Play Ball! Opening night for the Hudson Valley Renegades 2023 season is Friday, April 7 at 6:05 p.m. at the newly named Heritage Financial Park.

The Renegades will start the season with a nine-game homestand against the Greensboro Grasshoppers and the Aberdeen IronBirds.

"We are ready," says new general man-

ager Tyson Jeffers. The franchise will not only be playing in a newly renamed facility, but they have added new padding to the outfield wall, are in the process of renovating in the clubhouses, and have added new batting cages for both teams.

"We had a robust off-season," Jeffers said. "and it's still not over."

For the fans, the Renegades will open the season in style with the first of 21

post-game fireworks shows. Fireworks shows will be hosted after every Friday home game, every Saturday home game from June through September, along with a special Super Fireworks Show on July 3 (Independence Day).

And – since April 9 is Easter Sunday, the Renegades will have a post-game Easter Egg Hunt on the field.

Local Airmen honored for actions taken in Afghanistan

Seventeen New York Air National Guard Airmen assigned to the 105th Airlift Wing received the Air Medal for their actions taken in Afghanistan in 2021. The ceremony took place on April 1 in Orange County at Stewart Air National Guard Base. Air Force Chief of Staff General Charles Q. Brown was in attendance. Brown recognized the Airmen for their actions during the 2021 evacuation of Americans and Afghans from Kabul. Also in attendance were Major General Denise Donnell, the commander of the New York Air National Guard, and Brig. Gen. Gary Charlton, who is the commander of the 105th Airlift Wing.

Three Dutchess County residents were honored that afternoon. They were Senior Master Sgt. Kenneth Schofield, from Lagrange; Tech. Sgt. Scott Alden, loadmaster, from Beacon and Master Sgt. Michael S. Roe, crew chief, from Poughkeepsie.

Schofield teaches second grade at an elementary school in Cornwall Central School District in Orange County. As an airman,

Zion Episcopal Church in Wappingers Falls welcomes new priest

Reverend Alex Herasimtschuk is the new priest-in-charge at Zion Episcopal Church in Wappingers Falls. Father Alex originally hails from Poughkeepsie. Fr. Alex was ordained at the Cathedral of St. John the Divine, in New York City, in September 2022.

"The first day I interviewed with the church [here], I knew the Holy Spirit was sending me here," said Fr. Alex during a recent interview with Southern Dutchess News.

Fr. Alex served several parishes in New York City during his time at the seminary and afterwards. According to his biography on Zion's website, some of the churches he served included the Church of St. Luke in the Fields in Greenwich Village, The Church of the Good Shepherd in Wakefield, and the Church of the Transfiguration in NoHo (North of Houston St.). He earned his M.A. in Religious Studies from Syracuse University. Before his ordination as a priest, Fr. Alex was ordained as a deacon in March 2022.

"The priesthood really is a calling. It is not that this was my personal choice to come here. God played matchmaker," remarked Fr. Alex, who moved to Wappingers Falls with his wife.

Though he grew up in Poughkeepsie, Fr. Alex said he did not spend that much time in Wappingers Falls during his younger years.

"It still feels new and sometimes I forget I'm in Dutchess County because the environment is different," he noted. "My

wife and I love the Village. We can walk places and get to know the restaurants and businesses."

He continued, "Having a parish in the Village really helps create a sense of community. I've been enjoying that; Dutchess County is beautiful, and we enjoy reconnecting with the outdoors."

Zion has 120 communicants, said Fr. Alex, who regularly attend, and 186 total who participate in church life. On an average Sunday, he said, between 50 and 60 communicants are in attendance during services.

"Like most churches, Zion was really affected by COVID," Fr. Alex remarked. He added that they are starting to come back. Some families who have moved away watch services from Zion online, said Fr. Alex.

"Right now, the Church and I are currently discussing what Zion's mission is. Whenever a new priest comes in there's a re-evaluation of what God wants us to do. Right now, we're discerning together the direction we want to go in and [want] our future to be," commented Fr. Alex. He added, "The most important thing is we have to be open [and see what comes to us]."

Right now, he said, the mission is to serve and to continue to teach the Gospel and to remain open to what the Holy Spirit wants."

As for his Easter message, Father Alex said, "The Easter message for me is a celebration of life, a celebration of the resurrection of life over death. And it is also the victory of good over evil and love over hatred.

And so, with that, my message to the community in respect to Easter is to keep hope, keep the light, goodness and love can be victorious in a world of war, anxiety, fears and that the end of the days, the only thing that we can really rely on is faith."

Fr. Alex noted that he would like service to be the future of Zion. One is to serve the Wappingers Falls community as

a religious institution. That is "as one that provides spiritual guidance." And two, he said, is to have Zion "serve as a social and cultural institution that collaborates with a diverse number of organizations."

"I am truly happy to be here and I really look forward to what the Lord has in store for me and this church and Wappingers Falls and beyond," he said,



Renegades to honor West Point's Leahy with first Community Star Award


The Hudson Valley Renegades have announced the first honoree in the new Community Star Award presented by Heritage Financial Credit Union. Rachel Leahy, the Director of Sports Medicine for Army West Point Athletics, will be honored on the field in a pre-game ceremony before the Renegades' Opening Night game at Heritage Financial Park on Friday, April 7.

