State seeks ideas for former Downstate facility

New York State Urban Development Corporation, Empire State Development (ESD), is seeking proposals for the purchase and redevelopment of the decommissioned former Downstate Correctional Facility. The approximately 80-acre site on Red Schoolhouse Road in Fishkill. The Request for Proposals (RFP) was announced on July 18. The deadline is August 23.

According to the information from the State, "There are 37 buildings on the property, totaling approximately 558,000 square feet. The Site is improved with four nearly identical and symmetrical housing structures (core buildings) that are connected by tunnels to a central reception and commons structure

Wappingers Falls park 'temporarily closed'

Temple Park in the Village of Wappingers Falls is temporarily closed. It comes out of an "an abundance of caution" according to a message of the Village's website, which adds the Village of Wappingers Falls "is coordinating with" the New York State Department of Health (NYS DOH) and Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) "to undertake environmental sampling."

On July 20th, Gov. Kathy Hochul directed the Department of Public Service, Department of Health, and Department of Environmental Conservation to immediately investigate a recent report of old lead-covered cables left by telecommunication companies and the potential public health risks associated with exposure to those cables her office stated.

Dutchess County Historical Society to have new location in Rhinebeck

Agreements have just been finalized for the Dutchess County Historical Society (DCHS) to locate its extensive collections and research library in Rhinebeck. It will be located at 6282 Route 9 about a half-mile south of the village center.

Recently renovated, the 5,000 square foot building (a ground floor and basement) is well known locally as having served as Hobson's Appliance store for over half a century.

Executive Director Bill Jeffway explained, "For at least a decade, the DCHS board of directors has been aware that to accommodate the growth in its collections and libraries other space was needed. Not working under any particular deadline has allowed the board to wait until a most exceptional site was located, which is exactly what we feel has happened."



(reception center). The core buildings are composed of single-occupancy cells with a collective capacity for approximately 1,200 incarcerated individuals; each core building also has a small library. The reception center houses the kitchen and cafeteria, medical offices, chapel, and commissary among other services. Other structures on the Site include guard stations, storage sheds, and mechanical rooms.” Most of the buildings were built in 1979, according to the State, and some of the guard stations, storage sheds, and mechanical rooms were built over the next few decades, through 2003.

The notice about the RFPs states: “ESD is interested in proposals that will provide maximum benefits to the surrounding community and generate the highest economic return for the State. Given the unique location of the Site in the growing Beacon/Fishkill area, the Project presents a unique and exciting opportunity for redevelopment for the purposes specified in this RFP.”

The objective, the notice states: “The primary development objectives for the Project are to maximize benefits to the surrounding community and generate the highest economic return for the State. These benefits may include housing, commercial activity, and job creation. When proposing mixed use development with contextual multifamily housing serving a range of income levels, market rate units should cross subsidize affordable housing units.”

There is “[a]n archeological buffer is present on the site. Consultation with the State Historic Preservation Office will take place as part of the SEQRA (State Environmental Quality Review Act) review for the project,” according to the State.

The State included in the notice that some of the buildings are owned by ESD and the remaining buildings are owned by the State of New York under DOCCS (Department of Corrections and Community Supervision) jurisdiction. The entirety of the Site is cur-

rently exempt from property taxes.”

It also states two of buildings “are subject to a lease from ESD to the People of the State of New York acting through the Office of General Services (OGS) and a sublease to DOCCS. The remaining buildings are owned by the People of the State of New York acting through OGS and 10 subleased to DOCCS. All leases and subleases would be terminated in connection with the disposition of the Site to a Designated Developer.”

Rolison addresses federal Disaster Declaration for Dutchess, Orange, Putnam Counties

State Senator Rob Rolison (R-39th District) on Monday released the following statement after the Biden administration issued a Major Disaster Declaration for Dutchess, Orange, and Putnam counties, among others.

