Volunteers are being sought for the Sports Museum of Dutchess County in the Town of Wappinger, located on the Carnwath Estate.

"The Sports Museum is seeking two to four teen volunteers," said Mary Sagar, board member of the Sports Museum.

If one is interested, what type of training would there be for the volunteers?

"Volunteers would attend an orientation and a tour of the museum given by the president of the organization, Bill Ponte.

Additional training on the Oculus gaming system, cataloging and research databases, historical displays, and clerical duties would come from museum board members and existing volunteers. Volunteers would always be accompanied by an adult board member or volunteer as they perform their duties," explained Sagar.

Volunteers would be expected to commit to one three-hour shift per week at the museum, on either a Saturday or Sunday, said Sagar. "Additional hours can be earned working at the Sports Museum booth at

One of the people who volunteers already at the museum is Eriselle.

"I wanted to gain experience in the field and to see what it was like working in a museum. I received my first taste of this experience working there," said Eriselle.





So, what would a volunteer need to know about the Sports Museum?

“Volunteers will learn about local “Sports Legends” who are featured in museum displays. They would then be expected to share this knowledge with museum visitors,” Sagar explained.

Eriselle noted, “Many people were interested in the display on Melio Bettina, (the former Light Heavyweight Boxing World Champion). He was from Beacon and people liked seeing his information.”

Sagar said, “Volunteers will gain basic knowledge of the Sports Museum, such as how long it has been in operation, status as a not-for-profit 501(3)c, how to schedule tours, and items for sale in the gift shop.” She continued that volunteer “will learn how to operate the museum’s computer gaming system, as well as its

online research databases, and share this information with visitors.”

Sagar noted, “Volunteering at the Dutchess County Sports Museum will provide experience for students interested in sports journalism, public relations, museum studies, or database management, to name just a few. It is also lots of fun for people who love sports!”

Eriselle said, “Others should volunteer so that the museum will continue to grow. Dutchess County is a growing place, and many generations are interested in sports. More and more elite athletes are coming from Dutchess County, and there should be a place where people can see their stories.”

Family Fun Day set for July 22

A Family Fun Day is set for July 22 from 11 a.m. – 4 p.m. Admission is free. Attendees can tour the museum that day.

Visitors to the facility that day can tour the museum’s exhibits, which include ones on Dutchess County ball players and

historical artifacts.

According to organizers, visitors may participate in yoga in the park, raffles, music provided by a local DJ, a performance by a local youth dance troupe, face painting, and a visit from the Poughkeepsie Public Library’s bookmobile (“Rover”). More than twenty vendors will be in attendance. There will also be a chance for visitors to check out the menu and food from Empanada Mama, a local food truck. At the Museum Grill will be Roger Humeston. Incredible Creations will also be in attendance.

Dutchess, Putnam counties collaborate on Teen Driver Safety Program

The Dutchess County Division of Youth Services and the Putnam County Youth Bureau have collaborated on the "Parents as Driving Partners" initiative, aimed to foster safer driving habits and creating safe drivers by encouraging active involvement and shared responsibility between teens and their parents during the early stages of driving.

Through the new program, teenagers who receive their learner's permit at their local Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) office in Dutchess or Putnam will also receive a "Parents as Driving Partners" booklet. In addition to providing teens and their parents with driving tips and resources to become safe motorists, the booklet includes a Parent/Teen Driving Agreement, a mutual pledge to commit to working together to promote safe driving practices, abide by traffic rules, and avoid distractions while on the road.

The pact urges parents to support their child during their driving, teach proper techniques and model safe driving behaviors for them. The agreement also asks teens to obey safety rules and regulations, never drive while impaired, drive only with parental permission and never drive while using a cell phone.

Dutchess County Clerk Brad Kendall said, "Driving a motor vehicle is a great undertaking – one which, if not handled responsibly, can have grave impacts on drivers, their passengers and those with whom they share the road. Dutchess and Putnam counties encourage teen drivers and their parents to take the 'Parents as Driving Partners' pledge and make developing safe driving habits a shared effort."

Putnam County Executive Kevin Byrne said, "We are thrilled to collaborate with Dutchess County on the 'Parents as Driving Partners' initiative. By promoting active engagement and shared accountability between teenagers and their parents, we can cultivate an environment that promotes safer roads, more responsible drivers. Any measures we can take to help prevent motor vehi-

cle accidents should be implemented."

The "Parents as Driving Partners" program recognizes the pivotal role parents play in shaping their teen's driving behavior and aims to establish a strong foundation of responsible driving habits. By actively engaging parents and teenagers, the program encourages open communication, cooperative learning, and adherence to traffic regulations, ensuring safer roads for all.

In Putnam County, the DMV office is located at 1 Geneva Road in Brewster.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), teens are more likely than older drivers to underestimate or not be able to recognize dangerous situations; they're also more likely than adults to make critical errors that can lead to serious crashes. The presence of teen or young adult passengers increases the crash risk of unsupervised teen drivers; this risk increases with each additional teen or young adult passenger.