Following the ceremony and presentation of the Renegades first Community Star Award, she will throw out a ceremonial first pitch to kick off the 2023 season.

On Jan. 5, Leahy, the athletic trainer for the Army Black Knights men's hockey team, sprang into action after junior forward Eric Huss was injured by a skate to the neck in a game against Sacred Heart University. She applied immediate pressure to the wound while on the ice to control the bleeding, and continued to apply pressure through the ambulance ride in a life-saving effort as Huss was transported to a local trauma center for emergency surgery.

Leahy, a Hudson Valley native who lives in Newburgh, was named the Atlantic Hockey Player of the Week for her heroic, life-saving actions. Amazingly, Huss was able to return to the ice just over three weeks later on Jan. 27.

"I am so grateful to have been chosen to throw out the first pitch at opening night for the Hudson Valley Renegades. I grew up going to Renegades' games and watching my older brother play baseball at Heritage Financial Park," Leahy said. "Those experiences were part of my decision to enter the field of athletic training and continue a career in athletics. It's an honor to come full circle and be recog-

nized in my hometown surrounded by my family and friends. I'm thankful for the entire Renegades organization for choosing to recognize athletic trainers and bringing positive light to our amazing profession."

"Rachel, like all of our medical staff, is a competent and selfless teammate," said Army West Point Athletic Director Mike Buddie. "Her training, instinct and passion for her cadet-athletes were on full display as she sprung into action to aid Eric Huss on Jan. 5. Her immediate care prevented what could have been a tragic outcome – and we are so fortunate to have Rachel at West Point."

Sergio Santos takes over after leading the FCL Yankees to the Florida Complex League Championship in 2022. Santos had a six-year MLB career as a pitcher from 2010-2015, spending time with the Chicago White Sox, Toronto Blue Jays, Los Angeles Dodgers and New York Yankees. He is joined on the field staff by Pitching Coach Preston Claiborne, Hitting Coach Kevin Martir, and Defensive Coaches Rob Benjamin and Derek Woodward.

The Renegades play in the South Atlantic League (SAL), one of the most famous minor league systems in the country. They have teams as far south as Rome, Georgia. The Renegades will play 144 games, including 72 at home. Hudson Valley, now in its third season as the High-A affiliate of the New York Yankees, will once again play the majority of their schedule within the SAL North Division.

Renegades roster

The Yankees announced on Sunday the 2023 break camp roster for the Renegades. The roster features 14 returning players and 16 newcomers. Five members of the break camp roster rank within the Yankees' Top 30 prospects.

The Renegades roster features the Yankees' top two draft picks from the 2022 First-Year Player Draft – outfielder Spencer Jones and pitcher Drew Thorpe. Jones and Thorpe rank fifth and eighth, respectively, in MLB Pipeline's Top 30

Yankees prospects.

Returning to the pitching staff for 2023 are RHP Juan Carela, RHP Harold Cortijo, RHP Bailey Dees, RHP Carlos Gomez, RHP Trevor Holloway, RHP Jack Neely, and RHP Enrique Santana. Also returning to the Renegades after sitting out the 2022 season with an injury is LHP Clay Aguilar, who appeared in one game for Hudson Valley in 2021.

Newcomers on the pitching staff are highlighted by a trio of top prospects in Thorpe (No. 8), RHP Zach Messinger (No. 23) and RHP Chase Hampton (No. 26). LHP Joel Valdez and RHP Tyrone Yulie both have started extensively throughout their careers, while LHP Ryan Anderson, RHP Nick Paciorek, and RHP Danny Watson have proven themselves as dependable relief pitchers.

Catchers -The Renegades will feature an all-new catching corps, led by Antonio Gomez, the Yankees No. 27 prospect according to Baseball America. He is joined behind the dish by Rafael Flores and Ben Rice. Flores was signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent out of Rio Hondo College in July 2022, while Rice was a 12th-round pick in 2021 out of Dartmouth.

Infielders - Ben Cowles and Spencer Henson return on the infield, anchoring the right side. Henson clubbed a career-high 10 home runs in 71 games with the Renegades in 2022, while Cowles finished the season on a seven-game hitting streak.

Yanks' Volpe leads list of ex-Renegades in MLB

A former Hudson Valley Renegades player is now the starting shortstop for the New York Yankees.

Anthony Volpe, who played in Wappingers Falls just two years ago, started in the Bronx last week Thursday at shortstop, as the Yanks opened the 2023 season with a victory over the San Francisco Giants at Yankee Stadium.

As a High Class A farm team of the New York Yankees, the Renegades sell themselves on the future. They tell fans that you can come to the ballpark and possibly see a Major League player of the future. For anybody that came to see the Renegades play in 2021, they saw such an example.

For 55 games, the starting shortstop for the Hudson Valley Renegades was Anthony Volpe. He hit .286 and had 17 doubles and 15 home runs for the Renegades.

