The annual St. Patrick's Day Parade in Dutchess County is back after being virtual last year due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The parade line up begins at noon and steps off in the village of Wappingers Falls on March 5th at 1 p.m. Retired Wappingers Central School District principal Joseph "Joe" Corrigan will be 2022 St. Patrick's Day Parade grand marshal.

"I think it will be a good time," said Gene Noone, who is the chairman of the parade. He said the parade will bring "enthusiasm" and a positive outlook for the future.

There will be almost a dozen bands and

3 to 4,000 marchers, according to Noone.

There will be several new police departments coming down to honor late Dutchess County Sheriff Adrian "Butch" Anderson, said Noone.

Jack Fedigan, a member of the parade committee, noted that Anderson "participated in this parade since parade 1." Fedigan added that there will be a moment of silence for Anderson, Eileen Sassman, a past grand marshal and village of Wappingers Falls resident, and James "Jimmy" Sweeney. Sweeney was a former zone sergeant with State Police Troop K. He died in March of 2021 due to

illnesses related to his Ground Zero assignment in 2001. Sweeney was 68.

Grand Marshal Corrigan was an educator for more than 34 years. He was a teacher and principal at local junior and senior high schools, as well as an assistant superintendent of schools.

"There were probably a lot more people who fill the bill better than I did," said Corrigan. He noted he is "appreciative" of the honor.

Corrigan was an interim principal for the Wappingers Central School District at Myers Corners, James Evans and Vassar Road elementary schools. He was named

County officials seek changes to bail reform

On a quiet Sunday afternoon, Dutchess County Acting Sheriff Kirk Imperati was in a contemplative mood.

Just three days earlier, Imperati had joined other county and state officials at a press conference to implore New York Governor Kathy Hochul and members of the New York State Legislature to reform the state's two-year old bail reform system.

But he emphasized that this was less about political rhetoric and a complete overhaul of the system as it was about asking state leaders to do one thing.

Listen.

As politicians and district attorneys and members of the media bat around bail reform like a pinata, Imperati just wants the voices of the people fighting crime on the street – the police – to be heard.

"What we wanted to do is just have our local leaders and the governor's office and the state Assembly and Senate to listen to some of the concerns of law enforcement," Imperati told the Southern Dutchess News on Sunday. "We wanted to discuss some of the unintended consequences of bail reform. We take an oath to uphold the law, and it's hard to do that with this bail reform."

New legal rules regarding a cashless bail system and rules of discovery were adopted in 2019 and implemented in 2020. The rules eliminated cash bail for suspects facing most

COVID-19 update

Gov. Hochul ends school mask mandate

For the first time in a year-and-a-half, students and staff at New York schools can attend classes without having to wear a face mask.

Gov. Kathy Hochul made the announcement on Sunday, calling it a seminal moment in the fight against the COVID-19 pandemic as positive cases in the state and throughout much of the country have dropped precipitously in the last month.

"I always had that sense (that) if we stick with the experts and the data, and let that be our guide, and not let criticism and politics intervene in this decision-making, we'll end up in the right place," Hochul said at a

briefing. "And that is why I feel very confident that this is the time to lift the mask requirement."

Beginning Wednesday, March 2, masks are now optional. Students and staff can still wear a mask at their discretion, but it is no longer mandatory – meaning, for instance, that for some sophomores it will be their first time in high school without having to wear the face covering.

"Dutchess County has pressed the Governor to end use of emergency powers," Dutchess County Executive Marc Molinaro said in a statement. "We welcome the end to mask requirements for our children later this week – and will take no action to

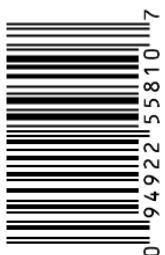
State landmarks lit in blue and yellow to mark solidarity with Ukrainians

“Outstanding Principal” by a local paper during his tenures as Wappingers Junior High School and John Jay High school principal.

It was noted by the St. Patrick’s Day Parade Committee, “Joe is a proud advocate of his Irish heritage. On each St. Patrick’s Day, Joe would greet his students appropriately attired with the ‘wearing of the green.’ He would then serenade them over the school’s PA system, with a traditional Irish lullaby. misdemeanor and non-violent felony charges.

