VFW honors WWII veteran Hochlowski, Ketcham presents honorary HS diploma

Former Prisoner of War (POW) during World War II and local Wappingers Falls resident Henry "Hank" Hochlowski, 97, was recognized by fellow veterans at the Veterans of Foreign War in Wappingers Falls on June 25.

In 2021, a mural, "Veterans Wall," was painted on the wall of the VFW Post on School St. VFW member Hank, who was

given the nickname "Hock" during his time in the service, is shown leading a team ashore from a landing craft during WWII in the mural. The mural was painted by artist Michael Scelia, who is a veteran.

Hank and his wife, Dorothy DiDomizio Hochlowski, who died in 2018, have three sons, Barry, Warren and Michael.

Warren said Hank was born on

September 3, 1925 in the City of Poughkeepsie. Hank's father died when he was an infant. Hank grew up during the Great Depression, being raised by his mother and stepfather. Hank told of how when he was seven years old, his appendix burst. Hank, who is one of 10 siblings,


It was big news across the country – literally – for the Hudson Valley Renegades last week.

Cavaccini wins in Republican primary for Wappinger supervisor

The Republican primary for the Town of Wappinger Supervisor race was between current supervisor Richard Thurston and current Dutchess County Legislator Joseph Cavaccini. Cavaccini received 613 votes (56.71%) votes to Thurston's 468 (43.29%) votes. Cavaccini will now run against Democrat Robin Licari in the General Election in November.

Cavaccini was endorsed by the Town of Wappinger Republican Committee, by a 29 - 5 vote in January.

Late last week, Cavaccini told Southern Dutchess News, "I am honored and humbled by the overwhelming prayers, well wishes, and overall support from all across our great community."

He remarked, "As we move forward to November, I am excited to continue our mission of protecting and improving the quality of life of our neighbors here in our Town and Village. Preventing overdevelopment that adds to congestion, promoting innovative attractions to fill our vacant retail sites, improving our parks and infrastructure, and restoring management and accountability to Town Hall remain my top priorities."

Cavaccini added, "Serving my hometown is the honor of a lifetime and I am so appreciative of the confidence our neighbors have placed in me."

Thurston first took office as supervisor for the Town of Wappinger in January 2018.

Thurston did not respond to inquiries for comment.

missed approximately a year of school as he was recovering.

When he was 18, Hank was drafted into the Army.

In 1944, Hank and the unit he was with were captured by the Germans, he said. It was while he was in France, he became a POW. He was a POW until the end of WWII.

"One day, they just let us go," recalled Hank.

Joe Angelo, with the VFW in Wappingers Falls, said, "He's our oldest WWII veteran." Angelo noted Hank will "tell you that when you wake up every morning, it's a good day."

Warren, who lives in Red Oaks Mill said, "He never talked about what he went through. We were young. He played sports with us, taught us values. We were just glad he was Dad."

Warren said, "When I heard about it (his father being a POW), we had learned a whole new part of our dad. He suffered from PTSD (post-traumatic stress disorder) for years. Our mother helped him with that."

Rebecca, one of Hank's seven grandchildren, said, "He's our hero. He's the patriarch of the family. We love him."

Kalyn, another of Hank's granddaughters, remarked, "He is definitely the hero in our area and our family. [The recognition] is well deserved."

VFW Senior Branch Commander Mike Rahilly said, "I'm just blessed to be a part of this."

Richard Gerbeth Jr., VFW Commander, announced that on June 25 Hank was "Commander for the Day."

'Hock' presented with diplomas

Hank was honored with high school diplomas. On June 24, Roy C. Ketcham High School, in the Wappingers Central School District, honored him with an honorary diploma during the Class of

2023 graduation which was held on the school's grounds.

"We are very proud to present Mr. Hochlowski with an honorary diploma from Roy C. Ketcham HS and commend him for his service and dedication to our country," said Dr. Dwight Bonk, Superintendent of Schools for Wappingers Central School District. Hank also received a diploma from the Poughkeepsie City School District.

