Sports Museum to open new Ralph Holt Learning Center

Ceremony set for Saturday in Wappinger

The Sports Museum of Dutchess County, in the town of Wappinger at 72 Carnwath Lane, will open on April 29. There will be a ribbon-cutting ceremony at noon for the new Ralph Holt Learning Center located at the museum.

"The center will feature access to archives and newspaper articles, sports related games and access to educational

databases," said William "Bill" Ponte, who is a president of the Sports Museum of Dutchess County Board.

"We are grateful that Dutchess County provided support for this endeavor through its Learn, Play, and Create grant. We believe that the center will be a unique resource for children and teens interested in local sports history," said Ponte.

Holt was a well-known resident in Wappinger. He died at the age of 93 in September 2022.

"Throughout his life of dedication to Wappinger's youth, Ralph Holt was a living treasure of our community. On Saturday April 29th, the Sports Museum of Dutchess County will honor Ralph by dedicating a learning center in his name

Renegades start successful 12-game road trip

ROME, GA. — The Hudson Valley Renegades started a 12-game road trip this week. But being away from the cozy confines of Heritage Financial Park didn't seem to bother them. Hudson Valley won the first three games in Rome against the Braves before finally losing and then picked right back up again to take four of the first five games in the series.

Hudson Valley won 8-2, 8-4 and 10-4 before losing 8-0 on Friday night, and then won again on Saturday, 3-2.

Juan Carela turned in his best start as a Renegade on Saturday. The right-hander threw 5.2 innings of no-hit ball, striking out eight and walking three before giving way to Carlos Gomez. In his last two starts, Carela

has thrown 10.0 shutout innings while striking out 17 batters and yielding two hits.

In the top of the 10th inning, Hudson Valley's Spencer Jones lifted a sacrifice fly to centerfield off Tyler Owens (0-1) to put the Renegades in front 2-1. Alexander Vargas then tripled and scored on a Caleb Durbin RBI single to run the advantage to 3-1.


Nick Paciorek allowed the automatic runner to score in the bottom of the 10th, but retired all three batters he faced to close out the 3-2 victory and earn his first save of the season.

The Renegades, the high Class A Farm team of the New York Yankees, were scheduled to play twice more in Rome, and then move on to a six-game series in Greenville, S.C.

Annual Heart Walk set for Saturday at Walkway Over the Hudson

The Dutchess-Ulster Heart Walk is set for April 29, at the Walkway Over the Hudson State Park. Participants may start on either side and walk any time between 9 and 11 a.m. There will be opening remarks at 9 a.m. on both sides of the bridge.

Two survivors who are to be recognized during the annual walk are Judy Seals and Jeanette Rodriguez.

Seals explained, "I was 90% blocked in my right coronary artery. [I] had stents put in, and three days later had to redo the procedure and get additional stents, as the blockage was still there." That was in 2006. She was in South Carolina for her daughter's college graduation.

As for her health today, Seals stated, "I have an office visit every six months with my cardiologist. I am on medication to lower my cholesterol and prevent additional heart issues. I luckily suffered no major heart damage and I continue to do all the right things for my body, to hopefully reduce any related risk factors. A lifetime change, eating better and exercising, is a must. As a result, my health continues to improve."

Rodriguez commented, "I experienced severe pre-eclampsia during my first pregnancy that caused high blood pressure. I had to undergo an emergency C-section. Between the high blood pressure and the stress, I was having palpitations for a long time after, and still do. I do need to rest when these happen. I do watch what I eat a low salt, low cholesterol diet to keep my blood pressure in line. Since my pregnancy, I do have a tendency towards HBP (high blood pressure), so this is something that I carefully monitor as needed."

Regarding what she is doing now concerning her health, Rodriguez said, "I am regularly seeing a cardiologist. I've lost about 10 pounds since the BetterU program, and am hoping to go a little more." The American Heart Association offers the BetterU program to assist women with heart-healthy lifestyle choices.

and memory. What an outstanding way to continue to recognize Ralph's legacy. Hats off to Bill and Barb Ponte and the Sports Museum for dedicating this precious memorial," said Town of Wappinger Supervisor Richard Thurston.