About 2,800 teens in the United States ages 13–19 were killed, and about 227,000 were injured in motor vehicle crashes in 2020, according to the CDC. The motor

The PACT Act offers veterans more benefits

Veterans across the nation are applauding the passage of the 2022 Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxics (PACT) Act, calling it a welcome and much-needed addition to the benefits already provided by the federal government to those who have served in the United States military.

I see that enthusiasm each day during my work at the Dutchess County Division of Veterans' Services. Every week, more and more veterans visiting our offices are looking to apply for the benefits they are now eligible for under the new law.

Along with expanding healthcare and benefits for veterans, the PACT Act enlarges and extends eligibility for U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) healthcare for veterans with toxic exposures, and it also includes veterans of the Vietnam, Gulf War and post-9/11 eras.

This is significant because a 2019 Pew Research survey of U.S. veterans found that the experiences of Persian Gulf and post-9/11 veterans differ significantly from those who served in previous decades. When veterans were asked how the VA is doing in meeting the needs of veterans, less than half stated the VA was doing an excellent or even good job.

The PACT Act, signed into law in August 2022, adds to the list of health conditions thought to be caused by exposure to lethal elements and provides thousands of veterans and their survivors with the care they've earned.

Specifically, the PACT Act expands benefits for veterans exposed to Agent Orange and a comprehensive list of other toxic substances that have affected our vets because of their proximity to burn pits. It also increases the list of toxic exposures and adds extra presumptive-exposure locations for Agent Orange and radiation. The law also requires the government to provide toxic exposure screenings to vets enrolled in the VA healthcare system, along with requiring research, education and treatment related to toxic exposures.

Many say the law is the largest expansion of healthcare for veterans in the VA's

history, for the first time ever providing all generations of exposed veterans these expanded benefits. In fact, the VA is so committed to ensuring the bill's success, it is continually releasing updated statistics to measure the PACT Act's impact on veterans and their survivors, which can be viewed for all to see on the VA PACT Act Performance Dashboard at www.access.tocare.va.gov/Healthcare/PactAct.

As of April, over 360,000 veterans and their survivors have applied for PACT Act benefits; over 2 million vets have been screened for toxic exposures; and 185,000 veterans have enrolled in the VA healthcare system.

To become eligible for PACT Act benefits, you must have a presumptive condition from toxic exposure. Simply put: A veteran's disability must be related to their military service; in other words, you need to prove that your service caused your condition. Some veterans' illnesses are assumed to be caused by their service; those are called presumptive conditions. The veteran doesn't need to prove their service caused that condition, only that they meet the service requirements; the government has made the bar much easier to qualify.

Under the PACT Act, eligibility falls into two categories:

The veteran will receive free healthcare for a comprehensive list of conditions; or

The veteran will receive both healthcare and monetary compensation for certain conditions; the effective date for compensation varies, however, depending on which condition they have.

FDR Library to present author event with Rosenblatt July 26

The Franklin D. Roosevelt Presidential Library and Museum and the Mid-Hudson Antislavery History Project will present a conversation and book signing with Albert M. Rosenblatt, author of "The Eight: The Lemmon Slave Case and the Fight for Freedom," at 6 p.m. on July 26. The event will be held in the Henry A. Wallace Center at the FDR Presidential Library and Home and streamed live to the official FDR Library YouTube and Facebook accounts.

Registered attendees can visit the Library's new exhibition, "Black Americans, Civil Rights, and the Roosevelts," free of charge before the program, from 4 to 6 p.m. This is a free public event, but registration is required to attend in-person. Visit fdrlibrary.org to register.

"The Eight" tells the story of Lemmon v. New York -- or, as it's more popularly known, the Lemmon Slave Case. All but forgotten today, it was one of the most momentous civil rights cases in American history. There had been cases in which the enslaved had won their freedom after having resided in free states, but the Lemmon case was unique, posing the question of whether an enslaved person can win freedom by merely setting

foot on New York soil -- when brought there in the keep of an "owner." The case concerned the fates of eight enslaved people from Virginia, brought through New York in 1852 by their owners, Juliet and Jonathan Lemmon.

The Eight were in court seeking, legally, to become people -- to change their status under law from objects into human beings. They encountered Louis Napoleon, the son of a slave, an abolitionist activist, and a "conductor" of the Underground Railroad, who took enormous risks to help others. He was part of an anti-slavery movement in which African-Americans played an integral role in the fight for freedom.

The case was part of the broader judicial landscape at the time: If a law was morally repugnant but enshrined in the Constitution, what was the duty of the judge? Should there be, as some people advocated, a "higher law" that transcends the written law? These questions were at the heart of the Lemmon case. They were difficult and important ones in the 1850s -- and, more than a century and a half later, we must still grapple with them today.