But in the minds of many, it hasn't played out that way and has divided party lines even further between Liberals and Conservatives.

Imperati, Dutchess County Executive Marc Molinaro, New York State Senator Sue Serino, County Legislature Chairman Gregg Pulver, County Legislator Mike Polasek and other law enforcement officials gathered at the Dutchess County Law Enforcement Center in the city of Poughkeepsie for the press conference.

"The past year-plus has shown the incomprehensible decision to eliminate cash bail throughout New York has made Dutchess County, and our state as a whole, a more dangerous place in which to live, work and raise a family," Molinaro, a Republican, said. "Under the current law, instead of receiving the innovative services and programs Dutchess County offers which discourage their recidivism, those apprehended due to criminal activity are free to re-offend, as they are back out on the streets hours after arrest, if not immediately."

Officials noted that with the programs available, Dutchess County reduced its jail population 40 percent since 2014 and saw a dramatic decrease in violent crimes county-wide for an eight-year period prior to the implementation of bail reform.

Since 2020 and the implementation of the state's bail reform law, Dutchess County has seen an increase in violent crime, including an increase in repeat offenders who commit crime while awaiting adjudication of their original case, according to a release from the

county executive's office.

“We’re not intending to replace bail reform, but we want to give the judges back some of their authority so we don’t have a situation like we have down in New York City,” Imperati said, referring to a plethora of cases where criminals have been allowed back on the street only to quickly commit another crime. “We arrest them, write an appearance ticket, and they’re out in the street doing the same thing that they’re doing. And we tie up four staff members a day just (doing paperwork) on discovery.”

To alleviate this problem, local leaders called on the State to expand the timelines for discovery, eliminate the ability for courts to grant defendants access to the homes of their victims during the discovery process, and reverse the requirement to share the contact of victims and witnesses with defendants.

That is especially true for victims of domestic violence, Serino said.

"At the time, we warned that in the rush to reform, Albany's supermajority was putting victims – especially vulnerable domestic violence victims – directly in harm's way by prohibiting judges from considering 'dangerousness' when determining whether an individual should be held, pre-trial," she said. "Unfortunately, today almost three years later, headline after headline continue to prove that our concerns were well-founded, not fear-mongering. New York is leaving victims vulnerable, and the unwillingness of Albany's supermajority to acknowledge any need for change defies logic. It is far past time for Albany to put the safety of the people we serve over politics, and that starts by going back to the drawing board on bail reform."



To the Editor:

The late Senator from New York, Daniel Patrick Moynihan, famously said, “You’re entitled to your own opinions, but not your own facts.” His words came to mind last week, when I read Marty Byster’s letter titled “Continental Commons, FOFSD have own truths”.

Over the years, the so-called Friends of the Fishkill Supply Depot (FOFSD) have described the Continental Commons property as “the largest American Revolutionary War burial ground,” and stated that “320 soldiers lie in unmarked graves.” These same activists reported that they have identified Americans, Canadians, and French soldiers buried on my property. According to the NYS Historic Preservation Office, these facts are not true.

In fact, a NYS Supreme Court judge reviewed archaeological studies and engineering reports presented by both the FOFSD and my experts, and the judge made it clear the FOFSD’s concerns such as archaeological and environmental impacts, inconsistency with the Town’s comprehensive plan, and Planning Board bias were without merit.

In Byster’s letter he boasts that the FOFSD wants to seize control of property that I’ve owned since 1986. This is a very disturbing confession, especially by a group that has intentionally and knowingly made false statements regarding my property to devalue it, so as to force me to sell it for pennies on the dollar to them. I have worked hard through the years to pay for, and maintain this property, for my children and grandchildren’s future, and there’s no way they are going to take it away from my family. ?

Last summer, I filed a Federal Civil RICO complaint against FBI special agent Lance Ashworth and associates of the FOFSD who perpetrated this fraudulent scheme. While Ashworth may have left the state, he will face justice. I proved my case in state court, and now I will prove it in federal court.

Opposes proposed Wesley Residence project in Village of Fishkill

To the Editor:

I am a resident of Fishkill and I want to preface what I am about to share with the fact that I’ve made it my life’s work to improve services and supports for older people in our community and beyond.

