## Cavaccini announces candidacy for Wappinger Town Supervisor

**Supervisor Thurston says he will seek re-election**

Dutchess County Legislator Joseph D. Cavaccini announced his candidacy for the position of Town Supervisor of the Town of Wappinger on January 25. Following this announcement, Cavaccini went on to receive the Republican endorsement after a 29 - 5 vote of the Town of Wappinger Republican Committee.

In response to Cavaccini's announcement, current Town of Wappinger Supervisor Richard Thurston stated "1. I am seeking re-election. 2. I will primary Cavaccini in the June Primary for the Republican Party Line. 3. I am currently seeking endorsement of the Conservative Party. 4. I fully expect to be on the ballot in November."

According to a statement from Cavaccini's campaign, throughout his tenure, he has proven to be a transparent and accessible public official, communicating and engaging with dozens of residents each week. He has worked daily to preserve the quality of life of the residents of the Town and continues to look out for the best interests of those who live here. He has strongly supported, sponsored, and passed legislation that works on behalf of the taxpayer rather than against, lowered taxes, and brought back over \$1million in County grant funding to projects here in the Town of Wappinger. Locally, he has worked to promote innovative economic development by advocating to fill empty storefronts and eyesore plazas before building new malls. As the Chairman of the Dutchess County

Legislature's Environment Committee, he has had the honor to lead meetings on land use, including the preservation of our farmland and open spaces. Cavaccini has a proven 4-year voting record in support of small businesses, conscious development, first responders, and fiscal conservatism.

"I have continuously stood up against 'overdevelopment' that causes increased traffic and overcrowding in schools, in doing so we are protecting YOUR property values. In addition, we eliminated the County sales tax on clothing and footwear, temporarily suspended the gas tax, introduced legislation to offer tax exemptions for our veterans and volunteer firefighters, all while lowering property taxes each year," said Cavaccini.

"Our platform is simple, get projects accomplished that will work in the best interests of protecting the quality of life of those who live in Wappinger."

In preserving property values, Cavaccini said he is looking to limit the over-development of large housing projects in rural areas and work to revitalize hamlet centers and vacant retail to attract solid destinations.

Further, Cavaccini said he intends to improve management and fiscal responsibility by returning a strong managerial presence to Town Hall - ensuring that projects are accomplished on time and on budget, securing Union contracts consistently on time, and holding professionals accountable—protecting tax dollars. In doing this, Cavaccini anticipates to fur-

ther prioritize parks and infrastructure across the Town of Wappinger.

Legislator Cavaccini has served the Town of Wappinger for over a decade, starting with his appointment to the Office of the Town Historian, before being elected to the Dutchess County Legislature. The lifelong Wappinger resident has a background in public relations,

**Climate action program kicks off in nine municipalities**

*Editor's note: This is the first in a series of articles that will inform readers about Dutchess County's Climate Action Planning Institute (CAPI), an innovative 16-month program to identify and address ways for local governments to become more sustainable, involving County Government and selected towns and villages that were chosen to participate.*

Nine municipalities in Dutchess County are participating in the Climate Action Planning Institute (CAPI) to identify a path toward more sustainable local government operations. They include Dutchess County government; the cities of Beacon and Poughkeepsie; the towns of Amenia, Pleasant Valley, Poughkeepsie and Rhinebeck; and the villages of Rhinebeck and Wappingers Falls.

CAPI is a project of the Hudson Valley Regional Council (HVRC), an organization of county governments that provides a regional perspective, offers education and outreach, technical assistance, and advocacy to the communities it serves. The initiative is funded by the NYS DEC Climate Smart Communities Grant Program.

The Dutchess CAPI group had its first meeting on Jan. 18 at the Cornell Cooperative Extension Dutchess County site in Millbrook, and from all accounts the program is off to a promising start.

"I thought it was a productive first meeting," said CAPI Coordinator Mary Lambert, who made the kick-off presentation to the group. "There were representatives from all nine communities. They seemed engaged, asked good questions about climate action planning, and are excited to begin the process of charting and more actively managing greenhouse gas emissions in their municipalities."