The federal government’s order will deliver disaster relief to affected localities and follows on the heels of Rolison and other elected officials demanding that state and federal authorities prioritize towns and villages severely impacted by the July 9 storm that released a season’s worth of rain into the Hudson Valley in just a few hours. While damage assessments are ongoing, at least one estimate from the Town of Pawling, Dutchess County puts the total cost at close to \$9 million.

“This action will send much-needed funding and assistance to the Hudson Valley communities hit hardest by the July 9 storm and floods. Help is on the way.

“In the meantime, I will continue to remain in close communication with local leaders in Orange, Dutchess, and Putnam counties to help coordinate the ongoing recovery efforts.

“From its start, this was a team effort, involving a number of hard-working stakeholders, especially our storm- and flood-impacted residents, and will remain so now that the federal government has provided us with the resources our local towns and villages desperately need to rebuild,” said Rolison.

Wappingers Falls park 'temporarily closed'

"The health and safety of New Yorkers is the top priority of my administration, and we are using all of the tools at our disposal to ensure communities are out of harm's way," Hochul stated in a release. "Lead-covered cables pose a serious threat to communities across New York, and I am directing State agencies to immediately launch a full investigation. We will hold the telecommunication companies responsible and take swift action to remediate any problems."

New York State Health Commissioner Dr. James McDonald said, "The New York State Department of Health takes reports of lead-containing cabling very seriously and has quickly mobilized in coordinating with the Department of Environmental Conservation, the Village of Wappingers Falls and the Dutchess County Department of Health to determine if the cables pose any health concerns and identify any necessary additional actions. We stand with the Governor in ensuring that the health and safety of all New Yorkers is protected, and will update the public on our next steps."

Village of Wappingers Falls Mayor Kevin Huber sent the link from New York State regarding the press release issued when asked to comment.

The Governor's Office stated this action follows a media report of lead-containing cable in large and small communities across the U.S., including the State of New York.

"The report included the example of an aerial lead cable located in a local park in the village of Wappingers Falls, Dutchess County, and stated soil at the park perimeter had elevated lead levels above what the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency considers safe in soil in areas where children play. At the Governor's direction, state experts from the Department of Health (DOH) and the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) have initiated sampling in the area to evaluate any potential for lead exposure," reads the press release.

"For more than 100 years, the U.S. telecommunications industry has connected people, businesses, communities, and first responders while supporting our nation's economy and critical infrastructure needs. As part of this commitment, our members take the health and safety of our workers and the communities in which we live and operate very seriously," a spokesperson for the USTelecom The Broadband Association stated in a statement earlier this month. "We have been unable to confirm the information reported by the Wall Street Journal because we do not have access to all of the data or methodology underlying its conclusions. We have not seen, nor have regulators identified, evidence that legacy lead-sheathed telecom cables are a leading cause of lead exposure or the cause of a public health issue."

Hochul directed the Department of Public Service (DPS), the regulator of telecommunication companies in New York, and DEC to investigate the scope of this potential concern based on past use of lead cables, according to the release. "As part of that effort, the agencies sent a letter to the

State's 246 facilities-based telecommunication providers to begin compiling an inventory of the presence of aerial and buried cables, both on land and below water, containing lead across New York. The letter directs telecommunication companies to provide DPS and DEC with a full inventory of lead-containing aerial and buried cable owned by the company for both cable still in use to provide service and cable that is no longer being used but has yet to be removed," it states.

According to the release, the purpose of the investigation is to better understand the inventory and ownership of such cables in New York. This information will be used to evaluate the need for additional steps. The inventory would include the type of cable (copper or fiber) and whether it is aerial or buried, as well as the city, town, or village the cable is located in, street name where the cable is located, the length of the cable, the closest intersecting landmarks at the beginning and end of the cable, and any other information that would be useful to physically locate and inspect the cable.

Gov. Hochul immediately directed DOH and DEC to conduct sampling for lead once the reported details about the Wappingers Falls park were released. Work is already underway and out of an abundance of caution, the park is temporarily closed. The results from this sampling will be made public as soon as they are available, the release stated.

