## Poughkeepsie rowing history shines in 'Boys in the Boat'

**By Rich Thomaselli**Poughkeepsie's rich rowing history is a key element in an extremely popular book and movie that was released locally on Christmas Day, 2023.

The best-selling book "The Boys in the Boat" by Daniel James Brown chronicles the 1936 University of Washington crew team that made it to the Berlin Olympics. The boat had to qualify by first winning the Poughkeepsie Regatta on the Hudson River. The Regatta was a huge sporting event that was held for more than 50 years at the beginning of the 20th century and seen by thousands of spectators each year who lined the riverbank until it was moved around the country starting in 1949.

## Serino takes Oath of Office as DC's ninth **County Exec**

Despite the region's first storm of the winter season dropping more than a foot of snow on Dutchess County, more than 350 guests, including family, friends, elected officials, community and business leaders, all gathered on Sunday, Jan. 7 to support Sue Serino as she took her Oath of Office as Dutchess County's ninth County Executive.

Hon. James Brands, former justice for the Dutchess County Supreme Court in the 9th Judicial District of New York, administered the oath to County Executive Serino during a ceremonial event held at Dutchess Community College's Aviation Education Center at Hudson Valley Regional Airport in Wappinger.

New County Executive Serino said, "I am so honored and humbled to be with you all as I take my ceremonial Oath of Office for this position. As I get to work for Dutchess County, I want to thank each and every one of you for the support you have given me and the trust you have placed in me to lead our County. This is not a responsibility that I take lightly, and I could not be more excited and humbled to create a stronger, more united Dutchess County."

Serino highlighted public safety, increased access to mental health, small business creation and retention. affordable childcare, food insecurity, transportation and affordable housing among her top priorities as she takes office. Constituent service and community engagement will be central in all efforts.

## Youngest current Legislator Truitt elected new Chairman

The current Dutchess County Legislature's youngest member is now its' leader.

Republican Will Truitt, 28, who represents District Seven (Hyde Park and Pleasant Valley) was elected as Chairman for 2024 by a vote of 16-9 at the Legislature's annual Reorganization Meeting on Wednesday, Jan. 3.

He may be the youngest member, but Truitt is also one of the most senior members of the Legislature - having served since Jan. 1, 2016.

He has served as Majority Leader for the past two years and ex-officio on all legislative committees, and previously served as Chairman of the Budget Finance & Personnel Committee and Government Services & Administration Committee. His first "Chairmanship" was as Vice Chair of the Public Safety Committee in his first term.

In his address, Truitt acknowledged the many new and recently-legislators saying, "As I look around this room, I notice that only two legislators, my friends John Metzger and Craig Brendli, remain from my first day in office. The rate of turnover serves as a reminder that we are all temporary stewards of this government, with limited time to make an impact. I look forward to working with the leadership of both caucuses."

He added, "As I look around this room, it is hard not to recognize that this is a time of change for county government. More than a third of this body is made up of new faces, and we have just welcomed a new County Executive in Sue Serino, District Attorney in Anthony Parisi, and

Comptroller in Gregg Pulver. I believe this moment provides truly special opportunities. While we will continue to build on the good work of the past, we will also keep an eye to the future as we explore creative new ways to make county government work more efficiently for everyone."

Speaking to residents of the county, he listed major challenges being the illegal drug crisis, opportunities for youth and the unfunded mandates from the state.

"We must address the (illegal) drug crisis in our backyard with every tool available at our disposal," said Truitt. "I look forward to this Legislature partnering with the Dutchess County Sheriff's Office, the District Attorney's Office and local law enforcement agencies across the County to crack down on those who would dare traffic and sell (illegal) drugs on our streets that are causing irreparable harm to our children and families."

He added, "Further, we must be bold in our investments in youth programming, as well as in our local parks and recreation to enhance the quality of outdoor and physical activities for our children who would greatly benefit from these opportunities to spend less time on their phones, video games and television screens."

He said an additional major challenge Dutchess County will face, along with every other County across the State of New York, is "the financial burden of ever-increasing unfunded mandates placed upon us by politicians in Albany who are desperate to claw back revenue and push costs down onto local municipalities to cover their absurdly

bloated annual budget. We will stand

strong and be a fearless voice for our Dutchess County taxpayers in opposing new mandates that are proposed by Albany, and will actively seek to partner with surrounding County Governments and NYSAC (New York State Association of Counties) in expressing our opposition."

