Naming of Lt. Gov. places Delgado, Molinaro in spotlight

After Dutchess County Executive Marc Molinaro announced his intention to run for Congress against incumbent Democrat Antonio Delgado, to represent New York's expansive 19th District in Washington, D.C., it seemed fairly straightforward as to the next steps.

If Molinaro lost to Delgado in November, he would return to Poughkeepsie to serve out his County Exec term until 2023. If he won, Deputy County Executive William O'Neil would take over and complete Molinaro's term as per the Dutchess County Charter.

Rarely do things go as planned, however, as we saw

Delgado dropped out of the race and will resign his seat in Congress after being named as the new New York State Lieutenant Governor to join Governor Kathy

WCSD vote set May 17 on budget, propositions, **BOE** candidates

Registered voters in the Wappingers Central School District (WCSD) will go to the polls on May 17 to cast their ballots regarding the 2022-23 school budget and trustees. There are three other propositions on the ballot (capital improvements, bus replacements and lease Givens Lane parking lot). Polls are open 7:30 a.m. to 9 p.m.

Proposition one is regarding the 2022-23 proposed budget. According to the District's budget information, the budget remains within the tax cap at \$265,714,022.

"The 2022-23 Budget provides our students with the programs and services that are necessary for our students to be successful and have the ability to reach their highest potential. The major priorities of this budget include student safety and student mental health and wellness, which is necessary now more than ever before due to the COVID Pandemic. In addition, the 2022-23 Budget is fiscally responsible to our taxpayers and, for the first time since the inception of the tax cap in 2012, comes in below the maximum amount allowable to remain under the tax cap. The tax levy increase for the 22-23 school year is .83%.," stated WCSD Superintendent Dr. Dwight Bonk.

No Federal funding will be necessary to balance the General Fund budget so as to meet the needs of students as well as goals and priorities of WCSD

Board of Education, said Bonk.
According to Bonk, the proposed

budget would provide:


- Additional 14.4 positions to support health and wellness for students and staff (i.e.: social workers), ENL teachers, special education, counselors, nurses, office staff, and Safety and Security Officer (SSO) at WJHS (Wappingers Junior High School) and VWJHS (Van Wyck Junior High School)
- School Resource Officer (SRO) at WJHS and VWJHS
- Additional 4 custodial positions for District buildings as well as overtime for activities and event coverage
- Boys volleyball and Girls modified lacrosse teams added (coach, supplies, etc.)
- Marching band at RCK (Roy C. Ketcham High School) and JJHS (John Jay High School) (stipends, supplies, etc.)
- Additional 1 Personnel staffing to assist with the increased reporting needs related to human resources

- Additional day of late runs added to the Middle Schools
- Additional inter-scholastic sports transportation for Modified, Jr Varsity and Varsity athletic teams
- Migration from SchoolTool to Infinite Campus, which will provide improved workflow and parental notifications to families
- NYS district-level building project (\$100,000 maximum)
- Restoration of funding for school level supplies and activities including field trips Allocated funds for continued implementation of the Universal Pre-Kindergarten program
- Increased funding for the preventative maintenance of athletic fields and facilities

According to Bonk, "[i]n the event that the budget is unsuccessful" the following items would be subject to elimination as the District would need to cut \$1,492,787:

- Up to 9 positions to support health and wellness for students and staff (i.e.: social workers), ENL teachers, special education, counselors, nurses, office staff, and Safety and Security Officer (SSO) at WJHS and VWJHS
- School Resource Officer (SRO) at WJHS and VWJHS
- 2 custodial positions for District buildings as well as overtime for activities and event coverage
- Boys volleyball and Girls modified lacrosse teams added (coach, supplies, etc.)
- Marching band at RCK and JJHS (stipends, supplies, etc.)