"We are so thrilled for all of these members of the Renegades family who are starting this season in the big leagues," said Tyson Jeffers, General Manager of the Renegades. "One of the most magical experiences Minor League Baseball offers is the chance to see future Major League stars play in our community, and we are looking forward to showcasing more of the next generation of big leaguers at Heritage Financial Park this season."

Volpe is considered the jewel of the Yankees minor league system. In fact, he was named the most outstanding player in this year's spring training camp that recently concluded Tampa, Fla.

Volpe is just one of more than two dozen former Renegades players who started the season with a major league team this year.

Additionally, former Renegades manager Matt Quatraro made his MLB managing debut with the Kansas City Royals after spending six seasons on the Tampa Bay Rays staff, and Stephen Vogt begins his coaching career as the Bullpen/Quality Control Coach for the Seattle Mariners after

Jacobson introduces financial literacy high school graduation requirement legislation

Money. How much we have and how we manage it is a reality that each of us face every day. Unfortunately, too many of our young people aren't being taught how to manage their personal finances—a situation that can have dire consequences for both their own future and our nation's economy. Today's students graduate from high school knowing reading, writing, and arithmetic, but they should also be taught how to apply those skills to understand a lease for a car or an apartment, what gets deducted out of a paycheck, and why it's important to maintain a good credit score.

Turning 18 is an exciting time, but whether it's college loans or credit card debt, a young person entering adulthood should be equipped to make informed financial choices. That's why I introduced A2298, making a pass/fail course on financial literacy a requirement of high school graduation. This is a small investment that will yield major dividends in the financial well-being of future generations. April is Financial Literacy Month, but my bill will make financial literacy a tool that every New Yorker can rely on all year round.

We have our climate goals ... now what?

As the new Chair of the New York State Assembly's Energy Committee, I am concerned, as are many of my constituents and colleagues, about how New York State will reach the ambitious renewable energy goals set forth in the Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act (CLCPA) without burdening already cash-strapped New Yorkers.

With this in mind, the New York State Assembly's One-House Budget removed many of the Governor's energy policy proposals, intending to discuss them outside the budget process. The All-Electric Buildings proposal - which has been the focus of much media attention – was modified to only apply to new commercial and residential construction, not existing buildings or homes. Further there are specific exemptions from the required electrification of new construction for emergency backup power, commercial food establishments, laboratories, laundromats, hospitals and other medical facilities, agricultural buildings, manufactured homes, crematoriums, and critical infrastructure such as backup power for wastewater treatment facilities.

If the legislature has its way there will be no "ban" on gas stoves in existing buildings either. We all know that propane generators and natural gas fireplaces have kept people safe and warm through extended power outages during past harsh winters. Instead, offering incentives for consumers to make energy-efficient improvements to their homes and finding ways to meet households where they are as we strive to accomplish our goals is the path the state should be taking.

Let's be clear, climate inaction is simply not an option. We have set these goals to address a real climate emergency. It is therefore imperative that we consider all the reasonable and available - even outside-the-box - clean energy alternatives that are reliable and compatible with our existing infrastructure and energy consumption as we strive to meet those goals.

While there are a number of solar and wind projects set to come online, the power from these renewables is still years away. In the short-term, there are other fuel sources that could be used to significantly reduce emissions - today! These include biofuels, which are already commercially available, and developing technologies, like linear generators which are being used in other states.

It is also clear that there are industries that will be difficult, if not impossible, to completely electrify. But the goal of the CLCPA is not electrification, it is decarbonization. There are steps we can take now to reduce our greenhouse gas emissions while these renewables come

online. Establishing a Clean Fuel Standard in New York State will make alternative fuels cost-competitive and more affordable for the transportation sector, enabling more widespread use right away. This will allow school and public buses to use biofuels to dramatically reduce our greenhouse gas emissions. Right now, some airline companies are using sustainable aviation fuels to fly into New York State, but because the fuels aren't cost competitive, they fly out of the state with fossil fuels.

In addition, the state's refusal to recognize and count the emissions reductions seen with energy produced by farmers via anaerobic digestion (capturing gas emitted by cow manure and burning it for electricity) creates a barrier to reaching our climate goals. New York State is losing not only the renewable energy produced by widespread use of anaerobic digestion, but the ability to count the reduction in emissions because farmers are partnering with companies to clean up and sell the gas or credit to other states like California - who then are able to count those emissions reductions for their own state.

There are legislative fixes, as well, and we have already introduced bills to make this energy transition more accessible and affordable, including offering rebates for purchasing a previously owned hybrid or electric vehicle; expanding access to the personal income tax credit for residential solar energy system installation; and allowing the State to utilize newly developed renewable energy sources.

I voted for and continue to support the CLCPA. As its very name suggests, this critical legislation calls for balancing our ambitious climate goals with protecting our communities. In the weeks since I became Energy Chair, my team and I have met with a wide range of advocates – from utilities to environmental organizations. Through these conversations, it has become clear that meeting our climate goals does not necessarily have a one size fits all solution, rather we need to utilize all of the tools available so New York State can rapidly decarbonize our economy while ensuring that our utility costs don't continue to soar.