Hank said he completed his high school education in Poughkeepsie, but he never picked up his diploma.

"It was good. A very happy time for me—all the people there," said Hank about receiving his diplomas.

County hosts children's book author to help spread the word on mental health

The Dutchess County Department of Behavioral & Community Health (DBCH) recently welcomed children's book author and international speaker Dennis Gillan for an opportunity to interact with staff and distribute the first copy of his anti-bullying book "Nice Shoes" to Morse Young Child Magnet Elementary School in Poughkeepsie. DBCH will distribute copies of his book to all public elementary schools and libraries in Dutchess County as an avenue for parents, teachers, and caregivers to open dialogue with children about mental health.

Gillan spent the day reading the story aloud to Morse third-graders and answering their questions. He also sat down for discussion with members of the Dutchess County Resiliency Council for Suicide Prevention, a group of passionate individuals who meet regularly to examine data, provide trainings, community projects, and education with the intention to lower suicide and ensure a safer and more supportive community.

Gillan discussed his organization, "Half a Sorrow Foundation," for which he is the executive director. The organiza-

tion was started to help improve the mental health of individuals within organizations by promoting real conversations about mental health. Since losing family members to suicide, Gillan has made it his mission to tackle the stigma surrounding mental health by sharing his story with others. He wrote the children's book "Nice Shoes" to introduce behavioral health to youth in a way that is understandable and may be relatable to begin the conversation at a young age.

Dutchess County offers many innovative behavioral health services, including its Stabilization Center, located at 230 North Road in Poughkeepsie, and the 988 Dutchess County Suicide and Crisis Helpline, both available 24/7 to those in need. Mental health and suicide prevention services are also available with a touch of a button using the Dutchess County Helpline App which is available in both the Apple Store and Android Marketplace.

Preserve the woodlands

To the Editor:

Regarding the proposed plans for the Hudson Highlands Fjord Trail connecting Beacon and Cold Spring:

All I can say is that building more infrastructure to accommodate the current mess of traffic at Breakneck Ridge, will only have one clear result; bring in even MORE traffic.

If the "core goal" and "top priority" of the designers is to "manage," and not "add to visitation and congestion" to Breakneck Ridge, Stony Point and other area destinations, they are clearly going about it all wrong because if you BUILD it, they WILL come!!!

Adding public restrooms at all trailheads, a visitor center, 4 more parking lots, a shuttle from the train station, a boardwalk trail which accommodates bikes, play and swimming areas, an outdoor classroom; ALL will make the area far more alluring to tourism & bring in FAR more traffic, NOT less!!!

Plus the fact that wild areas along the Hudson will become progressively LESS wild and more inundated with people...is this really in keeping with the vision of area residents or is it just the dream of a handful of elitists whose egos are too big to settle for a common sense, protective approach?

Since when did Scenic Hudson, a land trust, become more interested in building parks than in being dedicated to preserving & protecting areas for wildlife? It seems to me they have lost one of their core principles.

If you don't want to ADD to congestion, if you want to PROTECT wildlife and PRESERVE the peace of the woodlands, then you need to RESTRICT & not increase the number of people entering these areas. Be VERY conservative. Strictly limit the number of parking spaces, and shrink, not expand, the "grand vision" to protect, instead of exploiting, these environmentally sensitive areas.

If the limited parking spaces quickly fill up, so what? People will just go someplace else, no big deal! They won't park where they will get ticketed. Having thousands stomping up and down trails with their dogs is only going to increase erosion, drive

Yulie garners weekly pitching honor in SAL

The Hudson Valley Renegades are cornering the market on these awards.

Following a clutch performance in the biggest game of the season, pitcher Tyrone Yulie has been named South Atlantic League Pitcher of the Week for the week of June 19-25. Yulie becomes the fourth Renegade to win a weekly award in 2023, and the third to win Pitcher of the Week.

Tasked with taking the mound in a potential clinching game, Yulie stepped up to the stage and threw a career-high 7.0 innings, allowing no hits and three walks and striking out seven while picking up the win on Tuesday, June 20 at the Brooklyn Cyclones. With the team's 1-0 win over Brooklyn, Hudson Valley clinched the First Half Championship in the SAL North, punching its ticket into the 2023

SAL Playoffs.

