# Fishkill board hears about Castle Point plans

At the Town of Fishkill board meeting on April 6, Cullen Lyons, public affairs officer for the VA Hudson Valley Health Care System, discussed the recent report from the VA that was released by the Director of Veterans Affairs Denis McDonough. The report contained recommendations for different VA facilities. One of those facilities was the

Castle Point campus in Fishkill.

Lyons stated "there has been a lot of hype" around the recommendations. He noted one has to "go all the way back to 2018" when the MISSION (Maintaining Internal Systems and Strengthening Integrated Outside Networks) Act was passed by Congress. It is described, on the VA website, as "The Act affects many VA programs, including changes that make dramatic improvements to how Veterans receive health care provided outside of VA facilities."

Lyons remarked that the Act "opened up eligibility for veterans" to get care in the community.

The AIR (Asset and Infrastructure Review Commission) Report, released in March, contained recommendations. It will now go to the AIR Commission.

"I believe by Jan. 2023 they will present their recommendations to the president," said Lyons, who added that president will sign 'Yes' or 'No.'

Fishkill Councilman Brian Wrye noted, "2023 is coming up quick though." He said veterans need to organize and voice their opinions. Lyons remarked that when the AIR

Report was first released there was an article that was released and "some people did not read on" and it gained traction. Adam Roche, Director of Dutchess

County Division of Veterans Services said his office submits claims for veterans and helps veterans navigate a "very confusing VA system." He said for veterans not to hesitate to call and ask for assistance. The phone number is 845-486-2060.

Anthony Kavouras is the Director of Veterans Programs, here at Mental Health America of Dutchess County. He stated there is the Vet2Vet program which allows veterans to meet with their peers. The group meets twice a month. It is free to veterans and families.

Kavouras also spoke about the HERO program, which assists homeless veterans and other veterans who might be in a situation where they could lose their houses. There is also the Vet-Tap program which helps veterans find employment.

"If there is a veteran who needs anything, send them my way. If we can't help them, we'll find out who can," said Kavouras.

recognize the volunteerism of late town resident Joseph Ennesser, Sr. The 2nd annual Joseph Ennesser Veterans 5K Walk/Run on April 16. Registration is now open. Participants can check-in on race day at 7 a.m. The race will begin at 8 a.m. at the Van Wyck Trailhead on Lake Walton Road. Proceeds will go towards the Wappinger Veterans Advisory Group, which is co-hosting the race with the town of Wappinger.

"All funds raised, through sponsorships and registrations, go to any number of veterans causes; service animals, veterans transport, Castle Point Food Pantry, Castle Point Community Outreach groups, veterans situational and financial opportunities," said Kevin Hathorn, Chair of the Wappinger Veterans Affairs and President of the Wappinger Veterans Advisory Group.

The 5K Walk/Run funds the Wappinger Veterans Advisory group, an incorporated 501c(3) organization. "We interface with many veterans organizations and assist them in their quest to make the lives of all ranges of veterans better and easier to live," said Hathorn. Sponsorships allow businesses to get to know the participants and vice versa, thereby assisting businesses as well as possibly learning how to cater to that audience, he said.

Ennesser was a resident of Wappinger for many years. Ennesser spent nearly 20 years as a coach and past president of the Town of Wappinger Little League. According to a press release, he was instrumental in beginning the Girls Softball program and the Big League in the 1970s. He was a proud part of the league when the boys brought home a New York State Championship in 1970.

"Joe Ennesser was a true servant to our community. He made it his life's work to improve the quality of life in the lives of children and adults here in the Town of Wappinger for decades. It is appropriate that this race, created to help others, is dedicated in his memory," remarked Joseph Cavaccini, County Legislator for

Ennesser was one of the cofounders of the Sports Museum of Dutchess County. He was inducted into its Hall of Fame in 1985 because of the work he did for Wappinger Recreation programs, according to information from the town officials.

