Wappingers Falls home of award-winning art banner project

As one drives or walks through Wappingers Falls, one can see banners from local artists who are supporting Wappingers Rises banner program. The banners went up earlier this year and will be in place until November.

"A few years ago, we got those black lampposts. When I saw them, I thought how neat it would be to rotate art seasonally," said Courtney Urciuoli Kolb, one of the organizers of the project.

Asked what the overall goal of the project, Urciuoli Kolb responded, "To give artists an outlet to showcase the medium they practice in, who they are as artists, include all ages/stages of career, build community, brighten our business district/Main St."

So, how were artists selected, and how many of them are participating?

"There are 43 artists displayed. We made a call and in just two weeks we received over 50 pieces. I also contacted Wappinger Central School, Wappinger Senior Center, all local art organizations to make it as inclusive as possible. We placed Wappinger artists first. Then did a lottery for remaining places. I then asked those who weren't selected if we can hang onto their pieces for the next round which we hope to do next spring," Urciuoli Kolb said.

Urciuoli Kolb explained a bit about some of the artists whose works are highlighted. "Mariekien Coohius and Brian Zickafoose are village residents. They have always supported all efforts in the village and work to make a difference and unite the community. Laura Golben and I published our first children's book inspired by our daughters. Her work of art is a page from our book we launched during this campaign," she said.


Another week, another award.

Well, make that two awards.

Hudson Valley Renegades pitcher Drew Thorpe has been named the South Atlantic League Pitcher of the Month for June. He is the first Renegades player to win a monthly award since 2021. Additionally, new Renegades outfielder Christopher Familia was named Florida State League Player of the Month for his performance with the Single-A Tampa Tarpons.

Thorpe was one of the best pitchers in Minor League Baseball in June, posting a 0.31 ERA by allowing just one run in 28.2 innings pitched, while striking out 34 and walking only six. The right-hander led all pitchers in both Minor and Major League Baseball in ERA in June (min. 17.0 IP).



Local libraries offer new program to learn a variety of languages

Patrons at local libraries can now use Transparent Language Online.

"Transparent Language Online is a database through which patrons can learn languages foreign to them. There are 120 languages other than English for English speakers and lessons in English for speakers of other languages," explained Peg Siebert, who is with Blodgett Memorial Library, which is located in the Village of Fishkill.

The previous program offered was Mango. So, how does Transparent Language Online differ from Mango?

"There are more languages in Transparent Language Online. The age-appropriate lessons are geared to the needs of students in grades K-12 and adults in the business world. The database also includes lessons in preparing for the citizenship test," said Siebert.

Patrons "will have more languages and services to choose from with Transparent Language Online. If they have been using Mango, they will need to switch to Transparent Language Online to continue lessons," Siebert stated.

Kristen Salierno, director of the Howland Public Library in Beacon, said, "Howland Public Library patrons now have unlimited access to lessons in more than 110 languages, including English courses for speakers of over 30 languages. There are even full-length alphabet courses for 18+ languages to familiarize you with new writing systems like Mandarin Chinese, Hindi, or Arabic. Our subscription also includes KidSpeak for Libraries, languages course created for kids 6+ to learn Chinese, English, French, German, Italian, and Spanish."

Salierno noted, "Patrons can visit <http://dutchesslibraries.info/language/> and click on Howland Public Library to sign up with their library card number. A quick link will be coming to our website's homepage in the next few weeks as well."

Patrons should have a current library card to use the program. Transparent Language Online became available on July 1, said Siebert and patrons can access it

"I loved the idea that Wappingers Rises presented, of showcasing local artists' work on banners along Main Street," Cochius said. "It is absolutely an honor to participate!"

Cochius noted, "What a great way to show and share with the community and its visitors what you do as an artist, and that this variety of artists is also something Wappingers Falls has to offer. I am proud any time I look at the banners!"

As far as the feedback received, Cochius remarked, it "has been wonderful. Ranging from 'I have seen your art at the Boathouse!' to even 'maybe you can do a sculpture for us?'"

Urciuoli Kolb stated that the artwork recently won Hudson Valley Magazine's Best of Hudson Valley in the category of Best Art Walk.

"We didn't know about the nomination (there was a mix-up and it was sent to someone else) when we found out weeks after the announcement we were so excited and proud!," she said, adding "This is the first time the village has supported an art project of this scale and it shows positive community response."

Cochius said the project was "[v]oted by the community and visitors...I am moved and proud to be a part of this."