Meeting the state's climate goals will impact every one of our nearly 20 million New Yorkers, and to ensure a just transition - one that protects and supports workers, disadvantaged communities, and our rural, urban, and suburban towns across the state - we must recognize the diversity of New York, balance economic burdens fairly, and ensure good green jobs. We must hear our neighbors, businesses and family members' concerns and work to bring them along with us, providing energy affordability and reliability to all New Yorkers.



U-18 teams. The midfielder has been participating in trainings with Red Bulls II for the entire 2023 preseason in addition to having been around the team in past years, according to the organization.

"Dylan is going to be a great addition to help strengthen our midfield and defense," New York Red Bulls II Head Coach Ibrahim Sekagya said in the release. "His high work rate will be very useful for us on the pitch this upcoming season."

The midfielder attended all four years of his college career at Clemson University, where he consistently featured in the Tiger lineup. In his senior year, Sullivan appeared in 16 matches and logged 350 minutes playing in the defensive midfield role, according to the club.

Project to replace light fixtures on Mid-Hudson Bridge starts

The New York State Bridge Authority (NYSBA) announced that the popular necklace lights on the Mid-Hudson Bridge will soon be replaced with new fixtures. The necklace lights along the suspension cables are lit in different colors in commemoration of holidays as well as local and statewide events. The project begins on April 3 and is expected to wrap up sometime in May.

The necklace lights were first installed in 2001 and the fixtures have reached the end of their useful life. The original power cables and mount brackets will be retained during this project. The old light fixtures will be removed and the necklace lights on the bridge will be off once installation begins on April 3. The Mid-Hudson Bridge will be unable to participate in special lighting events while the project is underway.

The lights have been procured from

MagniFlood, Inc., who produced the original lights, with installation being done by Piasecki Steel Construction Corp. The project comes at a total cost of \$429,750.00 and is part of the Authority's capital plan.

The New York State Bridge Authority (NYSBA) operates the Bear Mountain, Newburgh-Beacon, Mid-Hudson, Kingston-Rhinecliff, and Rip Van Winkle Bridges. It also owns and maintains the structure of the Walkway Over the Hudson pedestrian bridge. The Authority receives no operating funding through state or federal tax dollars, with nearly all of its revenue coming through tolls. Tolls are reinvested back into capital improvements on the Authority's spans, ensuring these critical pieces of infrastructure can continue serving the Hudson Valley for decades to come. Free tax filing for eligible residents

Eligibility requirements include:

- a federal adjusted gross income (AGI) for 2022 was \$41,000 or less, regardless of age; or

- filer is 57 years old or younger with a federal adjusted gross income of \$60,000 or less; or

- filer's federal adjusted gross income was \$73,000 or less, and filer served as

Active Duty Military (including as a Reservist and or member of the National Guard).

"Many New Yorkers are eligible to electronically prepare and file their taxes online using brand-name software through Free File," said New York State Department of Taxation and Finance Acting Commissioner Amanda Hiller. "As the April 18 tax filing deadline approaches, we encourage eligible taxpayers to take advantage of this free software to quickly and easily e-file their tax returns."

Call 811 before digging projects

April is National Safe Digging Month and UDig NY has important information for anyone planning a digging project in Upstate New York. Digging without knowing the approximate location of underground utility lines can result in injury, repair costs, fines, and outages. That's why professional excavators and homeowners with digging projects should place an underground utility location request with UDig NY. A location request can be placed by visiting UDigNY.org or by calling 811. Location requests should be placed at least two business days, but not more than 10 days, before beginning an excavation project.

"Placing a location request at least two days before you plan to dig and understanding safe-digging best practices helps protect your entire community," said UDig NY Executive Director Kevin Hopper. "This National Safe Digging Month, I encourage anyone planning a project that involves digging to visit UDigNY.org to learn more about how to dig safely."

After a location request is placed, UDig NY processes and transmits the information to the member facility operators who are responsible for marking out the approximate location of any underground

public utilities in the dig area, helping excavators to dig safely.

In addition to placing a location request, anyone planning a digging project should familiarize themselves with important safe-digging concepts like the APWA Uniform Color Code – the colors that are used to mark out the type and approximate location of underground utility lines. To learn more about placing a location request, understanding a mark out, and other important safety topics, visit UDigNY.org.

UDig NY provides many additional resources to learn about safe digging best practices. These include the Certified Excavator in Safe Digging Best Practices (CEP) program, which is available online and at a variety of in-person events throughout the year. 

he is an instructor loadmaster.

"It was a great day," Schofield said after the ceremony.

Schofield, a former U.S. Marines, said he wanted "to continue to serve," so he joined the Air National Guard. This was Schofield's 10th award, according to the Air National Guard.

Asked what he will remember about those days in Afghanistan, Schofield responded, "all the orphans that we took." He said the situation was "kind of chaotic."

Thirteen U.S. service members, and nearly 200 people, were killed on August 26 at the Kabul Airport after a suicide bomb attack.

Tech. Sgt. Alden, it was stated during the ceremony, "helped board 424 evacuees. He diagnosed a maintenance issue which meant the pilots were not getting proper weight and aircraft balance information, so they could make the right calculations."

