Looks like a 'great maple season'

Visit Sharpe Reservation for Sugar Maple Celebration March 25

The 18th annual Sugar Maple Celebration will be held at The Fresh Air Fund's Sharpe Reservation on March 25 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. in Fishkill. The celebration features Sharpe's educational sugar maple operation.

"Attendees will learn all about the maple process from tapping of maple trees to boiling of the sap. At noon, our annual Hudson Valley Maple Syrup Judging Contest commences where a panel of judges will decide this year's Best of the Best Maple Syrup. Entries are all from local Hudson Valley producers. Our "Farmer's Market" Vendor Hall will feature over 30 local vendors that will be selling maple themed food and locally produced products," said Timothy Stanley. Stanley is the director of Sharpe Reservation.

Asked if there will be any new exhibits or programs this year, Stanley replied that the Hudson Highlands Nature Museum will have live animal shows. "Adelyn Folino is this year's storyteller and Up in Music will have fun movement activities, games and music for children. The Author's Corner will feature local writers of children's literature. This year will also see the re-opening of the Gustafson Planetarium that will be showing short sampler shows throughout the day," said Stanley.

The event attracts between 800 and 1,200 people, he said.

According to the Governor's Office, "In addition to its ranking for maple production, New York is also home to the largest resource of tappable maple trees within the United States and more than 2,000 maple sugar makers. In 2022, New York's maple industry used 2.9 million taps, tying 2021's record for the largest

number of taps used in a single year."

"Maple production in New York is thriving as the industry continues to set records and ranks second in the nation in this sweet crop," Governor Kathy Hochul said in a statement. "I thank our producers who work hard to make the delicious, innovative, and unique maple products we all enjoy, and encourage all New Yorkers to take part in Maple Weekends this month to

sample some of the world-class items that local vendors have to offer."

Attendees can learn about The Fresh Air Fund while visiting Sharpe for the day. "The Fresh Air Fund is a not-for-profit youth development organization that offers year-round programming to children from underserved communities



Renegades to open season on April 7 at The Dutch

It has been a busy off-season for the Hudson Valley Renegades - maybe not for the players and fans - but certainly for the front office.

As the team prepares for its 30th season in the area, Opening Day is less than two weeks away on April 7. The Renegades are the high Class A farm team of the New York Yankees and play in the South Atlantic League. They have a 144-game schedule, including 72 games at home at Dutchess Stadium. They open the season at home vs. the Greensboro Grasshoppers.

"The adaptation has gone well,"

said new general manager Tyson Jeffers, who has been with the franchise since 2020 and was elevated to GM this year. Jeffers has been elevated to General Manager, and Director of Corporate Partnerships Zach Betkowski becomes the Renegades new Assistant General Manager.

To recap:

Steve Gliner, the individual most associated with the franchise for two decades as the General Manager and the team President, will still be associated with the franchise as a consultant with Diamond Baseball Holdings, which now owns the Renegades, and oversees the various renovations of the stadium.

"Steve has made the transition so much easier," said Jeffers last week, while driving through a snowstorm.

It was not baseball weather, but Jeffers has been grateful for the relatively calm winter. Then again, he started with the team when the season was canceled in 2021 by the pandemic.

"Steve and I have been through what is probably the toughest part of the Renegades history. This is nothing," said Jeffers.

But he has more on his plate than just the weather and new construction at the stadium.

On Tuesday, the Renegades announced a naming rights partner for Dutchess Stadium.

None of the team members are set yet, as spring training in Florida has yet to disband. The Yankees are still making roster cuts, as is every other Major League team, and deciding where to send players.

in New York City. Each summer upwards of 3,000 children get to come and experience two weeks of summer camp at Sharpe Reservation and Camp Junior in Harriman State Park. Sharpe Reservation is owned and operated by The Fresh Air Fund," explained Stanley. To learn more visit www.freshair.org.

So, why is this an important event for The Fresh Air Fund to hold every? Stanley responded, "This event is a community day that showcases the beautiful scenic wonders of Sharpe Reservation to the public. In many ways, the day has come to be a reunion of old and new friends as we come together to celebrate the end of winter and the coming of spring. Year round, Sharpe Reservation is an outdoor education center that welcomes school groups and youth-based

organizations both locally and from nearby areas including New York City, Long Island, New Jersey, Connecticut and the Hudson Valley. This event showcases an amazing resource available to local schools."