- •Additional day of late runs added to the Middle Schools
- Additional inter-scholastic sports transportation for Modified, Jr Varsity and Varsity athletic teams
- Migration from SchoolTool to Infinite Campus, which will provide improved workflow and parental notifications to families
- NYS district-level building project (\$100,000 maximum)
- Partial reduction of funding for school level supplies and activities including field trips
- Partial reduction in funding for supplies and scheduled preventative maintenance for facilities and athletic fields.

"The Second Proposition on the Ballot is the Capital Improvement Project. By law, every 5 years, the school district must audit its facilities," stated Bonk. He noted, "Earlier this year, a Building Condition Survey identified that approximately \$75 million in repairs were recommended for our District. The Capital Improvement Committee, made up of Board members, staff, the District architect, and community members prioritized four areas of need addressed in the Building Condition Survey: which included safety; replacement/upgrades; infrastructure; and program. By creating a Capital Project proposition, the District will receive reimbursement from the State in the form of Building Aid at 58.3% which will equate to nearly \$12 million of the 20-million-dollar project." Without that reimbursement, the entire cost would rest with the taxpayers of the District, mentioned Bonk.

The Third Proposition is the Bus Replacement Purchase which is \$2.2 million dollars and will include the replacement of 22 buses. According to the superintendent, "[Twenty-two] buses are in need of replacement as they have over 134,000 or are 11 years of age. As the safe transportation of our students is paramount, and since we have and will continue to have the largest District-owned and operated Transportation Department in New York State, this proposition is essential."

The Fourth Proposition is the Lease of Givens Lane Parking Lot. "The Wappingers Central School District owns two parcels of land at Givens Lane in the Village of Fishkill. In 2001, the District determined that the property was not useful for school district purposes, and has since leased the property to the Village for

\$1 a year. The property is currently a public parking lot behind Fishkill Tire, providing 32 parking spots in a congested area. The Village maintains and insures the lot at no cost to the District," said Bonk. He added: "Since this arrangement has been mutually beneficial, the District and Village propose to extend the lease, with the same terms, for an additional 20-year term, to expire in September of 2041."

There are three seats on the ballot for the Board of Education. The eight candidates for the BOE are: Keri Cahill, Virgil Capollari, Anthony Ciro DiLullo, Ariana Dingman, Marie Johnson, Cheryl Migatz, Daniel Peña and Eddy Sloshower.

\$43,000 grant to repurpose baseball field in Poughkeepsie for Girls Softball program

The Town of Poughkeepsie was awarded grant from T-Mobile. Poughkeepsie was one of 25 small towns to receive one of the grants, called Hometown Grants. The grant will be used to repurpose one of the town's baseball fields into a softball field. The repurposing will accommodate the Town of Poughkeepsie Girls Little League Softball program. A ceremony was

held on April 23 to acknowledge the award. "The Town of Poughkeepsie is grateful to receive this grant from T-Mobile," said Poughkeepsie Town Supervisor Jon Jay Baisley, stated in a press release. "This will play an important role in the upgrade to this park and future plans for the town park infrastructure. Thank you for awarding this to the Town of Poughkeepsie.

We are delighted to receive the T-Mobile Hometown Grant. The grant is focused on revitalizing community spaces and we are the only project in the state of NY to receive the grant this year. The grant funding will be used at Stanley Still Park on Jackson Rd. to construct a new softball field for the primary use of Girls Softball. This project will allow the program to grow and offer more young girls the opportunity to remain in the program. The project will also include expansion of a walking path in order to make the new field fully accessible. The fields at Stanley Still are not solely used by Girls Softball however, but also by local Senior Citizen Softball Leagues and as an overflow facility for the local baseball leagues. So, the park and this project have dual purpose.'

"With the proposed revisions planned for the fields at Poughkeepsie's Stanley Still Park, we foresee positive experiences, enjoyment and smiles from all the young athletes in the local community. Hochul in Albany. That follows the arrest and resignation of former Lt. Governor Brian Benjamin.

I hope that the Lt. Governor stays true to his Hudson Valley roots and works with us to help move our community forward."