As a doctorally prepared social gerontologist, I have worked for many years in all types of senior living communities as well as assisting families each day who are facing unique challenges related to aging and dementia. So needless to say, I have great

interest in this conversation and proposed project.

I oppose this project primarily on a couple issues.

For me it is the scale. Even with the decrease in size, I cannot understand how the additional residents that will fill 82 apartments (which by the way are one AND TWO bedrooms) and the various staff vehicles will of course add to traffic on our little 2-lane road. By the way, public transportation still adds to traffic.

In addition, while less people may be working work full-time, we would be fooling ourselves to think these adults don’t have active lives within our community and help care for their grandchildren. Interesting to note that 38% of all grandparents provide babysitting or day care (AARP’s 2018 Grandparents Today National Survey).

My other large concern with this project is how it is being advertised—and I believe is misleading and let me explain why: The Wesley Residence website gives conflicting information about market research that was conducted –and I quote: “to determine if there was a need for senior assisted living in the local area that would enable seniors to enjoy independent living and be able to graduate into various stages of assisted living ageing in place.”

This language is confusing, this facility is not a continuum of care, it's not assisted living—It is an independent senior living community with no option to age in place if and when health care needs change.

In addition, the site continues: “Some of the feedback recommended a facility incorporating a full range of senior living options, including independent living, assisted living and memory care with suggested amenities including meal plans, transportation services, etc...”

Again, why confuse the public by mentioning services that you are not providing such as assisted living and memory care?... and it doesn’t make sense to compare assisted living to independent living.

From my experience, I can say that most people do not understand the differences between the various types of senior living. So by mentioning things like assisted living, memory care and “affordable senior housing” are confusing and I believe are being used to play into people’s sympathies to garner support of this project. I can speak with confidence, that a stand-alone independent living facility is not helpful solution to a rapidly aging society.

Also, can you please be transparent about what the rent will be? We know that approximately 12 apartments will be marketed as “affordable” but please define affordable and disclose what the rent will be for the seniors in the other 85% of the apartments.

There are plenty of apartment complexes around here already, and of the 13 low-income housing tax credit properties and Section 8 housing communities specifically for older adults in Dutchess County, eight of these are located in Fishkill, Beacon and Wappingers.

I am happy to consult with the church and Wesley developers for more innovative, sustainable and affordable senior care options that already exist.

And... I would LOVE to see Fishkill offer smaller, more home-like, inter-generational, and life- enhancing living options for older adults and be a progressive LEADERS in NYS in how we care and advocate for older people (and our future selves).

Notes from the Town of Wappinger Supervisor

Services for veterans are key initiatives in Wappinger

Since taking office in 2018, I and our Town Board have prioritized making veteran services a key initiative of our Town government. Thanks to the amazing dedication of Navy veteran Kevin Hathorn and our volunteer Wappinger Veterans Advisory (WVA) group members, we have made a good start but, we have much more to do. And, we hope that we can encourage more *residents to volunteer their time, energy, and caring* in the months and years ahead to show our deepest appreciation for the service and sacrifices of our veterans.

Our focus has been on showing our military members and veterans: deep respect for and appreciation of their services; honoring and memorializing their services; and providing support, resources, and access to the services they need. Among the activities we have initiated are: (i) dedicating the Wappinger Veterans Memorial Highway along Route 9 in the Town of Wappinger; (ii) installing on utility poles our Hometown Heroes Banners; (iii) laying memorial pavers; (iv) establishing the Annual Joe Ennesser 5k Run/Walk; (v) DAV (Disabled American Veterans) benefits registration and assistance; (vi) renovation of memorial monuments within the Town of Wappinger; (vii) annual book sale; (viii) hot meals program; and (ix) identifying and recognizing the gravesites of all veterans interred in the cemeteries located within the Town of Wappinger. We also work closely with the Dutchess County Division of Veterans Services, and its Director, Adam Roche, who is a resident of the Town of Wappinger.

The Wappinger Town Board has approved a Charter for the WVA, which has established itself as a 501(c)(3) tax exempt organization. By-laws will be approved at the upcoming annual membership meeting of the WVA. As stated in the proposed By-Laws, the Purpose of the WVA is:

“to uphold and defend the Constitution and Laws of the United States; to improve the quality of lives for the veterans and their families in Wappinger and the greater Hudson Valley Region; to assist veterans and their families in obtaining local, state and federal benefits to which they are entitled; to beautify veterans’ monuments; to enable local residents to honor veterans and their family members; and to serve and advise the Town Board of Wappinger on veterans’ issues.”

