The Hopewell Depot Museum will be celebrating its Sesquicentennial anniversary, 150th, on June 10th. A celebration is set for that day in Hopewell Junction from 1 – 5 p.m. at Railroad Ave. in East Fishkill.

"The Depot was the commercial and social center of a new community as well as the railroad operations. Trains loaded with coal couldn't make it over the mountains to the east into New England without the pusher engines that were staged at

Hopewell Junction. Therefore, it played a significant role in the industrial revolution of the Northeast which demanded coal for their factories. Today, the Depot is considered the southern gateway to Dutchess County. More than 100,000 visitors pass by the Depot every year and it creates an opportunity for local businesses just as it did 150 years ago," explained David Pfirman, Hopewell Depot Board of Trustees.

"And the popular band Cruise Control is closing out the afternoon at Mesier," said Latino.



**'Cider Donuts'**  
gain key victories  
over Aberdeen,  
keep division lead

After four losses in the first four games of the series to Aberdeen, the Hudson Valley Renegades came through with key wins on Saturday and Sunday to keep their division lead.

A go-ahead single by Eduardo Torrealba in the bottom of the eighth lifted the Hudson Valley Renegades to a 3-2 victory over the Aberdeen IronBirds on Saturday night at Heritage Financial Park.

The win snapped a season-long four-game losing streak for Hudson Valley, who played as their alternate identity, the Cider Donuts, honoring the long fall tradition of Apple farms in the Hudson Valley.

On Sunday, Drew Thorpe turned in the best start of the season for the Hudson Valley Renegades as the team blanked the Aberdeen IronBirds 9-0 in a one-hitter at Heritage Financial Park.

Thorpe (4-1) dazzled all afternoon, allowing just one hit and two walks while striking out seven in his eight innings of work. The New York Yankees' No. 6 prospect became the first Renegades starter to pitch into the eighth inning this season and just the second 'Gades pitcher to throw 8.0 shutout innings in the Portal Era (2005-Present). His lone hit allowed was a single to Creed Willems leading off the top of the second.

The Renegades have a 29-22 record and are still in first place in the North Division of the High Class A South Atlantic League. Jersey Shore is a single game in second place. Hudson Valley travels to Jersey Shore for a key six-game series this week. The series started on Tuesday.

Home was not sweet for the Renegades initially, who came back to the ballpark and promptly lost each game against Aberdeen to start the six-game series, including a 2-1 defeat on Friday.

Pitching dominated again a day later on Saturday night.

Chase Hampton was brilliant in the start for Hudson Valley, throwing 7.0 innings and allowing two runs on three hits while striking out 10. It was the third start this season that Hampton struck out 10 batters, and his second straight.

Aberdeen struck in the top of the second in an unconventional way, when Jacob Teter bounced into an inning-ending double play with the bases loaded on a groundball to first. Rafael Flores stepped on the bag and threw to second to end the inning with a double play. The tag, which completed the doubleplay came after Creed Willems touched

# Celebrate 150 years of the Hopewell Depot

Pfirman said, "150 years ago the area where the Depot now stands was primarily quiet farms. When the Dutchess & Columbia built their line through the Town of East Fishkill in the 1860s it opened up opportunities and people to run the railroad. By 1873 the railroad was struggling to meet payroll and needed more space for their maintenance and operations." He continued, "They built the Depot and yard to attract business from local farmers and maintain equipment. The Depot is larger than the others along the line to support those operations. The workers quickly settled in and needed a post office, barber, bakery, butcher, a general store, entertainment (the Hopewell Inn still operates) in what is now considered Old Hopewell, along Bridge Street and Railroad Ave. It was very hard, labor intensive, dangerous work on the railroads. Long days, heavy equipment and tools, coal, soot and ash from the steam engines, winter and summer to keep the trains running was demanding on the workers. When the Borden Creamery was built around 1901, trains collected raw milk from farms in all directions to be processed." There was an estimated 6,000 gallons a day were shipped to New York City, he said. Later on it was a communications center with telegraph and telephone services for the

area, Pfirman noted.

Organizers of the celebration want this to be a "great event" for the Depot volunteers and the community, as all celebrate the "legacy as a major railroad yard during the early 20th century and its impact on the Industrial Revolution" that was occurring in New England.