Carla Castillo, HVRC's Interim Executive Director, added, "I was making the rounds [during Lambert's presentation]; as I walked around and spoke to the participants, [many of them] were saying to me that they were so thankful to have a process like this: streamlined, with relevant resources [made available to them],

## Wappingers Falls dedicates road to Lopez family

The Lopez family have been members of the Wappingers Falls community for decades. The family's original house was located on Franklindale Ave. It was home to Bernard Lopez and his wife Concetta Bannano Lopez. Ingalls St. was dedicated Lopez Way in Wappingers Falls during a ceremony on January 28.

Bernard emigrated from Lipari, Italy. Concetta emigrated from Messina in Sicily.

According to their grandson, Mark Lopez, the couple met in America. They married on March 15, 1915 and made their home in New Jersey. It was in the 1920s that they and their family, which would eventually consist of three daughters and five sons, moved to Wappingers Falls. At one point during the future decades, six of the eight siblings each built and lived in houses that were in a radius of half a mile from each other, noted Mark.

Mark said his family owned a farm in the area on Red Schoolhouse Road in Fishkill.



The couple's youngest son, Vincent (and Mark's father), still lives in Wappingers Falls.

"My father died when I was born. My mother raised all eight of us," said Vincent recently at his home in Wappingers Falls.

Concetta worked at The Bleachery in the Village when Bernard died in 1933. During the Great Depression, said Mark, the family had lost its farm on Red Schoolhouse Road.

Mark said Concetta "was not a big fan" of President Franklin Roosevelt

due to her sons serving in World War II.

According to the family, the four oldest brothers (Felix, Fred, Anthony and Joseph) served in the U.S. Army. Felix served in Africa. Fred served in Italy. Anthony was stationed in the Aleutian Islands. Joseph was deployed to Germany. During their time in the service, Anthony and Joseph were injured.

During that time, Vincent attended schools in the Wappingers district.

Asked what the Village looked like back then, Vincent replied, "Basically what it looks like today."

Vincent said as a child he would play "in the woods."

"We were all pretty good athletes,"

said Vincent, who noted he played basketball and football.

Vincent joined the U.S. Air Force, he said, because his older brothers were all in the military. He went to Poughkeepsie to join the service. He was sent to Albany then. He was then sent to San Antonio, Texas. "I never left [the area before]," said Vincent, adding he traveled as far away as Hyde Park and Arlington for basketball games. He was deployed to Okinawa and then Guam for a while.

When Vincent returned home, he married in his late 20s. He and his wife began a family of their own. Vincent and his siblings, said Mark, remained in the local area. They worked at IBM, Texaco and other businesses in the local area. Felix owned Lopez Oil and had customers from the local area. Felix would sell his business,

said Mark.

Vincent recalled he was in what the family believes was a photo-op with President Roosevelt when Vincent was a child. It was when FDR stopped by Wappingers Falls and Vincent was brought into the car with the president.

"I was standing there. One of the guys picked me up and handed me over," said Vincent.

Vincent has a photo op of his own as the sign to Lopez Way was dedicated at Ingalls St. on Jan. 28.

Village Clerk John Karge said he offered a few words during the ceremony on Saturday to the approximately 40 people in attendance.

Mark said, "I'm very honored that Wappingers chose to honor my father and his family. We will always consider Wappingers our home."

## Faust declares candidacy for Legislature 15 seat

Retired police officer Robert Faust officially announced his candidacy for Dutchess County's 15th Legislative District last week. Chris Rolison has announced he is running to represent the 23rd District in the County Legislature. The district includes parts of the towns of Pawling, Beekman, and East Fishkill.



## **Town of Wappinger Master Plan should remain intact, not be rewritten**

**To the Editor:**

Town Supervisor Richard Thurston submitted five articles to the Southern Dutchess News over this past summer advocating for the need for significant change of the Master Plan (Comprehensive Plan, Town of Wappinger adopted 2010). The Master Plan is a land use and infrastructure plan that sets forth local goals, objectives, and policies for community growth and/or redevelopment over the next 20-30 years.