Private water testing not required by Town of Wappinger

Residents throughout the Town of Wappinger have received notices left on their door from a private company asking for a water sample. The Town of Wappinger or CAMO Pollution Control Inc., our Water Treatment Provider, is not sponsoring this testing.

Furry friends offer companionship to heroes in need

Are you a dog person? A cat person? When we think of our household pets, we often think of the unconditional love they bring to our lives. Sometimes we can’t even imagine our lives without the dogs, cats and other furry friends that always seem to pick us up when things feel low. For so many of us -- including many veterans -- our household pets truly can feel like family.

However, many veterans right here in Dutchess County feel isolated on a daily basis. When there’s no one to talk to, and no one to share our lives with, sitting in an empty house or apartment alone can be discouraging, and in some cases, very dangerous. That’s why some folks in our community are trying to share that unconditional love of a household pet with veterans who could use that companionship in their lives, to get them through.

For example, the Dutchess County SPCA has a great program called Pets 4 Vets that pairs up a local veteran with a furry companion, absolutely free! The DCSPA will cover all the adoption fees and shots, and they will even throw in a month’s worth of food and treats. They’re looking for veterans who live in a home environment already conducive for pet ownership.

My friend Kyle, who works at the Dutchess County SPCA, says the Pets 4 Vets program has really made a positive impact on the lives of several veterans already.

“Our heroes deserve to be happy,” she told me. “We’d love to help more veterans find that sense of companionship through the Pets 4 Vets program.”

Kyle and the folks at the Dutchess County SPCA aren’t the only ones in our community who believe pairing veterans with lovable, furry companions can have amazing benefits! Angela is Director of their program called Boots & Paws which supports first responders, military veterans and active service personnel, as well as federal agents by pairing companion dogs with these heroes. They also include one year of paid needs such as veterinarian care, dog food and training sessions at no cost to participants.

“I think that anything that makes you happy or brings you some kind of peace is

Village of Fishkill Board hears about proposed Wesley Residence project

The Fishkill Village Board of Trustees heard about the proposed Wesley Residence project. The senior housing project is being proposed by the Fishkill Church of the Nazarene, off of Route 52 diagonally from the CVS plaza in the village. “After our presentation the members of the Village Board of Trustees had many questions regarding greater details of the proposed Wesley Residence,” said Dr. Ron Pankey, pastor of the Fishkill Church of the Nazarene.

Asked why the project is important for the community, Dr. Pankey replied, “Growing population, need for senior housing and opportunities for seniors. Based on the Village Comprehensive Plan, the 2010 Census and the 2020 Census, southern Dutchess County has the highest percentage of senior citizens in the area and The Village has the highest growth of this population. While there are several assisted living facilities and low-income senior projects there are few, if any, opportunities for well, independent seniors to gracefully age in- place in an environment that provides onsite services, fitness and social interaction within walking distance of the Village.”

Dr. Pankey also added, “Wesley Residence will be subject to local real estate taxes and over time will provide significant income to the Village budget. The residents, due to proximity, will provide additional income to local merchants and service providers.” Pankey said, “Unfortunately, the flood issues at Forge Brook are real and the issue has been neglected by the Town, nearby residents and the Army Corps of Engineers. Both design upgrades and maintenance of the estuary have been ignored so it’s no surprise that it backs up and floods nearby properties. The water management plan designed by JMC, the project engineers, in conjunction with the Village’s engineers and as reviewed and approved by the NYS DEC and FEMA will not only mitigate and control drainage on the Wesley site but will provide an opportunity to push the Town to upgrade and maintain Forge Brook properly”

The applicant has been working the New York State Department of Transportation (DOT). According to Pankey, “The design provided by Wesley engineers has reduced access to Main

Street to right turns except when using the stoplight at Blodgett. It is expected that once more detailed work begins with NYS DOT further improvements will be developed to help relieve congestion on Main Street along our site frontage.” “This matter is still pending before the Board of Trustees, and no decision has been made on the applicant’s request for a zoning change. Therefore, it would not be appropriate for me to comment on the application at this time,” said Village of Fishkill Mayor Kathy Martin.

