Licari announces candidacy for Wappinger Town Supervisor

Town of Wappinger Democratic Chairperson, Robin Licari announced her candidacy for Town Supervisor on Feb. 21. Licari received the Democratic endorsement by a unanimous vote by the Town of Wappinger Democratic Committee.

According to a statement from Licari's campaign, she wants to give a voice to the residents of the Town. She wants people of all political parties to be able to participate in their local government.

Her priorities are clean water and protecting our wells. She wants to protect the wetlands, wetland buffers and water sheds that filter and fill our wells. She also expresses her concerns regarding the continuing gas spills in the Town. She will support zoning laws that seek to prevent contamination of the wells.

Licari would not accept political donations from companies with current business before the Town Board or companies employed by the Town Board.

Licari recognizes the contribution of residents who have paid their taxes and are good neighbors. Areas currently zoned as single family residential should not be altered. "I want to encourage developers to build the kind of homes that are needed in our community (homes for seniors, homes for first time buyers) versus developers building homes that are too expensive for the residents of Wappinger to buy."

Licari has lived in Dutchess County all her life and in Wappinger for 25 years. She has seen many of her friends retire and move out of New York State. It is important to keep Wappinger affordable and not to increase the Town tax rate.

Licari wants to develop a practical and

realistic plan for the 99 acre, Carnwath Farms Town Park. This park is rapidly deteriorating. "We must develop a realistic plan for this scenic property overlooking the Hudson River".

St. Patrick's Day Parade to step off Saturday in Wappingers Falls

Beale grand marshal of annual event

He was always behind the scenes.

Now, William "Bill" Holohan Beale will get to see what it's like to lead one of Dutchess County's, biggest events from the front.

Beale is as recognizable a name as there is in Dutchess County for his work on the radio with K104, with the county as the Director of Emergency Management, and as a Town of Wappinger councilman. Beale will be this year's grand marshal of the 2023 Saint Patrick's Day Parade in the village of Wappingers Falls on March 4 at 1 p.m.

"Bill is part of the fabric of Dutchess County," said Jack Fedigan, a former grand marshal himself and now one of the committee members for the parade. "He's done so much for this parade, that it was a no brainer."

Indeed, Beale has done copious amounts of work on behalf of the parade, including the MC of the Emerald Ball, which is held about a week before the event. Beale has been the parade's Master of Ceremonies for the past 25 years.

"We figured we'd give him off from that this year," Fedigan quipped.

Instead, another local radio personality, Joe Daily, hosted the ball on Feb. 18.

"Billy does a lot for the Irish community and does a lot for the county in general," Fedigan remarked.

Beale, 46, is a hometown guy with roots deep in Dutchess County. He grew up in the town of Wappinger and went to schools in the Wappingers Central School District. He even graduated from Marist College in the town of Poughkeepsie. Beale and his wife, Erin, have two sons, Liam and Sean. Beale's

father, John Beale, has deep and long connections to the parade.

"I like to say that his father married a Holohan," Fedigan said, "So, Billy is Irish through and through." Scholarships are awarded in honor of Beale's mother, Katherine Holohan Beale, by the parade committee.



County GOP endorses Serino for County Executive

Beale said, "This incredible honor means so much to me, having been involved with this gala parade since its inception and serving as its Master of Ceremonies for the past 25 years. I take great pride in my Irish roots and this parade has truly been a family affair for decades. As many know, my late mother had a passion for all things Irish, loved visiting the motherland – Ireland, and couldn't get enough of this parade! She spent many years co-chairing the committee's Emerald Ball with her sister Trish Holohan-Costello, and was very involved in the annual scholarship awards. Traffic alert for Saturday's parade

The annual Dutchess County Saint Patrick's Parade will be held on March 4 at 1 p.m. in the Village of Wappingers Falls.

Route 9D roadway from Middlebush Road to Delavergne Avenue will be closed starting at 12:30 p.m.

