County, WMCHHealth to create Behavioral Health Center of Excellence

Dutchess County Executive Marc Molinaro and Westchester Medical Center Health Network (WMCHHealth) announced plans to create a Behavioral Health Center of Excellence at MidHudson Regional Hospital, leveraging private and public resources to establish a holistic approach to providing inpatient mental health services in Dutchess County. County Executive Molinaro previously announced that Dutchess County will provide \$3 million in funding for the project, an investment that will go towards permanently adding 20 inpatient behavioral health beds at MHRH – increasing the total number of available mental health beds at this facility to 60.

Establishing a Behavioral Health Center of Excellence at MidHudson Regional Hospital will provide a high-quality standard of care for behavioral health patients in Dutchess County and surrounding areas. The funding provided by Dutchess County will facilitate updates to MidHudson Regional Hospital's inpatient behavioral health units, including shared community spaces and nursing stations in these areas, in order to enhance the healing environment while prioritizing a safe environment for patients and workforce members.

"Dutchess County has long prioritized the importance of mental health, and the forthcoming Behavioral Health Center of Excellence at MidHudson Regional Hospital represents Dutchess County's latest commitment – an unprecedented dedication of funding, resources and staff, unlike any seen anywhere else in the Hudson Valley – to ensure those living with mental health issues receive the compassionate care they deserve, close to home," said Marcus J. Molinaro, Dutchess County Executive. "This new center, the result of an extraordinary public-private partnership, will not only

Castle Point receives a reprieve from possible closure

It appears that Castle Point VA Medical Center will stay open. It was in March that the Veterans Administration released a report stating that Castle Point, and other VA facilities throughout the country, would be reviewed. The VA Asset and Infrastructure Review Act (AIR) of 2018 established the independent Asset and Infrastructure Review Commission. It prescribed directives related to the development and assessment of recommendations for modernizing or realigning Veterans Health Administration facilities.

Twelve U.S. Senators on the Senate Veterans Affairs Committee (SVAC) issued a statement last week opposing the plan.

"As Senators, we share a commitment to expanding and strengthening modern VA infrastructure in a way that upholds our obligations to America's veterans. We believe the recommendations put forth to the AIR Commission are not reflective of that goal, and would put veterans in both rural and urban areas at a disadvantage, which is why we are announcing that this process does not have our support and will not move forward. The Commission is not necessary for our continued push to invest in VA health infrastructure, and together we remain dedicated to providing the Department with the resources and tools it needs to continue delivering quality care and earned services to veterans in 21st century facilities—now and into the future," read the statement from the senators," reads the statement from the dozen senators.

According to U.S. Senator Joe Manchin (D-WV), a member of the Senate Veterans Affairs Committee (SVAC), the VA AIR Commission will not move forward because it is officially opposed by 12 bipartisan Senators, and this signifies the end of the AIR Commission.

Lenox Okall, Public Affairs Specialist for VA Hudson Valley Health Care System Castle Point Campus, told Southern Dutchess News there would be no comment at this time.

In March, Senate Majority Leader Charles Schumer (D-NY) came to Castle Point and rallied for the facility to stay open. "Our veterans fought for us, and that's why I will always fight for them to ensure our veterans in New York City and across New York receive the top-notch high-quality local care that they earned and deserve," is a portion of what Schumer said in a statement on June 28.

grateful for County Executive Molinaro’s support for the project and look forward to collaborating with the County Executive and his office to strengthen mental health services in Poughkeepsie and the surrounding region.”

While delivering improvements to the inpatient units is a priority, the partnership between WMCHHealth and Dutchess County extends to establishing a continuum of care between private and public resources that will help ensure the best possible behavioral

health patient outcomes.

As part of this expanded approach, WMCHHealth and Dutchess County Department of Behavioral & Community Health will partner to embed County staff at the Behavioral Health Center of Excellence at MidHudson Regional Hospital. This will help facilitate a seamless transition for discharged patients to continue their recovery by utilizing the extensive behavioral health programs available throughout Dutchess County for residents with mental health or substance use issues, using every available resource to help ensure the appropriate support for our patients to recover. Creating a Center

of Excellence also means establishing an approach to mental health services that best serves patients, such as focusing on delivering trauma informed care, which is training clinical staff to have an informed understanding of the role that trauma has likely played in the lives of individuals in need of mental health services.