"As a highly regulated industry, we've implemented and maintained strong safety programs, and follow local, state, and federal environmental and public health and safety laws and regulations. Our industry also has a long tradition of closely following science and evidence as it relates to public health, environmental protection, and worker safety issues. And safe work practices within the telecommunications industry have proven effective in reducing potential lead exposures to workers. Legacy lead-sheathed telecom cables were deployed in the nation's telecommunications infrastructure, and placement of these cables then began to get phased out in the 1950s, after the development of a new type of sheathing," the US Telecom statement stated.

A spokesperson for Verizon stated, "Verizon has millions of customers and more than 100,000 employees who work, live and raise families across the United States. We have a vested interest in keeping our communities healthy, safe and connected."

"We are taking these concerns regarding lead-sheathed cables very seriously. Lead-sheathed infrastructure has not been deployed in decades by Verizon or its predecessor companies. For about the past 20 years, we've been modernizing our network and deployed fiber optic cables in thousands of cities and towns. Only a small percentage

of our existing network today includes lead-sheathed cable," added the Verizon spokesperson.

"It's important to note that lead in the environment results from a variety of different industrial uses other than telecom – including electric utilities, water pipes, paint, engine fuels and more. In fact, federal and state governments have made upgrading lead water supply pipes in the United States a priority through the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act and other initiatives. As our review of this matter continues, we stand ready to work closely with our industry and others to address any concerns and issues" concluded the spokesperson from Verizon.

The Governor's Office noted, "Studies show that no amount of lead exposure is safe for children. Lead is a metal that can harm children when it gets into their bodies. Lead can harm a young child's growth, behavior, and ability to learn. It can also cause anemia, kidney damage, and hearing loss. There are many sources of lead. Lead can be found in dust, air, water, soil, and in some products used in and around our homes."

New York State Department of Public Service CEO Rory M. Christian, said, "Governor Hochul has made it clear that our number one responsibility is to protect the health and safety of our communities, and we take those instructions seriously. As a

result, we will waste no time in digging deep to find out whether there is a problem, and how best we can fix the problem if one exists."

NYS Department of Environmental Conservation Commissioner Basil Seggos said, "DEC's experts work closely with DOH, DPS, and our many other state and federal partners to use the best science available to investigate and clean up contaminated sites. We continue to hold polluters responsible for the potential environmental and health risks they create and will expedite the ongoing assessment of the extent of any lead-related impacts these cables could have on our children and communities."

"Regulators have been focused for decades on the primary and largest sources of lead in the environment like lead in motor fuels, industrial activities, lead dust from historic lead-based paint, lead in drinking water from historic distribution piping, and lead in household products, such as toys or jewelry. This regulatory focus has been highly effective, bringing national population lead levels in human blood samples down nearly 95% from the levels in the 1970s across all age groups, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention," according to the State.

"The U.S. telecommunications industry stands ready to engage constructively on this issue," states the statement from USTelecom.

The recent activist campaign against Continental Commons is severely flawed. Their ideological driven campaign ignores essential well documented engineering facts and misrepresents archaeological studies. These critics are creating a sense of panic when they falsely state:

Fiction

The Town of Fishkill's Blodgett Water District does not have enough water for Continental Commons.

Fact

There is more than enough water to service Continental Commons. In fact, a New York State Supreme Court Judge ruled the Town must provide water to Continental Commons after the previous Town Board wrongly denied water in the fall of 2020. Like it does today, the Town will receive water for the Blodgett Water District from the Village of Fishkill.

Fiction

Continental Commons plans to use more water than expected.

Fact

The Continental Commons does not plan to use more water than engineers projected when it was approved in 2019.

Fiction

Archeological studies identified a long-lost American Revolutionary War soldiers' cemetery.