In regard to his overall approach in working with legislators and people of the county to address problem areas, Truitt said, "I will maintain an open and active line of communication with all members of our legislative body, as well as with our County Department Heads and

Commissioners to ensure everyone's voice is heard and effective solutions are sought to the critical issues that face us in every community and municipality in Dutchess County."

In seeking to further "working together" relations with fellow legislators, Truitt said he plans bring back the "100 cups of coffee" event early this year to the Legislature "to signal our commitment in this county to getting back to civil, respectful discourse."

He explained further, "100 Cups of Coffee" seeks to bring members of the County Legislature together, to put aside our partisan differences, and to give us an opportunity to get to know one another on a personal level. Before we are Democrats and Republicans, we are Americans and we are human beings. In order to get started on the right foot, I look forward to working with Dutchess County's own Jodi Miller in coordinating this event in the Chambers of the Legislature early on in 2024 so that we may get to know one another and to appreciate each other's backgrounds and the communities that we represent."

Truitt also said the Legislature is "lucky to have many boards and committees tackling the issues facing Dutchess County, from Veterans, to the Airport, to the EMC, to the Tick Task Force and everything in between. This is only made possible by the citizen volunteers who sacrifice their time and give of their talents to help inform our policy making decisions. I am committed to utilizing these boards as much as possible. We will recruit far and wide to make sure that these boards are filled and remain active and vibrant."

## Parisi takes Oath of Officeas new DC District Attorney

On Tuesday, January 2, hundreds of individuals gathered at Cunneen-Hackett Arts Theater in Poughkeepsie to witness the swearing-in of the first new District Attorney in Dutchess County in 40 years, Anthony P. Parisi.

Parisi started his legal career in the Dutchess County Public Defender's Office before joining the District Attorney's Office and most recently acted as the Bureau Chief of the Major Crimes Unit prior to winning the

November election. The new District Attorney said "Growing up, I knew I wanted to serve my community. Never in my wildest dreams did I imagine that one day I would be sworn in as the District Attorney. I am humbled beyond my ability to express."

Overall, the event had a casual but upbeat feeling with Parisi's two young daughters, Seraphina (4 years old) and Giuliana (2 years old), taking the stage and leading the crowd in the Pledge of

Allegiance. Dutchess County Sheriff Kirk Imperati acted as master of ceremonies and commended Parisi on his work with the DA's office and stated that Parisi held all the qualifications to serve as District Attorney and that as District Attorney, Parisi would be "caring, compassionate, firm, and consistent."

Parisi's family, including his wife, Sinead, also joined him for the Oath of Office administered by Judge David Steinberg. Steinberg joked that "this is an important day for Dutchess County legal community and the community at large...for every 40 years, we get a new District Attorney."

Parisi thanked community members for their support and said "This is a time of incredible promise for our County. My hope is to continue to work on our criminal justice system and to build a system that keeps us safe, is fair and earns the respect and the trust of the community

## Serino names first woman to lead County's Public Defender's Office

Dutchess County Executive Sue Serino announced on Jan. 3 her selection of Margaret M. Walker as Dutchess County's next Public Defender, following the recent retirement of longtime county Public Defender Thomas N.N. Angell. Walker, who currently serves as a Bureau Chief and the Office's Director of Training, will be the sixth Public Defender in Dutchess County history.

"Margaret's breadth of education, experience and passion to serve others make her the ideal person to serve as our next Public Defender," said County Executive Serino. "In addition to her well-deserved reputation as a capable leader and legal mind, she brings her education and prior work experience in community and counseling psychology, which is critically important in helping to meet client needs and assist them in rebuilding productive lives. Our community will be well-served with Margaret Walker as our Public Defender."

Walker brings a wide range of experience as she prepares to lead the Public Defender's Office, having served in various roles in both the public and private sectors, including multiple roles in Dutchess County Government.