"Restoration of the Depot kicked off a movement to reclaim some of the small town pedestrian atmosphere from years ago. We hope the effort continues, along with lodging and services to support visitors who will stay to enjoy the cultural and historic charms of the region. We would like to see the Depot at the center of that renaissance," said Pfirman.

"I think it's a great opportunity for us to celebrate the preservation of the Depot and its history for the community. It serves to remind and educate us on the development of Hopewell Junction and the transportation revolution over the last 150 years," said Joe Sullivan, former president of the Depot.

The Hopewell Depot Museum "is a gift from the community to the community," said Pfirman. "Anyone interested in spending a little time to learn about local history, giving back to the area and sharing it with visitors will find it very rewarding. We also need building and construction skills to help us restore our 1916 Delaware & Hudson caboose. It is a fun project for those who like to use their

hands to create something the community and visitors alike will use and admire. Our visitors come from near and far."

"It's been a privilege to participate in

preserving the unique piece of history and helping to get it recognized on both the New York State and National Historic registries," said Sullivan.

It is very disappointing to read a paid ad, such as the one printed in the May 24-30 edition by a former elected official decrying the processes by which Town of Wappinger leaders are chosen in our democracy.

The election process, involving interviews by the party committees, petitioning for ballot placement and, of course, citizen voting - all while following the rules and meeting deadlines, though admittedly far from smooth, offers candidates the opportunity to make their case to engaged citizens. Implying that incumbents, who have even more opportunity through their position to make their case, shouldn't go through this process, or that the process is conducted without their knowledge, is an anathema to the accountability expected of elected leaders.

It does not enhance the former supervisor's legacy by complaining about the process so many years later, nor does it enhance her legacy by comparing the successes of her administration with the actions of the current occupant.

Both parties had very high hopes for his leadership when he was first elected and they and the citizens have been sorely disappointed.

See for yourself: Take a ride through Hughsonville, a ride down Chelsea Road, look at your 2023 Town Tax Levy showing an increase of 8%, look at your 2022 Town Tax Levy showing an increase of 5.8%, view the Public Scoping Session for a large propane storage facility and watch young families express their angst after working hard to build a family home in the town discovering that they will be absorbing the risks and health issues from such a facility.

In the same SDN issue, I was also discouraged to read a letter to the editor disparaging candidates who are in the early years of their careers and implying that their experience doesn't count. We should be welcoming such candidates and be grateful that they see a future with opportunities here and are not moving elsewhere. Let's hear what they have to say and encourage their ideas. Actuarial tables will explain that they have many more years to live with the decisions being made now and the consequences of those decisions than individuals at the end point of their careers.

No, the process may not be pretty, but it's the marketplace of ideas working and our local elected officials are gig workers. That means they can be dismissed...there are no coronations here.

## Fishkill councilman remembers father during Memorial Day speech

The following is part of a Memorial Day speech read by Fishkill Town Councilman Brian Wrye during the Village of Fishkill Memorial Day service.

### To the Editor:

Though we know this day is about Remembering, I just want to state I am not a previous member of active Military service.

Rather, I am one who grew up watching the so-called Vietnam Conflict on television, knowing that my father was one of its many fatalities.

Col. Wrye was declared MIA for many years, before being categorized as KIA. The Vietnamese government did return his remains and he currently rests at Arlington National Cemetery. My mother joined him there in 2017.

Today I remember my father, and I would like to share his military accomplishments leading up to his final mission in Vietnam. This compilation of his record was cataloged by my sister-in-law, Jill Wrye, and my brother, David Wrye. David is a retired Fed Ex pilot living in Kentucky with his family. He has many of our father's military records, so I asked him to help me with the chronology of his career.

Here it goes:

Blair Charlton Wrye

- Born May 23, 1929

- Only Child, grew up in Massachusetts & New Hampshire.

- He attended UNH, then Colorado College. It seems UNH took a dim view on his enrollment when he was caught driving his MG down the hallway of his dorm.

He decided to enlist in the US Air Force in 1951.

- 1952 he attended Officer Training School and became Commissioned as an Air Force 2nd LT.