The parade can last for several hours so local officials expect roadway closure for some time. Village side streets along Route 9D will be closed and congested with high volumes of traffic. It is advised to alternate routes during that time.

Dear Friends & Supporters of Save Hughsonville,

First, thank you so very much for sticking with us to save the corner of Route 9D and County Route 28 in Historic Hughsonville, we know it is a lengthy process.

Last week the court, with a newly assigned judge, requested that the lawyers brief the court on the case status. Very late in the day on Friday the 10th, the opposition's lawyer submitted a request for a hearing to impose a discretionary bond, because the temporary restraining order placed on the project last fall was supposedly having an economic impact on them. As you can imagine, the number was large - with the risk that if we lose the case, a large amount of money would have to be paid to the property owners to compensate them for their losses, potentially reaching back to the date the court entered the restraining order (October 17, 2022). We countered with a proposal that would allow them to remove the derelict buildings and begin cleaning up the property while we wait for the court to decide the two Article 78 lawsuits challenging the project land use approvals on the merits. A new opposition lawyer from Connecticut was introduced into the mix and our proposal was rejected summarily, and the opposition requested that the court proceed with scheduling an immediate hearing on the bond.

Our counsel feels that the court is nearing the time that they will make a decision on the article 78 lawsuits, and to reduce the risk to us, recommended that the temporary restraining order (TRO) be dropped at this time.

What does that mean? It means that the property owner can begin demolition of the buildings on the property, remove trees etc AND begin building the project... at their own risk. This means that if the court finds in our favor, the property owner will have to remove any new buildings or infrastructure that the court deems not allowed and restore the property to its prior condition at their sole expense.

This was a very difficult decision to make, but since the property owner does have the right to remove buildings and trees on their property no matter what future use of the property.

We know that as activity begins on the property, it will make us all very sad to see large trees that have watched over the Hughsonville Hamlet for so many years be reduced to wood chips and a Victorian house that has proudly stood on the corner in Hughsonville for over 150 years be removed, reducing very needed housing. Please remember the town officials who enabled this to happen and continue to remind them of who they should be representing and whose interests need to be protected.

Please continue to support us as we and the legal team continue to push forward on ensuring that our hamlet is not further violated.

Bees, birds, healthy soil need protection from toxic neonic pesticides

To the Editor:

Thirty years ago, when I joined the Biology faculty at Vassar College, flowering plants and trees decorated by floating butterflies and bees hummed in the spring. Now, with the surge in use of toxic neonicotinoid pesticides on farms and home gardens, a dramatic shift has occurred. It's clear to see that there are far fewer pollinators and butterflies visiting the local flora.

When seeds (like corn, wheat, soybean) are coated with neonics, the poison distributes throughout the growing plant and cannot be washed off. Neonics are extremely potent poisons to all insects, including honeybees and butterflies. They persist for weeks in the environment and are responsible for the collapse of pollinator populations. Neonics also threaten other wildlife and human health.

Insects aren't the only casualties of these poisons. I conducted research with a partner biologist at Marist College in 2020 which led to the surprising discovery that minute amounts of a household neonic-containing pesticide wreaked havoc on tiny soil organisms called nematodes—essential composting critters that make the soil healthy and rich, benefitting agriculture.

Lawmakers in Albany have the opportunity to save our pollinators and wildlife by passing the Birds and Bees Protection Act (S1856-Hoyleman-Sigal). Banning the unnecessary use of neonic-coated seeds on NY farms, gardens, and lawns will make our neighborhoods and outdoor spaces safer for all of us.

And, one day, we might again hear our trees and gardens hum with bees in the spring and summer. Please urge your NY senator and assemblymembers to support this bill.

CAMO to flush hydrants in Wappinger

Residents of the United Wappinger Water District East of All Angels Hill Rd., including the Royal Ridge Development, in the Town of Wappinger are being advised to limit water use.