WMCHHealth also announced last month that 20 inpatient mental health beds will be located in the expanded HealthAlliance Hospital on Mary’s Avenue in Kingston, NY, bringing the total inpatient mental health beds available at WMCHHealth facilities in Dutchess and Ulster counties to 80. WMCHHealth is the largest provider of behavioral health services in the Hudson Valley with a total

of 205 inpatient behavioral health beds throughout the Network.

The plan to expand the number of inpatient units to create a Behavioral Health Center of Excellence at MidHudson Regional Hospital requires approval by the New York State Department of Health and New York State Office of Mental Health, after which the WMCHHealth will work to finalize design and planning for the renovations. Construction on the project will be phased in order to avoid temporarily needing to take a significant number of crucial inpatient behavioral health beds offline for an extended period. The first phase of the project is expected to be completed late next year.

Town of Wappinger Supervisor Richard Thurston, on behalf of the Town of Wappinger, formally entered an agreement with Brian and Courtney Kolb to operate and maintain a one-acre community garden site at Carnwath Farms Historic Site and Park, off of Wheeler Hill Rd.

“The creation of the Community Gardens is another step in bringing life and functionality of Carnwath back to the community. We want to enable Carnwath to be a place to enjoy the outdoors while helping our residents to improve their quality of life. Gardening and farming are one of those key elements. Even the Town’s 2010 Comprehensive Plan envisioned this revival,” Thurston told Southern Dutchess News last week.

According to town officials, Carnwath Farms is more than 99.7 acres. In the 1990s, the property was purchased by the Town to develop a center for the arts, culture, history, and leisure for the people of Wappinger, noted town leaders. The site was a former Victorian-era estate. The Wappinger Town Board in June unanimously accepted the proposal by the Kolbs.

“I thank the Kolbs for bringing their

agricultural background and expertise to our Town’s largest park. I look forward to a successful partnership,” Wappinger Councilman William Beale, who represents the First Ward, said in a press release.

Also quoted in the release, Dutchess County Legislator Joseph Cavaccini who said, “It is exciting to see this project come to fruition after three years. I commend the Kolb family for taking on this responsibility and willing to work to bring agricultural programming to our community. We are excited to see the increased use of Carnwath Farms that will allow us to continue to rehabilitate this site to be a true destination for our residents and visitors alike.”

During the signing ceremony Brian Kolb said, “We came across the farm plot last year” and began talking to the to the Town. They will mainly do prep work for next year and will run irrigation, he said.

When asked when the project will begin, Thurston replied. “It has already begun in the sense that the one-acre has been set out and fenced. During the next month or two, the Kolbs (who are licensing the space to manage it for the Town) will be preparing the ground for cultiva-

tion. They plan to have some plots available for late summer/early fall gardening.”

Thurston noted the town leaders have a number of plans for Carnwath.

“The next item on the list is the renovation of a significant section of the first floor for the new community/senior center. Also, water and HVAC will be added to the Reese Cultural Center for year-round use. Our engineers will be finalizing their report on the renovation of the Mansion building. Currently, we are also Planning a Blue Grass Festival at Carnwath in August,” stated the supervisor.

“While we are adding these new programs, Carnwath is open from dawn to dusk for hiking, picnics and available for rental for parties, weddings and other events. The Sports Museum is open during the weekends,” remarked Thurston, who added community members should “come in to enjoy the nearly 100 acres of country land along the Hudson.”

Town officials said that residents interested in participating in this program are encouraged to monitor the Town website and social media for updates on registration and events.

State Police investigate fatal crash on River Road North in Wappinger

The New York State Police began investigating a fatal motor vehicle crash on River Road North in the town of Wappinger, which occurred on June 25.

Troopers were dispatched by Dutchess County 911 to River Road North at approximately 7:25 p.m., for a rollover crash with an ejection. According to officials, upon locating the operator, Troopers employed life-saving-techniques until Empress Ambulance Emergency Medical Services arrived and transported him to Mid-Hudson Regional Hospital.

According to State Police, the driver was later identified as Ravyn N. Vargas, 40, of Wappinger, who was pronounced deceased at the hospital, .

