

RCK edges Commack to win state baseball title

BINGHAMTON – State Champs! Years from now, when members of the Roy C. Ketcham High School baseball team talk about bringing home the second state championship in program history, they assuredly will talk about it in terms of the most unique way they won the title game.

Without getting a hit.

True story.

The Indians won the state Class AA title with a 2-1 win over Commack without getting a hit. It was a clinic in defense and pitching at Mirabito Stadium. Junior right-hander Riley Weatherwax was just as brilliant for

RCK, throwing a three-hitter.

The Indians finished the season at 28-2. "Never seen anything like it," said many of the players and coaches as they left the stadium.

Ketcham scratched across two runs in the third inning for the only tallies they would score. The rest was up to Weatherwax, who went the distance, and the defense, including a sterling play from shortstop Owen Paine with Commack runners on second and third and two out in the 7th inning on a hard-hit ball by Alex Gonzalez. Paine knocked it down and scooped it up and threw it on to first for the final out of the game.

That led to the traditional dogpile celebration in the infield after the game. It was a celebration 17 years in the making.

RCK has long been the class of Dutchess County high school baseball, and one of the best teams in Section 1, but a second state title has eluded the Indians and coach Pat Mealy for almost a generation. Quickly, the focus will turn to next year, and the possibility of a repeat since Ketchum only graduates four seniors.

Weatherwax struck out seven, walked three and hit a batter as he levered at times, but still held the Cougars hitless between the 3rd and 7th innings.

Renegades stay in first with strong outings at Jersey Shore

A five-run outburst in the top of the 10th inning led the Hudson Valley Renegades to an 8-4 victory over the Jersey Shore BlueClaws on Friday night at ShoreTown Ballpark.

The two teams split the first four games of this critical South Atlantic League North Division series.

Then the Renegades won the final two games on Saturday and Sunday. Another strong start by Chase Hampton and early offense helped the Renegades post a dominant 4-0 win over the Jersey Shore BlueClaws on Saturday night.

On Sunday, another historic performance by Drew Thorpe guided the Renegades to a 1-0 win over the BlueClaws. Following an amazing start last Sunday against the Aberdeen IronBirds, Thorpe turned in another one of the best starts that the Renegades have ever gotten. Across 7.0 shutout innings, the right-hander struck out 12, the most by a Hudson Valley pitcher in a single game since 2005 when online game-by-game records are available. In his last two starts, Thorpe (5-1) has thrown 15.0 shutout innings while allowing just six hits, two walks and striking out 19 batters.

The BlueClaws took the lead in the bottom of the first of the game on Friday as they jumped on Juan Carela two batters into the frame. After Nick Ward was hit by a pitch, Marcus Lee Sang drove him in with a triple to left-center. Two batters later, Andrick Nava lifted a sacrifice fly to center to score Lee Sang and give Jersey Shore a 2-0 lead.

In the bottom of the third, the BlueClaws tacked on another with a two-out rally off Carela comprised of a Rixon Wingrove single and a Nava double off the wall in right to extend the advantage to 3-0. Carela settled down after that, and did not allow another run across his 5.2 innings of work. The right-hander walked only one and struck out 10, marking the second consecutive start that he reached double digits in strikeouts.

Hudson Valley broke through against Gunner Mayer in the top of the fourth. Anthony Garcia singled and advanced to third on a Grant Richardson double with one out. Eduardo Torrealba lined a 1-0 pitch into left for a single to plate Garcia and cut the deficit to 3-1. The Renegades tied the game in the top of the sixth, as Grant Richardson tripled to score Spencer Henson and came home on a Torrealba sacrifice fly off Jason Ruffcorn to even the score at 3-3.

The game stayed tied until the top of the 10th, when the Renegades erupted for five runs off Matt Russell and Tristan Garnett. Ben Cowles drove in automatic runner Kyle Battle with a single to right field to put the Renegades in front 4-3. Rafael Flores followed with a single, and after the runners advanced to second and third on a groundout, Henson was intentionally walked to load the bases for Richardson. He hit a ground ball to first that he beat out for an infield single to score Cowles. Garnett then threw the live ball out of play thinking



Chippari's undefeated record leads RCK boys tennis team to strong season

It was a banner season for Roy C. Ketcham High School boys tennis team.

The Indians finished second in the league. It was the first time in a decade that Coach Linda Edgar's team finished that high and the first time she ever had a first singles player go undefeated through the year.