Holt, who had five sons with his wife Sylvia, was a manager and served as president for the Town of Wappinger Little League and the girls' softball league. According to Southern Dutchess News archives information, the teams coached by Holt would go on to win a number of championships, including the All-Star team in the 1970s that he managed.

Holt, who was a U.S. Navy veteran, was the chairman for the Town of Wappinger Recreation Department. Dutchess County Executive William

F.X. O'Neil said, "Ralph Holt was a Town of Wappinger icon who meant so much to the local athletic community – not only in his beloved town, but throughout Dutchess County." The county executive noted, "I'm proud that a grant from Dutchess County's successful Learn, Play, Create: Supporting Our Kids program has helped make the Ralph Holt Research Center at the Sports Museum of Dutchess County a reality. May future generations of fans learn of our County's rich sports history at this new facility and, in the process, keep Ralph's legacy alive."

Joseph Cavaccini, who represents Wappinger in the Dutchess County Legislature, said, "Last year, we lost a pillar of our community. Ralph Holt dedicated five decades of his life to improving the lives of children through sports here in Wappinger and it is only fitting that this new center of learning is dedicated in his memory. I anticipate the center will carry on Ralph's call to service in life, to help our youth through sports and recreation."

In the learning center there are computers where children, teens and visitors can search for more information on local sports icons like Tyler Adams, a professional soccer player from Wappinger who was the U.S. men's national team captain in the 2022 FIFA World Cup, and Joe Panik, from East Fishkill, who played for Major League Baseball. He played for the San Francisco Giants, New York Mets, Toronto Blue Jays and Miami Marlins. He was an All-Star in 2015.

One can learn about Melio Bettina, a Beacon resident, who was the 1939 Light Heavyweight Champion of the World. His niece, Angela Bettina, is on the Wappinger Town Board.

Major League games for the Athletics during the 1947 season. He started with the International League in 1946 and the following year made his only Major League appearance. In April 19, 1947, debut for the Athletics, he was a runner against the Ebbets Field Red Sox. Westrum languished on the bench in the early part of the campaign, getting only 11 at bats. He became the May call-up to the Giants' Triple-A team in the 1951 pennant race in which the Giants, 13 games behind the Brooklyn Dodgers on August 12, fought back to win 16 games in a row and finished the season tied with the Dodgers for first place. Westrum contributed 20 home runs with 70 runs batted in, and led National League catchers in base runners caught stealing. The two teams met in the 1951 National League tie-breaker series in which the Giants' season was dimmed by Bobby Thomson's Shot Heard Round the World, a three-run home run in the bottom of the ninth inning for a 5-4 win in the third and final playoff game. Afterwards, the Giants would lose to the New York Yankees in the 1951 World Series. His 1952 season was plagued by injuries and he only managed to hit for a .220 batting average in 114 games, although he still managed to finish second to Del Rice among catchers in assists. Westrum left the Giants starting catcher throughout the 1954 season, catching all four games in the 1954 World Series against the Cleveland Indians. At the end of the 1957 season he entered retirement. By 1965 he was brought on by the New York Mets as their new Manager, a role he held for two years. At 79 years old, Wally died on September 17, 1943 with the New York Sheriff. His exemplar major minor.

'Keeping it Real with G'Ma' to help those who lost loved ones to overdose

"Keeping it Real with G'Ma" grief support group will hold meetings the second Thursday of every month. The group is for people who have lost someone to drug addiction. The group meets at River Valley Arts center, Bly Studio, 9 S. Mesier Ave., in Wappingers Falls, from 6:30-8 p.m.

"We have named the group Keeping it Real with G'Ma Grief Support after our grandson, Matthew, died, as part of the Matt Herring Foundation. [It was] formed in our grandson's memory," said Sharon Herring, who runs the group with her husband, Jimmy. The couple started the group to help families deal with the stigma of addiction.

