
"I'm local. I grew up here," she said. "So, for me, it's very important to make the Village of Wappingers a beautiful place again, because it was once very beautiful."

Gates will open at 10 a.m. daily at the Dutchess County Fairgrounds in Rhinebeck.

Hundreds of thousands of people are drawn to the agricultural traditions and one-of-a-kind entertainment presented during the six-day event.

The Fair features livestock shows, a midway, petting zoo and the smells of your favorite Fair foods will waft through the air - tempting your palate.

The livestock shows are held throughout the week. Each year children of all ages from 4-H and Future Farmers of America (FFA) clubs bring their animals to the Fair to compete for money and prizes. The competition can be stiff, with everyone hoping to take home the prizes and the prestige of having won a competition. The competition is a great learning experience and gives the exhibitor feed-

back on how they can improve for the next competition. Fair officials spend over \$100,000 in premiums and prizes for the agricultural shows.



## O'Neil, Pulver to host Agricultural Forum with local farmers at DC Fair

On August 24, at 8 a.m., Dutchess County Executive William F.X. O'Neil and County Legislature Chair Gregg Pulver will host the 8th Annual Agricultural Advisory Committee Forum at the Dutchess County Fairgrounds in Rhinebeck with local farmers, elected officials and representatives from agricultural and land conservancy organizations. The agricultural industry is a critical component to Dutchess County's economic success, with nearly \$44 million in sales to the local economy.

The forum will include several key highlights and announcements, including:

- discussion of the state of agriculture in Dutchess County;

- agricultural updates from Agricultural Advisory Committee members; and
- a presentation by New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets Farmland Protection Specialist Jeff Kehoe, discussing the Agricultural Districts program and the differences between it and Agricultural Assessment.

The event will be held at the Dutchess County Fairgrounds, where many Dutchess County farmers are participating in the 177th Dutchess County Fair. Following the forum, the Dutchess County 4-H Special Needs Show will take place and then youth members of Dutchess County 4-H will conduct tours through several of the livestock barns.

## Many factors involved in minor league roster moves

If the Hudson Valley Renegades have designed on a South Atlantic League championship, it's a good thing that they won the first half of the division season.

The season is split into two halves in the South Atlantic League.

In the first 40 games of the second half, the Renegades have evenly split them.

"It's just the way the season is at this level," said Hudson Valley manager Sergio Santos. "I don't think we're in a prolonged slump or anything. It's just hard to get into a rhythm with so many roster moves."

Indeed, the team has made more than 30 roster moves this year.

Or rather, parent club the New York Yankees have made the moves.

"There are so many factors that determine the roster moves," said Hudson Valley General Manager Tyson Jeffers. "Maybe a player does too well at the single A level and warrants a promotion to AA. Maybe they just want to see how a player responds to moving up. Can he handle it mentally and physically?"

It's the same thing with moving up to Hudson Valley from Tampa.

"It's the little nuances of the game," outfielder Spencer Jones said. "Little things like, can a player hit behind you? Can they move a runner over?"

The chemistry of the team is disrupted, but such is life at this level of minor league baseball and player development. Also, much depends on the success – or lack thereof – of the two teams ahead of Hudson Valley in the Yankees chain, Scranton-Wilkes Barre and Trenton.

Did they make the playoffs? And do they need players on their roster?

As previously mentioned, do the Yankees just want to move a player up and take a good look at him?

"So many factors play into it," Jeffers said. "Everybody would like to win a championship as a measure of success, but we're really here for the development of the players."

that's not a far ride. But, yes, it helped a lot to know you have the first playoff game in its home, and you can prepare.


### The playoffs are about a month away, so please give us an update.

## Pvt. Wilson honored in Washington, D.C. with 'Taps'

A bugler dressed in a WWI period uniform plays "Taps" at the National WWI Memorial in Washington, D.C. At 5 p.m., each day through August 18, "Taps" is being played in honor of the late Beaconite Pvt. William B. Wilson, who fought and was killed in action, during World War I. The Veterans of Foreign War Post on Main St. in Beacon is named in honor of Wilson.

The playing of Taps is being live streamed on the Doughboy Foundation's YouTube channel at: YouTube.com/@DoughboyFoundation.

Veteran Harold Delamater, and a Beacon resident, is the Commander of the Post.

"As Commander of VFW Post 666 I am honored to have Pvt. William B. Wilson recognized with "Taps" being sounded in his name in D.C."

Delamater said Wilson "left Beacon in 1918 and shipped out to Europe with his buddies to fight WWI. Sadly, he was killed on the battlefield. Wilson's sacrifice should be heralded - he died trying to save his buddy."