Historic Wappinger estate now accessible as Town Park

In 1850, architect George Post and landscape architect Andrew Jackson Downing were commissioned to construct a three-story Italianate style mansion and estate overlooking the Hudson River on 200 acres for William Henry and Lydia Willis. Willis was a retired hardware merchant from New York City, and related to the Mesier family of nearby Wappingers Falls. He sold the estate shortly after its construction in 1855, when his son died of tuberculosis in the manor, and then built Obercreek nearer the Wappinger Creek.

In 1855, the estate was sold to New York banker, George Barclay, who died there on July 28, 1869. His only daughter, Matilda Antonia Barclay, married New York attorney Francis Robert Rives. Rives was Secretary of the American Legation at London under Ambassador Edward Everett during the William Henry Harrison administration.

Barclay/Rives family

It was the Barclay/Rives family who selected the name "Carnwath" for the estate as Mr. Barclay's wife, Louise Ann, and daughter, Matilda, were direct decedents of James I, King of Scotland and much of the family lived in the Village of Carnwath in Scotland.

By 1870, Francis and Matilda and their family fully moved into Carnwath as their primary residence. Its formal Italianate appearance was changed to the less formal Georgian style preferred by late 19th century architects. The east (servants') wing, large rounded additions, and south wing kitchen were added.

In 1873, Rives constructed the impressive three-story French style carriage house and romantic style ice house as well. With 100 farmhands Rives operated Carnwath as a gentleman's farm, also building a large cow barn and horse/hay barn (no longer standing). The carriage house's French design was influenced by Francis's father, William Cabell Rives, the United States Ambassador to France under President Andrew Jackson.

Francis Rives was a member of both the prominent New York City Knickerbocker Club and the Coaching Club, a society formed by horsemen in 1875 to promote coaching as a gentleman's sport. He also served on the board of directors of several Wappinger-based clubs and organizations such as the Grinnell Public Library, Zion Episcopal Church, and Wappingers Falls Rural Cemetery, among others. In 1891, Francis Robert Rives died, leaving his \$3 million Carnwath Estate to his son Reginald.

Reginald Rives quickly assumed a number of social and political positions following his father's death. He was elected Wappinger Town Supervisor in 1899, appointed as a Dutchess County Deputy

Sheriff, as well as being the president of the Coaching Club. Reginald compiled the book, "The Coaching Club, Its History and Activities."

He served as secretary-treasurer of the National Horse Show from 1925 to 1934 and was a prominent judge of harness horses in this country and abroad. For nine years he was whip of the public coach "Pioneer" and he once said that he was never more than forty-five seconds late on the 21-mile trip from New York City to Ardsley, New York. During his time owning Carnwath, Reginald and his wife were often featured within the social columns of daily newspapers throughout the northeast. Their travels and current gossip covered the press along side their friends the Astors and Vanderbilts.

Following a very public divorce, Reginald sold the estate in 1914 and moved to Reno, Nevada, before commissioning Reginald D. Johnson to design and build "Casa del Sueño" (Dream House) in Montecito, California in 1916.

In 1914, Carnwath was purchased by New York attorney Isaac Untermeyer, famous for defending New York City politician, William "Boss" Tweed, head of the Tammany Hall political machine. Untermeyer purchased the property to avoid the media following the Tweed corruption trial.

In 1925, the Order of the Brothers of Hermits of Saint Augustine, a Catholic friary, purchased the property then known as Mother of the Good Counsel Novitiate. There, young men on the road to priesthood devoted their life to God and religion. The brothers moved into the existing structures on the Carnwath estate but also built the administration building in 1927 as a dormitory, chapel, and living/eating area. The present chapel was built in 1950 and the dormitory in 1958. Priests from across the nation came to live, study, and worship at the

Novitiate. In addition to their religious duties, the brothers also enjoyed playing basketball in the Carriage House and sleigh riding down the sloping hills of the property.

In 1984, the Order of the Brothers of Hermits sold 99.7 acres (what is now left of the original 200+ acre Carnwath) to Greystone House Incorporated, later Greystone Programs. Greystone dedicated the site as the Susanne Maguire Pavilion and housed and treated severely handicapped individuals. A number of modifications were made to the property to service Greystone's needs during their ownership.

Town of Wappinger takes over

The Town of Wappinger purchased the property in 1999 for the purpose of preserving green space and the rich history of Wappinger. It became open to the public in 2000 as the "Greystone Estate" a public park. In 2003, the Town of Wappinger officially dedicated the "Greystone Estate" which included tours of the Carnwath

Manor, Chapel, Dormitory, and Carriage House; and renaming the property to its original name, "Carnwath Farms."

In 2005, the Town of Wappinger officially dedicated the dormitory building of Carnwath Farms as the Frances Reese Cultural Center and welcomed its first tenant, the Sports Museum of Dutchess County. The luncheon raised over \$30,000 for the restoration of the Carnwath Manor and hosted Hillary Clinton as its guest of honor.

Many in the community have set the goal that Carnwath Farms HSP and the Reese Cultural Center will be the area's premier location for the arts, culture, and antiquities.

Mixing the created environment with the natural one, a walk through this park will leave you impressed with sweeping views of the Hudson River and her surrounding valley.