Yulie, 21, was signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on July 5, 2018 out of La Romana, Dominican Republic. In three starts during the month of June, he has hit his stride, posting a 2-1 record with a 1.53 ERA while allowing just nine hits in 17.2 innings. He has struck out 18 batters and pitched to a 0.91 WHIP. This is his first career weekly award.

He joins RHP Juan Carela and RHP Drew Thorpe, who were named SAL Pitcher of the Week for the weeks of April 17-23 and May 29-June 4, respectively, and OF Aaron Palensky who was named SAL Player of the Week for the week of May 22-28, as Renegades to garner a weekly award this season. Palensky Has since been promoted to Double A.

Renegades get off to slow start in 2nd half

Call it a baseball hangover.

The Hudson Valley Renegades returned home for the first time since winning the first-half of the North Division of the South Atlantic League and clinching a playoff berth and dropped the series opener to the Wilmington Blue Rocks, 5-2, on Wednesday night at Heritage Financial Park.

The team did not play a traditional Tuesday night game. And this came on top of losing four of five games to the Brooklyn Cyclones the previous week. The Hudson Valley Renegades also fell to Wilmington by a score of 4-1 on Thursday night. The game was scoreless until Wilmington broke through in the sixth

inning off Jack Neely. With two outs in the frame, Brady House hit a solo home run to right-center off Neely (3-2). Jeremy De La Rosa followed with a single and stole second base, and came home to score on a T.J. White single to extend the lead to 2-0.

On Wednesday, Wilmington opened up the scoring with a pair of solo home runs off Tyrone Yulie (3-5) from Lucius Fox and Will Frizzell in the third and fourth innings, respectively.

After allowing just one hit through three innings, Andry Lara worked around a bases-loaded jam in the fourth to keep the Renegades off the scoreboard. Rafael Flores, Anthony Garcia, and Alexander Vargas strung together three consecutive

one-out singles to load the bases, but Lara (2-5) retired the next two hitters to end the threat and preserve their 2-0 advantage.

The Blue Rocks plated a run in three straight innings beginning in the sixth, when three of the first four batters reached safely against Yulie before Mason Vineyard entered out of the bullpen. The 24-year-old struck out both batters he faced in the frame, but a wild pitch scored Frizzell to extend the Blue Rocks' lead to 3-0.

Jeremy De La Rosa singled in another run in the seventh off Vinyard, and Jordy Barley homered off Indigo Diaz in the eighth to open up Wilmington's lead to 5-0.

Hudson Valley finally broke through in

the bottom of the eighth off Chance Huff. Flores and Garcia again tallied back-to-back one-out singles to bring up Vargas, who laced a double down the left field line to score Flores and place two men in scoring position. Antonio Gomez drove in Garcia on an RBI groundout to cut the deficit to 5-2.

Carlos Romero recorded the last four outs of the game to earn his first save of the season and hand the Renegades their fifth-straight loss, their longest losing streak of the season.

In the loss, Hudson Valley pitching recorded 15 strikeouts. Yulie punched out six in 5.1 frames while Vinyard struck out a career-high five batters in 1.2 innings.

The money will be used toward professional development for staff, community events and starting up a gay-straight alliance (GSA) chapter, which will benefit students from BOCES' 13 component school districts.

Scott said she has heard from many students who are supportive of the LGBTQ community and BOCES' efforts. "They

seem very excited that this is coming to their school," Scott said. "Our students come from all over the county and have different

backgrounds across the board. We accept everybody; it doesn't matter who you are, you're welcome here."