Her experience with the County began early in her career, with an internship with the

Office of Probation and Community Corrections in 1994, as she studied for her Master's degree in Community/Counseling Psychology from Marist Following her graduation from Marist in 1995, she worked for community organizations such as the Putnam Associated Resource Center in Carmel and the Community Rehabilitation Center in Kingston. She also served as an educator for the former Domestic Abuse Awareness Classes for Men program at Family Services, She later worked as a Domestic Violence Outreach Aide for the Dutchess County District Attorney's Office, where she assisted victims of domestic violence with support and referrals, acting as liaison with the prosecutors handling criminal cases.

Earning her Juris Doctor from Pace University School of Law, while working full-time, she graduated in 2003 and became an Assistant District Attorney for Dutchess County for several years. She briefly left Dutchess County Government in 2008, working at Corbally, Gartland and Rappleyea, LLP in Poughkeepsie and the Rensselaer County District Attorney's Office. In 2011, she returned to Dutchess County Government, serving as Senior Assistant District Attorney from 2011 to 2017 and then as Senior Assistant County Attorney from 2017 to 2019.

She began her role as Bureau Chief and Director of Training in the Public Defender's Office in 2019. She developed the office's first formal attorney training program, and her expertise helped guide and train all attorneys and staff. As Director of Training, she also attended new attorneys court appearances, client interviews, and assisted with attorneys' first experiences with litigation, in addition to handling her own criminal caseload.

Walker will be the first woman to serve as Dutchess County Public Defender. In her new role, she will lead a team of more than 35 lawyers, social workers, investigators and other pertinent staff, all of whom are dedicated to providing quality legal representation to indigent clients in Criminal and Family courts.

Walker said, "I am honored to be part of the incredibly talented team at the Dutchess County Public Defender's Office. I look forward to continuing the Office's reputation for providing a high standard of quality legal representation and continuing Tom Angell's legacy of client-centeredness, as we help those in need strive to better their lives. I appreciate the confidence County Executive Serino has placed upon me, and I am excited to begin a new chapter of working toward greater fairness and equity in the criminal justice system in Dutchess County.



## Rolison introduces bill to crack down on reckless driving

## To the Editor:

Reckless drivers are fast turning our roads into speedways. What can be done? The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration has rightly called the up-tick in motorvehicle-involved deaths a "crisis." And with an estimated 115 million Americans traveling by car over the holidays – the second-highest number on record – these figures could jump again.

Recently I introduced S.7717, a Senate bill to crack down on reckless driving that threatens pedestrians and other motorists. The legislation is simple: it provides discretion to prosecutors and judges to charge a suspect with aggravated reckless driving, a felony.

Individuals driving uninsured or unregistered cars, trucks, motorcycles or ATVs, or guilty of three reckless-driving violations, would face forfeiture of their vehicles and other penalties. The measure is necessary because impaired and/or reckless drivers (including marijuana users) pose a threat to others each time they get behind the wheel. If our roads aren't safe, Hudson Valley residents can't feel secure about traveling around our region and state.

I'm encouraging my colleagues to join me in supporting and passing S.7717 during this session of the New York State Legislature. We need safe streets again. Our hardworking residents and families deserve no less.

## Renegades begin prep work for 30th season

Valley Renegades. The High-A affiliate of the New York

Yankees has begun celebrating its 30th anniversary in the area as soon as the New Year started.

"We are thrilled to be celebrating our rich, 30-year history of providing affordable family fun and entertainment to the Hudson Valley in 2024," said Zach Betkowski, General Manager of the Renegades. "We have so many exciting new initiatives and special events in the works to pay tribute to the great players, teams, and memories of Renegades baseball."

Saturday nights throughout the year at Heritage Financial Park will be full of nostalgia as the Renegades take the field in 1994 throwback jerseys in the original maroon-and-green color scheme. It will be the first time that the Renegades have

worn that jersey since they were retired as the primary kit following the 2003 season.

Additionally, every Saturday night will feature a 30th anniversary-themed giveaway. The giveaways, which will be announced at a later date, will pay tribute to all eras of Renegades baseball from the inaugural 1994 team, to the New York-Penn League Championship clubs of 1999, 2012 and 2017, to the modern Yankees era.