The Hudson Valley Renegades lost two of their first three games after the All-Star break to the Bowling Green (Ky) Hot Rods this past weekend at Heritage Financial Park.

Bowling Green won the first-ever matchup against the Renegades 7-4 on Friday night in a rain shortened contest which was called in the top of the seventh due to wet grounds.

It was the first game back from the four-day break of the All-Star game for the Renegades.

The Hot Rods came out firing in the first three innings off Zach Messenger (1-7), plating four runs in the second inning before tacking on three more in the third.

In the second, after Will Vasquez reached on an error, Kenny Piper singled him home to take a 1-0 lead over Hudson Valley. The next batter, Nick Schnell, doubled home Piper before Blake Robertson capped off the four-run inning with a two-run home run to right field. Only one of the four runs in the frame were earned runs against the right-hander.

Messenger walked the first two hitters in the third before Vasquez doubled to scored Brock Jones and extend the Bowling Green advantage to 5-0. An RBI groundout by Piper and another double by Schnell grew the lead to 7-0.

On Saturday, the Renegades hung on in the ninth to fight off a late charge from the Hot Rods for a 5-4 victory.

Drew Thorpe (9-1) led the way on the mound, striking out 10 while allowing just three runs in seven innings. Over his last 51.0 innings thrown, the New York Yankees' No. 6 prospect has allowed just four earned runs. In picking up his ninth win of the season, Thorpe moved into a tie with Mike Venafo (1995) and Josh Maciejewski (2021) for most wins in a single season by a Renegades pitcher.

Hudson Valley jumped in front in the second with a parade of five singles against Duncan Davitt. Alexander Vargas and Antonio Gómez tallied back-to-back one out singles before Aldenis Sanchez drove home Vargas with a single of his own. Spencer Jones and Ben Cowles followed up with a pair of RBI singles to

take a 3-0 lead.

The Hot Rods took the finale of the series on Sunday as Willy Vasquez homered in the first and secured two more hits to help carry Bowling Green Hot Rods (12-6, 43-36) to an 8-2 victory.

The Hot Rods scored first in the top of the first inning against Renegades starter Juan Carela. Dru Baker singled and moved up to third on a base hit by Brock Jones. Baker scored on a throw down to second by the catcher Augustin Ramirez, making it a 1-0 ballgame. Vasquez smacked a solo shot to left, putting Bowling Green up 2-0.

In the top of the second, Blake Robertson earned a 3-0 lead for the Hot Rods with a solo home run.


What do the players typically come to you for?

County announces residents, businesses may submit flood and storm damage information for possible federal aid

Residents and business owners are encouraged to report damage to private property or small businesses in the wake of the storm that began on July 9th and subsequent flooding as the Dutchess County Department of Emergency Response works in collaboration with New York State to determine eligibility for potential aid from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

The State has established a Rain/Flood

Damage Self-Reporting Tool for residents and businesses to report damages, an essential step towards obtaining aid under FEMA's assistance programs. Residents are reminded that submitting their information is not a guarantee of funding, and online submissions do not register them with FEMA.

Dutchess County is awaiting a potential disaster declaration from FEMA, and the proactive measure of gathering residents' damage information will help the County

calculate residents' losses throughout the community. If and when Dutchess County receives its disaster declaration and FEMA determines the area is eligible for Individual Assistance, residents will be notified about how to register and apply for aid.

Among other basic information collected on the online portal, residents and businesses will be asked to provide:

- the type of structure that was damaged;

- the type of damage sustained; and
- a brief description of the loss or damage.

FEMA teams will be visiting Dutchess County in the coming weeks to visit affected areas to calculate damages as part of the County's inclusion in a Statewide Disaster Declaration under FEMA's Public Assistance (PA) program. Information submitted by residents and businesses will be crucial in the disaster declaration determination.

Visit artists during Beacon Open Studios July 21-23

Beacon Open Studios (BOS) is happening this weekend. July 21 is the Opening Reception from 6-9 p.m. at The Yard, 4 Hanna Lane, in Beacon.

"Attendees can expect to meet 80+ artists, see multiple group shows, attend a full outdoor music concert (tickets on sale now) and three separate film screenings (free to attend), one of which is outside on a large outdoor screen! This year's event has expanded from just visual art to include music and film," organizer for BOS Darya Golubina remarked.

Golubina said, "Beacon Open Studios is the only event of its kind in Beacon, run by local artists, featuring all of Beacon's artists together, on one day! BOS allows attendees to get a glimpse into the often-private studios of artists and gives them a beautiful moment behind the scenes! The three-day event is a wonderful way for artists to connect to their community and for the community to show support for the artist. Many rely on sales from the day to be able to continue to make their art."

Allison Walker is one of the artists participating in this year's BOS.

Walker said this is the first year she will be participating in the open studios day.

"I moved to Beacon last winter and have loved jumping into its vibrant art community. So happy to be showing in Beacon Open Studios - thank you Ethan Cohen Gallery!" Walker commented.