# Renegades start strong, win 2 of 3 in opening series

The 2022 season for the Hudson Valley Renegades, the High Class A farm team of the New York Yankees, is off

Starting out on a nine-game road trip, the Renegades won two of their first three gmes of the year against the Greenville (S.C.) Drive.

After falling by one run on Friday night in the opener, 7-6, Hudson Valley was down to its final out on Saturday night, but rallied to force extra innings and earned an 8-6 win at Fluor Field.

And on Sunday afternoon, the Renegades never trailed as they defeated the Drive 9-4.

The Renegades grabbed an early lead three batters into the game when Austin Wells drove in Trey Sweeney with an RBI single. Two batters later, T.J. Rumfield drove in Everson Pereira with a double off the wall to take a 2-0 advantage.

Hudson Valley tacked on a run in the second on a

# DOCCS begins decommission process at Downstate Facility

Downstate Correctional Facility in Fishkill, a maximum-security prison, was closed last month. It was one of six facilities throughout the state that was targeted for closure last year by the NYS Department of Corrections and Community Supervision (DOCCS).

As for what is happening now with the site, a DOCCS statement to Southern Dutchess Group on April 7 read: "Upon closure of a facility, DOCCS begins the decommission process in order to protect the State assets for potential re-use."

The statement continued, "When the buildings are empty the decommissioning process includes shutting down the utilities to the facility, draining the water pipes, shutting off all electrical service to each building, and closing and boarding up the buildings in an effort to protect the state assets for sale and reuse. The process is a very detailed process with the design and construction oversight com-

pleted by the office of General Services. The process for design, bid, and construction is estimated to take 12 months."

The following facilities have officially been closed: Ogdensburg Correctional Facility, Moriah Shock Incarceration Correctional Facility, Willard Drug Treatment Campus, Southport Correctional Facility, Downstate Correctional Facility and Rochester Correctional Facility."

DOCCS works cooperatively with the Office of General Services and Economic Development to facilitate the re-use of the closed facilities, noted the statement.

Last month, in a statement DOCCS stated, "The Fiscal Year 2021-22 New York State budget that was voted on and approved by the Legislature authorized the Governor to close state prisons as the incarcerated population continues to decline and as a fiscally prudent and safe way to save taxpayer dollars."





Editor's note: Once again this year, Hudson Valley Renegades President Steve Gliner will conduct a weekly Q&A with writer Rich Thomaselli to discuss the team and minor league baseball.

So you're sitting in your office in Dutchess Stadium on a Sunday, which must mean the home season is around the corner. Other than being able to start the year with no restrictions or protocols due to COVID-19, what's different for 2022 at The Dutch?

Well it's April, so that's different for the Renegades anyway (laughs). Not for me personally, but certainly for this market. You have to remember, we didn't have a season at all in 2020 because of the pandemic. Then last year when we became affiliated with the Yankees and moved to long-season Class A, even then we didn't get started until the first week of May.

That's why we're pushing our marketing up starting this week. Our market knows the Renegades as a short-season, low A team that didn't start until June. We have to get out there and let the market know we have 66 home games, not 38.

# New marketing, ownership and top prospects lead way for 2022

What kind of marketing push are you talking about?

Well for starters, we increased our marketing budget. We're in more places and doing more things. It's so different now than it was five years ago. We're working with (a local marketing agency) to hit all the touch-points in terms of digital and radio and print and all those different types of media. There's so many different ways to do it now, so many more ways.

As far as the messaging, it's the things people are familiar with – we have 23 fireworks nights 10 giveaway nights. 'Find Your Fun' is our new slogan this year so we'll emphasize that. I think the biggest thing for us is to get the word out that we're playing in April and May. This market is so used to us starting in June. It's on us to really get that word out.

You have new ownership in Diamond Baseball Holdings after more than 25 years with The Goldklang Group. How has that been going so far?