Regarding this year's sap flow, Stanley said, "I always say, 'pick the best six weeks you think the sap will flow,' which typically for this area is mid-February to mid-March. We tapped the trees on February 17. At first, we were unsure of what kind of season to expect based on the lack of winter weather this year and last summer's drought. So far, the trees have been producing a generous supply of sap as the nights dip below freezing and the days go above freezing. It looks to be a great maple season!"

Town of Fishkill, officer receive lawsuit due to February 2022 incident

A woman who was shot during a February 2022 incident at the Views at Rocky Glen apartment complex, off Route 52, is suing The Town of Fishkill and one of its officers. The civil case was filed in the United States District Court of the Southern District on February 27.

According to the court document filed, Chassity Wade is bringing action against Town of Fishkill officer Joseph DiPalma and the Town of Fishkill, "to seek redress for the injuries they caused her to suffer."

According to the court complaint, Wade's close friend was "in a mental health crisis and began stabbing himself in the head and face with a knife." The complaint continues, "as plaintiff followed him out of her apartment to try to stop him, from continued self-harm, two Town of Fishkill police officers, including defendant DiPalma, both of whom happened to be at plaintiff's apartment complex responding to an unrelated matter, encountered them." The court document claims that by the time the first officer reached Becerril, that Becerril "had dropped the knife and otherwise unarmed,

did not pose an imminent threat of death or serious physical harm to plaintiff, the police officers or anyone else."

Town of Fishkill Supervisor Ozzy Albra said last week, "It is an unfortunate incident. Hopefully this is resolved quickly." He also noted it was unfortunate that anyone was injured.

Attorney for Wade, Jonathan Goldman, and Town of Fishkill Police Chief Keith Dworkin did not respond to requests for comment.

According to the complaint, "Becerril then arose and tried to continue walking down the hill away from the apartment complex and toward the intersecting roadway. As he did so, [Officer John] Hurtado, who had fallen to the ground next to the plaintiff, tripped Becerril, who began to fall." The document continues, "As Becerril fell to the ground, defendant DiPalma, who was running up the hill toward them, began shooting indiscriminately in the direction of the falling Becerril and plaintiff, who was still on the ground. DiPalma continued firing in the same direction as Becerril got back up and proceeded down the hill." According to

the court papers, "In discharging his firearm, DiPalma not only hit Becerril, but also shot plaintiff in the thigh, causing her severe physical pain and suffering emotional distress."

The Town of Fishkill was served a Notice of Claim in May 2022, according to the court filing. The complaint states: "On January 17, 2023, [Wade] submitted to and completed an examination under Section 50-h of the New York General Municipal, conducted by counsel for the defendant Town of Fishkill." The complaint adds that more than 30 days have elapsed since the Notice of Claim was served and "the defendant Town has failed or neglected to adjust her claim."

The court document states: "When defendant DiPalma fired, he knew Becerril did not pose an imminent threat of death or serious physical injury to any other person on the scene. When defendant DiPalma fired, he did not assess the relative proximity of plaintiff to Becerril or otherwise take precaution to avoid shooting plaintiff, thus exhibiting deliberate indifference to and reckless disregard of her safety."

The complaint alleges when DiPalma discharged his gun, one of his bullets "struck Wade in her right leg, entering the side of her thigh just above her knee and

exiting the left side of her thigh just below her pelvis." DiPalma's "shot caused [Wade] excruciating and lasting physical pain and suffering and required her to undergo emergency medical treatment," states the court document. The document also states that Wade was "wheelchair bound for a month, after which she continued to have limited ability to ambulate."

In June 2022, according to a court document, regarding the officers involved in the incident, a grand jury found "insufficient legal evidence to warrant an Indictment against any person for any crime arising therefrom, and an Indictment is therefore: Not Found."

The complaint, that was filed in 2023, alleges that Town of Fishkill "has failed adequately to train its police officers in how properly to respond to instances of mental health crises and/or self-injuries behavior." Further down in the court document, it states: "This lack of training was a proximate cause of DiPalma's conduct, which violated plaintiff's substantive due process rights and resulted in her suffering substantial physical pain and suffering emotional distress."