Keep Fishkill Beautiful responds
Keep Fishkill Beautiful, a volunteer organization against the location of the project, said in a statement to Southern Dutchess News, “There is a statement on the FAQ page of the Wesley Residence website that claims that there are only a “handful” of people who against the development of these apartments. This is why the number of residents who came out to Village Hall on a windy rainy weeknight to challenge this proposal was so very heartening. The room was packed. There were no seats left and people were standing against the walls; the crowd even overflowed into the hallway. The Church of the Nazarene’s request to install this multistory apartment complex has clearly created a public outcry.” When asked about pricing, it was stated by a representative for the project that rent would be between \$3,000 and \$3,500 depending on the unit size. It was noted that this not a hard and fast number and depends on the market. At this time, there is a minimum of 10% affordable component.

“That evening we heard protests from individuals of all walks of life. We heard from people who had just moved to town, and those who have lived here their whole lives. Yvette Valdez Smith, County Legislator/Minority Leader wrote a letter of protest on behalf of her constituents, and all but one member of the Fishkill Town Board were in attendance,” Keep Fishkill Beautiful said in its statement. The number of seniors who have spoken out against The Wesley Residence during the meeting “was truly remarkable,” the statement noted.

The statement concludes, “The Mayor and Trustees can and should pull the plug on this immediately and table any further discussions regarding The Wesley Residence. This is what we would like to see happen next.”

Nutritional powerhouses

Some not-so-obvious additions to the ‘Good Stuff’ list

March is National Nutrition Month, so what better time to take a closer look at what we’re eating and what we’re not? Rather than looking at the usual suspects, though, let’s mix it up a bit and discover some fare not as often in the spotlight.

We all know about superfoods – blueberries, avocado, beans, salmon, oats, green tea, broccoli, spinach – because we often hear about how healthy they are. And they are tasty, too, as well as pretty easy to work into our diets. Still, there surely must be other things that are good for us, maybe even things we rarely, if ever, think of. Well, there are, and I’m here to put some of them front and center so we can add a little variety to the Good Stuff list.

Now, I’m not saying you should cut the good stuff out. Hardly. Let’s just say, as a big believer in the whole variety-is-the-spice-of-life thing, we should maybe add a little spicy variety to that list. And although I’m sure these are familiar to you, you may not have thought about them all that much, known how really good for you they are or even tried them before. So prepare to be amazed. OK, not amazed so much, but at least you might learn something new and add to your healthy options, too.

One more caveat (or two) before we get to it: I’m not a nutrition expert but I do a lot of research, relying on reputable sources for any information I pass on to you. That said, if you know better than I and find fault with anything here, please don’t hesitate to let me know. And second, I discovered a little witchery at play with some of these, in that many have properties that sound a bit like the sort of folk wisdom our ancestors understood maybe better than we did. Nice to learn that they really did know what they were talking about, at least some of the time. We can all take a lesson from our elders! Enjoy the journey!

DANDELION GREENS – Sure, you can forage them yourself but they’re also found in stores, and you might just want to look at these weeds in a kinder light. The bitter greens are high in vitamins A, C and K as well as calcium and potassium. They aid in digestion, have antiviral properties and have been used to treat and maybe prevent breast and lung tumors. The flavor is very green, peppery and bitter and so stands up well to rich ingredients like bacon and goat cheese. They’re also a treat grilled and wrapped around fresh figs.

JICAMA – A large, round root vegetable, the Mexican turnip as it’s sometimes called, is slightly nutty and

sweet, although low in sugar, and has a delightful juicy crunch with a texture similar to water chestnuts. In fact it’s kind of like a potato got together with an apple. An inflammation fighter that’s a good source of antioxidant vitamin C, potassium, folate and fiber and is excellent eaten raw. It does need to be washed and peeled before eating since the papery brown skin has some toxic properties. A vegetable peeler will do the trick. Then just cut the white flesh and add to salsa or salad, dip in hummus or cut into matchsticks or include in a crudite platter - it won’t brown when exposed to air - or sprinkle with fresh lime juice and chili powder. Also excellent stir-fried with sesame oil and rice wine vinegar. It also makes some tasty oven-baked fries. Oh, and because it’s 85 percent water, it’s great for staving off dehydration. Once cut it will keep in the fridge for about a week.