During the ceremony, Master Sgt. Roe was honored for providing "medical assistance to Afghan evacuees. On a separate occasion, he also provided medical assistance to Afghan evacuees in Kuwait."

what is normally expected while engaged in direct combat."

According to the Air National Guard, Tech. Sgt. Catu flew crew chief of a C-17 which was designated by its call sign Reach 824.


Col. Gary Charlton, II, commander of the 105th Airlift Wing said in an announcement before the ceremony, "The men and women of the 105th Airlift Wing have, time and again, displayed their incredible selflessness through their wholehearted dedication to the mission. Throughout this operation, these Citizen Airmen put themselves directly in harm's way for the sole purpose of saving the lives of others. 'The Spirit of Allies Refuge' named

During another ceremony that day, Brown took part in the naming of one of the Wing's C-17 Globemaster III, a cargo aircraft. The C-17 III was named "The Spirit of Allies Refuge," which commemorated the Wing's role in the 2021 summer mission.

During Operation Allies Refuge, the 105th Airlift Wing, which flies strategic airlift missions around the globe from Stewart, contributed during the operation with three C-17s and aircrews, according to the communications office. The operation ran from July 14 to August 30 in 2021.

Six members of the crew of C-17 Raven 824 were recognized for their actions during the mission in June of 2022. That aircrew was tasked with delivering an Army special operations helicopter and support crew to Kabul shortly after the Taliban occupied part of the airport, according to the announcement.



Lt. Sleight's Civil War Ledger Book testifies to hardships of soldiers

The first three months of 1865 were unkind to the Dutchess County men serving in the 150th New York Volunteer Infantry Regiment (the Dutchess County Regiment). After surviving Sherman's March to the sea and making a Christmas gift of Savannah to President Lincoln, Federal soldiers departed Savannah in January 1865 to pursue fleeing Confederates through the swampy Low Country of South Carolina into North Carolina.

Corporal William K. Watson of Company C, a Poughkeepsie resident, recorded a constant series of wet marching and "corduroying" of roads with fallen trees and limbs to create a surface upon which baggage wagons and cannons could pass. It was one of the worst situations for infantrymen and would only end when the regiment reached North Carolina in March. The reward for passing out of swampy territory was fighting a climactic battle at Averasboro, NC, on March 16, during which several men (including Watson) were wounded. Watson's diary is preserved within the collections of the Tennessee State Library.

Watson was not the only member of the 150th New York Regiment to keep a written record of the campaign that survives today. Richard Van Wyck of Fishkill was also a diarist. Selections from his diary along with his many letters home are available in "A War to Petrify the Heart," published by the East Fishkill Historical Society.

Aside from these narrative accounts, pieces of the expected military paperwork also survive. Wading through swamps day after day, building semi-floating roads of limbs and trees, and the general misery of a hard winter campaign could not put a stop to the cycle of reports, returns, and muster rolls constituting the life blood of the army's bureaucracy.

A rare survival in the collections of the Dutchess County Historical Society offers additional details to round out these common soldiers' diaries and connect them to the larger military

apparatus: The pocket ledger of Lieutenant David Barnes Sleight, within which he kept notes for filling out formal paperwork in later (presumably drier) conditions.

Civil War Weekend


For all those interested in seeing original and reproduction examples of the items recorded in Lieutenant Sleight's ledger, you have a wonderful opportunity coming up on the weekend of April 22-23. The East Fishkill Historical Society, located at 68 Kensington Drive in Hopewell Junction, will be hosting their second annual Civil War weekend. Join re-enactors of the 150th and 124th New York Regiments to discuss how Civil War muskets and equipment worked and to learn more about the life experiences of soldiers.

Period craftsmen will be on hand to demonstrate blacksmithing, woodworking, and other trades. On Saturday at 4 p.m., experience Bluegrass music Civil War-style with Max "Lumpy" Rowland, the Long Island Balladeer, performing on the banjo and squeezebox accordion. On Sunday at 1 p.m., the Hudson Valley Council Band will perform military music of the Civil War era. Food trucks will be on hand and fingers are crossed for great weather.

Sleight's background

Lieutenant Sleight hailed from LaGrange and became 1st Lieutenant (second in command) of Company I of the 150th New York. Captain Richard Titus, the official commander of the company, took a leave of absence from the regiment in September 1864, before the start of the Savannah Campaign. When he returned from leave, the Dutchess County Regiment was already well into enemy territory.

Titus was assigned to a temporary command in Tennessee, leaving Sleight to lead Company I through Sherman's March to the Sea and then into the Carolinas. Along the way, Sleight used his pocket ledger to keep track of the equipment that was "condemned" and the new equipment issued to individual soldiers. Presumably, he planned to use this information to fill out the

the first set of equipment condemned by Captain Platt M. Thorn. Discarded so that it would not hinder the men, this list of broken equipment included nine canteens, 24 haversacks, eight knapsacks, 20 shelter tents (the cloth halves of pup tents that would be the army's default campaign shelter well into the twentieth century), along with an ax, three hatchets, and three cooking/eating pans. As the campaign continued, equipment including the pouches used to hold percussion caps, the boxes that held paper cartridges for muskets, musket slings, and even muskets were deemed unfit for service with replacements issued. So in addition to building roads through swamps, one can imagine soldier exchanging broken equipment for new material, while the rain and cold continued around them.