The Renegades have planned several alumni appearances throughout the season, including on July 6 where the team will retire Wade Davis' jersey number. Davis pitched for the Renegades in 2005 and had a 13-year career in MLB with Tampa Bay, Kansas City, Chicago Cubs and Colorado, during which he was a three-time American League All-Star and twice finished in the top 10 in Cy Young Award voting. It will be the first player jersey retired by the Renegades since the team retired Kevin Brown's #45.

Flowers, a lifelong resident and four-term Common Councilwoman, was sworn in at Poughkeepsie High School Auditorium, along with members of the Common Council.

"Today we take the mantle and begin the earnest work to push the City of Poughkeepsie to its true potential, to unify our city, to ensure it's a safe place where all are welcome and can thrive," said Flowers. "I recognize there is a lot of work to do, and I am calling on members of the community to join me in this work and to understand that change can't happen overnight, but progress can — and will — be made if we each do our part to help nurture the city we love.'

Flowers presented outgoing Mayor Marc Nelson with a proclamation at the event, praising his work and thanking him for a seamless transition during these past few months following her victory in the November election.

Flowers, a graduate of Poughkeepsie City School District and Dutchess Community College, has served as Chair of the city's Finance Committee, Co-Chair of the city's Procedural Justice Committee and has been on the board of directors of numerous organizations, including R.E.A.L Skills Network Inc., Hudson River Housing and the Dutchess County Board of Ethics. She worked at Dutchess Community College for more than 33 years as the college's Grants and Contracts Finance Officer and former Supervisor of Student Accounts Office.

Flowers became involved in community activities at a young age, working alongside her father John M. Flowers, Sr., who coordinated large community events, including the John Flowers Old Fashioned Easter Egg Hunt, Father's Day Parade/Celebration and Community Day Picnic.

Poughkeepsie Common Council members joined Flowers in taking their oaths of office today, including new Councilmemberat-Large Da'Ron Wilson. 

## Poughkeepsie rowing history shines in 'Boys in the Boat'

The event was considered as big as any prize fight during that era.

"Rowing was very, very popular," says local historian Bill Davies. "It drew a lot of people. And then the colleges became involved, and there was always an attachment to your college. So it even grew in popularity."

The 1936 crew team from University of Washington that won in Poughkeepsie did go on to win the gold medal at the Berlin Olympics.

There were only a few schools at first mostly Ivy League schools," Davies said.

"Then more and more became involved and it grew. They were looking for a nice, straight, calm course and the Hudson was perfect."

The film was produced and directed by George Clooney from the book of the same name. None of the rowing scenes, including the Regatta, were shot in Poughkeepsie, or even on the Hudson River. The movie has a limited run in theaters. Most observers believe it was released on Christmas Day in order to qualify for the Academy Awards.

According to Davies, the Regatta was inaugurated in the 1700s when the British came over with a crew team and challenged anyone to the equivalent of \$1,000. Back

On Thursday, Jan. 18 at 7 p.m. Davies is scheduled to give a lecture at the Beacon Sloop Club's 2024 Lecture Series entitled "Competitive Rowing in the Hudson Valley," discussing rowing as a competitive sport in the Hudson Valley from the 18th to the 21st century. Of course, it will include the Poughkeepsie Regatta, once known as "the greatest one-day sporting event

in America."

Individuals seeking more information on local rowing history can check out "The Poughkeepsie Regatta 1891 - 1950," by Elizabeth Clarke and Ann Sandri. A collection of vintage photos can also be found at the Archives and Special Collections at Marist College website.

Many schools constructed boat houses along the banks of the Hudson to house their equipment. Today the Mid-Hudson Rowing Association (MHRA) is bringing back the tradition.

Davies began his rowing career on the lightweight crew at Wesleyan University and used his first paycheck after college to buy a single rowing shell. He began rowing his single shell on the Hudson River in 1983 and continues to row competitively at the

He has coached at the Craftsbury Sculling center in Vermont and the novice boy's and girls' crews for Our Lady of Lourdes High School during their program start-up. He is a past president of Mid-Hudson Rowing Association and started their sculling clinic in 2003, which he runs every summer. He is currently an assistant coach for the Vassar College crew, as well as head coach for the

sweeps and sculls programs at MHRA.

Davies has seen "The Boys in the Boat" movie and said it presents a very accurate description of the race and the times, including the construction of the University of Washington boathouse.