FENNEL – OK, so you don’t like licorice. Then you may not want to try fennel, but that would be a shame. Looking like a white bulb with green feathery hair, but not a root vegetable, fennel is an herb with refreshing anise flavor that can be cooked or eaten raw, aids in digestion – some serve it after a big meal – is an anti-carcinogenic useful for chemotherapy patients, and even has expectorant qualities. And I’m not done yet! It’s loaded with fiber, reins in those pesky free radicals that make us age quicker and helps maintain low blood pressure. Roasting or braising the bulb gives it a velvety texture, raw it as a celery-like crunch and the feathery aromatic leaves can be used as a garnish or to add a bittersweet note to dishes both sweet and savory. So while you may not like fennel, fennel really likes you.

RADISHES – Known for their hot, peppery bite, and surprisingly related to cabbage, radishes have been around a while. First grown in Egypt around 2800 B.C., they were originally black. No doubt the Egyptians knew of their antibacterial and antifungal properties, but maybe not so much that they’re also high in potassium and vitamin C. They boost collagen production for healthier skin, have anti-cancer properties, aid healthy digestion and battle free radicals. Enjoy them raw or try them roasted at a high temp for 30 minutes or so for a totally different treat, becoming a beautiful side dish with creamy texture. And yes, you can eat the leaves, making them among those two-for-one vegetables. If young and small, eat them raw. If not they’ll be tough but are excellent sauteed, braised or steamed. The taste? Earthy, peppery-spicy and slightly but pleasantly bitter.

And chickens love ’em, too.

CILANTRO – I know you’ve heard of and used this herb but it bears mentioning because it’s kind of a powerhouse. This member of the carrot family not only adds its distinctive flavor but also treats nausea, soothes inflammation, relieves gas and eases headaches, coughing and even mental stress! Boasting vitamins A, C and K, beta carotene, antioxidants, folate, manganese and potassium, cilantro can also boost your mood, help give you healthy skin and hair and helps rid the body of toxins and heavy metals.

BEET GREENS – Don’t you dare discard them! Oh, how I love beet greens! Saute in a little olive oil (or butter) and simply season with salt and pepper and you’ll have a silky, delicious dish of calcium, magnesium, copper, iron, phosphorus, B vitamins and vitamins A, C and K. Add some garlic for an even bigger health boost. They lack the high sugar and carbohydrate of beetroot and, in fact, have more nutritive value. They may even be better for you than kale, which is great news for me!

MUSHROOMS – They’re trending for a reason! That’s why they’re here. And because I love them. Loaded with cancer-fighting selenium, copper, vitamin C, B vitamins, protein and potassium, they are also the highest vegetarian source of vitamin D. They are rich in flavor, high in fiber and low in calories. There are many

varieties out there, and more exotic types coming on the scene all the time, as well as dietary supplements. Although some have higher nutritive value than others, all (that are edible) are undeniably good for you, so do with them what you will and reap the rewards!

These are just a few of the nutrient-rich things out there to add to your diet and keep you from getting bored. Likewise, each of these have more to them than just what I’ve listed, so feel free to do a little exploring on your own. I hope I’ve at least made you curious enough to do so and maybe, instead of strolling on by what you once saw as a weed or a fungus, you’ll stop and pick them up instead, because just maybe you’ll see them in a whole new, beautifully healthy light. Enjoy!



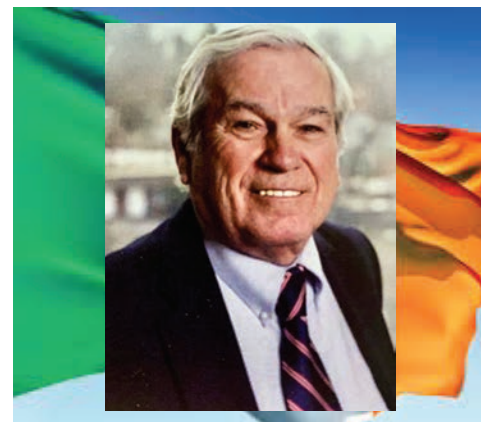