According to law enforcement, a preliminary investigation found Vargas was operating a 2013 Lexus north on River Road North and left the roadway for unknown reasons. Officials said, the vehicle struck a guiderail and tree before overturning. Vargas was ejected from the vehicle during the crash, according to officials.

This investigation remains ongoing.

In a letter to VA Secretary Denis McDonough written in March, part of what Schumer wrote was:

"I write to express my strong opposition to the references the Department of Veteran's Affairs made to closing the Brooklyn, Manhattan and Castle Point VA Medical Centers (VAMC) in its recommendations to the Asset and Infrastructure Review Commission (AIR Commission). Such recommendations would severely undermine the Department's mission to deliver world-class care to veterans in every area of our nation, and especially in New York City, Brooklyn, Staten Island and the Hudson Valley."

"Today's (June 28) announcement that the federal government will not close the Castle Point VA Medical Center follows

months of advocacy by myself and countless Dutchess County veterans, fighting to keep this vital asset open for America's heroes who depend on its life-saving services," said Dutchess County Executive Marcus Molinaro in a statement on June 28. "On behalf of Dutchess County's veterans and their families, I thank the Senate Veterans Affairs Committee for hearing our passionate pleas to reject the Asset and Infrastructure Review Commission's proposal to abandon our local heroes and the Castle Point facility that serves them. We will continue to defend our veterans to ensure they always receive the benefits they have rightly earned through their service to our nation."

Harold Delamater, who is the commander of VFW Post 666 in Beacon, commented on the announcement. "[It] sounds like good news but I don't have my hopes up. In Washington anything can happen," he said.

Veterans' voices heard on Castle Point

This past Spring, you will recall the shocking news of a VA report recommending closure of our Castle Point facility in Fishkill, where thousands of local veterans receive their health care. As a result, I'm proud to say the whole Hudson Valley veteran community really came together to voice opposition to this idea! Thankfully, those voices were finally heard. Last Tuesday, Senator Chuck Schumer released a statement which basically said the Senate would not support that VA report, thus effectively squashing any proposal to close Castle Point.

Let's listen to the reactions of some of our local leaders as they processed this good news.

Dutchess County Executive Marc Molinaro was quick to respond to the news, stating, "Today's announcement that the federal government will not close the Castle Point VA Medical Center follows months of advocacy by myself and countless Dutchess County veterans, fighting to keep this vital asset open for America's heroes who depend on its life-saving services. We will continue to defend our veterans to ensure they always receive the benefits they have rightly earned through their service to our nation."

Dutchess County Director of Veterans' Services Adam Roche echoed those sentiments, telling me, "Through coordinated efforts, Dutchess County veterans have been heard loud and clear in Washington, and their concerns have been taken seriously, with the federal government nixing any notion of closing this important resource that serves so many."

Assemblymember Didi Barrett, Chair of the NYS Assembly Veterans Affairs Committee, stated, "I am pleased that

cooler heads have prevailed and that Castle Point VA Medical Center, which has served generations of Hudson Valley Veterans and their families will remain open. I was proud to stand with Senator Schumer, federal and state colleagues and our local veterans to push back against this misguided announcement. I hope this same coalition will stand together again to fight for more robust VA services for veterans and military families in our Hudson Valley region."

Likewise, our State Senator Sue Serino told me, "When it comes to any issue that impacts our veterans, my top priority is ensuring that their voices and concerns are heard. Now, we must redouble our efforts to ensure that our local veterans always have access to the resources and quality care they have earned."

And by no means was this news only received well here in Dutchess County. Castle Point serves the entire Hudson Valley, and our neighbors were certainly relieved as well. Ulster County Executive Pat Ryan stated, "This is a huge win for the Hudson Valley, and for veterans and their families across the nation. The outcry from veterans helped end a proposal that was simply unacceptable. However, the fight is not over. Now we must push even harder for real investments to strengthen our regional VA services. As County Executive, I will continue to advocate for my fellow veterans and work to ensure that they receive the care that they need and deserve."