In the Spring of 2003, the Town Board appointed a nonpartisan 26 member Comprehensive Plan Committee composed of residents of Wappinger, as well as members of the Town Board, Planning Board and Zoning Board of Appeals. In 2004, an extensive survey of 58 questions was sent to every household in the Town of Wappinger seeking the opinion of residents regarding the development of a new Comprehensive Plan. 10,000 surveys were mailed to Town of Wappinger residents and 2,500 residents responded. The survey asked residents to prioritize planning issues and identify the strengths and weaknesses of the Town. The plan took 6 years to be developed and adopted.

The Master Plan was designed to last 20 to 30 years. It is supposed to be reviewed (not rewritten) every 5 years. The Comprehensive Plan for the Town of Wappinger remains a vital working document for the Town of Wappinger.

I am alarmed when any small segment of the Town of Wappinger community attempts to substantially rewrite this plan without the same due diligence, extensive work and nonpartisan community input that went into our current Comprehensive Plan. My recommendation would be that the Plan would be reviewed, and updated information be submitted but that the plan would remain intact. It is a beautifully written and designed plan for the Town of Wappinger. If you would like to obtain a copy of the Master Plan, please contact the Town Clerk of the Town of Wappinger.

major electrical, plumbing or structural work is to be done to a building. Please see our Town website for additional information and/or call our Building Department at 845-297-6256.

- **Does Wappinger have town-wide pick-up of bulk rubbish and leaves?**

Unfortunately, we do not because of significant expense and liabilities and much tighter regulatory restrictions. We operate a Recycle Center & Transfer Station in the Town for residents to take their trash, debris, etc. It is located at 771 Sgt. Palmateer Way. An annual permit/fee is required. Please see our website under "Recycle Center" for further information.

- **What is Carnwath Farms?** Located on Wheeler Hill Road along the Hudson, Carnwath is a 99.7 acre protected open space and buildings owned by the Town.

The amazing Sports Museum of Dutchess County is located there. Throughout my administration, since January 2018, we have made numerous repairs and improvements including: repairs to roof and gutters of the chapel; interior work in the Chapel; repair to the Administration Building; establishing a neighborhood garden maintained by the Kolb family; preservation of the mansion roof until the Board makes a decision on its fate; authorization to contract for water installation to the Reese Cultural Center; and we kept it open throughout the covid pandemic. Originally, we had hoped to create a community/senior center there, but, as I have advised the Board and also advised our seniors, this will not happen because it is not convenient or appropriate to move our seniors out there. I have discussed other options with our seniors including possible major retrofit of current town hall space. # Teen is 'solving problems, one stitch at a time'

Gabriella Rado is a teen and the founder of the nonprofit Sew Kind. It was during 2020, when the 16-year-old student, at John F. Preparatory School in Westchester County, began sewing masks for healthcare workers, frontline workers, seniors and the medically compromised as the COVID-19 pandemic was raging across the world. During that time, the Town of Beekman resident made nearly a thousand masks to donate and give away.

Gabriella explained that her mother, Jeanine Agnolet-Rado, suggested "I sew for charity and make it official, so I created Sew Kind this past fall."

Gabriella stated, "I love the name Sew Kind, and I think it's pretty clear to people that our mission is to show kindness by sewing items that not only bring people joy and let them know we care but hopefully by making their lives a little bit easier with a clever design." The nonprofit's tagline is: "Solving Problems, One Stitch at a Time."

Agnolet-Rado said, "Gabriella has always helped people--hemming pants for an elderly neighbor or mending something for someone who couldn't afford to replace a piece of clothing--but she always refused to accept money. My daughter is very kind, which is how we came up with the name."

As the need for masks diminished, Gabriella decided to concentrate on sewing items that would make people happy. That is how Sew Kind was formed.

Sew Kind had donated fleece blankets to patients undergoing chemotherapy at Hudson Valley Cancer Center last week, said Agnolet-Rado. According to Gabriella and her mother, infusion centers are typically kept cool, and the chemotherapy that patients receive is

colder than their body temperature, so they get chilly. Cozy blankets were with a ribbon attached. This way each patient can tie them up easily and bring them back for return visits.

Gabriella said, "People are so thrilled when you give them something you've sewn with all your heart...it's really special to them, and it makes me feel great as well."