Walker stated, "I am a printmaker (I have a 1500-pound printing press in our third floor, Main Street apartment) and make monotype prints and then draw over them with oil pastel making original, one-of-a-kind pieces. I have a master's in theology, Imagination, and the Arts from St Andrews in Scotland and approach each work with my honest questions. I find that even though the answers often separate us, we all have the same questions, and I am interested in what unites us."

Regarding the planning for this annual event, Golubina explained, "The planning for an event of this scale, requires months and many helping hands! We started our location outreach and schedule layout last year and our fundraising back in January! Fundraising and grants allow us to pay for locations for our registered artists to use during the event (should they not have their own studios) and give us the ability to waive registration fees for those who cannot afford to pay. We make sure to hire only local installers, stage crew, vendors, designers and photographers, to return our raised funds back into Beacon's community."

Each of our 80+ artists is featured on the BOS website and on a map, which are updated and redesigned each year, said Golubina. "We work with local artists, volunteers and local graphic designers. Our goal is to support local artists so that they can keep making art!"

Attendees will be able to see what called "a diverse group" of painters, artists, sculptors, photographers, installation artists and digital creators.

"We are so lucky to work with them, learn from them and be able to give them a platform to show their work to a wide audience!" Golubina said.

Walker said, "I am looking forward to seeing excellent art and meeting other artists to deepen my roots in this community. I hope to be here for decades to come and the best part of a place is its characters!"

Cool as a cucumber

Vicki has different uses for a variety of cucumbers

Nature has turned up the heat! I could give it a romantic spin and say it's balmy, but we have arrived at that swampy, sweltering, beyond-humid stage of summer so I'll spare you the rose-colored sunglasses and cut right to the chase – it's pretty brutal out there. I always worry about those who have to work outside this time of year. I've done it. I know how draining it can be. Even downing gallons of water isn't enough to combat the diabolical duo of extreme humidity and blistering heat. And, no, before you ask, you don't really get used to it.

Maybe it would help to know that while you're out there working – be it for a living or to keep the yard up to snuff – there's something else out there as we speak that's setting an inspiring example and is here to help, something not just surviving but thriving and about to offer itself up to make you feel much better if you only give it the chance. It even has its own idiom, so take heed and prepare to be refreshed.

There's a reason why 'cool as a cucumber' is an expression. These summertime fruits of the melon family boast, be it ever so humbly, a water content of 95%, their well-designed skin protecting and preserving all that enviable cooling hydration while preventing the absorption of heat. That gives them the ability to stay about 20 degrees cooler than the air around them, even when they're still outside growing on the vine, keeping them calm and collected while many of their neighbors shrivel and wither, including us. That they grow on vines often shaded by their large leaves can't hurt. Although they require sun, about 6-8 hours directly each day, they've got it made in the

shade, basically just hanging out to make your summer more bearable. Yeah, they're cool.

Any trip to the store will give you a few varieties, not just the one we all know, and farmers markets will likely have even more. Most stores carry 3 or 4 types, each with special characteristics making them suitable for all kinds of applications. I'll fill you in on the 4 most common with an honorable mention thrown in for good measure.

When we think cucumber, the one that comes to mind is medium-sized with slightly warty, smooth, dark skin and a fair number of pronounced seeds. These are best peeled since the skin is on the tough side, often waxed and usually bitter. I got a tip about peeling them from a chef in a restaurant I worked in, who said most of the bitterness is in the ends, so cutting them off before peeling prevents dragging that bitterness along the fruit as you go. I don't know if there's anything to it, but it's my method whenever I use them and I've got no complaints. Some people remove the seeds but I just don't. They don't bother me much. Besides, if I want seedless there are other, less time-consuming options.

Probably the most versatile of these options is the English cucumber, a long, slender variety you'll find in a tight plastic sleeve to protect its thin, slightly sweet, delicate skin, which isn't at all bitter and completely palatable. And, just like your mother told you, it's where a lot of the nutrients are, so it's only right to leave it be. And while not technically seedless they may as well be; they're pretty much non-existent, very small and tender, if there at all. They are very crisp

and easy to slice paper thin, perfect for sandwiches, cucumber salads and garnishes.

Small, chubby Kirby cukes are typically for pickling – think big dill pickles – but they're great in salads, salsas and gazpacho, too. They're firm with a bumpy, usually thin, crisp skin so they have a good crunch factor and don't require peeling.

More recently I've seen stores carry packages of slender, petite cucumbers, usually organic, that are marketed as Cutecumbers, Snackers or simply Mini. These are great for eating out of hand and on crudité platters, and kids love 'em. They can be pricey, but I'm a fan and these are my go-to for parties when I want a nice presentation. They are practically seedless, very crisp, sweet, considered burpless and just plain adorable.