Fact

The New York State Historic Preservation Office confirmed that archaeological studies do not support critics position that soldiers are buried on the Continental Commons property.

Fiction

Additional archaeological studies need to be completed on the Continental Commons property.

County Drug Task Force announces multiple arrests in fentanyl, cocaine investigation

The Dutchess County Drug Task Force announced multiple arrests and the seizure of dangerous drugs and an illegal handgun after search warrants were executed in the City and Town of Poughkeepsie.

The Dutchess County Drug Task Force has been actively investigating the sale of fentanyl and crack cocaine in the Dutchess County area, according to a press release. As a result of this investigation, two search warrants were executed by the Dutchess County Drug Task Force with the assistance of the Dutchess County Sheriff's Office Emergency Services Unit. During the execution of the warrants on July 18 a loaded illegal handgun was seized as well as a large quantity of fentanyl and crack cocaine, according to law enforcement. The county Drug Taks Force announced the following individuals who reside in the City of Poughkeepsie were arrested as a result of the search warrants executed by the Drug Task Force:

1. Phillip Stephens – Criminal Possession of Weapon – Loaded Firearm, a class C Felony offense.

Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance 3rd Degree, a class B Felony

2. William Moore - Felony warrant held by the New York State Police

3. Marisol Rivera - Felony warrant held by the City of Poughkeepsie Police

4. Michelle Butler - Felony warrant held by the New York State Police

Phillip Stephens is being held by the Drug Task Force pending his arrangement in City Court later this morning, stated law enforcement. All other suspects were turned over to the agencies that held the warrants of arrest.

The Drug Task Force was assisted by the City of Poughkeepsie NRU and NYSP. As with any criminal case, the charges described above are merely an accusation and defendants are presumed innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.

Work to begin on sidewalk from Innis Ave. to Jackman in Poughkeepsie

The Dutchess County Department of Public Works (DPW) has announced work is anticipated to begin to create a continuous sidewalk along the south-bound lane of Innis Avenue (CR-75) from the intersection of Jackman Drive to the intersection of Arnold and East Arnold Road in Poughkeepsie.

Project work will include widening the sidewalks; adding sidewalk where gaps exist; upgrading intersections on both sides of Innis Avenue to meet American Disabilities Act (ADA) standards; adding painted crosswalks to intersections; making improvements to the roadway's drainage system; and replacing and upgrading the traffic signals at the intersection of Innis Avenue, DeLaval Place

and Emmott Place. Innis Avenue will remain open during construction, but alternating lane closures and traffic interruptions are anticipated. Access will be maintained to driveways in the construction zone. The project is anticipated to be completed by November 2023.

Motorists are advised to plan for additional time and to exercise extra caution near the construction site, obey the posted speed limits, traffic advisory signs, and the directions from flaggers to ensure the safety of workers and other motorists.

Beacon Police: Woman dies after fall into Fishkill Creek

A 42-year-old woman from Beacon died after she fell down an approximate 15-foot embankment into the Fishkill Creek on July 18 around 6:40 p.m. in the area of 50 Leonard St., according to Detective Sergeant Jason Johnson with the City of Beacon Police Department. On July 20, police identified the woman as Sukanya Basu.

"An immediate search of the creek commenced, and the victim was located

by the City of Beacon Fire Department personnel. The victim was unconscious and unresponsive. Lifesaving efforts were initiated, and the victim was transported to a local hospital where she succumbed to her injuries," stated Johnson in a press release.

Johnson stated that an investigation confirmed that the woman accidentally fell backward while having her picture taken.

Revitalized Horse Trials return to Millbrook with full schedule

The Millbrook Horse Trials (MHT), long a staple of Dutchess County's summer calendar, is, once again, taking place after a short hiatus in 2022. Bringing a delicious mixture of elegance and mud, the five-day event begins on Wednesday, July 26 and concludes on Sunday, July 30.