Sew Kind has another mission -- to teach.

"Sewing is really a lost art, and many people think that young people of our generation have no interest, but I don't believe that's true. I think many children would love to learn to sew but don't have the opportunity. They either don't have someone in their family to teach them or have the money to take lessons," Gabriella stated.

Gabriella will be holding sewing classes. "I am looking forward to beginning teaching next month at the Boys and Girls Club in Newburgh. Lessons will be weekly on Saturdays," she explained.

The teen, who will be applying to colleges next fall, has an interest in pursuing a career in possibly engineering and law.

"I never realized how much engineering goes into sewing. When people think of engineering, they tend to think of bridges and roadways, high-end cars and smartphones, but the reality is that sewing requires a similar thought process. You have to figure out how to solve a problem, come up with a design and a concept, and then build it. The only difference is you're dealing with fabric. Learning how to sew could really spark an interest in engineering for many children--as it did for me. Girls, in particular, are typically not groomed to think in this way," said Gabriella.

"Kindness is contagious as they say,

and It would be wonderful if, someday, Sew Kind could spread to other communities... but there's only one Gabriella, so she'll need to recruit other sewers to join her," said Agnolet-Rado

Sew Kind is looking to recruit veteran, experienced sewers to join the effort and step in to host classes on occasion. Sew

## Climate action program kicks off in nine municipalities

because there's so much out there, just looking at it is overwhelming."

"It was a chance for us all to be in the same room together," said Village of Rhinebeck Trustee Vanessa Bertozzi. "The program had been postponed by COVID for a couple of years now. For me it was great, because I was able to get our mayor [Gary Bassett] to come, our treasurer [Karen McLaughlin] and our superintendent of public works [Kyle Eighmy]. It shows we take it very seriously, and shows the [village] team why we're doing it and why it's important."

In addition, Michael Forlenza, who serves on the village's Climate Smart Task Force, was inspired to volunteer for the program.

During the 16-month program, the participants will examine municipal processes, infrastructure and ecosystems; plan ambitious but realistic targets and actions; make data-driven decisions; identify community needs, including those of vulnerable populations; and engage with residents and officials alike, to address the highest priority community issues.

As a starting point, a baseline inventory will be taken of each municipalities' greenhouse gas sources and emission levels.

"This program is really focused on the process of municipal greenhouse gas emissions management, creating a target emissions reduction goal and charting a course to reach that goal," Lambert said.

Bertozzi said, "We'll be gathering data from our Central Hudson bills, gas mileage, fuel oil that goes to heat municipal buildings [and more]. The information will be input to a software tool called ClearPath, developed by the International Council for Local Environmental Initiatives (ICLEI), and will be utilized to forecast models for lowering greenhouse gas emissions. This data will be presented to the local boards and residents.

Castillo said the greenhouse gas inventory will be powerful because the municipalities will be able to determine their "energy hogs" and develop a plan to address them.

"It will allow them to prioritize the buildings, the projects [that should take precedence], and many of these projects end up saving municipalities money," she said.

"That's where it gets kind of interesting,"

said Bertozzi, "when you start looking at those visualizations and create a plan on how you're going to achieve your goals."

Lambert noted that "cross collaboration is part of the goal of the program; discussion among cohort participants, comparing their greenhouse gas emissions by sector, will enable them to share learnings, ideas, and best practices."

HVRC will oversee the process and provide support to the participants as needed, along with partner organization ICLEI, Local Governments for Sustainability, a global network of more than 2,500 local and regional governments committed to sustainable development. The CAPI cohort will meet with Lambert and Castillo 11 more times over the next 15 months; in addition, the municipalities will hold their own meetings, brainstorm solutions, seek input from their boards and the public and, ultimately, create their individual Government Operations Climate Action Plans.

It's ambitious, to say the least, but individuals like Bertozzi have the commitment to follow through. Her personal story highlights the need for action.

"I had been living in Red Hook, Brooklyn, and had a new baby; I was a first-time Mom. Hurricane Sandy hit, we had to evacuate, and that was really terrifying," she said. "I had a moment [where I realized] this is not a fluke, it's the new normal. Once the veils are lifted, you can't un-see what's happening."