And the honorable mention: lemon cucumbers. You'll probably have to scour farmers markets and farm stands to find them (or grow your own) since they won't be in stores, but they are lovely. My sister grew these on her farm back in the day and they're a real treat. You can't miss them: they're round and pale yellow, hence the name, with no bitterness. The skin is tender so no need to peel but will be tougher on older fruit, which will be darker yellow. The flavor is like any other cuke – sorry, no lemony notes – but they're a pretty alternative if you can find them.

That's a fair number of choices for upping your hydration and refreshment levels with even more choices when it comes to putting them to use. SOOO many choices! Slice them any way you like: thin for finger sandwiches, salads with delicate vinaigrette or to top salmon; chunks for salsa; spears for crudité or lunches, or just eat 'em whole, right out of hand. You can blend them into smoothies, puree for cold summer soups and even muddle them into your favorite gin cocktail. And don't forget pickles!

Or maybe you want to plan a day to chill out. Make spa water by adding slices to ice water with lemon and fresh mint to sip poolside, or place slices straight from the fridge on your eyelids to soothe and reduce puffiness. Having a party? Cut your cukes into 4-inch pieces and remove three quarters of the center with a melon baller or small knife, leaving at least half an inch at the bottom, and you have the perfect-sized cup to individually serve chilled melon soup, smoked salmon salad or cold sake. Chop up to make a creamy tzatziki sauce for pita, gyros or vegetables. Cut into thick rounds they make a cool, healthy cracker alternative for appetizers, and they play beautifully with the freshest fruit, especially melon, herbs like mint, basil, dill and cilantro, onions and tomatoes. Maybe you're getting the idea you should keep some at the ready all summer long. Because you definitely should.

And speaking of keeping, as with any produce it's best to use your cukes right away. That said, to keep them crisp for as long as possible, rinse and dry them before wrapping in a paper towel and placing in an open

plastic bag in the crisper drawer. That way you can enjoy them whenever you need what they have to offer. Which, as I think I've proven, is a lot. What I failed to mention is that they're also rock stars when it comes to nutrition, loaded with antioxidant flavonoids, vitamins A, C and K, magnesium, fiber and potassium. And, of course, all that water. Convinced yet? Well, here's an easy recipe for you that might help.

CUCUMBER SALAD

This was inspired by a salad my grandmother used to make with cucumbers from her garden. This version is not only easy, but refreshing and even a little comforting (at least to me) thanks to its silky dressing. You can use any cucumbers you like or happen to have. I've chosen the English variety because its crisp enough to slice paper thin, which I prefer.

INGREDIENTS:

2 English cucumbers, thinly sliced
Half an onion, sliced thin (red or sweet work best)
1/2 cup sour cream (or Greek yogurt)
2 tablespoons vinegar (white or red wine are both great)
Fresh dill, chopped
Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper, to taste

METHOD:

Place sliced cucumbers, onions in a bowl. Whisk together remaining ingredients to make the dressing, pour over the cucumbers and toss to evenly coat. Garnish with fresh dill and serve.

CAN BE MADE AHEAD

Because of their high water content, cucumbers will give off a lot of moisture if allowed to sit. If you plan to make this ahead of time, I suggest placing the cuke slices in a colander and sprinkling with salt, which will draw out some of that moisture so your final result won't be a watery soup. You'll pat the slices dry before assembling the salad, but go easier on the salt you add to the dressing which, by the way, actually benefits from chilling out in the fridge even overnight. You can keep them separate until you're ready to serve, or mix it up and refrigerate for a few hours. Just give it a gentle stir before bringing it to the table.

So let's all take a lesson from the extraordinary cucumber and stay hydrated, chill out and, above all, stay cool! Enjoy!

Frederick Douglass Day

A special event at College Hill Park in Poughkeepsie will celebrate the former slave, abolitionist, author and statesman.

“Our profoundest wish, our intensest desire, our chiefest aim, is to make this memorable day in some small measure the means of awakening a deeper interest in the cause of the fettered millions in our own land.” Thus spake Frederick Douglass on August 2, 1848, at College Hill in Poughkeepsie. And thus will speak again the members of Celebrating the African Spirit as they re-create portions of the famous speech at the third annual Frederick Douglass Day Experience at College Hill on Saturday, July 29.

Frederick Douglass (1817-1895), former slave, abolitionist, author and statesman, was a fiery orator. Four thousand people crowded onto College Hill to hear his lecture on the 15th anniversary of the end of slavery in the British Empire. Douglass was urging his listeners to follow Britain’s example, which was accomplished without violence.

Celebrating the African Spirit (CAS), co-founded and chaired by Carmen McGill, is dedicated to honoring the legacy of Africans and their descendants in Poughkeepsie, and to commemorate their contributions to the building and growth of the Dutchess County region. CAS is presenting the Frederick Douglass Day Experience, free and open to the public, with free food from Essie’s Restaurant and live performances by the musical group Souls United, from noon to 4 p.m. on July 29.

Last Wednesday I met with Carmen McGill and Nancy Foster, member of CAS, at the Lown Memorial Garden at College Hill Park. Nancy is president of the Revive College Hill Park Coalition. We also hooked up with Barbara Restaino, treasurer of the Coalition and guiding spirit behind the restoration of the perennial rock garden. We all sat in the shade of an ancient Sycamore while I learned that enslaved African people built historic Poughkeepsie. Slavery existed in New York State until 1823.