The next open call is still to be determined, said Urciuoli Kolb. It is hoped to be January 2024.

through their local library's website and follow the directions to create an account. "Then they can explore and enjoy," she said.

As a reminder, "There will be an overlap in services. Mango will last until July 31, while Transparent Language Online begins on July 1. This gives patrons a month to use both and compare," said Siebert. Salierno said library staff is avail-

able to assist anyone who needs help with the new system.

Salierno stated, "Patrons will be happy to know that Transparent Language also offers an American Citizenship Test Prep course. We have received many requests from the community members looking for resources to prepare for taking the U.S. Civics test, so we are thrilled to now be able to offer this service.

The East Fishkill Community Library in East Fishkill also offers this program.

Sidewalk improvement project on Innis Ave. in Poughkeepsie

Improvements are being made by Dutchess County Department of Public Works (DPW) to the sidewalk along the western side of Innis Avenue (CR-75), between East Arnold Road and the north leg of Jackman Drive, in the Town of Poughkeepsie with the anticipation of construction was to begin July 10.

Construction includes widening the sidewalk to 5 ft. and upgrading crossings to meet American Disabilities Act standards. Work will also include necessary changes to the drainage system. Access will be maintained to driveways during construction, according to officials. The special enforcement period began on June 30, and ended on July 5.

During the campaign, which was funded by the Governor's Traffic Safety Committee, State Police utilized sobriety checkpoints, additional DWI patrols, and ticketed distracted drivers who used handheld electronic devices.

Troopers arrested 193 people for DWI and investigated 949 crashes, including 158 personal injury crashes and five fatalities.

As part of the enforcement, Troopers also targeted speeding and aggressive drivers across the state. Below is a sampling of the total tickets that were issued.

During last year's 4th of July enforcement campaign, which ran from Friday, July 1, 2022, through Tuesday, July 5, 2022, one day less than this year's campaign, the State Police issued 12,160 total tickets and arrested 197 people for DWI.



To the Editor:

I'm writing to thank Councilman John Forman for his letter in the June 28th issue. I couldn't possibly have made my argument more eloquently than he made it on my behalf.

First, Mr. Forman recognized the millions of dollars in surplus funds the Town has accrued under my leadership – more than \$7.9 million in less than four years of my administration. When COVID began in 2020, I made the challenging decision to keep the Town open for business, and the growth we have seen is thanks in large part to the incredible work of our Town employees during the pandemic, and that was reflected in a Moody's rating increase last year that places Fishkill at the very top in Dutchess County. I take pride in the financial management of the Town and it's nice when a member of the opposing party takes time to recognize that.

Which is why I'm deeply concerned by his shockingly flippant remarks regarding our budget and our reserves. Mr. Forman seemed to use the surplus funds I have spent years accruing as a justification for his vote to defund the police. According to Mr. Forman, why keep reserve funds in the budget when you can always pull from the cookie jar later on? That's a frankly horrifying thing to hear from a man who is asking the people to put him in charge of a budget as large as the Town of Fishkill.

I'm also struck by the irony in Mr. Forman's remarks. On the one hand, he claims he wants our department "fully staffed and our officers appropriately compensated," while on the other he simultaneously votes to remove the funds we need to accomplish those goals for the future.

That's the type of double-talk residents can expect from a career politician like John Forman, and it shows how little he's learned about Fishkill since he began occupying a room in a private home to establish residency so he could run for office. Citizens want their leaders to tell them how it is, and the hardworking taxpayers of Fishkill deserve better than a man who talks out both sides of his mouth.

Streaking Renegades bounce back to win five games at Jersey Shore

The Hudson Valley Renegades are streaky, that's for sure.

After losing four games in a row, the Renegades got back on the winning track and pounded out 15 hits as they took down the Jersey Shore Blue Claws 9-2 on Wednesday night at ShoreTown Ballpark. The win extended the Renegades' winning streak to five games.

The team also won on Monday, 11-0, and 4-2 on Tuesday and 5-4 on Thursday with a two run rally in the top of the 8th inning.

On Saturday, the Renegades never trailed as they fended off the BlueClaws 6-4. The Renegades took the lead with a three-run outburst in the top of the third. Eduardo Torrealba, Luis Santos and Alexander Vargas strung three straight singles together off Jordan Fowler to plate the first run of the frame, and Ben Cowles followed with a two-run double

to left to give Hudson Valley a 3-0 lead.