It's been great. There are 11 teams under Diamond Baseball Holdings now. It's kind of nice, having the opportunity

to catch up with people that I do know, and to get to know others and share things. Diamond Baseball has an aggressive philosophy about the fan experience.

I know you don't have much to do with roster moves, but you have to be pleased the Yankees sent five of their top prospects to Hudson Valley to start 2022.

Oh, yeah. Trey Sweeney and Austin Wells are both first-round (draft) picks. And we didn't have a ton of players that are back from last year, which tells you that the Yankees are intent on moving their best players through the system. You can tell just from the fact that we had (shortstops) Oswald Peraza and Anthony Volpe here last year, and the Yankees think so much of them they didn't go after a big-name (free agent) shortstop for the big league club. Now Peraza is at Triple A and Volpe is at Double A. And the pitching throughout the system is amazing. There's going to be a lot of surprises with this organization. Over time, it's going to be really exciting to see players come through here. And you've got the Rachel Balkovec story.

Well you brought it up so let's end with that. Rachel is managing the Yanks' low Class A farm team in Tampa, of course the first female manager at any level in baseball history. I saw on a well-respected, highly regarded Yankees blog that she has a very good relationship with Yankees prospect Jasson Dominguez, who will start the season in Tampa, and that they could end up in Hudson Valley together. Your thoughts?

I've been exchanging texts and emails with Rachel and her story has been amazing. This might end up being one of the biggest things in baseball since Jackie Robinson broke the color barrier. They're not doing this for the gimmick; she's got the goods. I hope she manages here but, look, that's a story that's yet to be written. But she's very impressive. She actually learned to speak Spanish as part of her desire to be a better manager.

Pereira single, and two more in the third on a two-run home run by Cooper Bowman against Greenville starter Wyatt Olds. Wells brought in another run with a sacrifice fly in the fourth.

In his professional debut, Will Warren turned in a solid outing, allowing three runs on three hits in 3.1 innings. He walked three and struck out five while throwing 66 pitches.

Michael Giacone relieved Warren in the fourth and allowed a two-run home run to Joe Davis as the Drive cut the deficit to 6-4. The left-hander settled in from there and struck out five batters in 2.1 innings of relief in his 2022 season debut.

The 'Gades got some insurance in the top of the fifth when Aaron Palensky was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded to extend the lead to 7-4. Hudson Valley struck for two more runs in the top of the eighth on a run-scoring wild pitch and an RBI infield single from Pereira.

On his 21st birthday, Pereira finished 3for-5 with a run scored and two RBIs. He was one of three Renegades with a multihit game, joined by Sweeney and Rumfield, who had two each.

The Renegades were set to enjoy a day off on Monday before beginning a six-game series on Tuesday at the Rome (Ga.) Braves. First pitch in the opener is scheduled for 7 p.m.

# Will Yankees send Dominguez to play in Hudson Valley?

It's always the biggest question leading up to the Hudson Valley Renegades minor league baseball season every year.

Which of the top-rated players are we going to see at Dutchess Stadium this

Last year, the Renegades' first as the High Class A affiliate of the New York Yankees, fans were spoiled. Patrons at Dutchess Stadium got to see two of the top infield prospects in all of baseball in shortstops Anthony Volpe and Oswald Peraza – who could reach the Major Leagues by the end of this season or 2023, which is one reason why the Yankees did not acquire a high-priced free agent shortstop during the offseason.

Fans also got to see a highly prized pitcher in Ken Waldichuk.

This year?

The Yanks sent five of their top

prospects to Hudson Valley, including infielder Trey Sweeney and catcher Austin Wells, both first round draft picks.

But the player to watch is not here yet – Jasson Dominguez.

Just 19 years old, Dominguez, an outfielder, is one of the most hyped international prospects ever. The Yankees have been deliberate in bringing him along, with no need to rush him because of his age. Dominguez is already ranked No. 61 among MLB Pipeline's Top 100 Prospects – and No. 3 overall on the Yankees behind Volpe and Peraza.