"We ran that for about three years until COVID hit. We did not start that back up because we no longer had 'our finger on the pulse.' Things have changed in the drug world with fentanyl, Medicated Assisted Treatment and harm reduction. At this point, we feel we don't relate to those struggling with today's addiction issues. One thing that has not changed is our grief. Through the years, we have been approached to run a support group just for families that have lost a loved one to an overdose. Recently, four people expressed the need, so Jimmy and I decided that we could not turn a deaf ear to them," Herring explained. The McHoul Funeral Home sent the Herrings for grief training and to learn how to run such a group.

"People that attend this support group

can expect to be respected as they navigate their way through the grief after losing a loved one to an overdose," said Herring.

She explained, "Unlike other support groups where you could be sitting next to a parent that lost a 4-year-old to cancer, the person attending this group will be surrounded by peers (Families that have suffered through the hardships of addiction and now sadly, a death.)"

The Herrings told River Valley Art Center of their decision to start the group and they offered them a home for the group. "We selected the River Valley Arts Center as this is so centrally located to many people that have suffered a loss. We do not require registration at this point. Grief is a hard thing to navigate. Putting one foot in front of the other can be difficult. Intending to come and being able to actually show up is a challenge. We understand that. People will come when they are ready and when they can," explained Herring.

As for the mission, Herring said, "The mission of this group is to create a safe place where people who are grieving can share when they are ready to or pass and just listen to others. Grief doesn't stop, and until the person has reached a place of acceptance and understanding, it helps to be able to express themselves without judgement. Hopefully, they will take away some tools that might help them with the process."

Ongoing robbery investigation results in arrests

The Dutchess County Sheriff's Office Detective Bureau reports the arrests of three individuals in connection with a home-invasion style robbery which occurred at a residence in the Town of Pleasant Valley on July 2, 2022. The defendants, along with their associated charges and arraignment information, are as follows:

Marlon Washington, 47 of Poughkeepsie (City). Charged with Robbery 1st and 2nd degree, Burglary 1st degree, Kidnapping 2nd degree, Criminal Possession of a Weapon 2nd degree, and Conspiracy 4th degree (all felonies). Arrested on Nov. 17, 2022, arraigned before the Town of Union Vale Court and remanded to the Dutchess County Jail with no bail.

Jimmy Peraltamarte, 22 of Poughkeepsie (City). Charged with the same charges as Mr. Washington. Arrested on March 2, 2023, arraigned before the Town of Pleasant Valley Court and remanded to the Dutchess County Jail in lieu of \$100,000 cash bail or \$200,000 bond.

Miguel Lora, 47 of Poughkeepsie (City). Charged with Robbery 1st & 2nd degree and Burglary 1st degree (all felonies). Indicted by a Grand Jury and arraigned in County Court on April 12, 2023 while already being held at the

Dutchess County Jail on a probation violation from an unrelated charge.

The three defendants above are accused of participating in an armed robbery at a Pleasant Valley residence on July 2, 2022, during which cash was stolen and two victims suffered minor injuries. The incident was not random and there was no danger to the public as a whole; it is alleged that these particular victims were specifically targeted for the robbery. Information was previously withheld because this investigation has been a complex one which relied heavily on confidentiality to be successful.

The Sheriff's Office was assisted in the investigation by the Dutchess County District Attorney's Office and City of Poughkeepsie Police. As with any criminal case the charges described above are merely accusations and all three defendants are presumed innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.

State, county civil service agencies offer online exams for correction officers

The New York State Department of Civil Service (DCS) announced that 40 county civil service agencies are now offering an online civil service examination for Correction Officers to help improve recruitment for these critical public safety titles. The exam, which is being offered as an online exam for many counties for the first time, is used to fill positions in county jails.

Qualified candidates can apply for the exam through May 12 through their local civil service agency, then access and complete the online exam from June 1-30.

New York State also offers an online Correction Officer Trainee exam for positions located at New York State Department of Corrections and Community Supervision (DOCCS) correctional facilities. For more information and to access this online exam, visit <https://www.cs.ny.gov/testing/dec-instrument/cot-overview.cfm>.

Individuals interested in pursuing a career as a local Correction Officer must first apply for the exam this May through their local civil service agency, then access and complete the online exam by June 30. The online exam will require candidates to provide information about

their training and experience with an online questionnaire that is completed and submitted by the candidate.