Wade is asking for a jury trial.

The cameras will be in use when Sheriff's Deputies respond to incidents or take official action, including but not limited to using force and making arrests. They are made by Axon, will be worn on the Deputy's person, and will capture both audio and video.

During this past week Sheriff's Office personnel received comprehensive training on the use of the cameras and are well qualified to begin using them. The cameras are expected to be of significant overall benefit to both the Deputies and the public that they serve as we move forward and get better together.

Construction at Dutchess Stadium on target to start Renegades' season

Because of their contractual obligations with Major League Baseball, every minor league stadium has to meet certain minimum requirements.

Dutchess Stadium and the Hudson Valley Renegades are no exception.

The franchise has had to replace the outfield wall, which was wooden since its inception almost 30 years ago, with padding.

There is a new batting cage/tunnel, with netting.

And the home clubhouse down the right-field line is being renovated and the visitors will now have their own clubhouse on the leftfield line.

"That box is checked," new General Manager Tyson Jeffers said. "The clubhouse should be ready for opening day. Everything is falling into place. We're at

the finish line. The construction guys have one foot out the door."

The clubhouse was definitely a problem. Jeffers described it as a shared clubhouse, almost split down the middle with the visiting team on one side and the Renegades on the other. Now it will be so big that it will not only house the Renegades, but have a separate room for female umpires and coaches.

"Yeah, we were very fortunate that winter hit us a little late, and that allowed the whole construction to take place," Jeffers said. "You get all the outside work done first, and make sure that got all completed. And then when it starts to get a little bit colder, they were focused on all the inside stuff."

There will also be a weight-room and offices.





The Dutchess Tavern Trail returns with April 14 event at Rose Hill Farm

Records show that humanity has a long and diverse history of re-branding, re-booting, and re-launching favorite old concepts, whether that be a book, film, or TV program. The world of public history is no different: Program concepts and offerings go through cycles of decline and renewal.

The COVID pandemic was a particularly enforced cycle of decline, with a full stop to all in-person public history programming that brought a sudden stop to decades of inertia originally generated during our nation's bicentennial. While boosting online programming, thereby opening up local history to brand new audiences nationwide and globally, many of us have missed the old in-person touch. Now that society is once again open for business, I am happy to announce the return of a crowd favorite in Dutchess History: the Dutchess County Historic Tavern Trail.

Mark your calendars for Friday, April 14 at 6 p.m. when we launch the first event of the new series at Rose Hill Farm in Red Hook.

On the upcoming second Friday in April, we will turn back the clock at Rose Hill Farm, just north of the village of Red Hook, to 1927. At that time, Rose Hill was one of many apple farms operating in Red Hook and Dutchess County, then under the ownership and management of the Fraleigh Family.

On the south end of the village, near the town line between Red Hook and Rhinebeck, stood the old McGrath Farm and orchard, which had also been in the apple business for years. In 1926, the farm incorporated as the Red Hook Steam Cidery Company, with the avowed purpose of industrializing production of apple cider and other fruit juices. The business was barely in oper-

ation for a year when federal and county authorities raided the site, discovering equipment and products that had been deemed illegal by the 18th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution and the Volstead Act.

The business that had started innocently enough fell afoul of Prohibition and sunk back into relative obscurity. Yet despite its short life, the story of the Red Hook Steam Cider Company opens a window into how centuries of local apple (and apple-derived beverage) production shaped the landscape and lifeways of Dutchess County. I look forward to taking you into those details next month.

Followers and fans of the Tavern Trail will recall that we first launched the program series in 2016, following the success of similar offerings in Orange County and other areas of the Hudson Valley and the East Coast. The concept at that time was to partner with local historical societies, holding history happy hour events at venues with a physical connection to the county's tavern-fueled past.