Although Senators and other elected leaders might get the credit for saving Castle Point, I know it was the rank-and-file members of the veteran community right here in the Hudson Valley who

Big victories for Hochul, Delgado; Zeldin wins 4-way race for GOP nominee

Democratic incumbents Gov. Kathy Hochul and Lt. Gov. Antonio Delgado will face off against their Republican challengers, current Congressman Lee Zeldin (District 1, Long Island) and former NYPD Deputy Inspector Alison Esposito, in the General Election on Nov. 8.

Results are unofficial, with 100 percent reporting.

The June 28 primary election yielded a decisive victory for both Hochul and Delgado. Statewide, Hochul received 66.49 percent of votes cast, with an even larger margin, 78.58 percent, in Dutchess County.

Hochul's Democratic challengers, Jumaane D. Williams and Thomas R. Suozzi, respectively received 19.01 percent and 12.83 percent of votes statewide; in Dutchess, they received 12.09 percent and 8.27 percent, respectively.

On the Republican side, Lee Zeldin, who currently represents New York's 1st District in Congress, easily won the four-candidate primary with 43.52 percent of the vote statewide – although he came second in Dutchess County with 32.08 percent of the vote, behind former Westchester County Executive Rob Astorino, who received 36.01 percent of Dutchess County votes.

The final count for the three runners-up: Astorino (18.09 percent statewide, 36.01 percent in Dutchess); former White House aide Andrew Giuliani (22.63 percent statewide, 23.37 in Dutchess); and businessman Harry Wilson (14.54 percent statewide, 7.55 percent in Dutchess).

LIETENANT GOVERNOR

Current Lt. Gov. (and former NY-19 Congressman) Antonio Delgado had a strong showing against opponents Ana

Maria Archila and Diana Reyna. Statewide, Delgado received 57.1 percent of the vote (79.13 percent in Dutchess County). Archila received 23.34 percent of votes statewide and 12.64 percent in Dutchess; Reyna received 13.34

percent of votes statewide and 5.41 percent in Dutchess.

There was no Republican primary for lieutenant governor, as Esposito ran unopposed.

Minor League Baseball in spotlight as Senate looks at antitrust exemption

Minor League Baseball teams and players – including the Hudson Valley Renegades – are in the spotlight as the United States Senate Judiciary Committee is taking another long look at Major League Baseball’s antitrust exemption.

The Committee this week, led by a bipartisan group of senators that include Senators Dick Durbin (D-Illinois), Chuck Grassley (R-Iowa), Richard Blumenthal (D-Connecticut) and Mike Lee (R-Utah), sent a letter to a group known as Advocates for Minor Leaguers seeking information about minor league players.

That information includes salary structure and the way in which minor leaguers must navigate the farm team/affiliate structure in order to make it to a big league roster.

“We write to seek information about how baseball’s antitrust exemption is impacting competition in the labor market for minor league ballplayers, as well as

the operations of minor league teams,” according to the letter.

According to ESPN.com, the questions from the letter also include: What effect the antitrust exemption has on the occurrence of lockouts and work stoppages at the MLB level; what role the antitrust exemption plays in requiring all minor leaguers to sign a uniform player contract; and what effect removing the antitrust exemption would have on minor league working conditions. It also asks about the extent of corruption and abuse on the market for international prospects and if the antitrust exemption has any role in enabling these signing practices.

“We need to examine how Major League Baseball’s 100-

In the bottom of the ninth, the Renegades got back-to-back singles from Cristian Perez and Cooper Bowman, but Grant Hartwig induced a game-ending double play from Seigler to close out the contest.

The Renegades managed just three hits in the game, including the two in the ninth.

The Renegades are playing at Jersey Shore this week and will be at home hosting the Greenville Drive from July 12-17.

year-old antitrust exemption is affecting the operation of minor league baseball teams and the ability of minor league ballplayers to make a decent living,"

Durbin wrote. "This bipartisan request for information will help inform the Committee about the impact of this exemption, especially when it comes to minor league and international prospects.

We need to make sure that all professional ballplayers get to play on a fair and level field."

"This is about ensuring a level playing for the minor leagues and its' players. MLB's special antitrust exemption

shouldn't be imposing labor or contraction problems for minor league teams and players," Grassley wrote. "Baseball is America's pastime and that means more than just the major leagues."



Cut flowers at Brittany Hollow Farm

Annuals are 'perennial' favorites for bouquets.