RCK's Christopher Chippari went unbeaten as first singles with a record of 12-0. It was a dominant year for the Indians, competing against the likes of league champion John Jay Cross River, Mahopac, Carmel, John Jay East Fishkill and Arlington.

Chippari reached the round of 16 in the postseason tournament held at Harrison High School.

"We had the finest tennis athletes in Dutchess County representing our area and school," said Edgar.

"Chris will be joining the SUNY Oneonta men's tennis team this fall."

Freshman Arjun Murali won his first match and only faltered against the No. 3

seed, Bronxville's Patrick Kenny. Kenny made it all the way to the semifinals. RCK's Jake Waxman lost his first-round match, but not before splitting sets and losing in the third set tie breaker.

"Jakes tenacity was so impressive to watch," Edgar said. "Unfortunately, it came down to a few points that did not go our way."

Ketcham's first Doubles team of Donald Cheng and Tommy Leung had an outstanding year as well, finishing 10-2.

Ketcham has a young team and a lot to look forward to in the coming years as Murali is just a freshman and Waxman is a sophomore. "You will want to keep an eye on both of these boys as they are only getting stronger every year," said Edgar.

The Ketcham boys' tennis team also maintains high academic standards with 10 of the 12 athletes were recognized and awarded with "Scholar Athlete" merits. In addition, five boys received All League Awards. These included Chris Chippari, Arjun Murali, Jake Waxman, Donald Cheng and Tommy Leung.

Among the inaccuracies are:

He cannot make any statement on matters that are subject to litigation and for which decisions, as Supervisor, I am not responsible. The Planning Board decisions are a central basis for the litigation;

The Planning Board, not the Town Board, deliberated on and approved the design and drawings of the Hughsonville gas station project, and the building designs were conceived by my opponent with support of the Planning Board;

The Town Board HAS NOT approved any rezoning for propane storage tanks – Bill Beale and I have opposed it;

I have not been in favor of any plans for so-called overdevelopment – please identify one plan where I have been in support;

I rewrote and supported the repeal of a Town code section that had allowed for development;

The water and sewer lines proposed for Route 9 are exactly for the purpose of enabling water and sewer to go to our residents in that area. The County Department of Public Health has strongly endorsed the infrastructure project for this purpose.

Melanie's Law unanimously passes NYS Senate

State Senator Rob Rolison (39th District) released a statement on June 7 following the upper chamber's unanimous passage of S.6288, also known as Melanie's Law. Named for homicide victim and Dutchess County resident Melanie Chianese, Rolison re-introduced the public safety legislation earlier this year; former Senator Sue Serino was the bill's original sponsor. The version of Melanie's Law which passed the Senate today was co-sponsored by Rolison and sponsored by Senator Michelle Hinchey, a Democrat. The legislation now awaits passage in the state Assembly, where it

also enjoys bipartisan support.

"Today's (June 7) Senate passage of Melanie's Law is a testament to bipartisanship and what happens when lawmakers work together to get things done. Public safety should be a top priority for government. This is a victory for Melanie's family, especially her mother Cheryl and her young son, and all victims of domestic abuse. I am proud to have co-sponsored this critical bill to address a major loophole in current criminal procedure law that will protect more family members and loved ones from violence," said Rolison.

Jacobson sponsored bill allows Beacon, Poughkeepsie to collect hotel-motel tax

Asemblymember Jonathan Jacobson (D-104) passed two bills on June 6, enabling the cities of Beacon (A06556) and Poughkeepsie (A06555) to collect a hotel-motel tax of up to 5%. The legislation also includes Airbnbs and bed and breakfasts.

Jacobson said, "Airbnbs are popping up across the Hudson Valley. This tax gives the cities of Beacon and Poughkeepsie the option of collecting a local tax of up to

5% to help offset the costs of supporting these businesses.

"I have previously passed similar legislation for the City and Town of Newburgh. The benefit of this tax is that it is almost exclusively paid by visitors rather than area residents," Jacobson concluded.

The bills now await passage in the Senate, where they are sponsored by Senator Rob Rolison.

The Renegades jumped in front in a battle between the top two teams in the SAL North on a three-run double by Marcos Cabrera in the top of the second off Minor League rehabber Jon Duplantier. Hudson Valley added another tally in the top of the third when a throwing error allowed Spencer

Jones to score and extend the lead to 4-0. In the top of the fourth, a balk by Tristan Garnett brought Ben Cowles home, and Jones drove in Grant Richardson with an RBI single to extend the advantage to 6-0. Richardson had a huge game, going 4-for-4 with a double and three runs scored while reaching base in all five of his plate appearances.