- During 1952, he received training as a Weapons System Officer in the F-94 which was the first all-weather fighter interceptor for the Air Force!

- He was transferred to the 319th Fighter Interceptor Squadron which saw action during the Korean conflict. He was credited for the downing of 3 North Korean Migs and received the Air Medal and Distinguished Flying Cross. He flew a total of 71 combat missions.

- In 1954, now a 1st Lt., following the Korean conflict, he received primary and basic flight training. He would go on to be a flight instructor, Instrument Instructor, and a multi-engine instructor.

- From that point, He went on to jet training in the T-33, a Captain by now, and was ultimately assigned to the 357th fighter interceptor Squadron, flying the F-86 Sabre, assigned to a tour of duty in Northwest Africa flying out of Morocco. We were living in Casablanca.

- 2 years after serving with the 357th, he was transferred to the 66th Tactical Air Reconnaissance Wing where he once again was assigned duties as a flight instructor in the T-33 Jet trainer.

- Less than one year later, he received training in the RF101C, the supersonic variant of the F101B Aircraft Jet. He was then assigned to the 17th and 18th Tactical Reconnaissance wings in France serving as part of the NATO Alliance. And we were all living in the Champagne region in France.

(Somewhere in there were side trips to Germany and Switzerland.)

- Following his NATO assignment, he returned to the States and was assigned to the 322nd Fighter Interceptor Squadron in Oregon, flying the F101B – which had the capability of carrying nuclear weapons. This aircraft was primarily used as a Russian deterrent during the cold war.

- On August 12, 1966, he took off on a sortie with a target over Laos, which was part of the DMZ (Demilitarized Zone). As his aircraft reached its target, all radio transmissions ceased, and his aircraft disappeared off radar. It would later be confirmed that his aircraft was shot down by a North Vietnamese surface to air missile.

The Voodoo One-Oh-Wonder was the plane's nickname. No guns. No fighter escorts, until later.

In a book entitled OSPREY AIR COMBAT, McDONNELL F-101 VOODOO, by Robert F. Dorr, published in 1987, there's a photo of my dad. He was with a group of Voodoo pilots in Udorn, July 1966, just two weeks before he was killed. It was the last photo taken of him that I am aware of. He was smiling broadly. He looked good. He looked like a leader. He was soon to be a hero to us all.

- Col. Blair C. Wrye was listed as MIA from August 12, 1966 until his remains were repatriated with the United States in 1991. His official record was changed to killed-in-action after it was confirmed that he died as the result of the missile strike. His fate was withheld by the North Vietnamese Government for 25 years. During that time, he still was promoted to Lt. Col., then Col.

- He is interred in Arlington National Cemetery, and as I said our mother, Emily R. Wrye, joined him in 2017. And our mother was ever the faithful wife, mother, who possessed a very strong belief in our Lord.

- Col. Wrye's name is etched on the Vietnam Memorial Wall

PANEL 09E, LINE 131

AND IN ARLINGTON NATIONAL CEMETARY HE AND OUR MOTHER ARE IN SECTION 60, GRAVE 2833.

AND HE IS FOREVER & PROUDLY ON THE HEARTS OF HIS FAMILY. AND, AS AN ONLY CHILD, HE WOULD BE SO PROUD OF THE SIZE OF OUR FAMILY, SO MANY HE WOULD NEVER MEET.

I provide that history only to punctuate that we are all but one story. No matter the rank, the branch of the military, the War or Conflict, that same pain of loss has been visited upon many in our country.

- After nearly 3 years with the 322nd, and now a Major, he received orders transferring him back to RF101C Reconnaissance Aircraft and assigned to the 20th Tactical Reconnaissance Squadron in the Southeast Asian Theater, commonly known as the Vietnam War.

My mother told me that when he got his orders for Nam, he clearly stated to her: "I know I am not coming back."

- He flew missions out of Udorn airbase in Thailand where he was stationed and was awarded the position of Flight Missions Officer, responsible for assigning all pilot missions. He would fly a "sortie" everyday along with his fellow pilots and NEVER used his position as an excuse to avoid the very dangerous missions.

