Pencils, papers and chess boards and pieces. That is what one saw in the Glenham Elementary School gymnasium on April 21. The room was set up for the inaugural Chess Club Tournament.

The Chess Club has 27 members. The club has been in existence for four years now said Joseph Lopez, a Glenham elementary teacher who is the club's advisor.

'You have got to play with someone you have not played with before." Lopez told the students who were taking part in the tournament. The tournament started on April 19. There were five matches. Three matches were held the first day and

two the second day. "Are we ready? Thumbs up," Lopez told the students.

The first 30-minute match began.

The students, about 30 to 40 percent who knew a little bit about the game when the 10-week session began, according to Lopez, were concentrated and focused.

"They're just having fun. They're being kids," said Lopez, who noted they talked about etiquette and sportsmanship. Ben Gilleo, a Beacon High School

senior, assisted with the running of the tournament.

"This is one of the coolest things I've ever seen," Ben said. "It gets young

leveling off following soaring infections in fall and winter, active cases have been rising for the last month or so in the Northeast and right here in Dutchess County. A highly transmissible sub-vari-ant of omicron called BA.2 is the latest culprit; the Centers for Disease Control

and Prevention (CDC) recently estimated that more than 90 percent of all new COVID cases in the Northeast are caused by BA.2.

That said, hospitalizations and deaths – these are called "lagging indicators" because they don't start rising until several weeks into a new wave - are still relatively low. Does this suggest that BA.2 is milder than previous variants?

And how should we interpret data such as active cases? With the preva-lence of home testing, there's no way to know how many positive results (or negative results, for that matter) are

actually being reported. Last week, we spoke to Dr. Livia Santiago-Rosado, MD, FACEP, Commissioner of the Dutchess County Department of Behavioral and Community Health (DBCH), about these and other questions. Her answers reflected a watchful, respectful approach to a virus that truly isn't done with us yet.

Q: We seem to be at a place now where, although cases are increasing due to the highly contagious omicron sub-variant, hospitalizations and deaths are not reflecting that trend. Does this point to a sub-variant that is even milder, relatively speaking, than the omicron variant seen in the U.S. this past fall and winter?

"I think that's a complicated question. I don't know that we can make that assertion," said Dr. Santiago-Rosado. "The data we have does not suggest that it's milder than omicron; [the virus is] encountering a more protected population, through vaccination and [previously infected] people.'

She encouraged taking measures to increase the chances that, if infected, you can get through it without severe illness or hospitalization.

probably mirroring measles transmissibility," Dr. Santiago-Rosado said, "but there have been so many layers [of protection]; it's becoming very difficult to predict all

people continue the familiar mitigation efforts, "anything that we can do to tamp down the possibility of transmission, and if there is transmission to be [as safe as possible]," she said.

Q: With the increase of home-testing, how accurate a picture are we getting of active cases?

They're much more difficult to interpret, because we don't know what we don't know," Dr. Santiago-Rosado said. "I don't know how many people are taking home tests and testing positive and not reporting [or how many are testing negative]. The best we can do is look at the trends more than the specific numbers.

"But when we do look at the trends, certainly since the second or third week of March we've seen a steady increase [in active cases and community transmission] ... but as you noted we have not seen the [increase in] hospitalization and deaths," said Dr. Santiago-Rosado. "That's certainly hopeful, but I would still stay cautious."

Accessibility to and availability of antiviral medications could be one reason for lower hospitalizations and deaths.

'Some of those testing positive might be hopefully reaching out to their primary care physician," she said.

Dr. Santiago-Rosado noted that the BA.2 sub-variant is breaking off into "sub-subvariants, [and] we don't know if they're going to behave differently."

Protecting ourselves as much as possible is key, she said.

The Health Commissioner referenced the low rate of pediatric vaccination. While she understands that parents are weighing the risks and benefits of vaccinating their children, it's still a concern.

Molinaro presents 2022 State of the County

Dutchess County Executive Marc Molinaro presented his 2022 State of the County Address on April 20 at the Stissing Center in Pine Plains, as residents, business and nonprofit leaders, as well as local and state officials, attended to hear the County Executive's vision for the coming year.

"The state of Dutchess County remains strong, as our County has overcome unforeseen obstacles and come through the other side more united and robust than ever," County Executive Molinaro told the more guests in attendance. "Today we are poised for more growth and prosperity because of our decade-long commitment to smart, fiscally conservative and compassionate government. To continue along this path, we must redouble our efforts to keep Dutchess County safe and affordable, creating opportunities and optimism for every County resident."

During his address, the County Executive highlighted priorities for Dutchess County in 2022:

Affordability

Since taking office in January 2012, County Executive Molinaro has employed sound, conservative fiscal leadership to not only close the \$40 million budget gap Dutchess County Government faced when he began his tenure, but bring the County's fund balance to \$60 million entering 2022.

In light of recent inflation, the highest the nation and county have experienced in four decades, Dutchess County remains committed to fiscal responsibility that cuts costs and delivers relief, whenever possible. County Executive Molinaro has provided local residents unprecedented tax relief in 2022, including the eighth straight property tax reduction, cutting the tax levy by \$5.5 million – the largest tax cut in County history – and the seventh consecutive property tax rate decrease for homeowners and businesses, cutting the rate by 10 percent, all without reducing services to residents.

This year, the County Executive led the way with additional tax relief for residents and businesses, including:

• Elimination of County tax on clothing and footwear items up to \$110, becoming only the ninth county in the state and the first in the Hudson Valley to provide such relief;

• Cutting and capping the County tax on gasoline, limiting the County tax on fuel to just \$.08 per gallon, no matter the purchase; and

• Continuing to fund the County's Municipal Innovation Grant (MIG) program, which in 2022 focuses on projects that improve quality of life, and strengthen and develop communities, reducing residents' local taxes through shared services.