Some of our events took place at sites that were once taverns, such as Historic Red Hook's Elmendorph Inn, and other programs took place at sites that have remained taverns for most of their history, including Rhinebeck's Beekman Arms and the Stissing House in Pine Plains. For other events, we sought out restaurants located in creatively re-used historical spaces, with Beacon's Roundhouse being a particular favorite. Still other programs took place at historic house museums, including the Tabor-Wing House in Dover and the Brinckerhoff-Pudney-Palen House in East Fishkill. We explored topics ranging from Prohibition to the local landscape in twenty-minute segments, bringing the highlights of local history to

new audiences.

The COVID-imposed hibernation for the Tavern Trail offered an opportunity to review the first three years of programming and consider some alternative approaches. The re-booted series retains all of the crowd favorites: We will be inviting you to join local historians at riveting sites across Dutchess County to hear stories drawn from the annals of the local past. There will be exciting food and drink opportunities. The program will be free to the public, with the encouragement of making donations to support our local historical society partners.

Those partners will now have the opportunity to inform attendees on new projects and other upcoming event offerings. Reservations will be taken either directly through the Dutchess County Department of History or through the local partner.

So what has changed? In the new series, we are doubling-down on our commitment to build partnerships between local history and our county's marvelous food and beverage industries. We are seeking partnerships with breweries, wineries, cideries, and distilleries, as well as restaurants. And our programming will focus more than ever on stories related to food and drink, which loomed as large in the lives of past residents of Dutchess County as the perpetual question of what and where to eat and drink continues to stump us today. Allow the Tavern Trail to provide you

with a few answers to those questions.

When you join us at Rose Hill on April 14, you will experience the fruits of our past labors combined with that increased dedication to expanding community within Dutchess County. Rose Hill (rosehillferments.com) is ready to greet you with their sumptuous tasting room, a variety of locally-developed apple-based drinks, and a food pop-up with Chef Misto (misto-eats.com), a local sensation who will offer his usual sumptuous array of cuisine drawing from his classical training in French cuisine and his long experience with a diverse array of foodways from across the globe.

We will also have information available on our next event, at Foster's Coach House in Rhinebeck on May 19th. Stay tuned as the 2023 Tavern Trail series continues to develop.

School lunch

Luigi experiences culture shock in the cafeteria

Growing up Italian definitely had its advantages. For one, the food is definitely better. Breakfast, lunch, dinner or snacks, there was always something traditional. For example, a traditional American before school breakfast would consist of toasted Wonder bread with butter, raisin bran cereal and a small glass of orange juice.

In our house, mom would break out the blender for breakfast. First, she would crack a raw egg (brown shelled of course) into the blender, put a few teaspoons of sugar, add a shot of espresso and milk and blend until frothy. She would then toast a few thin slices of homemade bread and serve it with a couple of wedges of cantaloupe. We would then dunk the bread into the "egg crème." When we were done with our toast, we would finish the "egg crème" and then top it off with the cantaloupe. Needless to say, we would go to school wide awake from the espresso, and Sister Cecelia, the principal, could never figure out why we were bouncing off the walls.

I can remember the first time I had a school lunch as if it were yesterday. I am number four of five boys, so by the time I went to school, my mother was already very aware of the school lunches. She also understood that I would be coming home hungry because the school's version of lunch was very much different than ours.

Anyway, here I am, my first day in the first grade. I am really excited for lunch, because I have never really eaten "American" food and I can't wait to try it. In

my mind, this was exotic, something that you would see Anthony Bourdain eat on the Travel Channel. So, when it's time, Sister Louis, my first-grade teacher, lines us all up for lunch. Sister Louis had a thick Italian accent, and wore a uniform that made her look like the penguin version of Marlon Brando in the Godfather. She was very quick with her ruler that she kept hidden under her cloak, which she used to crack your knuckles if you weren't paying attention. A lesson I learned on the first day.

Anyway, she already knew that both my parents were "off the boat." As I stood in line, she looked at me and asked me if I was hungry. I told her I was and that I was very excited because I had never had any American food before. Well, she started to laugh and said that today we were having spaghetti with meat sauce. I said, "you mean Bolognese sauce?" And she said it was the American version.