"It was very well done, although they had to cut out a lot of details in the book, I'm sure, because of time reasons,' he said. "It didn't quite replicate the look of Poughkeepsie at the time, because it was filmed in England. For anybody who has rowed on the Hudson, he knew the presentation wasn't the same. But it was very well done.'

## Heroes honored for actions taken during gas explosion

"I know everybody in this room played a part in the response," said Ryan.

It was early in the afternoon on November 2, 2023, that a gas explosion occurred on Brick Row. Injured were 15 individuals, including five first responders. Eight adults and two children, who were in the apartments at the time of the explosion, were rescued and airlifted to the burn unit at Westchester Medical Center. A spokesperson for Central Hudson said in November that what was knows is that a contractor employed by Central Hudson appears to have struck a ¾ service line. A spokesperson for the company did not respond to an inquiry about where the investigation stands now.

Dutchess County Executive Sue Serino spoke during the event. She noted she once lived on Brick Row and thought about how it was back then.

Serino said her heart goes out to those families who were affected, the injured and those still in the hospital.

"Thank you from the bottom of my heart," she told those in the firehouse.

## Emergency responders recall incident described as 'controlled chaos'

One of those honored was Raquan White. White is with the Village of Wappingers Falls Fire Department.

"I arrived on scene the chief then notified us we had two victims trapped in a manhole," said White. He said with the Village of Fishkill and Hughsonville fire departments help, he was able to get one of the contract workers out. White said he and his partner then placed the victim in an ambulance and he drove with them to the hospital. White said it seemed like it took hours to help the victim, but it was just less than an hour.

"I really was at the point where I had a job to do and I did the job," said White.

Captain Alex Bravo is with the Village of Wappingers Falls Fire Department. He has been a firefighter for a decade, seven of those years with the Village of Wappingers Falls Fire Department.

"I responded out from Highland Falls," Bravo recalled about that day. "I remember coming across the Newburgh-Beacon

Bridge and seeing smoke. When I got there (on scene), everyone was still trapped. It was a lot of controlled chaos." He continued: "Nobody was questioning what we did. They did what we needed to get done.'

Lieutenant Stephen Reverri Jr. is with the Dutchess County Sheriff's Office. He remarked after the program, "I remember a coordinated effort of first responders working together to face a chaotic situation." He said it was because of the coordination that there was to be a tremendous outcome.

One first responder who was honored but wanted to offer an anonymous quote, said, "It does mean a lot to us that a guy in Congress, who makes it to Congress, comes back [to recognize us] -- that means a lot and

he says 'thank you' for what you do."
White said, "It's a great honor. We don't do it for the 'thank yous,' but it is a great

honor to be recognized."

Village of Wappingers Falls Police Commissioner Paul Italiano said, "I probably could not be more proud of these people. They're phenomenal. They are phenomenal, not only the day of but with fundraising." Italiano noted that Village of Wappingers Falls Det. Sgt. Jennifer Farrell "has worked nonstop, continuous hours, making sure the kids and families [affected] had a good Christmas. She took that on herself and the PBA. I could not be prouder of this department," he said.

A moment of silence was held for East Fishkill Sgt. DiDato. "I just want to ask everybody to take a moment to please join me in a moment of silence for East Fishkill Department police officer Daniel DiDato, his family and the entire community for his loss," said Ryan.

Community owes debt of gratitude Ryan said, "Our Hudson Valley community owes you a debt of gratitude we can never repay." He noted, "It was my honor to do that (read his statement about the incident and the response into the Congressional Record) and my honor to recognize you today.'

## **Tuscan Beef Stew Ingredients**

- 8 teaspoons olive oil
- 2 cups diced onion
- 1/2 cup diced carrot
- 1 tablespoon minced garlic
- 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 2 lbs. boneless chuck roast cut into cubes
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon black pepper
- 1 cup dry red wine

- 1 jar Coppola's Marinara
- 2 cups fat-free, lower-sodium beef broth
- 1/2 cup water
- 2 teaspoons oregano
- 2 teaspoons thyme
- 1 bay leaf

### Method

in flour and brown in the pan using 1 tablespoon of oil.