Dutchess County spends 28 percent less per capita than the statewide county average; has a tax levy that is 27 percent lower per capita than the statewide county average; and has outstanding debt that is 50 percent lower per capita than the statewide county average. Additionally, Standard & Poor's has again reaffirmed Dutchess County's AA+ bond rating, the highest among any county in New York.

Safety

During these times, Molinaro has supported the safety of Dutchess County residents, including urging State leaders to change the bail system and discovery rules, which have led to an increase in crime.

To further safeguard County residents, Molinaro has renewed his commitment to protect by dedicating resources and funding to programs and initiatives that provide for public safety, including:

• Partnering with Westchester Medical Center Health Network to develop a stateof-the-art behavioral health Center for Excellence bringing 60 mental health professionals and in-patient beds to create one of the largest behavioral health systems in New York State;

• Investing opioid settlement funds to develop the Law Enforcement Assisted Diversion (LEAD) program, a community-based diversion approach which focuses on a harm-reduction/housing-first framework which allows officers to redirect low-level offenders engaged in drug or other risky activity to communitybased services, instead of jail and prosecution;

• Expanding the successful Intensive Treatment Alternatives Program (ITAP), an alternative to incarceration for those in the grip of substance use disorder;

• Supporting the overall health of the community with a mobile vehicle, planned for deployment later this year, which will bring operations to every region of the County, offering immunizations, case work, sexually transmitted disease testing and education, veterans counseling, group sessions, referrals to community providers and more;

• Investing \$10 million in American Rescue Plan (ARP) funding for the design and development of a new, consolidated two-way radio system for first responders, which will replace outdated and uncoordinated two-way radio systems utilized by various emergency services throughout the County, providing all agency interoperability and a reduction in costs for most emergency services;

• Allocating \$4 million for this year's MIG program, which prioritizes fire and rescue agencies, including municipal, non-profit and established fire districts, to enhance their capacity and ability to respond to emergencies;

• Investing more than \$2 million to purchase three vehicles critical to the Department of Emergency Response's mission of preparing and responding to emergencies in the community, including a new state-of-the-art Mobile Communication Command Post vehicle;

• Increasing the diversity of the applicant pool for local law-enforcement agencies, which resulted in a record number of applicants for a recent police officer examination, as well as diversity in the latest graduating class from the Dutchess County Law Enforcement Academy; and Building on the Re-Entry Stabilization Transition and Reintegration Track (RESTART) program at the Dutchess County Jail to establish the Re-Entry Community Housing and Resource Guided Empowerment (RECHARGE) program, which provides individuals housed in the jail who are at high risk for re-offending with safe and secure housing, case management and employment assistance.

with a recommended initial funding of at least \$2 million per year, which will be a valuable source of flexible funding to aid the implementation of a variety of affordable housing efforts;

• Offset the costs of new or upgraded infrastructure, such as water and sewer, to ensure the viability of mixed-income housing developments; and

• Identifying sites that would be suitable locations for multi-family developments and ensure those locations are properly zoned for such development; such sites include those with access to household services, alternative forms of transportation and other necessary infrastructure, such as water and sewer.

Molinaro also elaborated on the County's plan to use ARP funds to build a countywide emergency housing facility, which will provide both temporary housing and wrap-around services for those experiencing homelessness all under one roof, transforming the County's emergency housing response system. Based on a nationally acclaimed model in Bergen County, N.J., Dutchess County's facility will be based on a core philosophy of moving individuals to permanent housing by offering evidence-based programs and intensive case-management services including, among others, addiction and substance use counseling, mental health and domestic violence counseling, Behavioral Evaluation & Assessment Team (BEAT) and community policing, financial and job assistance and faithbased connections – to help them secure and maintain stable accommodations. The County Legislature will vote on this solution approach at its May board meeting.

Among other efforts to create opportu-

ful Learn, Play, Create: Supporting Our Kids grant program, which provides onetime grants awards to local non-profit organizations that serve children and families and were negatively impacted due to the COVID-19 pandemic, including \$3 million which funded 147 projects in 2021;

• Engaging in accurately mapping internet access throughout Dutchess County and completing a strategic plan for highspeed internet access across the County;

• Investing \$1.2 million in ARP funding to establish and equip the Mechatronics Lab at DCC Fishkill, which will provide local students a comprehensive classroom, laboratory, and on-the-job learning program to train them to install, alter, troubleshoot, repair, and maintain electronic, mechanical, computer, control systems and components;

• Continuation of the successful Think Ahead college program, which will graduate its fourth cohort of Dutchess Community College (DCC) students with intellectual and developmental disabilities at DCC's graduation in May; and

• Investing \$180,000 to fund various summer youth programming, including summer youth employment, through the County's Agency Partner Grant program.

Why local school board elections matter

To the Editor:

The Mid-Hudson region bears the unfortunate distinction of currently being the only area in New York where school boards have voted to ban books from public school curricula and libraries, according to PEN America's Freedom to Write Index. The Yorktown School District in Putnam County has banned 10 books; the Wappingers Central School District in Dutchess County has banned one book; the Marlboro School District in Ulster County has banned two.

In two of the three districts, the books - of which all received national awards for literary merit and deemed appropriate for teens by the American Library Association were banned only after a member of the Florida-based "parental rights" group Moms for Liberty, which recently opened chapters in Putnam, Dutchess and Orange County, demanded their removal. That organization's website reveals that its members deliberately target local school districts. If school board members fail to do what they want (kudos to the Arlington School Board for recently refusing to kowtow to a Moms for Liberty member's ban-this-book request), the activists promise to replace school board members with their own candidates.