A matriarch of the family and pillar of strength in the community, Jackie was a woman of great tenacity and unwavering principles. A good and faithful steward, she displayed an aptitude for cultivating seeds – both in her garden and in the classrooms of Fishkill Elementary School. Spanning three decades, Jackie or as her students would call her, “Mrs. Sondermann” imbued primary kids with a strong sense of determination, work ethic, and a deep sense of purpose. Stern but fair was the hallmark of her discipline. She reinforced good judgement with her students so that they may take better care of themselves. At her best, she was able to help her students access a better version of themselves and give every student the chance to reach their God-given potential. Her students would remember her saying “don’t cut corners and take the easy way out” and “if you are going to do something, you better do it right.”

While she had a reputation of being “tough” and wanted her students to work hard, she offered comfort in times of hardship and distress. This extended beyond her classroom and into her kitchen, where her house was a second home to many. Whether you were a first-time visitor or a frequent guest, all were welcome with open arms and fed a home cooked meal – often picked right from her garden! 'Hidden masterpiece' of stained glass art to be unveiled at Grace Church, Millbrook

A long-hidden and recently restored masterpiece of American stained glass art depicting Jesus Christ and Mary Magdalene holding hands as he bids farewell before ascending to heaven (the "Resurrection Window") will be unveiled to the public on the afternoon of July 22 at Grace Episcopal Church in Millbrook.

Newly elected Bishop-coadjutor of New York, the Right Reverend Matthew Heyd, will join the Rector of Grace Church, the Rev. Dr. Matthew Calkins, and other clergy and honored speakers in an afternoon of talks, worship and the blessing of the newly restored window.

From 3-4 p.m., the Revs. Elizabeth Broyles and Shane Phelan, of the order of the Companions of Mary Magdalene, and Brianne van Vorst, stained glass conservator and expert consultant on the project, will speak in the Parish Hall on the significance and uniqueness of this historic window. At 4 p.m., Bishop Heyd will preside in a service of Evensong, concluding with a Blessing of the window in the Memorial Garden. Following the service there will be a reception on the lawn in front of the Rectory.

The window by renowned stained glass artist Maitland Armstrong and his daughter Helen Armstrong has been hidden since 1968 by a pipe organ placed in the rear of the church which completely blocked any interior view of the window - except for brave souls who climbed to a narrow loft behind the organ. The view of the window from the street was also hidden for many years by a large spruce tree. This was removed in 2003 and a Memorial Garden was placed under the window, but its layered glass construction meant that the street view was still obscured.

Today, Femenella & Associates, under the expert supervision of Brianne van Vorst of Liberty Consulting, has removed, cleaned and restored the window, and has placed it back in its original location - now facing the street for all who pass by to admire. Back-lighting will allow its magnificent colors and imagery to once again be viewed by the public. This priceless local treasure will be

"unveiled" in all its glory on the afternoon of July 22, the date which the church marks as the feast of Mary Magdalene.

The public is invited to attend this historic event in the life of Grace Church and the village of Millbrook. To learn more about this long-hidden masterpiece of American stained glass art, go to the Grace Church website (gracemillbrook.org) and click on the link to the Resurrection church window.

The stained glass artist Maitland Armstrong and his daughter and artistic partner Helen Armstrong were contemporaries and colleagues of Louis C. Tiffany and John La Farge. Together they led an American renaissance of decorative arts in the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. Their work in layered opalescent glass was particularly innovative.

Several of Maitland Armstrong's works were commissioned for Grace Church Millbrook under the patronage of John and Adelaide Wing and their children. John died in 1910 and Adelaide, his wife of 50 years, in 1911. The large four-panel Armstrong window commissioned in their memory by their children was installed in the rear of the church, in the side facing Franklin Avenue, and dedicated on Easter Sunday 1912. The local newspaper called it the Resurrection Window, as it depicts Jesus and Mary Magdalene in the garden after Christ's Resurrection. The scene depicts a passage from the gospel of John in which Mary recognizes Jesus, they briefly touch, but then Jesus says she must let go of him, for he has not yet ascended to the Father (John 20:11-18).) Traditional depictions of this scene show Mary at a distance, kneeling, while Jesus lifts his hands to indicate the need to keep at a distance. Yet in Maitland and Helen Armstrong's interpretation of the iconographical tradition, Jesus and Mary stand side by side, holding hands, while he indicates that he must leave.