In a time when many in our country truly feel as though we are being attacked from within, we gather to remember those who went head-on into battle and gave it all. I've told you about a member of my family, but he's a member of your family. He died for you. All who died for you and me are members of our collective American family. Forever to be honored and remembered.

## Palensky gains honor, promotion to Double A

Few minor league baseball players have a better week than this.

First, a special recognition, then a promotion.

Hudson Valley Renegades outfielder Aaron Palensky was named South Atlantic League Player of the Week for the week of May 22-28. Palensky became the second Renegade to win a weekly award in 2023, picking up an honor for the first time in his career.

Days after the recognition, it was learned around June 1 that he was promoted to Double AA Somerset (N.J.) in the New York Yankees farm system.

In five games against the Wilmington Blue Rocks, Palensky hit a scorching .619 (13-for-25) with nine runs, five doubles, a triple, two homeruns and seven RBI. He also stole all three bases

he attempted.

"Palensky has been consistent all year, and I'm really excited that he is being recognized for his consistency and work that he has put in so far," said Renegades Hitting Coach Kevin Martir.

Despite his promotion, he still leads the league in home runs with 12 and is second in extra base hits.

Palensky, 24, was signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent out of the University of Nebraska in 2020. Across the 2022 and 2023 seasons with Hudson Valley, he has hit .288 (99-for-344) with 75 runs, 22 doubles, five triples, 22 HR, 68 RBIs, and has gone 19-for-22 on stolen base attempts in 109 games, ranking in the top 10 in franchise history in a half-dozen categories.

## Making adjustments to rosters as players move through system

*Editor's note: Each week, writer Rich Thomaselli speaks with Hudson Valley Renegades General Manager Tyson Jeffers about the Renegades in particular and minor league baseball in general.*

**For fans who don't quite understand and wonder why their team like the Renegades lose four games in a row or get into slumps, talk about the transient nature of the game with promotions and constant roster changes.**


of things.

But in the end, the Yankees make all the roster moves, and I am not consulted. Rightfully so! (laughs).

**What is left in terms of construction at the ballpark?**

stands to renovate. We need to be able to keep our promises to the Yankees. Frankly, we probably have the best clubhouses in the whole affiliate system. We plan to put in some new ceilings in the clubhouse. We will also add some specialty seating that we think the fans will enjoy.

## Sheriff's Office participates in Project Lifesaver

Sheriff Kirk Imperati recently announced that the Dutchess County Sheriff's Office is now a proud partner of Project Lifesaver.

Project Lifesaver is an international organization which specializes in training, and providing equipment to, first responders to locate individuals who have gone missing and are at risk of serious injury or death due to a cognitive impairment. This includes people with Autism, Down Syndrome,

Alzheimer's disease, and any other cognitive impairment that puts them at risk of wandering. The program uses a watch-like transmitter worn by the client which emits a frequency specific to them, as well as a receiver used by the first responder to locate the client through the transmitter on their wrist. To date the program has a 100% recovery rate with over 4,000 completed searches, during which all clients were recovered within an

average time of 30 minutes with no serious injury or death.

At the present time the Sheriff's Office has assigned a Project Lifesaver Coordinator and a supervisor to the program, with the hopes of training many more deputies in the future.

"Project Lifesaver has been proven to be an extremely valuable tool in locating missing people at risk of serious injury or death, and at the Sheriff's Office we are very excited to now have it available to us," Sheriff Imperati said. "We hope to never have to use it, but if an at-risk individual goes missing in

Dutchess County it's nice to know that we now have a greater chance of locating them unharmed thanks to this outstanding program."

For those wishing to become part of the program there is no monthly cost; however, there is an enrollment process and some out-of-pocket expense for the equipment that the client wears. # Albra offers State of the Town in Fishkill

Fishkill Town Supervisor Ozzy Albra presented his State of the Town at the Fishkill Board meeting on May 24 at the Fishkill Town Hall. Albra's presentation was recorded and presented on video. At the start of the video, Albra states "I'd like to reintroduce myself to the residents." Albra is seeking reelection. Board member John Forman has announced he is running for the Supervisor position.

"I am proud to present to you the 2023 State of the Town Presentation. This presentation is meant to highlight the incredible progress our Town has achieved in recent years, the talented and dedicated staff and officials who do this work, and the ways we are working to make Fishkill a place residents can be proud to live, now and for generations to come," Albra stated.