While calls to censor the teaching of certain concepts and books they claim "indoctrinate children in sexual perversion and the need for social justice" is just the latest tactic far-right lawmakers and activists have embraced to energize their base, school boards are meant to be nonpartisan, focusing solely on serving the best interests of all students and not on advancing any political agenda. Mid-Hudson residents can help ensure that our local school board members remain nonpartisan by carefully reviewing each candidate's statement on their school district's website before voting in school board elections on May 17.

According to the National School Boards Association, as few as five percent of registered voters participate in school board elections. It's a mistake to let a tiny minority

of residents determine the composition and direction of Dutchess County's 13 school boards when those votes impact the future of more than 46,000 students and their families.

Finally, children and teens alike continue to struggle to get back on track academically after the disruption of the pandemic. As such, public school teachers, administrators, and school boards desperately need our support. That alone should be enough of a reason to vote on May 17.

Statement from Dutchess County Veterans Services Director Adam Roche

The following remarks were offered by Director Roche at the April 21 "Hudson Valley Veteran Services" public forum held at the VFW 8645 in New Paltz, which included comments on the possible closure of Castle Point:

"Thank you for inviting us and allowing me to speak on behalf of Dutchess County Executive Marc Molinaro and the veterans of Dutchess County and their families today.

County Executive Molinaro sends his best and regrets he cannot be here today due to a previously scheduled engagement.

On behalf of Dutchess County's veterans, who County Executive Molinaro represent, and who I work with every day as the Director of Veterans Services, I am here to express our collective frustration with the federal government's lack of transparency, and our opposition to the proposal outlined in the Asset and Infrastructure Review Commission Report.

Dutchess County has been a willing and able partner in the mission to protect and honor our veterans. For years, we've had an excellent working relationship with Castle Point and local organizations like our VFWs, Hudson River Housing, Mental Health America of Dutchess County and so many more.

We've funded projects like our Housing, Employment, Reintegration and Outreach (or HERO) program, the Tom Zurhellen Fund, and the Vet Zero ride program. The Vet Zero ride program, by the way, offers veterans FREE rides to appointments at Castle Point. Dutchess County has always been a boots-on-the-ground partner of the VA, and of Castle Point. And as such, we want and demand a seat the table whenever changes to the services our veterans depend on are being planned, especially when we are talking about such a monumental shift in programming and policy.

County Executive Molinaro delivered his State of the County address last night, during which he re-affirmed our commitment to our veterans with several new initiatives (including even more funding for the Vet Zero ride program) as well as opposition to this shortsighted plan. We stand with our veterans and demand there be no reduction in the physical and mental health services offered in Dutchess County and veterans can continue to access the services they depend on.

To that end, I'd like to invite everyone here, including both of you, [Ulster] County Executive (Pat) Ryan and Congressman (Antonio) Delgado, to our Veterans forum we had already previously scheduled with the VA on April 30th at the Poughkeepsie Elks Lodge.

The future of Castle Point

Unless you've been completely isolated over the past few weeks, you know what most folks in our veteran community have been talking about recently: the news of the potential closure of the VA Hospital at Castle Point, which is located in Dutchess County and serves thousands of veterans who live all over the Hudson Valley. The news has certainly provoked a bit of anger and confusion among our veteran population, but of course, it's important to have a full understanding of any issue before we react to it. Now I'm certainly not an expert in any sense, but I do feel like I have gained a good amount of perspective on this particular issue.

In March, the Veterans Administration (VA) released a report detailing recommendations for its medical facilities across the country, including our VA Hospital located here at Castle Point. Specifically, the report recommended Castle Point be replaced by a more modern facility to be built in the area; notably, the new proposed facility would not offer all the services now provided at Castle Point. Veterans who need those services not provided at the new facility would have to travel down to Montrose in Westchester County, or else receive those services through a private provider. The time frame recommended in the report for this transition to occur was five years.

As you might expect, many veterans have become critical of this proposed change. Veterans generally don't like change, and it can take a very long time for a veteran to trust a doctor, nurse, or a medical facility. Furthermore, veterans might be wary of their care being transferred to a private practice because outside medical professionals are not trained to deal with the unique circumstances veterans have in their health care, especially their mental health care.

The veterans I've talked to about this potential closure at Castle Point all have shared their frustration with this news. They feel like the VA is looking at the financial benefits of closing an old facility that was built in 1923, without first looking at the impact that change would have on the veterans who depend on this facility every single day.

One added issue that many folks haven't thought about with this proposed change is transportation. Our VetZero Heroes ride program gives free rides to veterans, and most of those rides are to Castle Point; the program is trying to keep up with demand now. However, if you ask our veterans to transfer their care to a variety of private providers, near and far – well, you can see how much more challenging transportation would become if Castle Point closed. We would need a better transportation solution for such a massive change.

I can understand the VA wanting to build a more modern facility in Dutchess County to replace Castle Point. That

makes sense in some ways, since the number of veterans in America will continue to decline in the decades to come. But today, the thousands of veterans who see Castle Point as a sort of second home feel forgotten. I think we should always think of our veterans first, and in this case, it seems like the VA was thinking about efficiency rather than the human cost of such a change. That's just one veteran's opinion, though.

Thankfully, many of our local leaders have also used their voices to express the veteran community's disappointment with this recommendation from the VA. We'll have to wait and see if the VA's recommendation becomes reality. Personally, I hope it doesn't.