Millbrook is one of the few remaining horse trials in the Northeast. It is by far the largest, and it is the only one that still runs all levels through Advanced. The event typically attracts world-class equestrians, as well as grassroots competitors. Some will be competing in the elegance of the dressage competition, while others will emerge from the cross country runs covered in mud, but smiling from ear to ear.

Millbrook, long a popular area with equestrians, offers an all-but-perfect location to draw riders from around the world. It offers a great deal of preserved open countryside, a local foxhound and polo club and strong support from the local community.

The event has strong ties to the Dutchess Land Conservancy, with the cross country course taking place on preserved land that is owned by The Millbrook School and dressage and show jumping being located at Cole Park Farm, just across the road.

The Millbrook Horse Trials is the largest horse trials in the Northeast, with more than 400 entries on average each year since 2007. Once a crowded calendar, 12 events have ceased functioning in Northeast over the last

10 years. Thus, Millbrook is now the only one that still runs the advanced level. The event attracts world-class equestrians, including Boyd Martin, Phillip Dutton and Sara Kozumplik, as well as local favorites like Booli Selmayr and Ariel Grald, who are both seasoned competitors.

"It's really charming and special," said co-chair of the board Caroline Merison. "People absolutely love it, and we are constantly working on improving the event." Merison took over as co-chair of the board along with Mimi Babcock when longtime Chair Simon Roosevelt stepped down recently. They are working to ensure that after unavoidable cancellations in 2020 and 2022, the 2023 horse trials will have a fresh start with revitalized energy.

Merison said, "Mimi and I are excited to take on the challenge of reinvigorating the Millbrook Horse Trials after couple of year's hiatus. It is a wonderful event and one that has 30 years of history. It is important to the local community, and to the national eventing calendar."

The event offers something for everybody. Food trucks and vendors will be on-site. There will be a petting zoo for children, as well as free access to the Millbrook School Zoo next door, and an arts and crafts tent on-site.

"It should be a fun weekend for everyone!" notes Merison. "We have been overwhelmed by the generosity and support we have received. We are so grateful for the enthusiasm of all our supporters both from

the Millbrook area and the broader equestrian community and feel a huge responsibility to deliver a great event this year."

General admission and parking are free of charge. Family entertainment includes the vendor village and weekend Millbrook Market, as well as food trucks featuring a variety of cuisines. The petting zoo and arts and crafts tent are sure to keep young children entertained.

Tailgating is available during cross country, with each space comfortably accommodating 10 people. People may bring their own tent, chairs and sumptuous picnic, or enjoy delicious cuisine from local food trucks and the Simply Gourmet concession tent. Cocktails are promised from the elegantly converted horse trailer bar, The Fizzy Filly, expected to be conveniently located next to the tailgating area.

Dutchess County Historical Society to have new Rhinebeck location

Founded in 1914 out of a meeting at the Pleasant Valley Free Library, DCHS did not have a building of its own until 1979 when it moved into the building it now occupies, Clinton House in Poughkeepsie. The 18th stone house was bought by New York State in the 1890s with a view to turning it into a Revolutionary War museum. Those plans never materialized and the house became associated with the Mahwenawasigh Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution, and eventually, DCHS in 1979.

The Dr. Franklin A. Butts research library was launched in 1984 and will be located there, as will a very recent acquisition, the Arthur & Nancy Kelly Research Library.

Jeffway explained, "DCHS has largely collected documents and photographs, and to a lesser extent objects, focusing on research, interpretation and publishing. The 1914 annual yearbook is the longest-serving historical journal in New York State, and we publish what we call 'occasional publications' on a variety of topics. Franklin Roosevelt was among the founders and earliest authors."

Owner Elijah Bender said he is delighted with the agreement, "The building location is a very visible gate-

way at the south of the village, embedded in a very historic setting. The site is flanked by a streetscape of intact 18th and 19th century architecture including the John Benner House and General Richard Montgomery's estate, Grasmere. These landmarks along with the new location of the Dutchess County Historical Society demonstrate our rich architectural and cultural heritage. Active farmland is part of the same parcel. It is a great example of how we can preserve the character that makes Rhinebeck so attractive."