Democrats' next move

What was left unsaid however, including by Delgado, is the 800-pound gorilla in the room – who will run in Delgado's place as the Democratic candidate for Congressional District 19?

'Since the contours of the new CD-19 are still unknown, we are currently involved in internal discussions. For the moment, I am confident that a strong candidate like Ulster

County Executive Pat Ryan, who is considering a run, will step forward and deliver a Democratic victory come November," Julie Shiroishi, Dutchess County Democratic Chair, said in a statement to the Southern and Northern Dutchess News.

Ryan and New York State Sen. Michelle Maurice Hinchey Congressman

- if he resigns as Dutchess County Executive before August 8, it's possible voters could be going to the polls this coming November to elect his replacement instead of in November of 2023. State Elections law calls for any vacancy occurring three months prior to a general election are authorized to be filled at a general election.

That doesn't appear likely, however. In all likelihood, Molinaro will not resign prior to August 8 and O'Neil will take over through the 2023 election cycle. O'Neil is a former businessman, but does have background in county politics. He was an assistant to former Dutchess County Executive William Steinhaus and later became Molinaro's chief of staff before becoming Deputy County Executive in 2012.

In the meantime, Molinaro is sitting back suddenly in the driver's seat with the developments in the Congressional race.

'Delgado's decision to resign mid-way through the election cycle shows that he knows he would lose in November because of the incredible momentum our campaign has built. Ultimately, the Congressman knows that he and his party are responsible for the crime wave, out of control inflation, and illegal attempts to draw themselves safe districts," Molinaro said in a statement. "The district lines may change. My opponent may change. But what won't change is why I'm running: For us. For you. ... We were going to win against Delgado and we'll win the special election when it's announced. We aren't changing course, we are full speed ahead."

Creation of NYS cabinet-level veterans agency a 'huge step forward'

Recently, much of the water cooler conversation (or "scuttlebutt" to all my sailors out there) among our local veterans has focused on the potential closure of the VA Hospital at Castle Point, so it's easy to overlook other newsworthy items that might impact the lives of our heroes. For example, after a long debate in Albany, our Assemblymember Didi Barrett (D-Dutchess/Columbia) reports that her legislation to create a new Department of Veterans Services for New York State was included in the 2022-23 state budget. Now, this might not sound very important to the casual observer, but for the veteran community in New York, this is a huge step forward.

"I fought to include this legislation to create a one-stop Department of Veterans' Services because I know New York State can and should do better for our servicemen and women," said Barrett, who is the Chair of the Veterans Affairs Committee in the New York State Assembly.

This is much more than a simple name change. The old Division of Veterans Services was established in 1945 to help World War II veterans make the transition home. But it's never been a cabinet-level agency. Surprised? I was too! I think we can all agree that veterans should be represented at the highest level of our state government; but unfortunately, that has not been the case until now. Having a cabinet-level official fighting for our veterans is welcome news, for sure.

This change sure sounds like a "no-brainer," doesn't it? But I know how long a battle it has been to get this legislation into the state budget, because it was more than two years ago when Assemblymember Barrett asked me to address her colleagues in the Assembly on how much this change could truly help our veterans. It was a great experience for me, discussing real issues like veteran mental health and homelessness with our elected leaders in the halls of justice, but at the time, I had no idea how long it would take to make this wonderful idea

"The establishment of this new department is a critical next step to ensuring our veterans and their families receive the benefits and services they have earned in the most effective and accessible way possible," continued Barrett. I couldn't agree more, and it's a shame that it has taken this long for such a meaningful change to occur for our heroes in New York State. This is the first time in more than 50 years that New York State has created a new state agency, the last being when the Department of Environmental Conservation was established way back in 1970.

Furthermore, Barrett's office reports that only 17% of New York's veteran population are accessing their earned benefits, in part due to the decentralized distribution of these resources. According to Assemblymember Barrett, this new legislation will centralize the benefits and programs meant to support veterans under

the newly created Department of Veterans' Services, making them more readily accessible. That's certainly good news for veterans and their families!