Rebuilding Together to repair 3 homes on National Rebuilding Day

Rebuilding Together Dutchess County (RTDC), a local affiliate of the leading national nonprofit organization, Rebuilding Together, will host its annual National Rebuilding Day on Saturday, April 30. With a vision to ensure safe homes and communities for everyone, RTDC works year-round to provide critical home repairs for our most vulnerable neighbors.

In our community of Dutchess County, RTDC will host approximately 75 volunteers to repair three homes for our neighbors in need on April 30th. This National Rebuilding Day marks a commemorative moment as it is the local nonprofit's 30th year helping our neighbors in need and making a difference in Dutchess County. Volunteers are the backbone of the organization, performing the bulk of the repairs on homes, and so it is a special occasion that this April also marks the first time since the beginning of the pandemic that volunteers will be reengaged on projects.

"The last few years have shown us the importance of having a safe place to call home," said Christopher Pels, Interim Executive Director and Past President of RTDC. "The critical repairs being made not only in April, but year-round, are improving the physical and mental health of our neighbors, increasing their safety and sense of independence and are improving their economic security and sense of community connection."

Candida, a Poughkeepsie resident, is one of our neighbors receiving repairs on the 30th. The 79-year-old widow fell in love with her home the moment she saw it 26 years ago and the love has continued ever since. She rejoices in the peace and quiet, and being a "homey type," she spends most of her time there.

Candida used to be able to keep up with most of the required home maintenance herself, until five years ago, when she had a heart attack and doctors told her she had to drastically limit her activities. "I was like a busy little bee," she said, "always in and out, but now with the surgery it has really slowed me down." Her son then stepped up and helped her, but since he moved out of the country a few years ago, she says the house has been neglected.

The repairs RTDC will do for Candida will first and foremost allow her to navigate her home more safely: grab bars and handrails will be installed, her back deck and stairs will be replaced, and the side walkway to the house will also be replaced.

To Candida, home means a sense of security and safety, but she hasn't been feeling that as much lately. As a Christian,

she often prays and one recurring prayer she says is "Lord, let me go from this house to your house." With the repairs she will receive on National Rebuilding Day, Candida's confidence and sense of security will be restored and she will continue aging in place safely.

The two other Dutchess County residents who will be served this month are Comly, an 87-year-old disabled veteran and Alice, an 82-year-old widow. Both Comly and Alice live in the Town of Poughkeepsie and have done so for 58and 53-years, respectively.

Continued from page 1 Dominguez, the farm system has been blessed with some tremendous pitching arms as well.

"We had 49 strikeouts in three games. I don't know for sure, but it has to be a team record, at least in our history," Gliner said. "It's not entirely surprising but from a standpoint of the game, yeah it's indicative of the organization as well. Great pitching is coming down the pike."

Hudson Valley pitchers combined to strike out 56 Brooklyn batters in the first four games of the current series, setting a new season-high for the staff in each of the first two nights (17 Tuesday, 18 Wednesday). In 2021, the Renegades struck out 17-or-more batters in a game five times, including a season-high of 18 three times. Notably, two of those three games came against Brooklyn (5/22 @ BRK, 9/9 @ HV). In 2021, the Renegades struck out 408 Cyclones, a rate of 11.81 K/9. With 152 strikeouts through 13 games, Hudson Valley ranks third among all High-A teams in strikeouts, trailing only Aberdeen (166) and Rome (163).

Hudson Valley pitching has been so dominant of late, it has combined to log 21.0 consecutive scoreless innings dating back to the seventh inning on Friday night, a Yankees-era team record. The back-to-back shutout wins are a first for the team since June 10 and 11, 2021, when the 'Gades shut out the Brooklyn Cyclones in consecutive games at Maimonides Park.

The Renegades were off on Monday before welcoming the Wilmington Blue Rocks to Dutchess Stadium on Tuesday, April 26, for a six-game homestand.

GLINER'S KORNER! Renovated suites and improving the fan experience

Every week, Hudson Valley Renegades President Steve Gliner sits down with reporter Rich Thomaselli to discuss the team in particular and minor league baseball in general

So you opened up the 2022 home season on Tuesday (April 19) against Brooklyn. What were your first impressions?

The ballpark looks great. That's he first thing. New ownership has given us some new resources to improve the fan experience. We moved the whole fence line out and created a whole new interior space. We moved the inflatables to the front area, upgraded the suites, and the new signage in the ballpark is much cleaner. Opening night was cold and windy though, so we're really looking forward to these Sunday 2:05 p.m. games (laughs). Overall, it was just good to get the park open and get the people back in the building.

Anything that you noticed that needs

revising, or changing, or needs to be worked on?

Nothing major, maybe just operationally. It's no different than the players, you have to work things out as the season goes along.

You've mentioned a couple of times now so far in the early season during our chats about the suites being renovated. Talk a little about that.

The suites are much fully renovated new cabinetry, new countertops, new painting, new lighting, everything except for the windows and the floors. We did it in all eight suites. Now we have the Sensory Suite available and so far every family that has been up there has loved it. We have two suites that are rented out season-long, a couple of others that are shared, and a few that are for individual game purposes. As the season progresses the usage gets better. I think since it's still April, we're still going through a little bit of an education in the market and we've



heard from people this week who said they didn't know we were already playing. They're so used to us starting in June like we did for 25-plus years that part of our market outreach has to include that we're open for business right now.

I think I already know the answer to this question, but how much of the game did you watch on Opening Night? Or even at all during this first week of the homestand?

A little here and there. Not a full game. Certainly not as much as I would like to.

Now that the team has come back home after opening with nine games on the road, how has your interaction been with the new manager?