“What Douglass spoke about then, is still valid in the U.S. Today,” Carmen assured me.

Researching a little about Douglass – I read the graphic narrative “The Life of Frederick Douglass” – I realized what an extraordinary statesman he was. For example, he had President Lincoln, whom he met three times, completely figured out:

“Viewed from the genuine abolition ground, Mr. Lincoln seemed tardy, dull and indifferent, but measuring him by the sentiment of his country, a sentiment he was bound as a statesman to consult, he was swift, zealous, radical and determined.”

Talent Davis is the creative director of Frederick Douglass Day. I tracked him down as his band was warming up at the newly renovated Malcolm X Park on Mansion Street. Talent provided this message:

“It’s been an honor serving as Creative Director for this event! It will be a special

cultural celebration to commemorate forefather Frederick Douglass! There will be a surprise performance at the end you DON’T want to miss!”

Back at College Hill, I encountered a team of young gardeners from Nubian Directions II sprucing up the park’s entrance, under the direction of City of Poughkeepsie Garden Supervisor Dora Levine. College Hill, the highest point in the city of Poughkeepsie, is a real gem, with its pavilion, gardens and soon-to-be

renovated underground cistern (stay tuned). The Frederick Douglass Day Experience will give us all a chance to enjoy. So don’t miss it!

Starring bass-baritone Alfred Walker, who combines "vocal heft and theatrical intensity" (Wall Street Journal), "Henri VIII" will run for five performances (July 21, 23, 26, 28, and 30) in an original staging by visionary French director Jean-Romain Vesperini in the Frank Gehry-designed Fisher Center on Bard's campus in Annandale-on-Hudson.

All five performances will be anchored by the American Symphony Orchestra and Bard Festival Chorale under the leadership of festival founder and co-artistic director Leon Botstein. Botstein will give an Opera Talk before the first Sunday matinee (July 23), and the third performance will stream live online (July 26) with an encore presentation three days later (July 29).

The subject of the 2012 Bard Music Festival, Camille Saint-Saëns (1835–1921) helped shape the course of French music over the course of his long and remarkable career. Today his operatic reputation rests solely on "Samson et Dalila" and, even during his lifetime, he was best known for his orchestral and chamber works. Yet the composer wrote no fewer than 12 operas, winning promotion to the rank of Officier de l'Ordre national de la Légion d'honneur with the help of his fifth, "Henri VIII" (1883). Set in England, the birthplace of Ralph Vaughan Williams – the subject of this year's Bard Music Festival, "Vaughan Williams and His World" – "Henri VIII" remained in the Paris Opéra repertoire throughout Saint-Saëns' lifetime, for a total of 87 performances, besides touring to Milan, Monte Carlo, Antwerp, Frankfurt, Prague, Moscow and London, where its success was one of the biggest of his career. Subsequent revivals

have been rare, however, even in Europe. "Henri VIII" only received its U.S. premiere in 1974, and this season's SummerScape staging marks its first major American production to date.

Owed largely to the prevalence of musical modernism, such neglect was far from justified. In its depiction of the historic love triangle between the Tudor king, his first wife, and the mistress who became his second, the opera boasts some of Saint-Saëns' richest orchestration and most exquisite vocal writing.

The libretto is the work of Saint-Saëns' collaborators Léonce Détrouyat and Paul-Armand Silvestre, who based their account on "La cisma de Inglaterra" ("The Schism in England") by Spanish playwright Pedro Calderón de la Barca. Drawing additional elements from Shakespeare and John Fletcher's Henry VIII, Détrouyat and Silvestre dramatize Henry's fateful split from the Roman Catholic church, which allowed him to divorce Catherine of Aragon and marry Anne Boleyn, in hopes of producing a male heir and ensuring the Tudor succession.

To stage the opera, the Fisher Center at Bard turned to French director Jean-Romain Vesperini, whose previous credits include original productions for Paris National Opera, Opera Hong Kong, and Moscow's Bolshoi Theater. Well-versed in the French grand opera tradition and its roots in tragédie lyrique, Vesperini has mounted rarities by Benjamin Godard and Victorin de Joncières, while his original treatment of Gounod's Faust prompted Canada's Journal de Québec to marvel: "The staging is of high quality and caliber. ... A production that will please both connoisseurs and those who want to learn about this art form, ... this house production is a success and one of the finest presented in recent seasons in Quebec."

"Henri VIII" marks the director's first foray into Saint-Saëns. Vesperini finds it telling that the opera dates from the period that gave rise to Freud's theories of psychoanalysis. He says:

"The arias and conversations are about the inner feelings of a man who changes his mind from one day to the next. When Henri first meets Anne, they sing a beautiful love duet together. But the king has also ordered the beheading of his ex-best friend! At the exact same time that the couple is flirting, monks are chanting at the funeral procession for the executed man. We literally hear the mix of Eros and Thanatos within the music itself."