Josh Maciejewski (1-0), Mason Vinyard, Clay Aguilar and Harrison Cohen combined for 4.1 scoreless innings out of the bullpen to close out the game. The win gave Maciejewski his 10th with Hudson Valley, making him the winningest left-handed pitcher in Renegades history, and just the second Renegades pitcher to ever record double digit wins.

Wednesday's game was postponed due to the poor air quality from the wildfires

in Canada.

That meant a double header on Thursday, and the Renee's did not fare well, losing a pair of pitchers duels, 1-0 and 2-1.

In the opener, the Renegades got a great pitching performance by Zach Messinger (0-4), who allowed just one run on three hits across 5.0 innings, striking out six and walking two. However, in the bottom of the fourth, he allowed a solo home run to Casey Martin that stood up as the game's lone run. Messenger has been a hard-luck pitcher all year. He does not have a victory all season, but his earned run average is below 3.

Matt Osterberg (2-3) and Tommy McCollum shut out Hudson Valley while limiting the team to only three hits in the game, all singles.

In the nightcap, the Renegades struck first in the top of the third inning. Luis Santos ripped a double down the left field line and scored after two passed balls advanced him to third and then home. Tyrone Yulie turned in one of his better performances of the season, but allowed a run on a Jared Carr RBI double in the bottom of the fifth to tie the game at 1-1. Yulie (1-4) allowed two runs on three hits in 5.2 innings, walking three and striking out three. In the bottom of the sixth, Jersey Shore took the lead on an RBI single by Casey Martin scoring Marcus Lee Sang from second base to give the BlueClaws a 2-1 lead.

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Hudson Valley Shakespeare Festival awarded \$10 million grant

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Thorpe's dedication brings weekly pitching honor

For the second time in three weeks, the South Atlantic League (SAL) Player of the Week is wearing a Hudson Valley Renegades uniform.

Drew Thorpe has been named South Atlantic League Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 29-June 4.

He had a bravura performance that triggered the award.

In his lone start of the week, Thorpe threw a career-high 8.0 shutout innings, allowing just one hit while walking two and striking out seven. He became the first Renegades pitcher to throw 8.0 innings without allowing a run since Aug. 17, 2008, when Tyree Hayes threw 9.0 shutout innings in a complete game shutout at the Lowell Spinners. It was only the fourth time since 2005 that a Renegades starter completed 8.0 innings in a start.

It was one of the best pitching performances in all of minor league baseball this year. He is one of only three pictures in minor league baseball this year to throw eight shutout innings.

"Thorpe's dedication to continue to get better week-to-week and between starts has been exemplary," said Renegades Pitching Coach Preston Claiborne. "From the education work

he does, to crafting pitches and executing a game plan, he's shown momentous growth. Drew never changes his demeanor, whether he has a quality outing or scuffles. His desire to be excellent is only augmented by how monstrous a competitor he is."

In recognition of his achievement, the Renegades will make a donation of \$500 in Thorpe's name to the Maria Fareri Children's Hospital at Westchester Medical Center Health Network.

Thorpe, 22, was drafted by the Yankees in the second round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of Cal Poly. Beginning his professional career this season with the Renegades, he leads the SAL in innings pitched (51.2), and ranks tied for 2nd in wins (4), and sixth in strikeouts (59). He is ranked as the Yankees' top pitching prospect and #6 overall by MLB Pipeline, and Baseball America ranks Thorpe as the #2 pitching prospect and #7 overall in the organization.

He joins RHP Juan Carela, who was named SAL Pitcher of the Week for the week of April 17-23, and Aaron Palensky who was named SAL Player of the Week for the week of May 22-28 as Renegades to garner a weekly award this season.

the people who are committed to the Renegades. Right now, we have one of the most successful teams we've ever had.


You talked about the summer being your bread-and-butter season. Is it shaping up to be that way?

HV Shakespeare Festival receives \$10 million from NYS Arts Council

The Hudson Valley Shakespeare Festival has announced a grant award totaling \$10 million from the New York State Council on the Arts (NYSCA) to support the construction of a LEED-Certified outdoor theater, and the ecological land restoration of their new 98-acre site in Garrison.