Oh, Tyson (Blaser) is great. Again because of the way the protocols are and not as tight as they were last year, I have access to the team. We've had more one-on-one contact. I'm very much a one-on-one contact type of person and I like to do that instead of a phone call. He's very good to work with. He's very appreciative of everything we do. On the flip side, he's been very good with helping us, whether it's with media or a meet-and-greet with fans.

Youth members are first to serve on Ag committee

Dutchess County Executive Marc Molinaro announced the appointments of Stissing Mountain High School senior Cailin Halladay and John Jay High School junior Jenna Franco to the Dutchess County Agricultural Advisory Committee and its Education Subcommittee during the 2022 Agriculture Breakfast at the Dutchess County Fairgrounds in Rhinebeck on Friday, April 22.

Halladay and Franco are the first two youth leadership members who have appointed to the committee. Halladay and Franco were appointed to a one- and twoyear term, respectively.

The Education Subcommittee, which reports to and advises the County Executive on issues and policies regarding agriculture and agri-business, provides organization and leadership in carrying out the vision of the agricultural plan, and facilitates the implementation of programs outlined in the agricultural plan. Both appointees are active in their local Future Farmers of American chapters (FFA) and participate in agricultural education programs through their schools.

Molinaro said, "Dating back to Dutchess County's founding, agriculture has been integral in our community's identity and success, and farming remains a fundamental part of our county's heritage and future. Today, we celebrate not only Dutchess County's agricultural legacy and current prosperity, but with the appointment of Cailin and Jenna, the future of farming in our community. Our Agricultural Advisory Committee will benefit from these young women's experience, expertise and perspective."

The County Executive also announced that a 2022 solicitation for farmland, open space and pocket park projects through the County's Partnership for Manageable Growth (PMG) program will open on Monday, May 2. The PMG program has enabled the preservation of more than 5,000 acres of farmland and open space in Dutchess County through the completion of 36 projects; an additional 1,000 acres will be preserved through eight pending projects. In January 2022, Molinaro announced PMG awards for four farmland projects: Hahn Farm in Pleasant Valley, Heritage Acres in East Fishkill, Obercreek Farm in Wappinger and Primrose Hill Farm in Clinton.

Dutchess County agricultural organizations, including the Dutchess County Dairy Committee Inc., Dutchess County Soil and Water Conservation District, Dutchess-Putnam-Westchester Farm Bureau, Dutchess County Ag and Farmland Protection Board, Dutchess County Agricultural Society, and Cornell Cooperative Extension Dutchess County, hosted Friday's event.

Bronx woman sentenced to nine years, \$5.8 million in restitution for setting Fishkill fires

A Bronx woman was sentenced to earlier this month for the April 2021 fire at the Village at Merritt Park townhouses.

Inez Feliciano was sentenced to nine years in state prison and five years postrelease supervision, according to Dutchess County Assistant District Attorney Ryan LeGrady. LegGrady noted that Feliciano was also ordered to pay \$5.8 million is restitution.

Dutchess County Judge Jessica Segal sentenced Feliciano, and took the pleas, said LaGrady.

According to New York State Police, it was on Sept. 23, 2021 that Feliciano was arrested for setting fire in the village of Fishkill.

"I am very grateful to our police and fire departments for their diligence in solving this case, and also for their assistance in bring the arsonist to justice. Arson is a incredibly serious crime that in this case could have resulted in mass injuries, and the deaths of many innocent people. I thank all of our local law enforcement officials for their dedication in helping us to hold -Archive photo NYS Police

accountable anyone who commits crimes of this serious nature," said Village of Fishkill Mayor Kathy Martin.

According to state police at the time, seven rear back porches, which had paper products being stored for recycling, were set on fire at the 200 Building, 400 Building and 800 Building. Each building contained 24 apartments. All the families residing in the 200 Building were displaced due to extensive damage. Damage was minor to the 800 Building and damage appears mostly limited to the exterior on the 400 Building. All occupants were evacuated safely and no injuries were reported.

"The arrest and conviction was the product of close work between the District Attorney's Office, the New York State Police, Dutchess County Sheriff's Dutchess Office, County Fire Investigation Division and a number of other local law enforcement agencies and fire companies. These agencies worked tirelessly, each in their own respective areas, to piece together all of the elements of this crime and ultimately bring Feliciano to justice," LeGrady remarked.

Toll rates on local bridges May 1

The New York State Bridge Authority (NYSBA) is reminding Hudson Valley drivers of new toll rates set to take effect at midnight on May 1. These rates are part of the Authority's four-year, phased-in toll revision that was initiated in 2020. Tolls are collected while traveling eastbound on the Authority's five toll crossings: the Bear Mountain, Newburgh-Beacon, Mid-Hudson, Kingston-Rhinecliff, and Rip Van Winkle Bridges. As part of the Authority's recent conversion to cashless tolling, all tolls are paid through E-ZPass or Tolls by Mail NY.

The new rates are the third phase of a four-year, phased-in toll revision on the spans operated by the Bridge Authority. Starting in 2020, the Bridge Authority began an incremental increase in toll rates on May 1 of each year, with the final phase set to take effect on May 1, 2023. Passenger cars with E-ZPass, which make up the majority of customers, see an increase of \$0.10 each year during the toll revision. The new toll rate schedule was approved in early 2020 after a lengthy public review and regulatory process.

funding through state or federal tax dollars, with nearly all of its revenue coming through tolls. Tolls are reinvested back into capital improvements on the Authority's spans, ensuring these critical pieces of infrastructure can continue serving the Hudson Valley for decades to come. Most notable among these projects is the replacement of the deck on the north span (carrying westbound traffic) of the Newburgh-Beacon Bridge, which is approaching its final stages and expected to be substantially complete by fall 2022.