Wilson was the first Beaconite killed during World War I. He was killed on August 19, 1918. He went to war with his best friends, George Van Pelt, and Herbert Miller, who was from Newburgh, Orange County.

The following about Wilson was sent to Southern Dutchess News by Delamater. It was a synopsis of Wilson's life that was from 2018 – the commemoration of

Wilson's death on the 100th anniversary.

"By mid-August the 107th was seeing its first real action as a backup force to the British in the Dickebusch Lake sector of Belgium. The doughboys' position were in clear view of the Germans who were

entrenched on nearby Mont Kemmel. The regiment's historian recalls that Company L, on the day of August 19, was under continuous shelling by the Germans, resulting in several American casualties. One of those was Herb Miller of

Newburgh, William Wilson's best friend. Miller lay in No-Man's Land, too dangerous to be retrieved in daylight. That night of August 19, Private Wilson and Corporal Richard Connery volunteered to go out and bring Miller back to the American trenches. Both men carried Miller on a stretcher under a heavy barrage of mortar fire. Connery was wounded by shrapnel; Wilson was killed by a sniper.

"Word of Wilson's and Miller's deaths reached their hometowns on September 18, 1918. The best friends had died on the same day, August 19, the only two soldiers from Company L to be killed on that day."

Delamater noted: "'Taps' signifies the end of the battle, a time to lay down your arms and rest. Taps has a special meaning to Veterans who can relate the sacrifices made when taking their oath to protect and defend the United States from all her enemies whomsoever." He continued, "Some Veterans served in combat but most served in support roles either on foreign soil or Stateside. Families of Veterans also made a sacrifice when their loved ones put on the uniform of the United States military and left home."

"Pvt. Wilson is gone but never forgotten," said Delamater.

Daily Taps at the WWI Memorial is an on-going program from the Doughboy Foundation. The Gary Sinise Foundation is the founding sponsor.

# County takes next critical steps to address homelessness

Following input from local stakeholders, Dutchess County is undertaking several vital steps to continue its journey to address the local impact of the national plight of homelessness with an evidence-based approach and the establishment of a permanent emergency housing facility. The County's approach includes comprehensive wrap-around services to help people move from homelessness to independence as quickly as possible.

Critical next steps include:

- Recruitment is under way for a new county Shelter Director position to oversee emergency shelter operations and accompanying wrap-around services, including contracted service oversight.

- A Request for Expressions of Interest from qualified organizations to manage the day-to-day operations of the Emergency Housing Facility will be issued in the coming weeks.

- Construction design is about to begin for the temporary location for the emergency shelter operations at Dutchess County Jail once it is vacated. The current PODS have reached end of useful life and need to be removed for completion of the Dutchess County Justice & Transition Center project (DCJTC).

- The County is applying for \$15 million in New York State Homeless Housing and Assistance (HHAP) grant funding to establish permanent location for the emergency shelter.

Additionally, County Executive William F.X. O'Neil has initiated conversations with the Governor's Office about opportunities to collaborate with the State to create housing opportunities at the former Hudson River Psychiatric Center property to provide more opportunities in the housing spectrum and ensure the success of the County's homeless prevention efforts.

O'Neil said, "Dutchess County continues our plan to develop the Hudson Valley's most transformative solution to homelessness. Taking these next actions builds more momentum as we seek our ultimate resolution to address the plight of homelessness and save lives. We have heard from the Legislature's selected representatives on this issue, and we've used their contributions to craft plans that will ensure success. We look forward to moving this process forward to offer those experiencing homelessness a hand up and support to find safe and stable housing."

## **Shelter Director recruitment**

The Dutchess County Department of Community & Family Services is currently recruiting for the Shelter Director position with a public posting of the job specifications and qualifications. The Shelter Director is a County government position with responsibilities involving the administration, supervision and coordination of the County's emergency housing shelter. Among other duties, the Director will be responsible for ensuring the provision of a range of services to ensure safe housing and get people to independence and housing stability. The Director will also be a liaison between the

shelter and the community.

The job description and qualifications were expanded and updated to incorporate feedback from the Legislature's Community Stakeholder Committee. Based on the Committee's recommendation, the qualifications for education/experience were enhanced to add an additional year of required paid case management and supervision experience. Those with a master's degree in public administration should have two years of experience, while applicants with bachelor's degree should have at least three years of experience. Additionally, based on the committee's feedback, the posting includes the preference for the director to be a Licensed Clinical Social Worker. Qualified applicants are encouraged to apply prior to the August 18th deadline.