The Supervisor said, "I discuss the many changes to Town laws we have adopted in recent years, changes designed to give power to the residents, by taking power away from developers who effectively controlled the Town for decades and creating a series of protections to make sure your Town government prioritizes you, the residents, and your quality of life."

It was stated by Albra, "One of the first things I decided to do when I was elected was to pass a term limit law. Town Councilpersons and the Town Supervisor can only serve two four-year terms, whether its consecutive or separate, for a total of eight years. Less than 15 Towns in New York out of 900, have term limits and I think it's the thing to do. It stops career politicians, it ends nepotism and encourages fresh ideas and citizen participation. This law needs to be done at the state and the national level as well."

"Before I took office, this Town for decades was run by the developers for the developers. Our Town resources were spent to accommodate developers. My policy is to take the power away from the developers and return it to you, the residents of the Town of Fishkill. I invest our resources into our community to improve our services and enhance your quality of life. You'll see this approach in action as I talk to you about the things the Town has done under my leadership," remarked the supervisor.

Albra said he has "an open-door policy" in town hall. He later added: "I believe in open government, and I want strong checks and balances, so one of my first directives was to create this [Town Board] office space, and I'm very pleased that our Town Board members use this space to handle Town business."

Regarding the Town of Fishkill Police Department, Albra, who is a former police officer who worked in Westchester County, said, "In 2021, the Town took part in New

York State Police Reform, and here at the Town we had great discussions and adopted a plan to further our goal of running a police department where everyone is treated equally and fairly at all times, and everyone receives due process, both the public and our police officers."

Albra mentioned a new salt shed was built at the Highway Department. "Next we are building an additional garage for our vehicles, and we are doing this ourselves in-house, saving us at least \$500,000. Once done we're going to be able to move space around at the Town Highway Department, so what we are going to do is put big dumpsters in the Highway Department and let the citizens of Fishkill use them Monday to Friday during business hours, where you can bring stuff and leave it there in the dumpsters. If that works out and it's not abused, that's something we can do permanently," said the supervisor.

Albra spoke about updates to the Town's parks and what services and programs are offered at the Town Senior Center and Recreation Center.

"Last year, the Town dedicated a statue of Chief Daniel Nimham, a native son of Fishkill, a tribal leader of the Wappinger people, and a Revolutionary War combat veteran who was killed in battle. This statue was a passion project of mine since taking office, and I thank the Town Board for their support in making it a reality. This statue helps to shine a spotlight on our incredible local history and I can't begin to tell you how many people have stopped me at Town Hall or around Town to tell me how much they love the statue, which is very gratifying." Albra also mentioned in the video the Hometown Heroes Banners program, where the inaugural 93 banners are hung throughout the Town recognizing a Fishkill veteran.

An updated Comprehensive Plan was adopted by the Town. "The Comprehensive Plan and the survey touched on three main issues: overdevelopment, traffic and water," he said.

"One responsible thing we have done is use ARPA (American Rescue Plan Act) money from the federal government to pay for our water and sewer projects. We purchased generators for booster stations in Beacon Hills. What was happening in Beacon Hills, is that when the power went out, they lost water. That's not going to happen anymore," said Albra. He said the Town is working on remediation of well issues for the Brinckerhoff and Snook well fields.

"In my time in office, I have kept a conservative budget, and your tax bills have been relatively flat, increasing about \$10 to \$30 for most taxpayers," according to Albra.

He added: "Board members sat in on bud-

get meetings, made suggestions about funding and asked for certain items to be placed in the budget. I then assembled all their ideas and presented them a budget for the Town Board to review as a whole, and make adjustments until everyone was satisfied."

"The entire board voted 5-0 to accept my initial budget, and then began the process of making changes. Most changes were changes I was fine with. In fact, I was fine with almost every change. But there was one change I wasn't okay with," said Albra. He continued, "\$105,000 of money earmarked for our police department was removed from the budget after it was introduced." The Supervisor said, "Unfortunately, the board voted to remove those funds, and I chose to vote against the budget. I stand by that decision."