When Bertozzi and her family moved to Rhinebeck a few years later, she wanted to be involved in her local community and "really make a difference." She began volunteering on climate-change programs, and then Mayor Gary Bassett encouraged her to run for office, and she was elected as trustee. As the Village's environmental specialist, Bertozzi is the Climate Smart Communities Task Force Coordinator.

"The good news is ... you can not only do better for the environment, but it's also a cost savings," Bertozzi said. There will be some up-front costs involved, she said, but those will pay off in the long run. "The other good news is that the federal and state government are earmarking a lot of funding to make this transition."

Castillo said this work model has the potential for "future opportunities

for collaboration."

"[The participants will be] able to see eye-to-eye and be able to learn from each other," she said. "Even a county will invariably have some similarities with a village when you look at energy use data."

Lambert added that there may be "future opportunities for grants and other funding mechanisms based on the work completed. We're constantly thinking about bringing grant opportunities to our members."

Castillo said "CAPI 1.0" was launched in 2017-2018. That NYSERDA-funded pilot program was mostly comprised of Ulster County municipalities along with one from Putnam and one from Dutchess, and focused solely on the greenhouse gas inventory. This led to the DEC-funded grant for Dutchess CAPI from the Climate Smart Communities (CSC) Grant Program. The CSC program is aimed at greenhouse gas reductions and savings increases through specific Pledge Element Actions. Communities that complete enough actions can then become

CSC-certified and qualify for potential DEC funding.

"We were finding that a lot of municipalities wanted to [become certified]," Castillo said.

"We're very excited that CAPI is under way," said Castillo. "The Mid Hudson, as you know, is a hotbed of sustainability, and this work is really valuable." It prompts residents to take notice that their local governments are "maintaining their own house, and it sets a really positive precedent and gets the community to consider their own [energy-saving efforts]."

"The leadership from these municipalities is exciting to see," Lambert said, adding that it "underscores the momentum" in the Hudson Valley for taking action on climate change. "These folks are embarking on some challenging but really important work. I'm truly inspired by them."


## Frank Joseph Roberts


## Crocifissa G. Mucci



# Candied bacon

A delectable, decadent and, most likely, an occasional treat

How have I not shared candied bacon with you yet?!? Seems a random question, I know, but here we are in prime comfort food season, and me, just having gone through my recipes to find things to bring to four (!) separate work-related parties, seeing everyone's favorite pig candy recipe and slowly realizing my colleagues were about to have it again, but I've left you quite in the dark for years! That just isn't right and, well, I'm about to atone for such a slight.

For those who have not yet discovered the unabashed joy that is candied bacon, I think I'm about to rock your world (though there really can't be many of you out there, unless you're just not that into bacon and then I feel a little sorry for you). To each their own, and more for the rest of us). All you need to find yourself in hog heaven is bacon, brown sugar and black pepper, though, to be honest, you don't need the pepper but, before you say it, you most certainly do need the other two! Read on and never doubt again.

Here's what happens when you slather bacon with brown sugar: at first, nothing, but then, when you bake it? Pure magic, that's what! The bacon gets hot, the sugar melts, then caramelizes, mixing with the hot bacon grease and spreading itself into the sweetest dark golden-brown smoky coat on each slice. It crisps as it cools just enough to be easily picked up and shoved into your face demurely eaten, because we're not savages and we know how to savor a good thing.

So why don't we make it all the time then if it's so easy and so good? First of all, I never said it was easy (it is) and it's better than just good, waaaaay better, so I get why you're asking. I'm no doctor and since I also don't play one on TV, I'd hardly be an expert here; but it's probably safe to say that it may not be the healthiest thing to eat every day. Best then, perhaps, to leave it for weekends or occasional occasions.

So far we've established a few things. 1: I kept something life-changing from you, 2: bacon just rocks, 3: you don't need many ingredients, 4: I'm stalling because I still haven't disclosed the magical secrets for making it all happen. Let's

remedy that now in the hope that you can forgive me.