Candidates should be prepared to provide information about their education and employment history to be able to respond to the questions on the questionnaire accurately.

Correction Officers complete a basic training course following appointment and can gain status as a New York State Peace Officer. The position also includes generous benefits including paid leave, health benefits, and retirement plans and opportunities for promotion.

According to estimates by the New York State Sheriffs Association, there are more than 1,000 correction officer positions to fill in counties across the state. DOCCS also has an ongoing need to fill correction officer positions across the state with over 1,000 positions immediately available.

Messinger: 'Some ways... a pivotal year for me'

Even when he is not at his best, Zach Messinger is at his best.

Messinger lost his first start of the season in an 8-0 loss to the Rome Braves. Messinger (0-1) lasted 5.1 innings, allowing three runs on four hits, walking one and matching his season-high by striking out seven. The right-hander has struck out 20 batters in 16.1 innings across three starts this season.

Most importantly, he has bought into the Yankee philosophy that it doesn't matter what his final records are, just that he is throwing well.

So far, so good.

"I try not to look too much at stats," he said. "I have faith in my abilities, and I know when I'm doing well, and I just have to trust that the powers-that-be see it as well."

Messinger feels like he has much to prove though. He wasn't chosen until the 13th round of the 2021 amateur draft, the 393rd pick overall, out of the University of Virginia. At 6-6, he has a perfect pitcher's body, a live fastball, and he continues to work on its breaking stuff.

Even with the loss on Friday night, Messinger earned run average is still 2.20. And he's still relatively young, especially having to call. Messinger won't turn 24 until October.

"In some ways, I think this is a pivotal year for me," he said. "I'm young, and I've only been in professional ball for a couple of years. But have to breakthrough."

Messinger is scheduled to start again this week when the Renegades go to Greenville, South Carolina, for another six-game series.

TYSON'S TIDBITS!

Renegades manager's role differs from a Major League GM

Every week, reporter Rich Thomaselli will sit down with Tyson Jeffers, the general manager of the Hudson Valley Renegades. These are his thoughts on the team in particular, and minor league baseball in general.

Please explain to people that just because the team goes on the road for two weeks, you don't. You and your staff still have responsibilities to take care of.

That is 100% true. Yeah, it doesn't just slow down. I like to tell people that we go from 'on' to another mode. On game days and during the offseason, we're a little bit more traditional with the nine to five. And then when we have games during the season, we're kind of on almost 24/7. So, it never stops. Once the team is on the road, it does give us an opportunity to take a little bit of a breather and go home to

our families at a normal time. But we're still planning for the next home stand and making sure that we're doing everything we can to build out the experience for the next set of games.


Has anything changed, or will we see anything different when the Renegades come home in a week?

I think there's already been some player changes, but that's the Yankees' deal. I don't make any changes or trade or anything like that, and neither did Steve (Gliner). I just concentrate on the business side of things and the operations of the ballpark. But we are thrilled when a player gets called up and is able to continue his career... Like I said, it's about checking all the boxes that were left unchecked. ... People recognize the job title, and they immediately equate it with a major league general manager. It doesn't

work that way. It can be confusing, but basically the Yankees take care of the players, and we take care of our fans. So, there is a coordinated effort in all that. But when it comes to the players and the relationships of players, and how players are moving up and moving down, those are all decisions made by the Yankees.

Has anything come up at a league level, like 'Hey, I heard about this, so we should try it.'

Yes, so once a month the Sally League, we get together on a conference call. We talk about a lot of things. Some of those include operations and like, hey, how you dealing with this? How you doing with staffing? How you doing with promotions? But yeah, when we look across the industry, our promotions team and our sales team, they're always looking at different ideas that teams are finding success



with and we usually pinpoint those. There's a lot of copycatting in the industry, but the audiences are different. What is working in Oklahoma City, for instance, may also work in Hudson Valley.

Based on your impressions from the first homestand, how has the crowd been, and how has their reaction been?