CAMO Pollution Control, Inc. will be flushing hydrants between the hours of 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. beginning Monday, March 6th through Friday, March 31.

During the flushing, residents may experience erratic water pressure and turbid water conditions. This condition will only be temporary. According to CAMO, at all times the water will meet satisfactory sanitary quality. The flushing will bring about long-term improvements in water quality.

Residents advised to take precautions and avoid encounters with coyotes

The Dutchess County Department of Behavioral & Community Health (DBCH) continues to advise residents to be aware of continued reports of coyotes exhibiting bold/aggressive behavior in the Towns of Poughkeepsie and Hyde Park, notably in areas just north of the Mid-Hudson Bridge to the Hyde Park Drive-In Theater, as well as the City of Poughkeepsie.

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYS DEC) has determined that these behaviors are consistent with coyotes being fed intentionally or unintentionally, creating an increase in coyote encounters. Residents should not leave out food (including for pets) or otherwise attempt to feed coyotes or other animals outdoors.

Additionally, the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYS DEC) coyote conflict guidance advises that January through March is the breeding season for coyotes in New York State. Pup-rearing season extends beyond that into the summer. Coyotes are more territorial during this period and there are increased risks for conflicts.

DBCH reminds residents to avoid contact with wild animals. Do not approach!

The NYS DEC recommends the following precautions:

- DO NOT approach or have contact with wild animals, as they may be rabid.
- Do not feed coyotes.
- Make garbage inaccessible.
- Remove outside food sources including pet food and bird seed. Pet food and

garbage attract coyotes and other wildlife, including rodents, and increase risks to people and pets.

- Be alert of your surroundings and take precautions such as carrying a flashlight or a walking stick to deter coyotes.
- Be mindful of children and pets while outdoors. Do not let pets run free.
- Do not allow coyotes to approach people or pets. If you see a coyote, be aggressive in your behavior: stand tall and hold your arms up or out to look as large as possible. If a coyote lingers for too long, make loud noises, wave your arms and throw sticks and stones.

Report coyotes exhibiting bold behaviors (approaching people for food, attacking leashed pets with owners, chasing joggers or bikers, etc.) or repeatedly seen during the daytime in a human-populated area or near residences to the NYS DEC Bureau of Wildlife at 845-256-3098. Please note that seeing a coyote occasionally is not evidence of bold behavior.

Residents should contact their local police department in the case of an emergency.

If there is any physical contact between a coyote and a person or pet, report the incident to DBCH as soon as possible at: 845-486-3404 Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. 845-431-6465 on nights/weekends/holidays.

Diverse cultural heritage brings community together

Our Wappinger community is blessed by its tremendous cultural diversity. This diversity imparts countless values from generation to generation. In so doing, our way of life benefits immeasurably from their customs, social standards and traditions. In today's column I focus on several cultural contributions to our amazing community.

I. Our Irish Heritage. Wappinger's Irish ancestors have left and continue to leave indelible marks on our culture and community. In Dutchess County the Irish are the second largest ancestral group. Recognizing their contributions each year for the past 27 years, the Dutchess County Saint Patrick's Parade has been held, rain, snow or shine. This coming Saturday, March 4th, the 28th Annual Saint Patrick's Parade will step off at 1 p.m. at the Wappingers Rural Cemetery. From its start, it will proceed through the Village of Wappingers Falls along Main Street. This year, the Parade Committee honors William Holohan Beale as the Parade's grand marshal, recognizing his outstanding ongoing contributions to our community and especially to the annual parade.