The window's memorial inscriptions quote another verse from John: "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you" (John 14:27). The scene as depicted in this exquisite window conveys this assurance of eternal love, peace and togetherness.







Crockett's Victory Garden

Mark writes about groundbreaking gardening book

Chemicals! In the vegetable garden! Now that I have your attention, I want to talk about the seminal groundbreaking gardening book that made its debut almost 50 years ago.


I was perusing my collection of garden books, searching for a copy of the "Golden Book of Wildflowers." I wanted to take it along on a summer wildflower walk that was happening last Friday night at the buttercup Farm Sanctuary in Standordville (I'll report on that next time). Wedged between a copy of "Perennial All Stars" by Jeff Cox and the Ortho book "All About Bulbs," appeared my well worn copy of "Crockett's Victory Garden." It got me wondering what has changed, and what has remained the same, in the world of vegetable gardening over the past half century.

Fifty years ago, in the early 1970s, everything was falling apart – long lines at gas stations, unemployment, inflation (12% in 1974). The president resigned. In response, people started vegetable gardening. The Public Broadcasting Network launched a TV show called "The Victory Garden," hiring garden writing celebrity James Underwood Crockett as host. Crockett was the perfect guy for the job (old white men were still popular back then). With his khaki pants, denim work shirt and casual demeanor, he made vegetable gardening accessible to the masses.

The book "Crockett's Victory Garden" was laid out month by month, as it followed Jim Crockett in his 75 X 75 foot garden throughout the year.

"There's a simple test for soil readiness: if a handful of soil remains in a moist ball after it's squeezed, the soil is still too wet to work, if it crumbles like chocolate cake, it's ready." That's Crockett's introduction to the month of March. And on it goes, until February, when he's sowing seeds for the following spring's garden. "July – By the time July arrives in the Victory Garden, the soil has been hard at work for four months and it may begin to show some signs of wear. So before I put in any additional crops to fill the vacancies left by harvests, I add nutrients."

Perusing the book, which was my Bible growing up as a young gardener, I must admit that not much has changed in the gardening world. The world outside changed – as Lou Reed sang, "Those were different times." People smoked cigarettes on airplanes. We watched a lot of television. If we were expecting a call, we sat home by the telephone. Nobody drank bottled water. But we still planted tomato seedlings after the last frost in May. Jim Crockett taught us how to use raised beds, turn peat moss and compost into the soil to make it richer, and how to prevent cutworms by using an old tuna fish can.

of print, along with books by Rudyard Kipling and Dr. Seuss.

"Turnips will be devoured by root maggots unless something is done to prevent this, so after I sow the seeds at one inch intervals along a 1/2-inch deep furrow, I water the row with a mixture of water and diazinon I repeat the diazinon application at 10 day intervals throughout the growing season ... I stop the diazinon routine two weeks shy of harvest."

Diazinon, a potent insecticide, is still sold in garden centers, but most gardeners nowadays prevent root maggots with floating row covers, which Crockett fails to mention. To be fair, he does delve into a primitive form of integrated pest management when he states, "It is a wise gardener who learns the life cycle of each major insect and disease and strikes it early, when it is most vulnerable with the least toxic material that will insure protection."


All in all, "Crockett's Victory Garden" is a wealth of information about vegetable, fruit and sometimes flower gardening, clearly stated and incredibly thorough. You can still buy the book, used, on Amazon, for \$1.23, or \$134.99 for the collector's edition.

• Heavy rain – Last week's downpours might have washed the fertilizer out of your containers of flowers and vegetables. Add Miracle-Gro fertilizer, or something similar, the next time you water them. Make sure all containers have proper drain holes, or they will fill up and drown the plant's roots.

• Woodchuck update – Ever since I installed my woodchuck-proof fence topper, which is a piece of wire fence bent outward to keep them from climbing over, I haven't seen a woodchuck anywhere on my property. I think I created a "nuclear deterrent." The woodchucks know I mean business, so they're either staying away, or secretly planning a massive blitzkrieg attack. Stay tuned.