Needless to say, I was very disappointed that we were having spaghetti Bolognese and not some exotic American dish like Salisbury steak. Anyway, we get in line, and I am at the back of the column because I am the tallest, so I get to watch everyone go first. As I wait in line, I am craning my neck to see what is going on in front of me. As we wait in line a woman hands us these hard plastic trays and eating utensils as we shuffle forward a few feet at a time. So now I am holding my tray with this exotic looking utensil that looks a spoon and a fork combined which I come to find out later is called a

spork. I try to be cool like I know what it is but in my mind, I have absolutely no idea what a spork is or what it is used for. When I get up to the "buffet" line, I place my trays on the line, clutching my spork and start to slide my tray forward.

Now, looking at me though the sneeze guard is this woman who to me looks to be 107 years old with a hair net on her head, plastic gloves on her hands and a hairy mole the size of my father's garden growing on her face. She looks like the wicked witch of the west from the Wizard of Oz. Seeing her should have been the first warning sign to me that this was not the spaghetti Bolognese that my mother made. But being a rookie to the school lunch program, the alarm bells really didn't start to go off. Not only that, I was too horrified by what I saw in the pans to really notice Miss Mole, I mean Miss Molly.

Staring at me in the pan was something Miss Mole called spaghetti. The only problem was that this red tinted goop was served with an ice cream scoop, and I have never seen spaghetti served with an ice cream scoop. So, Miss Mole slops this concoction onto my plastic plate with a wet thud. She then puts this red liquid with some chopped hamburger mixed in it, on top of my "spaghetti ice cream." I was later informed that this was red sauce or gravy. A slice of white bread with margarine smeared on it completed my entrée.

On my tray, is what I am sure will be my last meal. I start to walk away only to be told to wait, there is more. More? I thought. I hoped and prayed it was something I could eat. Instead, they threw a bowl of this green wobbly stuff on my tray and finished it all with a carton of milk.

Now remember, this is my first time eating something other than homemade Italian food. I clutch the edges of my plastic tray and began to wonder if maybe the tray would taste better than the contents. I walked over to the class table and sit down with my new friends. In my class there was one other person whose parents came from another country, Demetrius who was Greek. As I approached the table I immediately sought him out and was looking at his face to see if he was thinking the same thing I was. I was hopeful that he would be smiling and shoveling this "food" into his mouth with this instrument of destruction called a spork. Instead, he was staring at his plate and playing with the green wobbly stuff with his fingers, that I would come to find out later was green Jell-O. When I asked Miss. Mole, what kind of flavor the green Jell-O had, I was told "green."

Anyway, I sat down at the table and was looking around at all the happy faces of my new friends. They were all commenting how much better this was than their mom's and how great the meat sauce was. I decided that it had to be OK if they were all enjoying it, so I tasted the sauce. I was shocked that this was called meat sauce. Where was the basil, the parsley or garlic? Where were the little pieces of pork? Where was the hand grated cheese? This sauce tasted like tomato juice.

And another thing, I was used to twirling my spaghetti with a fork. This stuff was all mashed together and you ate it with a spork. My head started to spin. Partly because of the spaghetti and meat sauce but mostly because watching the Jell-O wobble was making me dizzy. I looked over to

Demetrius and asked him what he thought. He just shook his head and kept playing with the Jell-O.

I didn't know what to do. In our house, we had to eat what was on our plate. Not only that, Sister Louis was watching us, me in particular, to make sure we finished our lunch. I was afraid I was going to get hit with that ruler again. Just then Miss Mole came out with a pot and asked us if anyone wanted seconds. Seconds? I didn't even want the firsts. The other kids at the table all raised their hands very enthusiastically. I looked at them like they were crazy. They all had red stained faces, sauce spattered on their uniform shirts, a piece of buttered Wonder bread in one hands, with a sporkful of green flavored Jell-O in the other hand.

Sister Louis saw the look in my eyes and realized that I had just experienced culture shock. She came up to me and asked me if I was OK. I told her, in Italian, that I wasn't very hungry. She reached into the pockets of her nun habit and pulled out half of a salami sandwich. She told me I could have it. I told her "grazie" and she responded with "prego."

I remember eating that sandwich like it was a piece of filet mignon.

Sister Louis and I had a special bond from that day forward. I would go out of my way to be respectful to her like she was one of my aunts. I never gave her a hard time and would make sure I always greeted her with "Buon Giorno" every morning. She retired after that year, but I will never forget her kindness and the salami sandwich. So while laughing at the story of my first school lunch, please enjoy this recipe for Rigatoni Bolognese.