Yankees director of player development Kevin Reese noted on MLB.com last month that he is comfortable at the rate Dominguez is being brought along.

"On all of our measurables, he's right up there with some of the elites in the Major Leagues — max exit velo, his running speed, overall power for his body type," Reese said. "It's really, really good. So I have no concerns with how that plays out over time."

Not to mention the fact that Dominguez is still not only a teenager, but he missed his entire first year of professional baseball when the 2020 minor league season was canceled.

To use direct deposit, simply check direct deposit on your tax return, then enter your bank's nine-digit routing number and your account number. For checking accounts, this information is available on your checks; for savings accounts, contact your bank.

If you opt to forgo the simplicity and convenience of direct deposit, make sure your mailing address is correct when requesting a refund check by mail. Any error can delay your refund.

# Prepare and file your income tax returns for free

Free File software is now available at the Tax Department website, www.tax.ny.gov. Taxpayers with income of \$73,000 or less in 2021 can electronically complete and submit their federal and New York State income tax returns online at no cost.

To be directed to the free filing options, simply click Free File your income tax return on the Tax Department's website. It's easy, fast, and secure.

To ensure you're not charged a fee, you must go to the Tax Department's website to complete your return. You'll save on preparation fees, prevent costly errors, and ensure that you receive any refund you're owed in the most efficient way possible.

### Check your refund status

Taxpayers can also quickly view the status of their New York State tax refund anytime by using the Check your Refund application on the Tax Department website: www.tax.ny.gov. It's the fastest and most convenient way to know when to expect your refund. It's updated daily and provides the same information available to our phone representatives—only without the wait!

# The Russian invasion of Ukraine: A human rights problem

As Russian troops pull back their positions to prepare for a new attack on Kyiv and other communities in Eastern Ukraine, we learn of the unfolding horrors of countless atrocities against unarmed, defenseless civilians, especially children. While the Ukraine is 4,723 miles from Poughkeepsie, the battle scars can and will affect us for decades to come. What is happening there is very relevant to Wappinger, NY. WE MUST CARE ABOUT WHAT HAPPENS IN THE UKRAINE in VIOLATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS, most specially the abuse and murder of children. Thus, we need to ensure that our State and National elected officials do much more about the atrocities and the underlying fundamental humanitarian rights issues.

The Russian war against the Ukrainian people is deeply rooted in a long, tortious history of Russian paranoia, racism, imperialism, political intrigue, and corruption. Russian annexation of Crimea, its stranglehold on Belorussia, and the invasion of the Ukraine, exemplify a very dangerous Russian authoritarian fascism with strong imperialistic tendencies.

When the world faced a similar imperialistic fascism during World War II, a great American and Dutchess County resident, Elanor Roosevelt, stood firmly in defense of humanitarian principles. The 'First Lady of the World" was a trailblazer in protecting human rights. As one of the authors of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (the "UDHR") (now being attacked by Russia), she called upon the world community never again to let up in fighting to protect fundamental human and civil rights. Elanor Roosevelt is remembered especially for pointing out why human rights are for every one of us, in all parts of our daily lives:

"Where, after all, do universal human rights begin? In small places, close to home - so close and so small that they cannot be seen on any maps of the world. Yet they are the world of the individual person; the neighborhood he lives in; the school or college he attends; the factory, farm, or office where he works. Such are the places where every man, women, and child seeks equal justice, equal opportunity, equal dignity without discrimination. Unless these rights have meaning there, they have little meaning anywhere. Without concerted citizen action to uphold them close to home, we shall look in vain for progress in the larger world."

Elanor Roosevelt espoused that all humans are free and equal, regardless of creed, color, beliefs, or religion. Thirty (30) fundamental rights and freedoms are set out in the UDHR. One of those, Article 5, declares that no one has the right to subject anyone to cruel or inhuman treatment. Regularly, the Wappinger Town Board takes action to address issues

that impact human rights locally as proclaimed in the UDHR.