III. An Important Historical Event in the History of Our Puerto Rican Residents. The number of our Hispanic and Latino residents in Dutchess County has grown significantly during the past two decades. Among the largest ethnic groups are those of Puerto Rican nationality. An important date in the history of Puerto Ricans occurs on March 2nd. On March 2, the Jones-Shafroth Act (also known as the Jones Act of Puerto Rico, Jones Law of Puerto Rico, or as the Puerto Rican Federal Relations Act of 1917) was signed by President Woodrow Wilson. Although the Act created or continued some inequalities, it is noted most for the fact that it granted U.S. citizenship to anyone born in Puerto Rico on or after April 11, 1899. It also created a two-house legislature and established a bill of rights for Puerto Ricans. Ultimately, it paved the way for an independently elected governor and Puerto Rico's own constitution. Most significant for New York City and Dutchess County, it enabled the migration of Puerto Rican residents to the U.S. mainland. Without such a law, we would not enjoy many friendships and benefits derived from our residents of Puerto Rican origin.

Free tax preparation for Dutchess, Orange, Putnam residents from Hudson Valley CA\$H Coalition, AARP Foundation

Hudson Valley residents who need help with their tax returns can receive free tax preparation from AARP Foundation Tax-Aide's IRS trained and certified volunteers through the Hudson Valley CA\$H Coalition. Last year, 4,218 residents of Dutchess, Orange, and Putnam Counties received help preparing and filing their taxes. This year with volunteers both tenured and new, they hope to assist close to 8,000 individuals, seniors, and families file their tax returns.

To receive help, it's as easy as picking up the phone and dialing 2-1-1 to schedule an appointment through United Way's Hudson Valley Region 2-1-1 Helpline (or by dialing 1-800-899-1479) from 9am to 4pm Monday through Friday. A call specialist will review eligibility, make an appointment, and provide directions to the appropriate tax site. This free tax preparation service is provided to all those who are eligible by AARP Foundation Tax-Aide, Hudson Valley CA\$H Coalition members, United Way of the Dutchess-Orange Region, Community Action Partnership for Dutchess County and many other community partners.

"Last year, \$5.4 million was returned in the form of tax credits and refunds to people who need it most in our community," noted Jeannie Montano, President, and CEO of United Way of the Dutchess-Orange Region. "Part of the mission of United Way is fighting for the financial stability of every person in our community. We hope that individuals, families, and seniors will take advantage of this free

help and call 2-1-1 to schedule an appointment."

Photography exhibit set for opening night in Beacon March 4

"Uncontaminated Sound: Reflections" will take place at the Howland Cultural Center, 477 Main St., in Beacon on March 4. The show will highlight years of music, comedy, and dance archives from photographer and local resident Robert Lundberg. The show will be up at the Howland for six weeks.

Asked what people who can attend expect, Lundberg replied via email, "This is a question I've been struggling with over the expanse of these previous weeks of production. The internalized "my hopes, wants, and expectations" versus the reality of experience. An experience in which, I've been waiting to bring to fruition for about a year and a half or so." He continued, "However, pulling from my archives from 2017-present I want visitors to immerse themselves within this crazy narrative that has been my life since NY took hold of me. These unique moments and interactions with cultural makers of all calibers brought forth in a stream of consciousness presentation, spanning over a half decade."

Lundberg explained, "To add another element to the somewhat 63 or so images, visitors who attend the opening night will experience two special performances by singer-

song writers Jeffrey Lewis and Indigo Sparke. In short, visitors can expect a dynamic range of imagery paired with musical immersion during the opening March 4th."

Lundberg said he has "always been a keen observer of my surroundings, but it wasn't until I made the move from Boston to Brooklyn that I picked up the camera for serious endeavors." He explained, "Being in a new city with tons of visual stimuli, I started immersing myself in this new environment and its culture, the camera was the best tool to record my experiences. That was late 2016. Due to a few fortuitous interactions in 2017, I was off in running taking on music assignments for Paste Magazine and showing my first image in Chelsea that same year. So, now it's been about 5 or 6 years of photographic work, wow time honestly flies."