On Sunday, behind a terrific pitching performance by Drew Thorpe, the Renegades shut out the BlueClaws 2-0. Coming off a complete game shutout win on Monday, Drew Thorpe was fantastic again for the Renegades. He threw 7.0 shutout innings, allowing just three hits and three walks while striking out seven. Thorpe (8-1) has allowed just one run across his last 44.0 innings pitched, dating back to a start on May 28 at Wilmington.

The Renegades have already clinched the North Division of the South Atlantic League and have a birth into the playoffs in September as first-half champions.

Moving into the 2nd half, planning and enjoying every day at the park

Each week, writer Rich Thomaselli and Hudson Valley General Manager Tyson Jeffers talk about the Renegades in particular and minor league baseball in general.

No, not really. We plan for 66 home games and we will have 66 home games. Making the playoffs is an added bonus. What I will say is that the midway point of the whole season is a good time to take stock of our team and see what we are doing right and what we need to work on. It's like a milestone.


So for me and our staff and our leadership, it's a good time to evaluate everything. We talk through everything. We are just trying to find out if people are getting the most out of their staff. Everything is a balance. You want to make the playoffs special, for the players and the fans. But there are a lot of things we have to do right now. Do we need busses? Do we need to arrange flights? When the season is officially over, how do you get everyone out of here? It's not necessarily hard, but you have to work on plan B, C, D and more at the same time. As a general manager, I have to plan out all those things in my head.

Thorpe named top pitcher in June for leading Renegades to key wins

He was named SAL Pitcher of the Week on June 5 after throwing 8.0 shutout innings against Aberdeen on June 4, and followed that up by striking out a franchise record 12 batters and issuing no walks in 7.0 innings on June 11 at Jersey Shore. In four starts, Thorpe completed 7.0 innings three times, and pitched into the eighth twice.

Thorpe, 22, was drafted in the second round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft by the Yankees out of Cal Poly. He becomes the first Renegade to win a Player of the Month Award since Randy Vasquez won High-A East Pitcher of the Month for August 2021.

Familia, who was promoted to Hudson Valley from Tampa on June 29, was the most dangerous hitter in the Florida State League in June, batting

.380/.456/.899, and led the league in average (.380), runs (22), home runs (10), RBI (28), total bases (71), slugging percentage (.899) and OPS (1.355). He finished third in on-base percentage (.456), was fourth in doubles (seven) and fifth in hits (30).

The 23-year-old was originally signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent out of Bani, Dominican Republic on July 2, 2018. Between the

Tarpons and Renegades, Familia has already set a new career high for home runs in a season (12) in only 27 games.

Thorpe will be honored before a game on the next Renegades homestand, with a \$500 donation being made in his name to the Maria Fareri Children's Hospital at Westchester Medical Center Health Network (WMCHHealth).

On Wednesday, the Renegades scratched across the first run of the game in the top of the third against Mitch Neunborn. Aldenis Sanchez lined a one-out single to center and raced around to score from first base on a double off the left field wall by Torrealba.

Hudson Valley blew the game open in the top of the fourth, erupting for five runs on seven hits while sending 10 batters to the plate to take a 6-0 lead. Nine of the 10 Renegades who came to the plate in the frame reached base, with two outs being made on the bases. It was part of an incredible stretch from the third through fifth innings, where

13 out of 15 Renegades batters to come to the plate reached safely on either a hit or a walk.

After the BlueClaws scratched across a run against Harrison Cohen in the bottom of the fourth, Christopher Familia led off the top of the fifth with a solo home run to extend the lead to 7-1. The blast was Familia's first in High-A, and

was part of a night where he finished 4-for-5 with a home run, a double, an RBI and four runs scored while falling a triple shy of the cycle.

The Renegades are back home for six games starting on Friday when they host the Bowling Green Hot Rods for three games before the Brooklyn Cyclones come in for three games.



In February, NYSAF announced "a dedicated, multi-year collaboration with Marist College that will enable us to expand our year-round services for artists developing new work in theater, film and television in the Hudson Valley and New York City. It also opens up significant new educational programs and experiential learning opportunities for Marist students, in collaboration with NYSAF's professional community."

The collaboration began in 2021, according to Liz Carlson, NYSAF Interim Artistic Director. For two years now, the partnership has produced a New York City-based Winter Season at Marist's Midtown Manhattan location.