This grant is part of a record large capital project funding announcement by NYSCA, which totals over \$90.5 million distributed to 19 projects across New York State. The \$10 million award represents one of the largest expressions of support by NYSCA in the state, marking a milestone achievement for HVSF as it receives capital funding from NYSCA for the first time.

Governor Kathy Hochul expressed her commitment to New York's diverse artistic and creative endeavors, stating, "From New York City to the North Country, we are investing in our state's robust arts and culture sector to ensure all New Yorkers, regardless of their background, have access to the transformative power of art. Our unprecedented support for this shared vision of accessible and sustainable cultural spaces will result in a stronger economy, more jobs, and improved community and personal health for New Yorkers and our visitors from around the globe."

The news of the NYSCA grant comes during the quiet phase of a large-scale capital

campaign designed to transform a 98-acre site in Garrison, a former golf course, into HVSF's first-ever permanent home, and build a solid foundation for environmental and financial sustainability for the company's future.

A significant portion of the grant will be used to support the construction of a new open-air theater designed by the celebrated architecture firm Studio Gang, founded and led by Jeanne Gang. The timber-frame structure is slated to be the nation's first purpose-built theater to achieve LEED Platinum certification from the U.S. Green Building Council (USGBC). The funds will also be used for the ecological restoration of the site, creating native meadows, new picnic lawns, and new ADA accessible pathways. These initiatives all align with HVSF's commitment to achieving carbon neutrality for the campus by 2040.

"This transformative grant empowers HVSF's next chapter as a national model for environmental sustainability in the performing arts and underscores our emergence as a cultural anchor in the region," remarked Kendra Ekelund, Managing Director at HVSF. "We are deeply grateful to Governor Hochul for her long-standing support of our project, which began with her visit to our site during her tenure as Lieutenant Governor in June of 2021. This grant represents an investment not just in HVSF's mission, but also in the numerous communities we serve in the mid-Hudson region. We are so thankful to NYSCA for this robust and profound investment from New York State."

Davis McCallum, Artistic Director at HVSF, added, "We are honored to be a part of this historic investment from Governor Hochul and NYSCA in the future of the Arts in New York State. The funding will not only allow HVSF to create a permanent, open-air theater venue in the heart of the Hudson Valley, a unique experience that will inspire audiences for generations to come, but it will also enable us to enhance backstage facilities for our company of artists, and make key improvements to the visitor experience for our audiences. Our aspiration is to be the greenest theater in the country, and this remarkable support from NYSCA advances us mightily on the path to that goal."

In her live announcement on June 6, Governor Hochul added, "We're going to continue bringing Shakespeare to the Hudson Valley, and I had a chance to visit and witness the incredible work that you're

doing. And I just knew that we had to continue supporting this. There are so many different ways that you can touch the soul. It's with your eyes. It's with your ears, listening to the music. It's also just becoming engaged in a story - a story that's over, I don't know, 500 years old, hundreds of years old, that it continues to this day to tell stories that have incredible relevance."

NYSCA Executive Director Mara Manus said, "We are immensely grateful to Governor Hochul and the New York State Legislature for this historic level of capital grant-making. These critical investments will support visionary expansions, essential facility improvements, and community-building strategies that will promote health, safety, and accessibility. We commend the Hudson Valley Shakespeare Festival for their bold and inspirational project that will deliver the measurable benefits of the arts to New Yorkers and our visitors for generations to come."

NYSCA Chair Katherine Nicholls said, "Capital projects for the arts are an investment in our communities, our health, and our prosperity for decades to come. On behalf of the Council and staff, I congratulate the Hudson Valley Shakespeare Festival on its vision and dedication to serving the residents and visitors of New York and we look forward to seeing all that will flourish from this initiative."

NYSCA's Large Capital Improvement Grants for Arts and Culture support arts and cultural institutions across the state that are undertaking impactful, large-scale capital improvements. Grants range from \$2 million to \$10 million for projects with a total cost of \$4 million or more. This funding will support investments to expand cultural programming, reach new and diverse audiences, and promote accessibility. These grants will also help advance the State's goals around diversity, equity and inclusion and will require all grantees to commit to social equity initiatives and access plans that serve all New Yorkers. NYSCA's Large Capital Improvement Grants program is administered in coordination with Empire State Development, which reviews applications to evaluate the potential for projects to support local placemaking, community development, and downtown revitalization efforts.