The building had for more than half a century been home to Hobson's Appliance. George Hobson received radio training in the U.S. Navy in the 1920s and then after returning home to Rhinebeck started a small radio business in the 1930s. The business continued to grow until it had a significant presence at the building discussed here from the 1950s.

Jeffway concluded, "We really have the best of two worlds: a very contemporary, accessible, efficient building recently designed to sit quietly in the neighborhood — and a location on the historic route that has grown from a footpath for Indigenous Peoples, to the colonial King's Road, to the Albany Post Road, and today's Route 9."

Thorpe strikes out 13 vs. Brooklyn to set franchise record for Renegades

Another record-setting night for Drew Thorpe propelled the Hudson Valley Renegades to a 3-0 victory over the Brooklyn Cyclones on Saturday night at Heritage Financial Park. The win was one of the few bright spots for the Renegades in the past week, who now have a record of 11-13 in the second half of the season.

Thorpe (10-1) dazzled on Saturday night, striking out a career-high 13 in eight shutout innings. The New York Yankees' No. 6 prospect retired the first 16 batters of the contest before allowing a single to Omar De Los Santos in the sixth inning. The 13 strikeouts are a new Renegades franchise record that was previously held by Thorpe after he punched out 12 vs. Jersey Shore on June 11.

Thorpe has amassed 124 strikeouts this season, the most in single-season franchise history, a record that he took over when he recorded his eighth strikeout of Saturday's game in the fifth inning. His 10 wins passed Josh Maciejewski (2021) and Mike Venafro (1995) for a new franchise record.

Hudson Valley provided Thorpe with some offense beginning in the third inning off Cyclones starter Joander Suárez. After Suárez (3-7) retired the first seven hitters of the contest, Aldenis Sánchez and Luis Santos tallied back-to-back singles before Spencer Jones laced a two-RBI double to left-center to hand the Renegades a 2-0 advantage.

Christopher Familia extended the Renegades lead to 3-0, blasting a solo home run to left-center in the fourth.

The Renegades dropped the series finale against Brooklyn 7-4 on Sunday afternoon.

The Renegades had the long ball working early as Ben Cowles led off the first inning with a solo home run to left field to hand the Renegades a 1-0 advantage. Hudson Valley used a pair of long balls in the third inning to extend their lead to 4-0.

Cowles hit his second blast of the game off Cyclones starter Cameron Foster. He became the seventh Renegade to record a multi-home run game this season and the first since April 30 at Greenville.

The Renegades lost four of their first six games in the second half of the season since the All-Star break. That includes two of the first three games at home against the Cyclones.

It started with a 7-4 decision on Tuesday. New York Yankees' No. 3 prospect Spencer Jones opened up the scoring in the first inning with a solo blast to right field off Cameron Foster, his 11th home run of the season. The blast was Jones' fourth lead-off home run of the year.

Brooklyn answered right back against Tyrone Yulie with a pair of two-run home runs in the second from Mateo Gil and Rhyllan Thomas to hand the Cyclones a 4-1 advantage. It was a lead that Brooklyn never relinquished.

The Renegades deficit ballooned to six after the Cyclones scored three more runs off Yulie (4-6) in the fourth. Brooklyn collected three doubles in the inning, including a pair of run scoring hits from Cesar Berbesi and Kevin Parada. Berbesi came home to score after he stole third base and advanced home on a throwing error from Agustin Ramirez.

Hudson Valley responded with three runs of their own in the bottom half of the inning to cut the lead to 7-4. Alexander Vargas started the rally with a one-out triple off Foster (4-4). Spencer Henson then singled Vargas home and advanced to second on a throwing error from Stanley Consuegra. Grant Richardson tallied the second triple of the inning and scored on another Cyclones throwing error to complete the game's scoring.