This change to a full-fledged Department of Veterans Services might not seem particularly newsworthy at first, but I think it has the potential to pay big dividends in the

Albra noted "even though they're old, they're still effective."

According to the resolution the police department has 30 bullet-proof vests and assorted panel covers which have been taken out of service and deemed obsolete by modern law enforcement standards.

"The Town of Fishkill Police Department has established a collection site at the police department for defensive and medical equipment and supplies. These items will be donated to provide humanitarian aid in defense of the people of Ukraine," said Town of Fishkill Police Chief Keith Dworkin. "Town of Fishkill Police Lieutenant, Patrick Cadden, who initiated the project and is conducting the groundwork, has identified thirty sets of surplus TFPD body armor. With help from the Fishkill Town Board, we were able to turn this surplus equipment, which would have remained in storage, into valuable protective equipment for donation."

O'Malley said, "DAAR Charitable Foundation is working to get badly-needed protective gear to Ukrainian civilian volunteers and first responders, and we are so grateful to the Town of Fishkill for providing these items."

Dworkin noted, "We are reaching out to all police agencies in the Hudson Valley to donate any equipment and supplies they would like, to aid in this effort."

The resolution stated, "Accordingly, it is proposed that the Town Board declare the used bullet-proof vests and assorted panel and covers surplus and dispose of them by providing them to the DAAR Charitable Foundation program for sending assistance materials to Ukraine."

Rumfield quietly having solid start

T.J. Rumfield's name might not have been part of the group touted coming north with the 2022 Hudson Valley Renegades when spring training broke last month, but he has quietly emerged as one of the hottest players on the team.

The left-handed hitter, who shares playing time at first base, nonetheless leads Hudson Valley with a .354 average despite going on the seven-day disabled list.

Rumfield has hit a pair of home runs, five doubles and is tied for the team lead with 11 RBI.

Rumfield was drafted in 2021 out of Virginia Tech in the 12th round, but it wasn't by the Yankees. Rumfield was originally picked by the Philadelphia Phillies and played 21 games for their Class A farm team in Clearwater, Fla. But the Yanks thought highly of him and dealt pitcher Nick Nelson and catcher Donny Sands to Philly for Rumfield and pitcher Jose Valdez in the off-season.

"I got the call from our player development (person) for the Phillies and he told me that I was traded to the Yankees and I kind of just sat there for a second because I really didn't comprehend what was happening, Rumfield, a native of Godley, Texas, told the

website Pinstriped Prospects. "He said someone from the Yankees organization will be reaching out to you in a couple of days and he wished me the best of luck.

It hasn't been luck at all.

Rumfield has shown a sweet stroke, hits for power and average, and prides himself on defense. And he's pretty good on the base-paths as well, having stolen three bases in five attempts.

Renegades end road trip with doubleheader split

The Hudson Valley Renegades ended a two-week road trip by splitting a double-header on Sunday with the Jersey Shore BlueClaws at ShoreTown Ballpark.

The Renegades won the opener 2-0, while the BlueClaws took the nightcap 4-0.

In the opener, T.J. Sikkema made his first professional pitching appearance since July 21, 2019 and was perfect in 2.0 innings. The left-hander, who was the 38th overall pick in the 2019 First-Year Player Draft by the Yankees, retired all six batters he faced, striking out three and throwing 26 pitches, 20 for strikes.

The Renegades took the lead in the top of the second after Ben Brown walked the bases loaded and Aldenis Sanchez delivered a two-run single to left. That was one of just two hits in the game for Hudson Valley, but it was all the Renegades would need.

Edgar Barclay (3-2) spun 3.2 shutout innings of relief, striking out five and allowing just one hit. Tanner Myatt closed out the win with 1.1 scoreless innings to earn his first save. Sikkema, Barclay and

Myatt combined to one-hit the BlueClaws, the second one-hitter of the year thrown by Hudson Valley.