Albra remarked, "Earlier this year, I also voted against a \$1.7 million bond issue." He explained, "This was set to fund projects which weren't included in the 2023 budget we already adopted."

Regarding the waterfront, Albra said, "I'm working with a developer on waterfront development right on the Hudson River. This is going to be a beautiful asset to the Town of Fishkill. It's going to include about 100 luxury apartments or condos, and half the property is going to be dedicated to the Town so we can create a Town park with a marina and water access for the residents of the Town of Fishkill. I'm looking very forward to getting that done."

Toward the conclusion of his State of the Town, Albra remarked, "So in a few weeks, you're going to see me come to your neighborhood, I'm going to stop in and say hello, and I want to hear from you, the residents, how we can make the Town of Fishkill even better."

## Board members comment

### on State of the Town

Council member Louise Daniele said about the State of the Town offered by Albra, "I was very impressed with the Supervisor's presentation. It combines a detailed overview of our town and its departments with a comprehensive look at the many accomplishments the town has achieved."

Daniele noted via email, "Watching the presentation, I'm very proud of my contributions to the tremendous progress the Town has made on behalf of the residents, instead of the developers as it was in the past."

Forman said via email, "First thing I'd like to say is Supervisor Albra and I both grew up in Beacon and we have known each other for many years. There are several areas of where we are in agreement with each other and of course there are several areas where we are not on the same page."

Regarding the 2023 Budget, Forman said, "An obligation of the Supervisor is to present a budget to the Town Board. After many

meetings with our Department Heads (spearheaded by Carmine Istvan), the Town Board ultimately adopted a budget that resulted in less spending (-\$376,000) than the original budget presented by the Supervisor. This budget was voted by the entire Town Board and passed by a 4-1 margin." Forman continued, "Yes, the Supervisor was the only NO vote against this budget. And the reason he gave was, 'I will not vote for a budget that defunds the Police Department.' For the record, the Chief of Police turned back \$5,000 from his original budget request. The Town Board gave a "haircut" to the Supervisor's budget, not a "chainsaw." Supervisor Albra thought he might score some political brownie points with the Police Department and some residents by making his NO vote on the budget political."

Forman said about a \$1.7-million bond, "During budget time, we had some major items we had to discuss. One of them was addressing the roof at Recreation Center. A small problem that has become a bigger problem over the years. This Town Board has finally decided to spend the necessary money to address this issue. This along with a couple of major pieces of equipment for the Highway Department is what was included in this bond. Passing a bond was discussed in great detail while we working on the budget and it was decided this was the direction we were going. The Supervisor did not offer any other alternatives at the time."

When it comes to the Police Department, Forman said Albra "has a dysfunctional relationship with our Police Department." He said, "It has been a commitment on my end, to open up the lines of communication with the Fishkill Police Department. There is a noticeable, positive difference with the relationship between the Fishkill PD and the Fishkill Town Board, since the 2021 elections of Brian Wrye, Carmine Istvan and myself to the Town Board. I fully expect this positive relationship to continue moving forward."

Forman remarked, "Supervisor Albra would like the residents to believe the "big city developers" own this town and get what they want." He noted, "Supervisor Albra continues this narrative, desperately hoping that people are listening. For the record, there hasn't been one instance where this current Town Board has changed a Zone for a developer that would cause any Red Flags. Every decision based on its merit."

Council member Brian Wrye declined to comment, and Council member Carmine Istvan did not respond to an inquiry for comment.



## love to cook

If you cook at all, or just love to eat, you should grow your own herbs. The end. They add a lot of flavor to everything from salad to dessert, tend to be beautifully fragrant both fresh and cooked, are easy to grow and can be harvested for use throughout the year. But I'll bet you know all that if you're already a fan, so here's one more little reason: they flower. I just love a multi-tasker!

Before you ask, no, this isn't a gardening article. We'll be leaving that to the very capable Mark Adams, thank you very much. But a little garden talk can't be helped given the topic, so I hope you and Mark will forgive anything I get wrong or leave out on that front. Also, before you ask, yes, there are more than a few edible flowers out there, like pansies, nasturtiums (my favorite!) and marigolds, but they aren't exactly herbs now, are they?