In March, the Authority completed its transition to cashless tolling. All physical toll booths have been removed to allow for more seamless travel and less engine idling, with motorists now passing under cashless tolling gantries at each bridge. E-ZPass users have their tag read by sensors; all other vehicles have a photo taken of their license plate and a Tolls by Mail NY invoice sent to the registered vehicle owner's mailing address. Tolls can also be paid through the award-winning Tolls NY mobile app. The Bridge Authority continues to encourage the traveling public to sign up for E-ZPass to take advantage of convenience, lower toll rates, and seamless travel throughout the eastern United States. E-ZPass tags can be procured online at www.e-zpassny.com or at select retail locations around the state.

Q: In light of the situation as it stands, what advice do you have for the public, with regard to mitigation strategies such as mask-wearing, and attending indoor gatherings?

"We're pretty much adhering to recommendations by the CDC and the state," said Dr. Santiago-Rosado. "The CDC came up with their paradigm of low, medium, high community levels [see the sidebar on this page for details]. As long as we're remaining in the low category, for those people who it makes sense to mask anyway, it would still be advisable; otherwise it's an observation thing. Assess your possible risk and the situation that you're in. Kind of watch and wait.'

She added a caveat.

"But if these cases continue to go up,

there's certainly a possibility that we'll be hitting moderate and even high categories again. If we reach high community levels, we'd definitely start masking anywhere indoors, limiting numbers of people [at gatherings], but that's more when you get into the high community level," she said. "I want people to be aware of that, though ... I would hate for people to think it was coming out of nowhere. It's something we're watching, and we want to stay ahead of this.'

Q: Is there anything else you'd like to add?

"[I'd like] to reiterate the importance of those vaccines and boosters," said Dr. Santiago-Rosado. "For some people it may be a while since they had their first vaccination series.

She recommends talking to one's primary care physician to determine the best way to proceed.

How the CDC measures **COVID-19 Community Levels**

The CDC looks at the combination of three metrics - new COVID-19 admissions per 100,000 population in the past 7 days, the percent of staffed inpatient beds occupied by COVID-19 patients, and total new COVID-19 patients, and total new COVID-19 cases per 100,000 popu-lation in the past 7 days — to deter-mine the COVID-19 community level. New COVID-19 admissions and the percent of staffed inpatient beds occupied represent the current

potential for strain on the health system. Data on new cases acts as an early warning indicator of potential increases in health system strain in the event of a COVID-19 surge.

Using these data, the COVID-19 community level is classified as low, medium, or high. See https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/science/community-levels.html for specific metrics.

NYS budget includes Barrett's bill to create Department of Veterans' Services

Assemblymember Didi Barrett (D-Dutchess/Columbia), Chair of the New York Assembly Veterans' State Affairs Committee, announced that her legislation to elevate the Division of Veterans' Services to an executive-level department, creating the Department of Veterans' Services, was included in the just passed 2022-23 NYS Budget. The legislation was Barrett's highest budget priority, and was included as part of the Education, Labor and Family Assistance bill (A.9006-C). This is the first time in more than 50 years that New York State has created a wholly new state agency, the last being when the Department of Environmental Conservation was established in 1970.

The state Division of Veterans' Services was established in 1945 to serve World War II veterans and their families returning home from overseas. As it is currently structured, the Division of Veterans' Services is not a cabinet-level agency. Most of the programs and services available to New York State veterans are actually administered by vari-

ous other state agencies, including the Office of Mental Health, the Department of Labor, the State Education Department, and Department of Health.

Currently, it's estimated that only 17 per-cent of New York's veteran population are accessing their earned benefits, in part due to the decentralized distribution of these resources. This legislation will centralize the benefits and programs meant to support veterans under the newly created Department of Veterans' Services, making them more readily accessible to veterans and their families. Addressing this inequity and other needs specific to women veterans are issues that can be more effectively targeted under a Department of Veterans' Services. This measure will allow for programs

currently administered by other state agencies to be considered for transfer to the Department of Veterans' Services in order to provide a "one-stop-shop" for veterans and their families to navigate the variety of benefits and services available to them.

Native spring wildflowers take advantage of the few weeks when the sun shines down on the forest floor, before the trees sprout their foliage. April temperatures have been running almost four degrees below normal, so the wildflowers are biding their time, keeping their roots, tubers and bulblets tucked underground. I was itching to see some sign of spring, so last Friday (April 22), I grabbed Sue and granddaughter Ambika and headed south to the wilds of Westchester County.

The Mianus River Gorge Preserve, 197 Mianus River Road in Bedford, N.Y., was set aside in 1953 to protect a glorious old growth forest – 935 acres of scenic trails, woodland, steep cliffs and canyons. It was in these protected glens, an hour south of Poughkeepsie, that I expected to discover emerging native blossoms. Alas, after an hour of trekking, it seemed that the preserve, to paraphrase Monty Python, was curiously devoid of wildflowers. Heading back to the car, we stumbled upon the holy grail of native wildflowers, in full bloom:

• Wake Robin – The red trillium is one of the 39 trillium species native to the eastern U.S. I've seen white trilliums, with their three petaled blossoms at the Jane Colden Wildflower Sanctuary in Vales Gate, but this was my first glimpse of the red kind. These blossoms are the earliest to bloom in spring, hence the name. Since bees are rarely active this early in the year, the trilliums give off a foul odor to attract flies for pollination. We also saw lots of skunk cabbages, which I would not count as wildflowers, emerging in the low wet valleys, also pollinated by flies.