Captain Titus would eventually rejoin the 150th New York after the fighting was over, travelling with the regiment from Raleigh, NC, to the final grand review parade in Washington, DC, in June 1865.

His first lieutenant, David Sleight, was not so fortunate. On March 16, 1865, at Averasboro, where Corporal Watson suffered a wound, Lieutenant Sleight lost his life. He was one of only two officers to die in battle during the regiment's three active years of frontline service. His ledger would continue to be used by other officers before ending up with Captain Titus's papers, which are now on deposit at the Dutchess County Historical Society.

While military history is a perpetually popular topic, the experiences of David Sleight and other soldiers of the Dutchess County Regiment remind us that there is always a tremendous human cost, in suffering and lost time as well as life, whenever disputes cannot be settled in a peaceful fashion.






Students in one of Kyle Bautista's classes at Roy C. Ketcham High School work on the circumference of Earth project.

Students in Kyle Bautista's classes at Roy C. Ketcham (RCK) High School, in the Wappingers Central School District, recently recreated an experiment. The experiment was first performed around 240 B.C. by Eratosthenes, who was a Greek astronomer, geographer, mathematician. Bautista said the goal was to determine the circumference of the Earth.

"Students will be calculating the angle of the incoming rays from the sun and using this angle to compare it to the angle of the sun's rays in Bogotá, Colombia. With a meter stick, students will measure the shadow created at solar-noon. Using trigonometry, students can then determine the angle of the sun's rays. After communicating with Bogotá and getting their data, using a simple proportion, they can determine the circumference within a few percentage points of error," explained Bautista. "I often tell students that as astronomers, the only medium we have to work with is light and this is a clear example of that. This experiment is so simple, but requires creativity and using resources others wouldn't even think of using, like the shadow of a pole!"

One of the students who took part in the lesson was Grayson, a junior at RCK.

"Throughout the lesson we simply measured the length of a shadow with meter sticks by exploiting Eratosthenes's discovery of the Earth's circumference, where we then got in touch with students from Bogota, Colombia and calculated the distance and compared our different observations and answers with each other." Grayson continued, "Not only was the experiment very interesting but it was enjoyable to share and communicate with students and even compute Eratosthenes's great observation."

Bautista said that the students who participated are juniors and seniors in one of his two sections of Astronomy class, or his one section of Regents Physics. Altogether, there were approximately 40 students who participated.

Asked what he hopes students learned from the experiment, Bautista responded, "I hope students recognize the beauty of Astronomy and how exciting it can be. I hope students take a moment to value academic curiosity and creativity. As we learn in Astronomy, a lot of ancient astronomers were curious people with a desire to learn more about the world around them. The same can be true for my students today, learn about the world around you, in the classroom and with the people that surround you."

Rafael, a RCK senior, said, "I learned to find the circumference using the easy way using only a meter stick and a circular bubble level. Also, that the angle that we got from Colombia is different because Colombia is closer to the equator which makes the shadow to look smaller."

Grayson commented, "From the experiment I have learned that there is an absolute difference of a shadow's length depending on where you and the sun are located."

Bautista said he invited administrators and staff from the school's yearbook to attend the experiment.

"My hope in inviting people is for my students to identify themselves as true scientists and what they are doing matters. Astronomy is a fascinating subject and the skills they learn in this class are greater than algebra or memorizing the planets. These students are developing creative thinking, communication, leadership, and a desire to learn," said Bautista.

Hudson River Fish Advisories explained

Fishing is fun, and fish are an important part of a healthy diet. Fish contain high quality protein, essential nutrients, healthy fish oils, and are low in saturated fat. However, some fish contain chemicals at levels that may be harmful to health. To help people make healthier choices about which fish to eat, the New York State Department of Health (NYS DOH) issues advice about eating sportfish (the fish you catch).

Some fresh waters and marine waters (near New York City) are impacted by human activities and local or distant contamination sources. The fish from these waters are more likely to be contaminated than fish from other waters. People who eat the fish they catch, or get locally caught fish from others, often eat fish from a limited number of favorite fishing waters or locations. When those favorite waters/locations contain fish with higher contaminant levels, the people who eat them may have higher contaminant exposures. In general, fish from the market or a restaurant come from a wider variety of locations, including waters with less contaminated fish.

NYS DOH also issues advice about game, such as snapping turtles and wild waterfowl. Game may also contain chemicals at levels of concern.

Health risks from contaminants in fish and game

The primary contaminants of concern in New York State fish and game have been mercury and polychlorinated biphenyls (PCBs). Other contaminants such as cadmium, chlordane, DDT, dieldrin, dioxin, mirex, and per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS, previously known as perfluorinated chemicals or PFCs) are also concerns in fish from some of the State's waterbodies. These contaminants build up in your body as you continue to eat these fish and game over time. Health problems that may result from exposure to these contaminants range from small changes in health that are hard to detect to birth defects, reproductive and developmental effects, and cancer. For more detailed information about contaminants in fish and game, visit

www.health.ny.gov and search for "About Chemicals & Bacteria in Fish."