On April 11th, the Town Board issued a proclamation focusing on the underlying rights of children not to be abused under Article 5.

The Town Board declared April 2022 as Child Abuse Prevention Month. Statistics have shown that 1 in 10 children will be sexually abused before their 18th birthday. Five children die each day in the US. In Dutchess County, over 1000 cases of child abuse are reported each year and about 5x as many go unreported. As part of our initiative, we are committed to working with local organizations in preventing and stopping the abuse, neglect and maltreatment of children. Our Board meeting kicked off the importance of increasing awareness on the warning signs to recognize and report the abuse of children. And, we recognized importance of families and the greater Wappinger community working together to strengthen families to prevent child

In this regard, I invited Kimberly Haight, Executive Director of The Center for the Prevention of Child Abuse to speak to the Town Board and residents about child abuse. Ms. Haight has been in the nonprofit sector for all of her career. She started in case management and others were quickly motivated by her leadership. She has been the Executive Director of The Center for nearly 5 years. Since assuming her role, she has rapidly expanded the therapeutic opportunities available to victims and their families by adding victim advocates, trauma therapists, and one facility dog named Peace to the CPCA. Prior to this position, she was Vice President leading a team at a local United Way.

Although there is no easy solution, we must start TODAY by showing a strong backbone in defending the interests of human rights.

# Autism Awareness - parents stress care at Anderson Center

One "loves to play basketball" while the other has "an infectious laugh that can make your worst day turn bright.

We're talking about Henry and Nate two of the many special students at Anderson Center for Autism in

April is Autism Awareness Month and many parents are particularly appreciative of the special care all children receive at Anderson Center.

Meet Chip Loewenson and his wife, Susan Brune, and Alison and Edward Meehan as they talk about their sons.

Chip says Henry is near the middle of the Autism spectrum and has limited language, far better receptive than expressive language. On Henry's love for basketball, Chip says "While he does not understand team play and defense, he has a precise shot from many distances. He impresses other kids on the court."

He and his wife contacted Anderson Center when Henry was 19 years old. "The application process was thorough, but the people at Anderson were kind and comforting," said Chip. "We have been so impressed by the Anderson teachers, therapists, and administration. It is a very well-run organization."

On life at Anderson, Chip said Henry "seems very content and happy. He is 25 years old, so like any 25-year-old, he likes being independent from his parents. He gets excellent care at his group home and gets along with the five other guys there. The staff members were real heroes during COVID-19, especially in the early days, showing up every day no matter what."

Susan serves on the board of the

Anderson Foundation, which helps to raise funds to support the Center. "It is a cause near and dear to our hearts," said

Nate is 15. Alison said, on the Autism spectrum, he is what most would classify as severe. He is non-verbal, but his receptive language skills always astonish most that know him. "He is lovable and enjoys giving lots of hugs."

She and Edward reside in Delaware, so they do not have the opportunity to visit Nate as often as other families at Anderson Center. "When we come to visit, we make sure to bring lots of snacks, activities such as puzzles and videos of his favorite shows," said Alison. "Nate will sit calmly for a good half-hour, however, he typically gets a little antsy as the visit continues. We keep the visits to no more than about an hour-and-a-half."

Nate was accepted into Anderson in late 2019 and started attending right before the pandemic in 2020.

"We were advised to wait a few months to visit," said Alison. "When the time came to drive up to see Nate, we couldn't believe how healthy he looked. He had lost weight (which he most likely needed to), and appeared calm. Nate has progressed at Anderson. He follows directions more than we've ever witnessed. We realize our son is very complex and are so grateful for any little bits of progress he makes. Anderson is all about collaborative teaching and care."