Thanks to the director's own French background, he understands the resonance Saint-Saëns would have found in his source material. In late-19th-century France, the relationship between divorce, Catholicism and the law was all too topical. Following a brief period of legalization in revolutionary and Napoleonic France, a national ban on divorce was reinstated until shortly after the premiere of Henri VIII. Vesperini says:

"Saint-Saëns was not just an artist. He was a political man who was very involved with the public life of his country. He wanted to write a historical opera, but one that addressed contemporary issues too. Today the story of Henry VIII doesn't speak to us in the same way because divorce is normal and accepted. But that wasn't the case in Saint-Saëns' France. Divorce was a big topic of conversation in French society. Many people were in favor, but the most devout Catholics were still against it. That's why it makes

sense that Saint-Saëns chose to tell the story of a king who had to split from the Catholic church to obtain a divorce."

SummerScape's "Henri VIII" will star bass-baritone Alfred Walker in the title role. Last seen at Bard in 2019's "The Miracle of Heliane," Walker also appears this season at the Metropolitan Opera, Lyric Opera of Chicago, and San Francisco Opera. Walker sings opposite the Catherine d'Aragon of soprano Amanda Woodbury, a Grand Finals Winner of the Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions, with mezzo-soprano Lindsay Ammann – "a force to be dealt with" (Opera News) – as the beautiful but ambitious Anne Boleyn. Rounding out the quartet of principals is Canadian tenor Josh Lovell – "a handsome sounding tenor with a warm, liquid voice and easy high notes" (The Guardian) – as Don Gómez de Feria. The first-rate cast also features two returning basses: Kevin Thompson, last seen in 2019's "world-class production" (Opera Wire) of The Miracle of Heliane, sings Thomas Cranmer, the Archbishop of Canterbury; and the Duke of Norfolk, Anne's uncle, is sung by Harold Wilson, who "command[ed] a sonorous bass" (New York Times) in the leading role of 2022's production of The Silent Woman, which confirmed SummerScape's reputation for "essential summertime fare for the serious American opera-goer" (Financial Times).

Onaje is currently the Artistic Director of Ujamaa Studios located at the Cunneen-Hackett Arts Center and displays his work extensively as well as designs custom picture frames. Shirley Parker-Benjamin is an interdisciplinary artist creating work across the genres of sculptural mixed media, assemblage, and installation. She explores the intersection between ancestral, spiritual, and metaphysical African/African Diasporic traditions and the feminine integrating found objects, natural materials, metals, minerals beadwork and fiber to convey her ideas. Shirley's work has been exhibited regionally and internationally and her studio, Ezili Arts, is located at the Cunneen Hackett Arts Center. Omar Parker is a photographer based in Queens, New York who captures urban life's essence through a lens. For 30 years, he has been drawn to all aspects of the urban environment—from graffiti's vibrant expression to the interplay of people on the streets, including himself. "I document the raw energy and hidden beauty, seeking to immortalize the transient art of graffiti and the intricate stories behind human interactions," comments Omar. "Through composition and timing, I aim to evoke emotions, challenge perceptions, and reveal the allure of urban life. Join me as we uncover the captivating narratives that shape our urban world."

David Vorves is a self-taught artist living in the Hudson Valley, and has been painting for seven years. His work explores themes such as perception, memory, self-consciousness, and humanity, and is characterized by bold color, twisted form, and turbulent brushwork.

"My 'alla prima' paintings evoke a feeling of fleeting permanence, and often take on a sort of sentience of their own," comments Mr. Vorves. "I strive to create artwork that forces the viewer to look deeper within themselves, and to notice the people around them." His exhibit at the Cunneen-Hackett Arts Center, entitled "Tainted Nostalgia", explores the memories we love to remember but hate to think about, the people and places that inhabit them, and how such memories ultimately are responsible for molding us into who we are today.

Jill Ziccardi's artwork is influenced by nature and symbolism, domesticity, satire and American slang language that calls attention to our own absurd and harmful associations about being "female" and "male". Mocking past and present stereotypes with humor and irony, her images expose the disconnect between the sexes, and the bias that is embedded in our common language and in our psyche. "As a young artist, I was inspired by a seemingly unremarkable 20 second experience when, one day, I stepped into an elevator full of men and one of them was discussing his affections for a woman he enthusiastically referred to as a 'hot little tomato!,' Ziccardi recants. "The image of a sexy woman as a tomato amused me, offended me and ignited my sassy sense of humor...I grew up in an ethnic Italian family and the image of a tomato was especially meaningful for it was a term used to objectify and devalue 'the female'." This chance encounter opened up Pandora's box of ideas that Ziccardi is still executing and sourcing from today, and likely indefinitely. Her arsenal of images is commonly known and quite varied (Chick, Skirt, Bombshell, Prick, Nuts, Bunny, Tail, etc...) and is reappropriated from slang language and reclaimed as her own.