I did not invent this concept of brown sugar + bacon + heat = Amazing, and I do not know who did, but they should have a commemorative plaque somewhere or maybe a statue, which I'd be on board with starting a petition to get done. In fact, there are so many essentially the same recipes out there for such a simple thing that if they were taken off the internet tomorrow it would free up enough memory to maybe help me remember all the things I've forgotten. Like not having shared this with you before which, I promise you, I am actually going to do riiiiight....now!

Sorry, not quite! A couple things first. Greasy bacon and sticky burnt sugar can be messy and might result in smoke billowing from your oven and the lingering aroma of badly burnt sugar in your hair, on your clothes and greeting you when you walk in the door for a few days. I'm going to try to set you up so that doesn't happen, but it had to be said (and it still happens to me sometimes).

Second, some recipes call for thick-sliced bacon (this one doesn't), which I have used, and is fine. It just takes longer to cook, and I like my bacon candy sooner rather than later, as well as on the crispish side, thank you very much. Speaking to that, remember that it will crisp up as it cools, so it may take some practice to get it just the way you like it.

And one more: most recipes out there say to lay bacon strips on a baking rack set atop a parchment-lined baking sheet, which works really well because the strips aren't sitting in the grease drippings. The one I'm sharing here omits the rack so there's a lot less mess to clean up (think scrubbing a wire rack free of baked on sugar) and you'll get nice flat pieces, but you'll want to transfer the bacon from the greasy pan to a rack or paper towel-lined plate a few minutes after taking out of the oven.

### CANDIED BACON (ready or not!)

No special equipment here, but you will need some baking sheets. Parchment paper is also a must. And I'm thinkin' you'll want some foil, too, for easy

clean up.

### INGREDIENTS

1 pkg (12-16oz) bacon (not thick-cut)  
Brown sugar (dark or light), about 1/2 cup  
Freshly ground black pepper

### METHOD

Move oven rack to center position. Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Cover a baking sheet (or 2) with foil. Line with a sheet of parchment paper.

Lay strips of bacon on parchment. Sprinkle each pretty generously with brown sugar, press into bacon, gently flip over and repeat. Sprinkle with black pepper and any leftover sugar. Arrange slices so they are close but not touching. Try to leave about 1/2-inch of space from edges of pan.

Top bacon with another piece of parchment, right to the edges and covering all the slices. Top with second baking sheet.

Bake 20 minutes. Check bacon. It goes from almost done to burned pretty quickly. It should be golden brown. Flip

slices, replace parchment and top sheet. Rotate baking sheet and cook for another 15 minutes, which should be enough.

If this sounds better-than-good to you, what are you waiting for? After all, I made you wait long enough. Make it for a few or a crowd or you all by your lonesome because no one would ever think to judge you when it's bacon. Sweet, savory, salty, spicy, smoky, scrumptious and, I hope, worth waiting for. Enjoy!



negative thinking, loss of control and mainly fear.

# The Wild Garden Project

**Excitement abounds with news of a long-awaited addition to Bellefield's landscape in Hyde Park.**

It's happening! – The Wild Garden at Bellefield – thanks to a generous donation by Hudson Valley native Bob Ouimette. "The Wild Garden" is a project initiated by Anne Symmes, former director of the Beatrix Farrand Garden Association, to realize the vision of pioneering landscape gardener Beatrix Farrand. On the drawing board for the past 10 years, new funding and support from the National Park Service have pushed the project to the front burner.

Beatrix Farrand (1872-1959) was a charter member of the American Society of Landscape Architects, having studied with Harvard botany professor Charles Sargent at his home. She went on to champion the informal cottage gardens or mixed flower borders pioneered by William Robinson in his seminal 1870 book "The Wild Garden." Farrand incorporated these designs into more than 110 commissions, including work for John D. Rockefeller, Stephan Harkness, Princeton University, and most famously, at Dumbarton Oaks garden in Washington, D.C.

In 1911, Farrand designed a garden at Bellefield, the estate of Senator Thomas and Sarah Newbold in Hyde Park – a private walled garden attached to the Newbold house. The plan called for a "wild garden" outside the walls, incorporating Farand's favorite native plants. For some reason, the wild garden was never completed, and the more formal interior garden eventually fell into disrepair.