So, flowers. Yes! Many herbs flower; and where once I appreciated that just for the aesthetics, which pollinators do as well, I now also love how very tasty they are. If you're looking for a perfectly pretty garnish for a cocktail or dessert that also adds a pop of unique flavor, then you wouldn't have to look any further than your own backyard. If you grew your own herbs, that is. Besides, when you grow them yourself you know for sure whether they're safe to eat, treated with pesticides or exposed to things like car exhaust. You just can't know for sure if you don't know how they grow.

A quick caveat before we move on: there are herbs that flower and herbs that bolt.

Cilantro, famously, sends up thick stalks of white flowers that make coriander seeds when it gets too hot, after which the leaves

change from flat to feathery and lose their flavor, basically marking the end of that plant. This is bolting, and it isn't what you want if you're looking forward to a long season of fresh herb-y goodness. But since I promised not to dip my toe too far into Mark's garden pool, that's all I'll say about that and will just stick with herbs that flower in the best of ways so you can enjoy them with wild abandon. And think how happy we'll make the bees!

My favorite perennial herbs to grow for their flowers are oregano, thyme, chives and, the gift that keeps on giving, sage. Not only do they come up better every year, but they are easy to care for and spread themselves out nicely in the garden, making them as easy to pick and use as they are prolific. I show them a little love every day and they reward me well into fall. I also love taking my neighbor children around the garden, introducing them to not only the names and scents of my (known to be safe) plants, but their flavors as well.

My sage plant, *Salvia officinalis*, or common sage, has a pride of place in its own raised bed where it's lived for many years and is happily well-established. It actually has a trunk! It's just outside my backdoor where I see it every morning, it's bright purple blossoms buzzing with bees that help its fragrance waft my way. And while sage itself is not my favorite cooking herb, I love its beautiful, soft, grey-green leaves for decorating, its leafy branches for drying to bind for smudging. But this is all about the flowers, and they are gorgeous! They're a rich, bright purple and grow up the stem forming a pretty spike that's perfect for use in cocktails, bruised slightly to

release their sweet intensity, or muddled in honey syrup. The flavor is sweet up front, delicately sagey with hints of mint and pepper, making them suited for both savory and sweet dishes. The individual flowers can be stripped from the stem and tossed into salads, sprinkled atop roast pork, sautéed in butter to garnish chicken, stirred into butter or goat cheese, candy them in sugar, place in a bottle to infuse vinegar or make a soothing evening tea with chamomile. And if all that weren't enough for you, they're packed with antioxidants, too!

Oregano and thyme flowers look similar: tiny clusters of white, pink or pale purple flowers on stems that rise above the leaves to show off. As with other herb flowers, they have a more delicate flavor version of the leaves, with thyme blossoms also having hints of citrus and mint. Thyme blossoms are beautifully suited for garnishing any number of sweet or savory dishes. Add them to your bouquet garni to flavor sauces and soups, add to salads and quiches, sprinkle atop desserts or use to infuse honey. Oregano is a very strongly flavorful herb, which many, including myself, happen to love. For those who may find it a bit much, using the oregano blossoms, which resemble those of thyme, might be just the thing as they are mellower and even taste more like thyme. Use them in pizza and pasta sauces, in salads, on grilled meats and vegetables or to infuse olive oil. Similarly, basil (though not perennial) and mint blossoms (just try getting rid of them!), which grow in spikes much like sage, and resemble each other, can be used fresh or dried for both savory and sweet applications.

Of course, using any of these flowers fresh off the plant is ideal for summer (and I forgot to mention the best time to pick them is in the morning after any dew is evaporated) but that's not to say you can't harvest now to enjoy later. Just as I pick my oregano leaves several times a week, I also add a few flower stems to some of the bundles before rinsing and hanging upside-down to dry. Why upside-down? Any essential oils will travel from the stems to the leaves – and flowers – concentrating the flavor as well as the nutrient value. I use a lot of oregano and what I put up to dry now will last me through win-

ter and beyond until I can replenish in spring. Because dried herbs are more concentrated, you need less for flavoring than when you use fresh.