"This is the first year we're fully committed," Carlson said. "In the wake of the pandemic, when we were re-emerging from the digital era, we were collaborating with many organizations in Poughkeepsie [such as Vassar College and Revel 32]. We were in an exploratory phase, re-learning about the artistic community in Poughkeepsie."

She added: "The artistic community in the Hudson Valley is rich. [NYSAF has had] many iterations of relationships over the decades."

Of course, many local theater-goers are already familiar with NYSAF and its nearly four-decade partnership with Vassar College, Powerhouse Theater. That program, which also serves as an incubator for new works, continues on the Vassar campus this summer.

Asked about the end of the Powerhouse partnership, Carlson noted, "We made almost 40 years of a relationship. Art evolves, and how we support art needs to evolve. Sometimes things need to be a little different. Especially in this moment in time, when we as an industry are mindful of how we 'show up,' [we need to] seize the opportunity to show up in the best way possible."

The NYSAF-Marist Summer Season kicks off on Friday, July 14, with Joe Iconis & Family. There will be a reception at 5:30 p.m., followed by the concert at 7 p.m. at the Murray Student Center. Proceeds from this event will support educational initiatives for both NYSAF and Marist.

"It's a fun way to start a season," said Carlson. "Joe Iconis is bringing up an incredible group of singers, actors, instrumentalists, and they're going to do a concert of some of Joe's new music, maybe some favorites for those who know his work."

Iconis is a musical theater writer and performer. He has been nominated for a Tony Award, two Drama Desk Awards and a Lucille Lortel Award, is the recipient of an Ed Kleban Award, Jonathan Larson Award and Richard Rodgers Award. His musical "Be More Chill" (with Joe Tracz) opened this season at Broadway's Lyceum Theatre, following a sold-out Off-Broadway run at The Pershing Square Signature Center and a world premiere at Two River Theatre.

Another season highlight occurs at the tail end of the season, when renowned actor Laurence Fishburne will perform his new solo show, "Like They Do in the Movies," Aug. 5-6.

Fishburne has achieved an impressive body of work as an actor, producer and director. His versatile acting has won him awards in theater, film and television. He may be best known for his role as Morpheus in "The Matrix" trilogy, but his many film credits include Academy Award nominee John Singleton's "Boyz 'n the Hood," Richard T. Heffron's telefilm "A Rumor of War," Steven Spielberg's "The Color Purple," Steven Zaillian's "Searching for Bobby Fischer," Clint Eastwood's "Mystic River" and cult classics, "Deep Cover" and "King of New York."

Carlson notes that the summer program is about the community as a whole.

"I think it's what's really beautiful about what we do," she said. "Poughkeepsie is a great equalizer. It doesn't matter to us [if someone is world-famous or is just starting out]. Each artist needs a space ... to be bold, learn what they really need to do for their project. It's thrilling that Laurence is going to be with us in process."

Other highlights include an adaptation of Madeleine L'Engle's novel "A Wrinkle in Time" and "Paradise Ballroom," where music and dance are the main storytelling vehicles. Tickets and complete season details are available at <https://www.newyorkstageandfilm.org/>.

Carlson told of a patron who has been coming to see NYSAF's work for decades and shared that he was "really blown away with seeing the thought process hap-

pening right in front of him, to see the underbelly of how art is made, especially those who go on to define the theatrical canon."

She added, "I don't think you get what we do anywhere else: Courageous art-making, in a community of other artists."

The support the artists provide for each other makes them brave, and creates a unique energy, she said.

"Every time a show is seen at New York Stage and Film, it's never going to be seen that way again," Carlson said. "[They're] truly once-in-a-lifetime moments."

that's italian!**by luigi coppola**

Sunday church bells

**Services provided plenty of opportunities
for antics from the Coppola brothers**

As I write this latest installment, the restaurant kitchen temp is near 100 degrees. I have no air conditioning in the office, which is where I am. The sweat is pouring off my body. I find myself thinking of church in the summer.

I must have been 4 or 5 years old at the time. We always went to St. Peter's Church in Hyde Park, which was a chapel with the school gymnasium behind it that was opened up for Sunday services. The gymnasium also doubled as the cafeteria when school was in session, but that is another story for another day. Anyway, it was hot. Damn hot. As always, my four brothers and I were dressed in a jacket and pants for church. Never short sleeve shirts. Always long pants, never shorts. Always socks and shoes. Mom's rule, period.