She added, "Nate's father and I can't express enough our gratitude for Anderson's commitment and dedication to helping our son. Working with these children is incredibly challenging. It takes a very special person to do what the staff at Anderson does on

Said Patrick Paul, CEO and Executive Director of Anderson Center for Autism, "According to the Centers for Disease Control, 1 in 44 are now diagnosed with autism, which means that most of us know someone who has been impacted. That said, every one of us is really a part of the autism community in some way; we all share a collective responsibility to build a culture of inclusivity.

"Autism Awareness Month gives us a chance to take pause and consider ways to educate and enlighten our communities. Active cases and community transmission rates continue to rise across New York State. In Dutchess County, confirmed cases doubled in the past week, and the community transmission rate has jumped. However, the CDC still rates Dutchess as a county with a low risk of transmission for fully vaccinated individuals.

It should be noted that data related to active cases is accrued only from test results from approved labs; home testing results don't show up in the official numbers.

Hospitalizations are about the same week over week; and for the second consecutive week, no deaths related to COVID-19 have been reported.

Active cases: 316 (up from 174 on April 3)

Community transmission: 21.45 per 100,000 (up from 13.96 on April 3)

**Hospitalizations due to COVID-19:** 6 (up from 4 on April 3)

Hospitalizations of individuals with COVID-19: 8 (down from 9 on April 3)

**Total deaths:** 655 (unchanged from April 3)

% population 18+ with at least one dose of vaccine: 85.42 (slightly up from April 3, when it was 85.31) % of total county population with at least one dose of vaccine: 76.95

(slightly up from 76.85 on April 3)

% of total county population that has completed their vaccine series: 69.38 (slightly up from 69.27 on April 3)

The county dashboard doesn't include data on boosters; however, according to the CDC, 51.4 percent of the county's fully vaccinated population has received a booster, up slightly from 51.2 percent on April 3.



# He refused to die

Former County Cooperative Extension leader Director Les Rollins writes a book.

"I can't lose my memory – that's all I've got."

Les Rollins was entering rehab after three blood clots were removed from his brain. The rehabilitation was a success, but after a few more health scares – open heart surgery, a broken leg, a pacemaker – Les decided he'd better start writing stuff down.

Now, at age 95, Les Rollins has published his autobiography, "I Refused to Die." As the title suggests, his life story is full of joy and optimism, with a few setbacks and sorrows, but always with a sunny outlook and an eye on the future.

Les is perhaps best known as the executive director of Cornell Cooperative Extension Dutchess County from 1971 to 1983. When he joined extension in 1963, it was in "really bad shape," Les writes.

He presided over the construction of the present day Farm and Home Center on Route 44 in Washington Hollow, consolidating the three arms of extension – Agriculture, Home Economics and 4-H – under one roof. He improved relations with the community and the local newspaper, bringing extension into the modern era. (Nowadays Cornell Cooperative Dutchess County consists of four program areas – Agriculture and Horticulture, Environment and Energy, Family and Consumer Education, and 4-H and Youth Development).

Leslie Rollins spent his early years working on his dad's farm in far northern Vermont, along with his three brothers. They milked cows, boiled maple syrup, dug potatoes, and cut timber for a nearby paper mill, all with a bare minimum of

mechanization.

Less started his career in extension as an associate agent in Franklin County, N.Y. at an annual salary of \$3,300. He began designing dairy barns in the new "free stall" style, which allows cows to roam within their stalls instead of being confined. His interest in construction led to the founding of the local construction company Rollins Associates, Inc., on his "retirement" in 1984.

I became friends with Les during the many years we appeared before the Dutchess County Legislature to beg (I can't think of a more appropriate term) for money to keep the local extension in business. During Les' tenure, the county's demographics were pivoting from agriculture to residential development. Of the 280 local dairy farms in 1970, only 24 remain today. Land that my family rented to grow sweet corn became Vassar College student housing, or a gravel pit. Extension started offering more programs that served urban communities, to gain the attention of innercity county legislators.

Funding is still a challenge, as I guess it is for everybody.




