give voice to our hopes and desires for the future in the form of resolutions, wishes, and intentions going forward. The Japanese express this with Kakizome, the ritualized first calligraphy writing of the year. Kakizome or "first writing," takes place within the first few days of the year, traditionally in a poetic calligraphic form expressing their hopes and aspirations for the coming year. The poems were later burned to seal the fate of the hope.

The Kakizome tradition continues, but these days practitioners write auspicious kanji (Chinese characters) rather than poems. Each guest chooses an idea or sentiment to carry with them into the New Year. For example, if you hope for good health in the New Year, you would write a

more patience, you would practice the kanji for tolerance or acceptance. Kakizome is about positive wishes for the New Year. It is a reflective practice based on the belief that practicing one kanji over and over helps the writer focus on the hoped-for theme.

Volunteers from the local Japanese community will be on hand, offering guidance in choosing and writing your chosen kanji. Brushes, paper, and ink will be provided.

The Mid-Hudson Japanese Community Association (MHJCA) is a not-for-profit organization whose mission is to introduce Japanese culture to the local community, foster a sense of community among Japanese residents, and be a bridge for cultural exchanges between Japanese and non-Japanese residents of the Hudson Valley. 

"Run!"

I leapt over a coffee table, squeezed through the front door, and bolted down Al Azhar Street, glancing back to make sure Sue and Becky were following me.

I was in the lead, because I had all the money.

The three of us turned a corner and plunged into the Kahn-al-Khalili Bazaar, losing ourselves in a warren of alleyways and tiny cubbyholes. I remember one old lady sitting cross legged on the ground trying to sell me a used Brillo pad.

In our travels to 40-plus countries over the years, Sue and I, and sometimes daughter Becky, have experienced quite a few adventures involving money, some hilarious and some downright frightening. All the current talk about inflation, and our impending trip to yet another foreign country (Costa Rica this time) got me reminiscing about our past monetary adventures.

- Madrid We usually divvy up our cash among various suitcases, wallets and pockets. I keep a wallet in my back pocket with a couple of dollars and some expired documents to hand over to random thieves. On the Plaza Mayor, in the heart of Madrid's tourist district, bands of robbers stage intricate diversions - fights, fireworks, fake accidents - while they work the crowd. This happened to me. I lost everything – cash, passports, airline tickets. Sue and I were left with one big suitcase and a few dollars in the wallet in my back pocket. After a couple of days literally sleeping in the streets, Sue wanted to get our clothes washed at a laundromat. As I was handing over the clothes from the suitcase, Sue noticed a lump in the arm of one of our sweaters – \$1,000 in cash!
- Cuzco, Peru Trying to do the right thing, I ordered a safety deposit box in the hotel lobby. I opened it to find somebody

else's passport inside, along with what looked like a million dollars' worth of diamonds. I handed the box back and said, "never mind, I think I'll hang onto my money."


- Santa Marta, Colombia We're always trying to figure out ways to hide money from the maid when we leave our hotel room. When I suggested hollowing out a loaf of bread in the cupboard and hiding some money inside, Sue said, "people are so poor here, the maid will probably steal the bread!"
- Caracas Venezuela January 2003. Our hotel was charging the "official" rate to change our dollars into bolivars. The 500 bolivar per night rate would cost 500 dollars, even with a credit card. On the street, a dollar would buy 100 bolivars. This was going to be a tricky situation, so Sue stood about 20 yards away while I held up a hundred dollar bill and asked if anyone wanted to exchange it. I had to

battle my way out of the crowd, but I came out with ten thousand bolivars, enough to stay in our hotel for a month. But we got out of Venezuela the next day.

- Havana, Cuba Bring lots of dollar bills to Cuba. I only had a twenty. I bought something and got nineteen dollars worth of change in Cuban money. When I went to buy something with the change, the guy said, "we don't accept Cuban money."
- Singapore At a Burger King on Sentosa Island, the cashier sifted through my money looking for the perfect bank note. He kept rejecting any that had the slightest wear and tear. Finally I just threw one at him and grabbed the burger. Becky ate it and almost died from food poisoning.
- Ethiopia The "travel agent" who booked our tour to Lalibela wouldn't take a credit card. We had money wired to us. When we picked it up at the bank, they gave us a giant bag filled with dirty, smelly bills. The travel agent wanted dollars, but we told him to come get his Ethiopian money. We were stuck in our room until he got to the hotel, since the gigantic pile was too big to take with us, and we couldn't hide it.
- Cairo, Egypt I get a kick out of changing money on the street. In Cairo, a random guy invited me, Sue and Becky to his shop, where he proudly showed us a photo of himself with his arm around his "good friend" Mohammad Ali. I noticed that his face had been pasted in the picture. Just then, a couple of guys came down the stairs and set a coffee table in front of the door. That's when I yelled "Run!"







Biography


Phyllis Chadwick has been living in Dutchess County for about 40 years. It was during this part of her life that she was able to explore her creativity on a deeper level.