“What a bargain!” says anybody who’s ever stopped at Brittany Hollow Farm to pick a bucket of flowers. Yes, a whole bucket overflowing with ageratum, cosmos, celosia and zinnias for \$20, or \$15 if you bring back the bucket next time.

Darryl and Debby Mosher are longtime farmers at 7141 U.S. Route 9 in Rhinebeck (actually, just south of Red Hook), specializing in potatoes, tomatoes and peppers. They took their produce to the Rhinebeck Farmers Market, restaurants and The Culinary Institute, and won dozens of ribbons at the Dutchess County Fair, including a few grand championships. In 2008, son Brendan and daughter-in-law Kim decided to grow flowers for their wedding. Since then, the flower field has grown to cover three acres, with three new beds added this season. Now the flowers have taken over, with vegetables grown mostly for their own table.

Debby tells me she grows 50 different flowers for cutting, along with 20 varieties of zinnias and 15 of celosia. All the flowers are annuals, so Debby and Darryl, with help from family and friends, replant the fields every season, starting with cool weather snapdragons in mid-April and finishing up by the end of May. Seed is started in the greenhouse on March 15. The beds are laid out to look like a fancy arboretum, with clipped grass pathways and lawn chairs for an occasional rest.

The website lists 15 “favorite” varieties, but I pressed Debby for her number one. Zinnias, which take up a third of the beds. By the way, the field is visited by thousands of pollinators, especially butterflies (they love zinnias), with not a single native flower in sight.

Here are some of the best flowers for cutting:

- Ageratum – The taller varieties like “High Tide” and “Blue Planet” make good cut flowers. The white ones fade to brown. Blue is better. For the most part, flowers for cutting prefer full sun.
- Ammi – “Green Mist” looks like a Queen Anne’s Lace on steroids. A dependable filler for bouquets.
- Celosia – A big part of Brittany Hollow’s beds. The “cristata” types – I call them “brain flowers” – are long-lasting in the vase. Plumosa varieties come in every color except blue, in all sizes and shapes.
- Ornamental Millet – Debby calls this the longest lasting cut flower, although it’s really only a cattail-like spike. What else lasts three years?
- Snapdragon – A cut flower staple. In full bloom now at Brittany Hollow. The slightly shorter varieties like Liberty Mix won’t need staking.
- Sunflower – Everybody’s favorite. So popular that Debby has to limit the visitors to four blooms per bucket, or else

they’d all disappear. She has to enclose the sunflower patch in netting – the deer love sunflowers, too. The Johnny’s Selected Seed catalog lists 35 varieties of sunflowers.

• Zinnias – This midsummer staple was just coming into bloom last Wednesday (June 29), the grand opening day at Brittany Hollow Farm. From the colossal Benary’s Giant to the petite Oklahoma series, zinnias, I think, are the most popular flower for bouquets. They are also deer-proof, but, alas, not Japanese beetle-proof. Debby has been removing the beetles from her zinnias for so long, she swears it’s cutting down the repeat population. (The Moshers don’t use any pesticides.) My, and Sue’s, favorite zinnias include Old Mexico, Queen lime and the new Profusion Red Yellow Bi-color.

Brittany Hollow Farm has attracted visitors from all over the Northeast. Some folks come just to enjoy a stroll through the garden. Or a whole family can have a great outing filling a bucket. You can call ahead for pre-cut bouquets or even pick one up at the on site kiosk. Entire weddings have been sourced at the farm, but it

is best to call ahead before you arrive with a team of harvesters. A private garden behind the Mosher homestead is available for small groups of cut flower enthusiasts, which was very popular during the height of COVID, when social distancing was a concern.

If a bucket of flowers lasts a week, why not stop by every week and keep your home looking beautiful all summer long.

It looks like the cut flower competition at the Dutchess County Fair has been suspended, perhaps indefinitely. Go to <https://www.dutchessfair.com/participate/exhibitors-competitions/> and scroll down to Recycled Art Show – Amateur to see what kind of floral events are still happening. Sue will have her new flower display, featuring new plants for 2023.

All are welcome to attend the meeting, get to know the Board of Directors, fill out a volunteer form or an application to become a trustee on the Board.