## **RFEI for Shelter Operator**

Dutchess County will be soon issuing a Request for Expression of Interest (RFEI) seeking a highly regarded organization, experienced in shelter operations, that understands and appreciates the County's needs regarding the Emergency Housing Facility and the desire to implement a new, innovative model with qualified and established program management staff.

The Operator will be responsible for the day-to-day operations of the emergency housing facility including, among others:

- development of facility operational and security plans, and policies and procedures, in accordance with Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance (OTDA) regulations, and in partnership with and approval by the County's Department of Community and Family Services;

- responsibility for intakes and discharges;
- 24-hour on-site security, including screening with a metal detector and x-ray machine;
- offering a variety of activities that are available at the facility to help engage with guests and provide meaningful activities throughout the day;
- preliminary health screenings of guests; and
- provision of three meals per day, prepared in a facility approved by the County's health department.

The RFEI is expected to be publicly posted in the coming weeks, and all eligible community providers are invited to express their interest. The RFEI incorporated comments and feedback from a public meeting convened by the administration in December 2022 to discuss the emergency shelter project with community members and local stakeholders. The RFEI also includes feedback from the Community Stakeholder Committee formed by the Dutchess County Legislature. The Committee's recommendations were sent to the County Executive, in keeping with the resolution regarding the shelter project passed by the Legislature in 2022.

## **Planning for temporary location for Emergency Shelter**

Temporary housing units (PODS) were installed at the current jail site in May 2015

as a provisional solution to the costly practice of housing out inmates to other counties, due to overcrowding at the jail. At the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, the PODS, which were no longer being utilized for inmate housing due to bail reform, were converted temporary emergency housing facility to provide safe haven for the homeless. The PODS have continued to be utilized as the number of homeless individuals has grown significantly since prior to the pandemic. However, the PODS have reached the end of their useful life, and ongoing wear and tear have required increasing maintenance and repairs.

Additionally, the PODS must be removed for the completion of the Dutchess County Justice and Transition Center (DCJTC), necessitating an interim facility for the shelter.

With the 1995 section of current jail set to be decommissioned when the DCJTC opens later this year, that section of the jail facility will serve as temporary location for the Emergency Housing Facility. County Legislators had the opportunity to tour the 1995 section earlier this year and concurred that the facility is a significant improvement over the current PODS and authorized construction design funding. Design is set to begin late this summer.

Until a permanent shelter location is solidified and ready to welcome guests, the former jail facility will enable the County to safely house individuals and most importantly, begin the critical programming that is not possible to conduct in the current PODS location.

The first floor of the jail facility will serve as office and programming space to begin providing critical wrap-around services, including mental health, substance use, housing case management and vocational assistance. This can begin as soon as the jail facility is vacated this fall. The second floor will be the living area, including sleeping quarters, and will be the focus of the majority of the construction work.

Once a permanent shelter location is identified and opened, the 1995 section of the jail will be repurposed for other uses including housing needs.

## **HHAP grant application for permanent location**

In 2022, the County identified the 26 Oakley Street property in the City of Poughkeepsie to convert into a permanent emergency housing facility and transform the County's emergency housing response system by connecting those needing housing and services with providers where they reside. Having new evidence-based programs and intensive services located at one facility will facilitate the County's new model for assisting those experiencing homelessness find permanent housing.

The County utilized \$2.1 million in American Rescue Plan (ARP) funding to purchase property.

Following construction estimates on schematic design, the multi-million cost of retrofitting the current Oakley Street build-

ing for that use, however, was beyond what the County could reasonably direct towards the project.

To bring the vision at Oakley Street to fruition, the County is pursuing a grant through the State's Homeless Housing and Assistance Program (HHAP) for up to \$15 million, which provides capital grants and loans to municipalities and public corporations, not-for-profit corporations, charitable and religious organizations to acquire, construct or rehabilitate housing for persons who are homeless and are unable to secure adequate housing without special assistance.

The State's HHAP application and review process will take place in the coming months, and Dutchess County expects to receive a decision on its application by the end of 2023. If approved, the County will use the grant to fund the capital costs associated with the Oakley Street project, with an anticipated opening date of the permanent shelter in Spring of 2026.

County Executive O'Neil said, "It has long been our vision to use the Oakley Street building as the cornerstone of Dutchess County's transformational approach to dealing with homelessness and its root causes. We've been steadfast in our vision and creative in resolving the unforeseen challenges we've overcome. This newest grant opportunity not only keeps that goal in sight, but it will help us achieve our mission of making our plan a reality. Dutchess County is eager to continue our progress to address the scourge of homelessness and help lift residents out of it, into a better life."

Dutchess County will continue to review other potential permanent locations, should its grant application not be approved. The County will also research and analyze a distributed shelter concept as suggested by the Community Stakeholder Committee and others for its validity, acceptability and affordability.