In the nightcap, the BlueClaws took the lead in the bottom of the first against right-hander Blas Castano. An RBI single for Jared Carr scored Ethan Wilson to give Jersey Shore a 1-0 lead.

The BlueClaws tacked on two more in the second and another in the third off Castao (0-3) to take a 4-0 advantage. Only two of the runs allowed by the right-hander in the game were earned, as he struck out three and walked two.

Hudson Valley threatened throughout the game, mounting a bases-loaded oneout threat in the fourth, and a second-andthird, no-out opportunity in the sixth, but was unable to score both times.

The Renegades combined to steal six bases in the doubleheader, and have now swiped a Minor League Baseball-high 69 bases this season.

The Renegades, now 14-12 overall, were scheduled to return to Dutchess Stadium on Tuesday to begin a series with the Aberdeen IronBirds.

Every week, Hudson Valley Renegades President Steve Gliner sits down with reporter Rich Thomaselli to discuss the team in particular, and minor league baseball in general.

So the last few weeks we talked about opening the season, opening the home season, getting Dutchess Stadium ready ... what did you do with these last two weeks with the team on the road?

(Laughs) I took my first two days off in 37 days. But I quantify that by saying, by definition that just means I'm not going into the office. Because even if I'm not at the Stadium I'm always working. There are always moving parts and we have to be available to do some things. But my wife and I actually took advantage of the weather early in the week and had a chance to go over to Brotherhood Winery in Orange County and it was a pretty relaxing day.

Find anything that you liked?

Yeah, we found a couple of things!

Valley They have this chocolate wine. It's kind of like a Bailey's Irish Cream, it has that consistency to it instead of traditional wine, but it was great. It's my new favorite. And I'll say no more (laughs).

Did you get a chance to get the staff some time off as well?

Oh yeah, we gave everybody a couple of days off during the week as well as last weekend. It was a busy time leading up to the season. I mean, 37 straight days is a long time. You have to pace yourself, and it's important for people to decompress.

I saw that you also had a chance to make the short trip down to Jersey to see the Yankees' Double A franchise in Somerset. What was that like?

Nice. Really, really nice. I've been meaning to get down there and check out their ballpark. It's a great ballpark. Patrick (McVerry), their general manager who I have gotten to know over Zoom, was a great host and I got to see some of the spaces and see some of the



things they've done. I think they seat 6,100. Their concourse is open to the seating bowl, kind of like Yankee Stadium, so it's nice.

Then we take care of everyhingelse – the bats, the balls, the uniforms, the other clothing ... we make sure they are integrated into the Renegades family.





RTDC volunteers help three residents with repairs on National Rebuilding Day

Three Dutchess County residents received assistance with home repairs by volunteers with Rebuilding Together Dutchess County (RTDC) on National Rebuilding Day, the last Saturday of

RTDC has been serving the community for 30 years. Their mission is to repair homes, revitalize communities, and rebuild lives by performing cost-free critical home repairs for low-income home-

"It is unbelievable that all these things can be done in one day when it's things I've been trying to accomplish for years,' says Alice, 82, of Poughkeepsie.

Alice used to wash windows, climb up and down ladders, mow the lawn. Her neighbor called her the "pioneer woman" because she was always out doing stuff around the house. However, "in 2014, I got cancer" she explained, "and my health started to go downhill and my capabilities went with it." Combined with the medical bills and more money going out than coming in, she hasn't been able to keep up with the home repairs as she used to, or would like to.

For Bob, 87, who was also served, these repairs mean he can stay in his home. "I now know I will be here forever. That's what I wanted to do, stay here. When I die, I want to die here. Not in a hospital, not in a home, but here." In addition to other repairs throughout the home, chairlifts were installed so Bob can navigate the split-level home safely and the bathroom door was turned into a pocket door to make it wider to allow him to walk in safely with his rolling walker.