Tubetini with Asparagus

Ingredients

1 bunch fresh asparagus
1/3 cup diced shallots
2 cloves garlic, peeled
1 tablespoon olive oil
1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese
1 cup heavy cream
salt & pepper
1 lb. tubetini pasta
cracked black pepper
toasted pine nuts
grated lemon rind
grated Parmesan cheese

DIRECTIONS:

Trim the ends off of the asparagus spears and cook them in lightly salted water for about 5 minutes until tender.

Cut off the tips, reserve and set aside, then cut the stems into pieces.

In a saucepan, heat the oil and cook the shallots about 3 to 4 minutes.

Add the garlic and cook until the garlic is golden.

Add the cream and chopped asparagus stems and heat over a low flame.

Add the grated Parmesan cheese, and stir.

Taste, and season with salt and pepper.

Keep the sauce warm while you cook the pasta.

Drain the pasta, then toss with the sauce and reserved asparagus tips until everything is heated through.

Serve in individual bowls garnished with pine nuts, lemon rind, and black pepper.

Luigi Coppola is one of five brothers born to Francesca and Antonio Coppola. The Coppola family came to America from Naples, Italy in 1954. Antonio and his brothers opened their first restaurant in Poughkeepsie in 1961. Luigi and his brothers Nick, John, Antonio and Vincent have carried on the family tradition in the way their parents taught them, using classic recipes taught to them at their apron strings. 

LitFest set for June 17, 18 in Beacon

The inaugural Beacon LitFest, hosted by the Beacon LitFest Committee and Howland Cultural Center, will take place on June 17 and June 18. The lineup will include award-winning writers, poets, and playwrights and cameo appearances by New York Times (NYT) and NPR (National Public Radio) Puzzlemaster Will Shortz and accomplished actor and producer Emily Mortimer, said organizers. The event will also offer writing workshops with master instructors at Howland Cultural Center (HCC) in Beacon.

The Festival will feature four panels—nonfiction, poetry, drama, and fiction, on June 17th, from 11 a.m. and 5 p.m. according to organizers.

According to Beacon LitFest information, the nonfiction writers Donna Minkowitz, Ginger Strand, and Jamie Price will read their work and discuss their working methods, initiating a day-long conversation about creative processes. "Poets Martine Bellen, Indran Amirthanayagam, and Patricia Spears Jones will read their work and engage in conversation about the place of poetry in today's literary landscape," stated a press release. "Two playwrights, Charlotte Meehan and Nigel Gearing will launch the afternoon, demonstrating two unique ways of creating plays. They will be followed by Laura Sims in conversation with actor and director Emily Mortimer."

Danielle Trussoni joined by Will Shortz, puzzle editor of The New York Times, will be on the last panel of the day. The two will discuss the ways they collaborated on her latest novel, "The Puzzlemaster," states the release. Organizers note that attendees will receive the first edition signed copies of

Trussoni's novel with the purchase of any other book. A free lunch will be available and is courtesy of sponsor Healthy In Color.

"Howland Cultural Center (HCC) is thrilled to host the literary festival emphasizing the inspiration of the written word and the growing Hudson Valley literary community" Theresa Kraft, the board president said. The event is a collaborative event created by the Beacon LitFest committee, steered by Hannah Brooks, HCC board member and Shane Bly Killoran, creator of Hithouse Film, and Ruth Danon founder of the poetry project, Live Writing, all based in Beacon.

"I'm so thrilled to join Ruth & Hannah for this literary journey! And as a life-long theatre practitioner and scholar, I'm unbelievably excited that playwriting will be included as the literary art that it is," said Killoran via email.

Three consecutive live writing and storytelling intensives, limited to 12 participants each on June 18 at 10 a.m., noon and 2 p.m., according to organizers. The workshops, led by Hudson Valley writers, include: "Live Writing-A Poetry Project" with poet and curator Ruth Danon, PhD; "Is It Memoir? Is It Fiction?" with journalist and memoirist Ken Foster; and "From Stage to Page: Adding Drama to Narrative" with Dramaturg, writer and producer, Shane Bly Killoran.

"Our plan with this festival is to highlight Beacon's growing literary community and expose audiences to fresh and thought-provoking work," said Dr Hannah Brooks, LitFest co-producer and Howland board member, in the release.

Howland Cultural Center and BLF support diverse voices in panelists and audiences and are committed to inclusivity and access to cultural participation,