Keenly aware of the national housing shortage, as defined locally in the Dutchess County Housing Needs Assessment released 2022, the County, with the support of Assemblymember Didi Barrett, is exploring opportunities to transform the former site of the Hudson Valley Psychiatric Center into a transitional/affordable housing campus in alignment with Gov. Kathy Hochul's announced executive action to review state-owned sites to create and increase the supply of affordable housing and promote broader housing growth. The County Executive has forwarded a letter to the Governor, explaining how the former Hudson Valley Psychiatric Center offers the location, space and opportunity to build such a campus and calls on the State's support of such a transformative project.

"Housing is one of the most critical needs facing our community and our nation. Dutchess County is working to tackle these challenges across the spectrum, from emergency shelter to transitional and permanent housing. It is an ongoing process and we are demonstrating bold leadership in addressing this difficult problem," said O'Neil.





## Summer wildflowers at Buttercup

Spring isn't the only time to check out native wildflowers

When the first wildflowers of early spring start to poke through the snow – trout lily, Dutchman's breeches, columbine – we feel a surge of hope for the new year in store (no, that mawkish intro was not written by GPT). By the time summer arrives, and our dreams have all been dashed against the rocks of time, wildflowers are not so much on the radar.

But wait – a summer wildflower walk at the Buttercup Farm Audubon Sanctuary gave me a new lease on life. At 6:30 p.m. last Friday evening, a group of nature lovers, led by Dave Decker, gathered at the entrance to the 641-acre Buttercup Sanctuary in Stanfordville. Dave is a “land steward” who manages four Audubon sanctuaries in eastern New York. Audubon is a non-profit conservation organization named after the self-trained artist John James Audubon (1875–1851), who painted 700 bird species in his famous book “The Birds of America.”

So Dave is an expert on local birds, but also knows a ton about ecology, insects, grasslands, and wildflowers. On our two-hour, mile-long trek, we identified 25 species of flowers, not all native. Many of our most common wildflowers are feral – living in the wild but not native – for example, red clover, ox-eye daisy and Queen Anne’s lace. Among the native wildflowers:

- **Daisy Fleabane** – This looks like a miniature ox-eye daisy with lots of flowers on each stem. It’s an important source of nectar for native carpenter bees.

- **Jewelweed** – We encountered the yellow

“pale jewelweed,” as well as the common orange variety. Jewelweed is a wild relative of impatiens, colonizing stream banks, in our case, along the edges of Wappingers Creek, which runs through the sanctuary.

- **Goldenrod** – The 120 different species of goldenrod bloom in the fall, so we were just noticing the Canada goldenrod (which Dave told us is not native to Canada). More than 100 species of butterflies and moths use goldenrod as a larval host plant, as well as a source of nectar and pollen. Watch for the little crab spider, nestled in the flower, waiting for its prey.

- **Fringed Loosestrife** – This increasingly threatened flower is host to the native oil bee, which will itself die off if the fringed loosestrife fails to thrive. This is an example of the mission the Audubon Society is carrying out. We need the biodiversity that these protected areas provide.

- **Purple Loosestrife** – Famously not native and invasive. A few years ago, it was feared that purple loosestrife would crowd out native wetland flora like cattails. Recently, two species of beetles have been introduced which feed on loosestrife, eliminating huge stands of these invasives. Some beekeepers are up in arms as the beetles invade the purple loosestrife in their apiaries, since it is an important autumn nectar source for honeybees.

- **New York Aster** – This fall-blooming native aster is just starting to show its blue color. It’s a tall plant, often falling over in the rain. Plant breeders have developed shorter

varieties, better for home gardens. These would be classified as “nativars.”

- **Milkweed** – The terminus of our one-mile hike found us in a 100-acre meadow. The meadow is mowed every two or three years to keep it from growing up to forest. This meadow is a critical element of the sanctuaries biodiversity, as it harbors a number of ground-nesting birds like the bobolink, which I had never seen before. Milkweed is common here – famous as the host plant of the monarch butterfly caterpillar, as well as the milkweed tussock caterpillar. These insects become disagreeable to birds after they drink the milkweed sap.

On our walk, we were joined by Brian

Straniti, Outreach and Engagement Manager for the Dutchess Land Conservatory, who organized the tour. D.L.C. has helped to conserve more than 400 properties in the Hudson Valley through easements and deed restrictions. Check the events page on their website for the next wildflower walk. Or you can organize your own. The Buttercup Sanctuary is open dawn to dusk every day. The entrance is on Stissing Road in Stanfordville. Bring mosquito repellent.