Women who eat highly contaminated fish and game and become pregnant may have an increased risk of having children who are slower to develop and learn. Some contaminants may be passed on to infants in mother's milk. Exposure to contaminants may also have a greater effect on young children than adults.

People can get the health benefits of eating fish and reduce their exposures to contaminants by following the NYS DOH advice; visit www.health.ny.gov and search for "Hudson River & Tributaries Region Fish Advisories." The advisories tell people which fish to avoid eating, and how to prepare and cook fish to reduce their exposures to contaminants in the fish they do eat. Women of childbearing age (under 50) and children under 15 are advised to limit the kinds of sportfish they eat and how often they eat them. Women beyond their childbearing years (over 50) and men may face fewer health risks from some chemicals. For that reason, the advice for women over age 50 and men over age 15 allows them to eat more kinds of sportfish and more often.

Basics for setting advisories

New York is a water-rich state: 2.6 million acres of water in Lakes Erie, Ontario and Champlain; approximately 0.75 million acres in more than 4,000 smaller lakes; 70,000 miles of streams and rivers in 15 major watersheds; 150 tidal miles of the Hudson River estuary; and 1.1 million acres of marine waters extending three miles from shore. Many species of fish in these waters are sought by anglers.

In New York State, fish and game advisories are primarily based on information that the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation (NYS DEC) gathers on contaminant levels in fish and game. NYS DEC collects fish samples each year from different waterbodies. It varies from year to year, but NYS DEC annually collects and analyzes contaminants in about 1,500 fish from more than 50 locations/waters. Sampling focuses on waterbodies with known or sus-

pected contamination, waterbodies susceptible to mercury contamination, popular fishing waters, and waters where trends in fish contamination are being monitored. Also, testing focuses on those species that are most likely to be caught and eaten by sport anglers. NYS DEC also tests some game species (e.g., waterfowl and snapping turtles) that accumulate chemical contaminants. NYS DOH reviews the NYS DEC testing results for fish and game to determine if an advisory should be issued or revised for a given waterbody, or for a particular species of fish or game. See "Fish and Game Advisory Derivation" at www.health.ny.gov for more details.

Types of advisories

To reduce exposure to contaminants, and help anglers and hunters choose which fish and game to keep for food, NYS DOH has the following types of health advice:

General Advice for Sportfish: The general health advisory for sportfish consumption is that people can eat up to four, one-half pound meals a month of fish (which should be spaced out to about a meal a week) from New York State fresh waters and some marine waters near the mouth of the Hudson River. If there is no specific advice for a waterbody, NYS DOH recommends following this general advice because:

- some chemicals are commonly found in New York State fish (e.g., mercury and PCBs);
- fish from all waters have not been tested; and
- fish may contain unidentified contaminants.

Specific advice for sportfish

For some waterbodies in New York, NYS DOH issues advice that is more restrictive (i.e., eat up to one meal per month or don't eat) than the general advice (eat up to four meals per month) for men over 15 and for women over age 50 because contaminant levels in some fish are higher. Waters that have specific advisories have at least one species of fish with an elevated contaminant level, which means that other fish species may also be affected. In nearly all

cases, if a waterbody has any specific advice, NYS DOH, to be more protective, has advised that women under age 50 and children under age 15 should not eat any fish from that waterbody. The specific advice for a waterbody also applies to tributaries and connected waters if there are no dams, falls, or other barriers to stop the fish from moving upstream or downstream. This is because chemicals remain in fish when they move from one waterbody or location to another.

The information at www.health.ny.gov/fish will help you find which waterbodies in New York State have specific advisories, where they are located, and what that specific advice is. Our website also lists public access waters with the general advice; where the whole family can eat up to four meals per month.

Regional advice for sportfish

Regional advisories are issued because of regional patterns for a specific contaminant across the state (i.e., mercury) for several species that can be reasonably anticipated to apply to most or all waters in the region including those that have not been sampled. NYS DEC data indicate that certain fish from Adirondack and Catskill region waters often have mercury levels approaching or exceeding levels of concern, generally higher than mercury levels in the same species from other regions in the State. With the regional advisories, NYS DOH seeks to simplify the advisory message and issue protective advice for those at greatest risk, reducing the need for waterbody-specific advice. The regional advisories also provide women under age 50 and children under age 15 opportunities to eat some fish from Adirondack and Catskill waters by providing a list of less-contaminated species.

Game advice

Game may also contain contaminants at levels of concern. NYS DOH issues advice about choosing and preparing game to eat, such as snapping turtles and wild waterfowl. For more information about eating game, visit the website and search for "Advice on Eating Game."

Laerdal Medical's Donna Kosack to chair 2023 Dutchess-Ulster heart Walk April 29

In 2022, the Dutchess-Ulster Heart Walk literally "bridged" two communities when it took place on the Walkway Over the Hudson State Historic Park.