We always sat to the left of the altar and had a perfect view of the priest and the altar servers. My brother, John, was an alter server at the time and Fr. Cody was the priest. I can still see John standing on the altar facing us in his black and white robes, hands devoutly clasped in front of him trying to look pious. Sweat pouring off his face with the flicker of the alter candles accenting the beads rolling down his nose.

I, on the other hand, was busy making faces at him, trying to make him laugh. I would get into it pretty good sticking my tongue out, waving and pushing up my nose like a pig. It always stopped abruptly when my father would reach behind me and smack the back of my head. I would wait a fair amount of time for my father to forget I was there, then start the game again, making faces until my father would

spy me out of the corner of his eye and smack the back of my head again to make me stop again.

When Fr. Cody would start his sermon, I would nap, or try to. Honestly, I tried to stay awake, but I couldn't. I always fell asleep. Fr. Cody would start his sermon and automatically my eyes would get heavy and start to close. I would fight it for a few minutes, but before I knew it, my head was bobbing, my mouth was open, drool was coming out of my mouth, and I would start to snore. When Pop noticed, he would reach behind me and yank my hair to wake me up. I remember waking up in a pool of perspiration and drool. The humidity in the church was so bad that the pews would get wet from our sweat and we would stick to the wood. My poor father. He never had a moment's peace with me.

My favorite part of the mass is when the bells would be rung. When the alter server would ring the bells, they would always get carried away and make enough noise to wake the dead. I was told by my brother that there would be full scale arguments about who got to ring the bells. It was the best job. Sometimes they would fight over the bells right on the altar. Each alter server would have their hands on the bells and try to ring it for themselves. You could see them leaning into each other fighting for position.

The church would be silent at the most solemn moment of the mass. Alter servers fighting for bell position. Everybody's head is down in prayer, Fr. Cody would pick up the host and say, "This is my body which will be given up for you," the bells would start ringing. I would blurt out..... "Hello? Hello?" Like it was a telephone

ringing. Every time, I would get smacked. Every time my brothers would crack up and I would rub the back of my head.

People around us got quite used to it and even started to look forward to the brief comedy in the middle of Sunday mass. I remember one time Fr. Cody looking over to me laughing as I rubbed the back of my head.

The one good thing about Sunday was Sunday dinner. Mom always made something special if we were home instead of at our grandmother's house. When it was a special Sunday, she would make ricotta gnocchi. Because the gnocchi were light, she would make a quick tomato sauce to go with it. With some chunks of mozzarella mixed in to beef it up.

I remember coming home, getting out of our church clothes and watching Abbot and Costello and the Bowery Boys as mom put together dinner. If the phone rang I would jump up to answer it saying "Hello. Hello?"

Ricotta Gnocchi**Ingredients****Gnocchi:**

- 1 (8 ounce) container ricotta cheese
- 2 eggs
- ½ cup freshly grated Parmesan cheese
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon pepper
- 1 teaspoon fresh minced garlic
- 1 cup all-purpose flour, or as needed

Sauce:

- 3 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 jar Coppola's Tuscan Sauce
- ½ lb. meatloaf mix
- 8 ounces fresh mozzarella cheese, cut into small chunks

Directions

1. Whip together the ricotta, eggs, Parmesan Cheese, salt, pepper, and garlic in a large bowl. Mix in 1 cup of flour. The dough should be soft but semi-firm. Add a teaspoon of flour at a time till you reach the proper consistency.

2. Divide the dough into 3 or 4 pieces. Roll the dough into long ½ inch tubular segments. Cut each segment into bite sized pieces, and place on a lightly floured baking sheet. Place in the refrigerator to firm up until ready to use.

3. Heat olive oil in a saucepan over medium heat. Stir in meatloaf mix and brown. Drain liquid and add Tuscan Sauce. Stir and let simmer for 10 minutes.

4. Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to a boil over high heat. Drop the gnocchi in the water and let them cook until they float to the surface, 1 to 2 minutes, then drain.

5. To assemble the dish, stir the cubed mozzarella cheese into the sauce and allow the heat of the sauce to soften, but not melt the cheese. Place the gnocchi in the pot and toss lightly, careful not to damage the gnocchi.

6. Serve with crusty Italian bread and grated cheese.

Luigi Coppola is one of five brothers born to Francesca and Antonio Coppola. The Coppola family came to America from Naples, Italy in 1954. Antonio and his brothers opened their first restaurant in Poughkeepsie in 1961. Luigi and his brothers Nick, John, Antonio and Vincent have carried on the family tradition in the way their parents taught them. Visit their website at www.coppolas.net.