"The repairs we provide on National Rebuilding Day, and throughout the year, are life-changing, life-saving repairs for our neighbors in need," says Darcy McCourt, the newly appointed Executive Director of RTDC. "Our services ensure homeowners like Alice and Bob can live independently in safe and healthy homes.'

This National Rebuilding Day was special to RTDC because it is their 30th year serving Dutchess County homeowners and it was a return to their roots. The day marked the first-time volunteers were out in the community helping their neighbors since the start of the pandemic.

Program Manager, Wyeth Drummond, felt the significance of what it all meant. "The last few years have been hard for everyone, but National Rebuilding Day reminded us how important the work we do is, what it truly means to those we assist and that together we can truly make a difference."

More than 75 volunteers from sponsoring organizations Arlington Teacher's GKontos Association, Roofing Specialists, Poughquag United Methodist Church and United Methodist Church of Hyde Park made these projects possible.





Proven Winners (PW) began about 20 years ago, promoting scaevola, or fan flower as one of their introductions. What a great garden performer! Since 1992 PW has added several new colors and last year introduced a beautiful bi-color, Whirlwind Starlight.

PW works with over 50 breeders, choosing plants for uniqueness and excellent garden performance. Once chosen, these plants are trialed for another two years. Plant breeding is a slow and complicated process. Several years ago, I had the opportunity to visit Syngenta's experimental bed in New Jersey with my friend "Bob the Breeder" and was disappointed to find out that some of my favorites in the trial would not be available for 10 to 15 years – if they made it to market.

John Gaydos, Director of Product Development for PW, travels around the world meeting with growers. In South America, a breeder took him to the back of the greenhouse and showed John his new discovery -Euphorbia. Would PW like the exclusive? "Yes!" said John, and PW's first euphorbia, "Diamond Frost," was "born."

Proven Winners is best known for their petunias: Gorgeous in beds, containers and baskets and available in a vast array of colors and sizes. New for this year is

Supertunia Double Priscilla. Supertunia Vista series has been bred for outstanding landscape performance. Best selling is Vista Bubblegum, new for 2022 is Vista

Verbenas are famous for fizzling out in the heat, but several PW varieties perform well in the summer. Superbena Whiteout and Sparkling Amethyst are two great choices. A new type of verbena was introduced this year called "Cake Pops." Samples were planted in my home garden where this verbena displayed outstanding garden performance. The swarms of butterflies the flowers attracted were a delight to watch.

Cuphea Vermillionaire is an absolute hummingbird magnet. This low maintenance plant is easy to grow, drought tolerant and deer resistant.

An exciting introduction for this year is Heliotrope Augusta Lavender. Bred and selected for outstanding landscape performance, I was impressed with this plant in last year's garden and loved to watch the butterflies that flocked to its flowers.

Calibarchoa or million bells is another PW winner. I love Superbells Double Amber and Double Orange, Tropical Sunrise, and this year's new introduction, Double Twilight.

Lantana is a favorite of butterflies and hummingbirds, and PW offers the best true red variety on the market, Luscious

Royale Red Zone.

Jamesbrittenia is a new plant introduction for 2022. At the trials last summer, I liked the plants offered by the Danziger breeders better that PW"s Safari series.

There are at least 500 varieties of coleus, and PW, along with many other companies, continue to offer new ones. I am not impressed with PW coleus that tend to flower sooner than other introductions. Coleus flowers are insignificant and unattractive, so those that flower later or not at all are superior varieties.

Blue My Mind is the best evolvulus on the market. I tried this one and another new introduction last year (Blue Daze from a competing company), and the PW variety was better by far.

PW has the best names for their plants. of "What Do Your Flowers Say Today?"

When I asked Andy, Proven Winner trial manager for the U.S., how the names are chosen, he grinned and told me that he had been on the "naming committee" but was no longer a member. A new petunia for the Picasso series was being introduced, and Andy didn't think it performed as well as Pretty Much Picasso and suggested "Van Gogh's Ear."

Andy was thrown off the committee and that petunia was dismissed, as well.