Asked how he would describe his technique when capturing his subjects, Lundberg responded, "To be honest, I've never really articulated my process too much, as I've always just dove into creating. However, to give a bit of insight into my ethos when creating images with the lens there are actually a few underlying structural rules I attempt to apply. For instance, generally from the start I've attempted to strictly use natural or avail-

able light sources, as I find it more interesting on a technical level to adjust to the residing light sources that exist on location. Which lends itself towards the naturalistic, raw, and real output I seek within my work."

He noted, "Conversely, there have been a few occurrences in which I had to use external lighting or flash, as in such scenarios the environment was basically pitch black. Additionally, I tend to always seek out deep shadows and blacks, I guess in ode to noir films and cinema in general."

As far as his thoughts about the upcoming show at the Howland, Lundberg said, "I'll tell you one thing, after the opening I hope to catch up on much-needed sleep. However, it's been an honor to work with the Howland Cultural Center and I'm super excited to see my work live in such a beautiful and unique space. The challenge has been how do I present my visual narrative and my vision of the work within the provided physical space ie: a sectional (bookcase style) gallery as the Howland of course was a library in its previous life."

He said, "All in all, I'm both elated and a bit nervous to show this "work" that has taken hold of my early to mid-thirties. In comparison, it's like opening up my personal visual journal of this past half decade to





the general public. With this, there's a lingering tension between vulnerability and the need to show this "extension of self" that won't dissipate, until everything comes to fruition. It's both a surreal and an intangible feeling at this point, though once I see all the pieces hung and the night kicks off, I intend to soak in the moment and just try to enjoy this special opportunity."

Javits Center's Rooftop Garden

New York City legislators get a lesson in urban agriculture

"Don't try to steal an apple from this orchard," warned Liz Morrow. "We've installed 3,000 security cameras." That's 79 cameras per tree – 32 apple and 6 pear trees.

This orchard is on the roof of the Jacob K. Javits Center in Manhattan, built in 1986 on top of the Lincoln Tunnel and covering a massive 3 million square foot space. In 2021, a new addition added another million square feet of event space, and as part of its LEED gold certification, a "green roof" and a rooftop farm. (L.E.E.D. Stands for Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design).

New York Farm Bureau members toured the roof during our trip to educate New York City legislators about farming issues. Urban agriculture is trending right now, and it better be, since if these city politicians keep throwing roadblocks (in some cases, literally) to upstate farmers, all their food will have to be grown in the five boroughs.

And they're off to a good start. The farm on top of the Javits Center produced 40,000 pounds of produce last year, 100 pounds of honey from their nine beehives, and ten bushels of apples. (The pears didn't work out). The beehives are home to a total of a million bees. Our guide Liz Morrow gave each of the visitors a small jar of Javits Center honey, supposedly organic, but who knows where those bees get their nectar. The farm is managed by an outfit called Brooklyn Grange, which runs other rooftop farms, including one in Long Island City where Sue and I enjoyed

a home-grown dinner ten years ago.

The farm at the Javits Center covers one acre, on 18 inches of "soil," plus the orchard with three feet of "soil" - actually lightweight perlite and peat moss mix.

The rooftop harvest includes lots of leafy greens, plus carrots, beets, tomatoes, cucumbers, even melons. Some of the vegetables are pickled for off-season consumption. Of course, nothing was growing during our February visit, except for a gorgeous stand of redcross butterhead lettuce in the rooftop greenhouse.

The green roof covers an additional seven acres, planted with perennial sedum. Fifty species of birds and three of bats call the green roof home. Seven million gallons of rainwater is absorbed by the roof instead of running into the storm sewers. You can watch activity on the roof through a live camera – google "Javits center green roof." You can also book tours of the roof and the farm.

Our group met with Quiana Mickie, director of the brand new Mayor's Office of Urban Agriculture. Quiana is in charge of 600 community gardens throughout the five boroughs plus lots of small rooftop green spaces. Her first job is to put together an ag report of all the food produced in the city. My guess is that it won't be enough to feed eight million people.

But it's a start.