I think in many ways, we are still educating our fans. Remember, for decades we started this season in the middle of June. They are not used to baseball in April. Luckily, the weather has been cooperating. We will see about that in another week when they come home again. Starting so early can be a shock to some people. But the numbers are up in April compared to last year, and we'll see what happens in our bread-and-butter months of June, July and August.

love to cook



There's something so special about spring air. Nothing else smells quite as good. And it has a way of whetting the appetite, not only giving us a desire for all things fresh and spring, but I find I'm craving things coming into season. Strawberries definitely fit the bill.

I recently made a fluffy cheesecake, which put me in mind of saucing it up, though I resisted and kept it pure. But then came an opportunity to put on a dessert bar featuring ice cream and various toppings and, well, strawberries once again came to mind. This time I acted on the urge and made a lovely sauce for the occasion, so how could I not share?

Strawberry sauce, even when the beloved berries aren't in season, is tempting enough. But when you think of ruby red, ripe, in-season jewels that are harbingers of spring? It takes it to another level. And so, with fresh spring air doing its thing, I jumped the gun a bit in anticipation of local berry season and started practicing a little early.

As it turns out, strawberry sauce is not only delicious but also very easy to make and comes together in minutes, a plus when you need a quick fix or have occasion to make it at the last minute. Another great thing about this recipe is that you can make it anytime the craving hits, no matter the season. I prefer fresh berries, which are usually available, though you could certainly use thawed frozen berries if the need arose. It's forgiving because

even off-season berries are made better with sugar and a bit of fresh lemon juice. That said, I can only imagine how much better it will be with local berries in-season and, trust me, I'll be finding that out firsthand as soon as possible!

There's no real trick to this. I tried it two ways but found adding a little cornstarch mixed with water helped thicken it without as long a wait and didn't affect the flavor at all. Just put 1 part cornstarch and 2 parts water in a cup and mix well with a fork to dissolve any lumps and make a smooth slurry. If you opt to forego that step your results will be just as delicious. It will just take longer for it to reduce down and naturally thicken on its own. I apologize in advance that, when I tried it without cornstarch, I didn't note how long that process took. I'll hazard a guess and say about 20 minutes. Still not long and definitely worth the wait!

HOMEMADE STRAWBERRY SAUCE

This recipe calls for fresh berries, which I think is the way to go, not just because I'm a fan of all things fresh but also because the consistency and presentation will be better. You really want the pieces of fruit to show and retain their shape. For that reason, too, I cut the berries coarsely, about a half-inch dice. I also strongly recommend resisting the urge to puree the sauce when it's done cooking. It will look more like frozen

strawberry margarita mix and be a cloudy dark pink rather than a glossy ruby red.

INGREDIENTS

- 1lb fresh strawberries, rinsed, hulled and coarsely chopped
- 1/3 cup sugar (a little more if you like it really sweet or your berries aren't as ripe)
- 1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice (from 1/2 a lemon)
- 3 tablespoons water
- 1 tablespoon cornstarch mixed with 2 tablespoons water
- 1/2 teaspoon pure vanilla extract (good quality)

METHOD

- In a medium saucepan, combine berries, sugar, lemon juice and 3 tablespoons water and give it a stir. You don't have to be gentle; mashing the berries a bit makes them release some of their lovely juice.

- Add the cornstarch slurry and stir to combine. Cook over medium heat until it starts to bubble a bit. Add vanilla and reduce heat. Simmer until it thickens, stirring occasionally, about 5 minutes.

- Remove from heat, give another stir and allow to cool just enough to serve.

- This will keep in the fridge for about a week. It will set up a bit as it cools. If too

thick, warm it up and add a little water if necessary.

It's easy, it's pretty and it tastes and smells amazing. Why wouldn't you make it? I like serving it warm on top of ice cream, cheesecake, waffles and in yogurt, but really, the sky's the limit. I confess I even ate a few spoonfuls just because I could (and at the time didn't have anything to put it on). Yeah, it's that good. So get your strawberry fix whenever you want but please revisit it when local fresh berries are in season and see what a difference it makes. And tell your friends! Or, better yet, share some with them. Enjoy!