Back at the parking lot, we almost got locked inside the gate. As the park ranger was letting us out (the preserve closes at 5

p.m. sharp), he explained that the second weekend in May is prime time for Mianus River Gorge wildflowers. But if you want to save gas, here are a few spots closer to home:

• John Burroughs Nature Sanctuary – This is the place to see native wild red columbines. They cover the crags of this rugged 200-acre oasis on Floyd Ackert Road in West Park (just north of Highland, N.Y.). Burroughs (1837-1921) was a naturalist, conservationist and author of 23 volumes of essays, including his first, titled "Wake Robin." He sounded prophetic when he wrote, "The fuel in the earth will be exhausted in a thousand or more years, and its mineral wealth, but man will find substitutes for these in the winds, the waves, the sun's heat."

• Franny Reese State Park – This relatively new park (opened in 2009) is chock full of Dutchman's Breeches, the little white relatives of the bleeding heart, with blossoms shaped like the pantaloons of the Hudson Valley's early Dutch settlers. The park itself, located just to the west of the Mid Hudson Bridge, is named for Frances Reese (1918-2003), a founder of the environmental group Scenic Hudson, who famously fought to keep a power plant from being built on Storm King Mountain.

Wappingers Creek Greenway Trail – This 11-mile ramble, starting at 91 Sleight Plass Road in Poughkeepsie, is studded with Erithronium, a native lily, also known as Trout Lily, because they bloom on the first day of trout season (but not this year), or fawn lily, because the leaves are dappled like a fawn's coat, or dog tooth violet, because the blossoms look like dogs' teeth, or adder's tongue. An adder is a snake, but I've never seen its tongue. Also along the Wappingers Creek, you'll find ramps, the broad leaved

wild leeks, which are considered to be a delicacy, but not if you plan on going out in public for a few days after eating them. It is legal to harvest ramps for personal consumption, but not to sell commercially.

• Creekside Park – Opened just last year, this 20 acres along Wappingers Creek was donated by the developers of Eastdale Village, the humongous mini-town on Route 44 just east of Poughkeepsie. I have seen just about every type of wildflower there, including bloodroot, spring beauty and marsh marigold. Unfortunately, a look-alike of the marsh marigold called Lesser Celandine, with up to 12 petals on each blossom, is taking over the area around the creek's banks. You can see genuine marsh marigolds along the paths at Roosevelt Historic Site and Vanderbilt Mansion in Hyde Park, down by the Hudson River.

Salad days

It's that time of year, when cravings turn to lighter, fresh fare

I don't know about you, but I'm craving eating lighter. Spring does that to me. I'm outside more, working in the garden, taking walks or playing with the dog, and my body tells me it's time to lighten up and fly right, eschewing the comfort of melty, cheesy casseroles and meat and potatoes for salads and fresher entrees. It's like there's some kind of nutrition clock that's running the show and, you know what? I'm listening!

I'm not saying I'm a health nut or that I'm going on a raw diet any time soon (or really ever), but warmer weather and finally being more active certainly plays into my getting the itch to take better care of myself, which I admittedly didn't over the winter.

So these days and nights you're apt to find me tucking into a nice fresh green salad for dinner, sometimes accompanying a piece of chicken or fish but, more often than not, just a big old bowl of the green stuff loaded with a variety of vegetables and a handful of nuts, sunflower seeds or homemade croutons thrown in for literally good measure. The dressing is left up to the whim of the moment, so I try to keep a nice selection on hand since I don't always feel like making my own.

Lately my favorite go-to is Greek salad,

which I also love to take for lunch, but when it's dinner I want garlic bread or a light flatbread pizza with it. That's what I'm sharing this go-round; it's fresh on my mind as well as my plate.

GREEK SALAD

An easy side or meal to toss together quickly, it's great for a healthy lunch or dinner, alone or as a side. If you use a seedless, or English, cucumber there's no need to peel it and, while you can certainly make your own dressing, I'd opt for local Four Brothers (my favorite which, if not found in your store of choice, is available to purchase by the case or gallon from their website or in one of their area restaurants), but Newman's Own is also good.

INGREDIENTS:

Toss in a large bowl:

1 head Romaine lettuce, or 3 Romaine hearts, chopped

- 1 pint grape tomatoes
- 1 cucumber, peeled and diced
- 1 medium red onion, thinly sliced
- 1/2 cup whole black olives
- 1/2 cup crumbled feta

6-8 pepperoncini (pickled small peppers with mild heat), optional

Greek dressing (bottled) or whisk together:

1/3 cup red wine vinegar

2 tablespoons olive oil

1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice

!/2 teaspoon Dijon mustard

1 clove garlic, minced

¹/₄ teaspoon onion powder

2 tablespoons chopped fresh oregano or

teaspoon dried

salt and pepper to taste

Makes about 4 side or two dinner servings

And now for the flatbread pizza part of our program. In the past I always made mine with pizza dough but these days, hey, I've got things to do so I often opt for packaged flatbread or, even better, naan, which is more individually sized, thinner and has a lovely soft yet slightly chewy texture thanks to its base of egg and yogurt.

Whatever base you choose you really don't need a recipe. If you're using packaged flatbread or naan it's likely it will come with heating directions. Generally brushing naan with olive oil, adding toppings and baking in a preheated 400 degree oven for about 5 minutes should do the trick, or until your cheese melts if you're topping it. They're great on the grill too.

Here are some of my favorite combinations: Loads of freshly grated Parmesan,



minced garlic and fresh herbs

Fresh ricotta, lemon zest, salt, pepper, baby arugula

Pesto, fresh mozzarella and chopped tomatoes

Burrata, fig jam, arugula and a drizzle of balsamic glaze

And then sometimes, if no one is watching, I'll even pile some of that Greek salad on a warm naan and go to town. What? It saves time so I can get back outside to play AND it's delicious! I have no regrets. Why would I? I'm eating better than I have in months and it's spring! Maybe you'll join me in this spring fever-driven food kick. I hope you do and I hope you enjoy!