In 1993, an intrepid team of garden enthusiasts, including my mom Doris Adams, founded the Beatrix Farrand Garden Association, with a mission to restore the 20 X 60 foot garden inside the walls, referencing historic photos and examples from Farrand's nearby gardens. The result is a stunning display of perfectly composed borders set off by vine-traced walls and clipped hemlock hedges, open to the public 7 a.m.-dusk every day, adjacent to the Franklin D. Roosevelt National Historic Site.

When I heard about the jump start to the Wild Garden Project, I immediately called Bob Ouimette, who happens to be a friend, even though we hadn't spoken since we graduated from Arlington High School 55 years ago. In addition to his initial generous donation, Bob set up a \$25,000 challenge matching fund, which should go quite a ways toward realizing the total goal of \$150,000.

Bob is a former corporate attorney

living in Manhattan. He got interested in historical preservation, working as a trustee at The Mount, novelist Edith Wharton's restored home in Lenox, Massachusetts. Beatrix Farrand was Wharton's niece, so Bob was excited to learn about the Wild Garden Project happening in his home town. Last fall, he visited Bellefield and was bowled over by the staff's enthusiasm and the "significance" of Farrand's contribution to the gardening profession.

"How can I help?" he asked.

"Hmm, let me think," replied Bellefield's horticulturist Karen Waltuch.

I sat down with Karen and program director Chris Zumtobel last Tuesday at the National Park Service office in the Newbold House next to the Bellefield Garden. The room was crackling with enthusiasm. Volunteers are already eager to get started, as soon as the ground dries out, including the Park Service itself, with their heavy equipment, as well as Heather Whitefield, the iconic, award-winning landscape designer and her crew from Organic Matters. A troop of Eagle scouts will also be helping out. Karen and Chris hope to beef up the in-house crew of 15 volunteers to maybe 30.

A "wild garden" is not exactly a "wild-flower garden," although it uses mostly native species. "Wild" refers to the design – informal, as though it just grew, without the weeds. Farrand's original plan placed the wild garden outside the walls. When completed, this will serve as an invitation to visitors at the F.D.R. Estate to explore Bellefield, which will be connected by a path leading from the Wallace Center.

Witch Hazel, Fothergilla, Sweet Fern (comptonia) and Serviceberry are scheduled for the first phase of the wild garden. Also, Farrand's favorites – Paw Paw and Cucumber magnolia. Ferns will fill in the spaces around the trees until phase two gets under way with native flowers.

Let's all get together to support the Wild Garden at Bellefield. Google Beatrix Farrand Garden at Bellefield for more information.



The event will be held in the Henry A. Wallace Center at the FDR Presidential Library and Home and streamed live to the official FDR Library YouTube, Twitter and Facebook accounts. As Adolf Hitler's Nazi armies threatened Europe, Democratic President Franklin D. Roosevelt urged a divided America to mobilize to defend democracy and freedom. Many Republicans accused FDR of leading the nation needlessly into war and demanded that America remain neutral. On June 20, 1940, FDR shocked the country by announcing that two prominent Republicans would take posts in his cabinet. Henry Stimson, former President Herbert Hoover's secretary of state, became secretary of war, and Frank Knox, the Republican vice-presidential candidate in 1936, became secretary of the Navy.

Roosevelt intended the appointments to build national unity. But building a coalition across party lines was a risky move that could have backfired politically. It also placed a bipartisan relationship at the center of America's confrontation with global fascism. FDR's Republican allies went on to play critical roles in leading the war effort, and many bills passed Congress during the war years with strong backing from both parties. Following Roosevelt's death, Stimson continued to champion bipartisanship under President Truman in the closing chapter of the war.

"Uniting America" tells the story of

how this alliance stands as an historic example of united leadership in a nation scarred by political division.

Peter Shinkle worked for 19 years as a reporter at various news organizations, including most recently the St. Louis Post-Dispatch. He covered the federal court system and wrote investigative stories on subjects ranging from improper disposal of radioactive waste to contamination spread by a lead mining company. He is the author of "Ike's Mystery Man: The Secret Lives of Robert Cutler."