Add wine to pan, and bring to a boil, scraping pan. Cook until reduced to 1/3 cup (about 5 minutes). Add vegetables and Marinara sauce. Stir for 5 minutes then add remaining ingredients. Simmer, uncovered, for 1 hour or until meat is very tender, stirring occasionally. Discard bay leaf. Served with sliced crusty Italian Bread and the remaining red wine.

## The case of the missing cow - an Ancient Documents story

With the new year now upon us, thoughts tend to turn to what lies ahead. It is a time for resolutions, for hopes and dreams, and for seeking signs that confirm this year will be one of triumph. Auguries come in all forms, and not all of the fates they presage are good ones.

Today we will journey back in time through the Dutchess County Ancient Documents Collections, the surviving filings of the colonial county courts of Common Pleas and General Sessions. An example is an unfortunate augury for one resident of 18-century Rhinebeck. What fate did a missing cow predict for Sylvanus Garlick?

The date was October 15, 1743. At this point in Dutchess County's past, Rhinebeck was roughly twice the size it is today, including all of modern Red Hook, with a substantially smaller population. The residents, a mix of Germans, Dutch, and English, were spread across that area, living in modest wood frame houses with a few stone structures thrown in.

The west bank of the Hudson River did not see as much building in stone as the east bank, especially in Ulster County, which is famous for its multitude of early stone houses. There were small concentrations of settlement - a cluster of houses with a store and church here and there, but the social land-scape was radically different.

In contrast to the modern map, the major communities (less than hamlets by modern standards) could be found at places like Rhinecliff (where the Rondout Ferry crossed), Old Rhinebeck (immediately north of the Ruge's Chrysler Dodge Jeep), Staatsburg, and Wurtemburg. It is likely that the old small town stereotype of everyone knowing everyone else was especially true, since the population was so small at the time. The modern villages of Rhinebeck, Red Hook, and Tivoli were still years to decades away from their initial foundations.

Our window into this early period of settlement in Northern Dutchess is Ancient Document #1656, a coroner's inquest on the body of Sylvanus Garlick and potentially the only surviving evidence of his existence.

How it began

On that fateful day in the middle of October, probably in peak leaf season, Garlick visited his friend Jacob Sornsborgh. Garlick's official purpose was to reclaim a milk cow that he had loaned to Sornsborgh, but it is highly likely that the two men shared some conversation over strong drink (the period term for hard alcohol) before Garlick began his journey home. Frans Neher, a neighbor, saw Garlick leading his cow along the road to his home later that day, and later testified that he thought Garlick was probably drunk. One can easily imagine the weaving gait of a man deep in his cups and over-

Neither Garlick nor his cow appeared on the evening of October 15, so the next morning neighbors began a search of the route between the Garlick and Sornsborgh houses. First they found the cow. Then they found Garlick's stone-cold corpse, with "a great holl in his head," which today's investigators would probably describe as a wound from blunt force trauma.

In accordance with period practice, the neighbors summoned the county coroner, who immediately formed a jury to investigate the affair, probably calling on the same men who had gone out to search for Garlick that morning. In these days before criminal scene investigators (CSI) or truly professional law enforcement officials of any kind, the jury had to conduct the investigation themselves. A careful walk over the scene revealed a blood trail leading back in the direction of Sornsborgh's house, with blood spots on stones and wood along the road.

## Accidental death ruling

Having seen the evidence firsthand, and after interviewing Neher, the jurors concluded that Garlick's death was an accident. Garlick had been intoxicated when he left Sonsborgh's home and had fallen somewhere along the route, smashing his head against a rock, piece of wood, or some other debris on the ground. Garlick then crawled some distance (unspecified)

before finally collapsing.

The chill temperatures of a mid-October night, back in the days when winter was much harsher than today, did the rest. Such accidental deaths were an infrequent, though not uncommon, feature of life in early Dutchess County, appearing with far greater frequency than murder. The land was largely undeveloped with people living at significant distances from one another, daily work was hard and unencumbered by OSHA regulations, and the climate and weather offered much greater challenges than the ones we face today. Sylvanus Garlick's unfortunate fate is a reminder of the many hurdles that past residents of Dutchess County have overcome to grant us the relatively comfortable lives we lead today.