Birding Trail opened

New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) Commissioner Basil Seggos announced the grand opening of the Hudson Vallev segment of the New York State Birding Trail to highlight the State's world-class and wide-ranging birding opportunities. The Hudson Valley segment includes 39 locations on public lands throughout six counties, providing a variety of quality birding experiences for New Yorkers and visitors to enjoy. The announcement was made as part of DEC's annual Earth Week celebration and in conjunction with the annual New York State Tourism Industry Association conference in Westchester.

The Hudson Valley segment of the trail includes 39 locations on a mix of public and private lands throughout Columbia, Dutchess, Putnam, Rockland, Orange, and Westchester counties. From Bird Conservation Areas (BCAs) including Hudson Highlands State Park, and Rockefeller State Park Preserve, to the tidal swamps and marshes at Tivoli Bays Wildlife Management Area, and the Mount Peter Hawk Watch that provides a scenic overlook for raptor watching, the Hudson Valley provides unique land-scapes and habitats for birding along the Hudson River and beyond.

New segments of the Birding Trail are opened in a phased approach. DEC announced the New York City trail segment in October 2021, the Greater Niagara trail segment in February 2022 and Long Island segment in March 2022, totaling more than 130 birding locations. Once finished, the Statewide Birding Trail will provide birding opportunities for everyone, regardless of age, ability, identity, or background, across New York State.

To promote the trail as an inclusive experience for all, DEC and partners are working to select sites that are welcoming and accessible by public transportation. Several Hudson Valley birding trail locations are accessible via the Cold Spring-Beacon Trolley Shuttle which runs from Memorial Day to Veterans Day weekend. DEC also continues to solicit input from a wide range of New Yorkers and organizations that represent Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC) communities and is making information available in both English and Spanish. Bird walks will be held in collaboration with organizations working with BIPOC communities.

The New York State Birding Trail map is available at www.ibirdny.org and provides valuable information on each site such as location, available amenities, species likely to be seen, directions, and more.

"With the horrors going on in Ukraine, the Towne Crier and friends are making a community statement to show our support for Ukrainians on Thursday, April 28, with music and guest speakers," said Phil Ciganer, owner/operator of the Towne Crier Cafe in Beacon.

Several notable performers from around the Hudson Valley are scheduled, including David Amram, Tom Chapin, Aaron Parks, Joe Louis Walker, Vanaver Caravan, Dylan Doyle, John Sebastian, and Annalyse & Ryan – plus special guests.

The show begins at 7 p.m., and there is a minimum suggested donation of \$25, with proceeds to benefit humanitarian efforts in Ukraine.

The situation in Ukraine resonates deeply with Ciganer, who was born in Moldova, an Eastern European country and former Soviet republic, just after the end of World War II.

"It's a part of the world where I was born but never knew firsthand," he said. "My parents experienced a similar situation [as Ukrainians do now] after World War II. They found themselves fleeing on foot, living in detention camps ... I was the infant you see the mothers carrying. They just literally walked from Moldova to Genoa, Italy."

Ciganer's family "jumped an ocean freighter to Cyprus," he said, and eventually settled in Israel, later moving to the United States when he was a pre-teen.

Keynote speakers at Thursday's event will include Beacon Mayor Lee Kyriacou as well as Natalie Pawlenko, President of Ukrainian National Women's League of America (UNWLA).

Ciganer said the Mayor will be out of town, but he'll make a virtual appearance

Kelly Garcia, one of the event organizers, lauded the work of UNWLA. Garcia is not affiliated with the organization but noted its focus on supporting women and especially children.

"There is much more money needed there than we could possibly raise [with the concert], but we'd like to do our part," said Ciganer. "This is more of a consciousness raising event, from the Beacon community, [letting Ukrainians know] that we stand with them."

"Oftentimes, we do get a little hung up on [wondering] will our efforts really help? And I sincerely believe that they do, that every little bit helps," Garcia said. "It's a significant group that's coming together, and a testament of Phil's integrity in the community."

Dutchess County Parks to celebrate Arbor Day at Wilcox Memorial Park April 30

In celebration of Arbor Day, Dutchess County Parks will host a special event on Saturday, April 30, at Wilcox Memorial Park in Milan to honor and celebrate the beauty and history of the park.

The day kicks off at 10 a.m. Saturday with an unveiling ceremony for new historic panels that recount the story of the Wilcox family, who owned the 615-acre property formerly known as Oakdale Farm. The descriptive panels are displayed on a kiosk built by Boy Scout Troop 50. The ceremony will also include planting two pine trees in honor of the Wilcox family, who were celebrated for their visionary commitment to re-forestation of the property in the early 20th century, as well as gifting numerous Wilcox family historical materials to the town of Milan historian. Following the ceremony, attendees will have the opportunity to take a guided hike to learn more about the park's history. Attendees can register by emailing soneil@dutchessny.gov. The event will be held light rain or shine.

From the earliest days of settlement in Dutchess County, the forest was an essential resource. Farmers harvested trees to create fields for growing crops and raising livestock. Miners used wood to create charcoal for refining local iron ore. Sawmills turned lumber into boards for building homes and barns. As a result, vast tracts of the county became deforested. In the early 1910s, Frederick Wilcox saw an opportunity to reverse this trend on his family's estate, Oakdale Farm, planting as many as 10,000 trees per year for several years. Following the deaths of her husband and son, Irene Wilcox sold Oakdale Farm to Dutchess County in April 1961 on the condition that it be transformed into a public park.