Rigatoni Bolognese Ingredients:

1 Quart of Coppola's Tuscan Sauce
1/2 cup of dry red wine
3 ounces of extra virgin olive oil
1 1/2 pounds ground pork/veal/beef (known as meatloaf mix in most markets)
1/4 cup grated Pecorino Romano cheese
1/4 cup ricotta cheese (optional)
1/4 cup shredded fresh basil (optional)
1 lb. of rigatoni pasta

Directions:

In a sauté pan heat olive oil and brown ground pork/veal/beef (drain any excess fat).

Add 1/2 cup of red wine and scrape bits off of bottom.

Add all of the Coppola's Tuscan Sauce and simmer for 15 minutes or until sauce is thick.

Cook pasta and toss with sauce, reserving some.

Once plated, top the pasta with the reserved sauce, ricotta, grated cheese, and basil.

Serves 4-6

Luigi Coppola is one of five brothers born to Francesca and Antonio Coppola. The Coppola family came to America from Naples, Italy in 1954. Antonio and his brothers opened their first restaurant in Poughkeepsie in 1961. Luigi and his brothers Nick, John, Antonio and Vincent have carried on the family tradition in the way their parents taught them, using classic recipes taught to them at their apron strings. Three new exhibits at Cunneen-Hackett until April 28

The Cunneen-Hackett Arts Center, located at 9 and 12 Vassar Street in Poughkeepsie, presents three new art exhibits in their Visual Art Galleries until April 28. Featured will be the works of Penny Dell in the Victorian Gallery at 9 Vassar Street, and Archil Pichkhadze in the Hancock Gallery and Logan Lesley in the Reception Gallery at 12 Vassar Street.

Penny Dell is a printmaker who enjoys making woodcuts, etchings, and monotypes and many combinations using these modalities. "My decades of drawing, painting and printmaking are coming together these days in works that combine all three with other adventurous mediums," she comments. "Presently, I use collage, encaustic, handmade paper and gilding to layer over a print—building pattern and color. Hexagons cut from the decorative interiors of envelopes have been a driving force. I layer tirelessly and final works with very different appearance and impact are the result." Dell was born in Mexico and grew up in Mexico City and Acapulco, before coming to the US at age thirteen. The artist Francisco Dos Amantes and the zoomorphic figures of Aztec friezes influenced her early work. She studied English and French Literature at Simmons College and the Sorbonne, and painting at the Triveni Kala Sangam Akademi in New Delhi, India. Dell's work is regularly exhibited in the Hudson Valley and in NYC as well as regionally and can be found in many corporate and private collections including Cablevision, Rutgers University and the New York Public Library. From 2005-2007 she served as President for the National Association of Women Artists. Dell lives and works in Poughkeepsie.

Archil Pichkhadze received his BFA from the School of Visual Arts in NYC where he studied illustration and his MFA in Painting from Brooklyn College. While at Brooklyn

College, Pichkhadze was profoundly influenced by his instructor, the esteemed realist painter, Lennart Anderson. "I am in love with the visual world," he states. "For me, the most important part of making a painting is the act of looking. I want each painting to hold the viewers gaze, let him or her enter and wonder around a bit, making their own personal connections and discoveries along the way." Pichkhadze's painting presents him with the task of balancing its many elements and equates it like lines in a poem where the parts of the painting have to support and play off of each other in order for the whole to succeed. The implied narratives in his work over the last decade have floated much closer to the surface with these images attempting to balance the visual and emotional complexities found at the borders of observational realism, fading memories and lost dreams. His exhibit at the Cunneen-Hackett Arts Center presents a selection of these paintings for viewers to experience a touch of wonder. Pichkhadze resides in Ulster County.

Logan Lesley is visual artist who uses acrylic, oil and spray paint along with organic materials to create colorful and vivid abstract pieces of art that sometimes include portraits. "I started creating art that hopefully when others see it they see something they can connect with," remarks Lesley. "In my art I want to captivate the onlookers attention by pulling them in with my vibrant use of colors that can evoke a sense of connection." Logan Lesley originally hails from Ohio and is currently based in New York.