Up 'til now I've talked about herbs that are related as members of the mint family. Each is unique but there's no question that similarities are present. So for the last flowering herb I'll shake things up a bit with chives, kind of the polar opposite of the mint family I suppose as they're in the allium, or onion, family. Pretty pinkish-purple puffs that remind me of clover flowers sit atop the slender chives, although their season is short. In fact mine are just about done and I didn't use nearly enough this year. I love keeping the stems long and crisscrossing them on top of planked salmon, mashed potatoes and grilled chicken. They have a lovely light oniony flavor that doesn't overpower and they look so pretty besides! They can also be pickled, deep-fried or just pulled apart and scattered as a garnish. And as with all the herbaceous beauties I've listed, they are loaded with nutrients.

There are a lot of great reasons to grow herbs and probably no better time of year to enjoy them in all their fresh, flavorful glory. Add them to any and every course, from cocktails and salads to desserts and cheese boards. Whether you use them for the flavor they add or just to pretty up a plate, herb flowers bring a uniquely seasonal beauty to whatever they grace. So grow some, enjoy every aspect of them and create some delicious buzz – in your garden and your kitchen!

# The big garden

Family and friends turn a large plot of land into the annual garden.

It starts in January. We (meaning Sue) order seeds of annual flowers that we want to try out in the "big garden," a 2,500-square-foot plot next to the house. This will be the 33rd year for our garden – 33 years of gorgeous cut flowers, blossoms to enter in the Dutchess County Fair, new varieties that we might grow in our greenhouses, and a vista to admire all summer long.

The seeds come from Burpee, Harris and occasionally Thompson and Morgan Seed Company. Sue sows them in trays of seed starting mix in April, a few thousand seeds in all. We also get samples of new varieties from breeders like Dummen, Ball Floraplant and Proven Winners. Over the years, we've developed a relationship with them by providing feedback from our trials held at the fair.

Traditionally, the goal is to plant the garden on the second Sunday in June, when the work in our commercial greenhouses (5 acres of them) starts to space. When I looked at the 10-day weather forecast last Sunday, May 28, I realized the following weekend would be ideal for planting.

And it was.

I called my friend Rick and arranged for him to till the garden on June 2. On May 31, I took out my trusty John Deere riding lawn mower and mowed down the winter rye that we planted last fall as a cover crop, to keep the soil in place and to hold the nutrients over the winter. Next day, I

spread 20 bales of pro-mix (a commercial blend of peat moss and perlite) over the area to make up for soil removed when we cleaned up last year's crop, followed by 40 pounds of 10-10-10 garden plant food. On Friday Rick tilled the garden. Saturday, me and five helpers laid down nine rows of black plastic mulch, each row 3 feet wide by 70 feet long.

We would need 1,000 transplants to fill the space. Sue arranges the varieties by their height – tall ones like tithonia and sunflowers in the back, dwarf celosia and profusion zinnias in the front, and by their fitness as entries in the Dutchess County Fair competition. Deer resistance matters, although we plant some flowers deer love, and spray them often with "Liquid Fence" or any deer repellent that contains egg solids. This year's garden is populated with about 50 different varieties of flowers, including:

- Zinnia Queen Lime Peach – New in the Queen series. We love zinnias for their deer resistance, they make great cut flowers which we have on our tables every day, and we enter them in the fair.
- Celosia Celway Terra Cotta – Not deer proof (only the feather-type celosias are), but the color is unique.
- Cuphea Sweet Talk Red – This looks like a real winner. It was already blooming when we set it into the garden (you should cut the blossoms off when you plant it, but I hate to do that). Cuphea is a

magnet for hummingbirds. We had to swat them away as we were planting. Where can I buy some hummingbird repellent?

• Gaura Belleza Pink – Breeders have come up with new varieties of Gaura that are user friendly, and exquisite.

• Salvia farinacea Victoria Blue – This is an old stand-by. Deer hate it, the blossoms last until November, and it smells like cat piss, but who cares?

Last Sunday, June 4, five of us got down on our hands and knees to plant the garden, using trowels to slit a hole in the plastic mulch and insert the 1,000 transplants. Five hours later, viola! A beautiful garden. Then we turned on sprinklers to water it in.

After about three weeks, I will apply a weed killer to the tiny weeds that come up between the rows.

It's that easy.