"It was a great, first-time experience, very positive," said Donna Kosack, Systems Adoption Manager at Laerdal Medical and chair of both the 2022 and the 2023 Dutchess-Ulster Heart Walk. "I agreed to chair again this year because the American Heart Association has a good mission, and I don't want to lose the momentum we started with our event on the bridge last year."

On April 29, the Dutchess-Ulster Heart Walk will take place on The Walkway Over the Hudson State Park. Walkers can begin their walk on either side of the bridge, and at any time they choose, between 9 and 11 a.m.

"This is such a great opportunity to bring both Dutchess and Ulster counties together again, and show that we are united in the fight against the nation's No. 1 and No. 5 killers, heart disease and stroke," Kosack said. "Last year's walkers were pleased, and I can't wait to see what the turnout will be this year."

Kosack's family and her own health history have made her a strong advocate for educating people about heart disease.

When Kosack was in her 20s, her uncle, then in his 40s, had his first heart attack. Her father and grandfather had also had heart disease. But after her mother was diagnosed with cancer for the second time, Kosack was sitting on her couch and felt pressure in her chest. At the physical

she had scheduled for the next day, doctors detected a heart murmur and sent her to a cardiologist, where she learned she had a bicuspid aortic valve – a congenital heart defect which means that her heart valve has two flaps instead of the customary three – which has created an aortic aneurysm.

Kosack immediately had her two daughters and son checked to make sure this isn't something they inherited. They don't have it.

"I'm monitored closely for the aortic aneurysm," Kosack said. "If it gets too big, doctors will operate on it, and replace my valve at the same time."

Kosack was also diagnosed with cancer last year, and says she is currently doing well. She keeps a close eye on her health and eats well and admits she can benefit from more exercise.

Personally and through Laerdal, Kosack has a long history of involvement with the American Heart Association. Laerdal is a longtime sponsor of the Dutchess-Ulster Heart Walk and Kosack has volunteered and participated in Heart Association events in the 15 years she has worked at Laerdal. She was also a member of the BetterU program in the Hudson Valley, a 12-week heart-health improvement program for women that is part of the Go Red movement.

"I really want to stress how relevant this is to all of us," Kosack said. "Heart doesn't care what nationality, gender or age you are."

Kosack pointed to Damar Hamlin's car-

diac arrest as an example of heart disease's wide reach.

"He was a healthy young man, doing nothing out of the ordinary for him," Kosack said. "And he just dropped. Where he is today is even more astounding. It's critical that we reach out to more and more young people, to make them aware of their risk, and to teach them the skills they need to survive – or equally as

important, help others survive, like Damar."

At Laerdal, Kosack said, they are adapting Damar Hamlin's "3 for Heart" challenge, watching his video; signing up for the Laerdal team; bringing three friends; donating and completing their CPR challenge.

Kosack encourages everyone to come to the Heart Walk.





The open house will include many of the Sheriff's Office's specialty units, information about the facility, and personnel from different areas of expertise to answer questions and provide further information. The open house is welcome to visitors of all ages, and those attending are asked to enter the grounds via the North Hamilton St. gate (across from Thrifty Beverage) and then will be directed from there.

Register for free rabies clinic in Red Hook April 30

The Dutchess County Department of Behavioral & Community Health (DBCH) is partnering with the Dutchess County SPCA to host a free rabies vaccination clinic for pets on Sunday, April 30th, at the Red Hook Town Hall, at 7340 South Broadway in Red Hook. The clinic will run from 8 a.m. to noon, with free parking available. Registration is required, walk ins will not be accommodated. Registration will open on April 5 online at DCSPCA.org or call the DCSPCA at 845-452-7722, x425.

The rabies clinic offers Dutchess County residents the opportunity to obtain rabies shots free of charge for their dogs, cats, and domestic ferrets. Proof of residency is required. Non-residents will be charged a fee of \$10 per pet vaccinated. All dogs must be on leash, and cats and domestic ferrets must be in carriers. Vaccinations will be

good for three years for pets with proper proof of a prior immunization. For those without proof, the vaccination will be good for one year.

In New York State, rabies shots are required for all cats, dogs, and domestic ferrets by the age of four months. Animals must always remain up to date on rabies shots. Revaccination is required on a regular schedule to keep the animal properly immunized against the rabies virus. Owners can be fined up to \$200 if they fail to get their pets vaccinated and keep them up to date.

If a pet has not been vaccinated or is not up to date on its rabies vaccination and fights with a rabid or suspect-rabid animal, the pet must be promptly destroyed or placed in quarantine for six months to protect other animals and people in case the pet develops

rabies. These mandates do not apply for a vaccinated pet in the same situation. In such cases, only a booster dose of rabies vaccine would be given within five days to treat the pet.

The Dutchess County Department of Behavioral and Community Health is available 24/7 to assist with any questions or concerns regarding potential rabies exposure to people or domestic animals. Pet owners should report to DCBH with any incident in which their pet has been bitten by or has an open wound exposed to the saliva or nervous tissue of a domestic or wild animal. Staff will investigate and advise the pet owner of any necessary steps they should take to ensure the safety of their animal.


Sudoku requires no arithmetic skills.