Paul Gervase retired the Renegades lineup in order in the ninth to collect his fourth save of the season.

After Yulie departed, the 'Gades bullpen combined to throw four scoreless innings. Joel Valdez made his first relief appearance of the season, tossing a scoreless 1.2 frames while Harrison Cohen followed and struck out three in 1.1 scoreless innings.

After winning on Wednesday, the Renegades faltered on Thursday night 4-3 at Heritage Financial Park.

After Zach Messinger (1-8) retired the first six batters of the game, the first four men reached in the third inning. Mateo Gil and Cesar Berbesi worked a pair of walks before Rhyllan Thomas singled to load the bases. Gil then scored on a wild pitch by Messinger to hand the Cyclones a 1-0 lead. Kevin Parada hit a sacrifice fly to center to score Thomas, before another wild pitch scored Alex Ramirez, who reached base on a hit by pitch. William Lugo capped off the innings scoring with an RBI single to extended the Cyclones advantage to 4-0.

Blade Tidwell (7-3) kept Hudson Valley off the board until the seventh inning, when Grant Richardson hit an opposite field home run to cut the Cyclones lead to 4-1. After Aldenis Sanchez flied out, Quinn Brodey entered the contest in relief. Eduardo Torrealba doubled and Luis Santos walked to begin Brodey's outing. After Santos was caught stealing second on a double steal attempt, Spencer Jones lashed a single to left field to score Henson and cut the deficit to 4-2.

Agustin Ramirez led off the eighth with a solo blast to left field to inch the Renegades closer at 4-3. Hudson Valley had the tying run at the plate on two occasions, but were unable to drive in a run in the frame.

Paul Gervase entered out of the bullpen for Brooklyn and retired the first two hitters before Jones clobbered a ball to right that Thomas made a leaping catch at the fence to take away extra bases and end the contest.

coming up (it started Tuesday July 25). We might be able to squeeze in a day off in there.


Along those lines, are these the "dog days" for management too?

Wagon, New York Soda Jerks and Cheesecake Heaven. This year will be providing two large tents to provide shade from the sun and shelter from the rain as well as high top tables for eating.”

As for how this event helps with community and police relations, Dworkin replied, “I strongly believe that providing a highly motivated community policing program pays dividends to our residents. We are constantly seeking ways to improve how we provide police services to the community. Last year I started looking at ways to expand our connection with our residents. The National Night Out program offered the opportunity to do that on a much larger scale. Due to the overwhelmingly positive response from those who attended last year, we were encouraged to repeat the event this year and make it even better.”

Dworkin noted pulling the event off is “a huge undertaking.” He thanked Recreation Department Director Jason Maietta and Assistant Director Lauren McMenamin.

“It’s a good day for residents and first responders to enjoy good food, good music but more importantly good conversation. It’s our mission to keep the lines of communication open and let the residents know that we here for them,” said Dworkin.





Baked Sea Bass Toscana

Ingredients

1 whole Sea Bass or Porgy roughly 1 to 1 1/2 lbs.
2-3 plum tomatoes
12 pitted Kalamata olives, roughly chopped
1/2 cup white wine
10 sprigs fresh parsley, finely chopped
4 cloves garlic, finely chopped
1 pinch salt
1 pinch pepper
1 pinch oregano
4 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil
2 tablespoons butter
1 fresh lemon

Method

Clean the fish and rinse well. In a sauté pan, add olive oil and sauté garlic until golden brown.

Add parsley then rest of the ingredients. Sauté till sauce is creamy.

In a ceramic or glass baking pan, place the fish. Pour the sauce on top of the fish. Add 1/2 cup of water in the pan and bake for 45 minutes at 350 degrees.

When serving, squeeze a fresh lemon over the top of the fish.

Serve with a crisp white wine, i.e. Pinot Grigio, and a nice crusty loaf of Italian bread.




