History of Lafayette in Fishkill to be highlighted during August 27 ceremony in Fishkill

Marquis De Lafayette, a hero in both the American and French revolutions, will be celebrated at Rombout Rural Cemetery in the Town of Fishkill on August 27 at 11 a.m. French Deputy Consul General Damien Laban will be the keynote speaker at the event. He will tell how Lafayette was influential in the revolutions that took place in America and then later France.

"I'm looking forward to attending and presenting the history of Fishkill," said Fishkill Town Supervisor Ozzy Albra.

Arnold Restivo is the historian for the Town of Fishkill.

"He was an audacious hero of two revolutions," said Restivo.

Lafayette led the Continental Army to victory in 1781 in Yorktown, Virginia. The battle ended the American Revolution.

Lafayette fought for liberty, said Restivo.

Lafayette, who became an orphan in his early teens, "built strong friendships with Thomas Jefferson and Alexander Hamilton," as well as George Washington, noted Restivo.

The monument at Rombout Rural Cemetery in part states: "IN HONOR OF MAJ.GENL. THE MARQUIS DE LA-FAYETTE WHO WAS ILL MANY WEEKS IN THE BRINCKERHOFF HOUSE ADJOINING DURING THE

AMERICAN REVOLUTION." The stone was given by a Lafayette Post to the Melzingah Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution (D.A.R.) in May of 1899.

Fishkill Councilman Carmine Istvan,

who is the CEO of Eastern View Landscaping, has donated funds and man-hours to clean up the trees and area near the monument, along with members of D.A.R. and Rombout Rural Cemetery. The hope is to draw more attention the

history in that area, which includes the Brinckerhoff Inn, statue of Sachem Daniel Nimham and the Fishkill Tea Party.

"I'm excited to give back," said Istvan. "My family, on my father's side, has been here for many years."

Istvan said, "I hope the event will bring light on Lafayette and what he did and the history of the monument, which is there to make sure" people do not forget.

Albra and Istvan both noted that they hope the event is a way for the area residents to prepare for the 250th anniversary of the United States in 2026 and to highlight Fishkill's history. Albra mentioned that it was just over one-year ago that the award-winning statue of Sachem Nimham was dedicated.

Lafayette traveled back to his native France, where he assisted with the French Revolution. He is said to have helped inspire the revolution with the writing of the Declaration of the Rights of Man and the Citizen. Author of America's Declaration of Independence, Thomas Jefferson, is said to have assisted Lafayette with the French document.

The event will take place at Rombout Rural Cemetery, at the intersection of Route 52 and Route 82, in Fishkill at the Lafayette Monument. Those who attend are asked by organizers to park in the Ocean State Job Lot parking lot and walk to the monument.



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

Safety over partnership is needed in NYS Senate

To the Editor:

As a parent and community member, public safety is personal to me. I want to know that the streets my kids walk on are protected, and that our neighborhood is secure. I understand that the surest way to reduce crime is by investing in proactive measures that target the source and stop illegal activity before it can even start. That means getting guns off of our streets and out of the wrong hands, promoting school safety and cracking down on illicit markets and drug trafficking. It also includes taking steps to end hate crimes once and for all, and giving law enforcement the tools they need to do their jobs.

The New York State Senate Democrats have advanced measures that address all of these issues. Yet our State Senator, Rob Rolison, has voted against each one of them. He rejected millions of dollars in the State Budget for evidence-based gun violence reduction programs and funding to prevent hate crimes. He voted against a bill that would allow cops to seize firearms during domestic violence calls, and even turned his back on measures that would crack down on illegal pot shops. Rob Rolison claims to stand for law and order, but his voting record proves otherwise. Hudson Valley families deserve a Senator who puts safety above partisanship, and doesn't play politics with our lives. We can't afford Rob Rolison's reckless votes in Albany.

Forman letter to Central Hudson regarding proposed rate increases

To the Editor:

Central Hudson's proposed 16% rate hike for 2024 is outrageous and as an elected representative for the Town of Fishkill, I cannot endorse such a measure.

Southern Dutchess County has been especially hard hit by inflation and the rising cost of housing. For the New York State Public Service Commission to allow such a dramatic increase at this time, would be a crushing blow to residents of our town. This, coupled with Central Hudson's faulty billing practices over the past couple of years, could destroy the livelihood of many families here. I urge you not to allow this to happen.

During this difficult time, in the face of economic uncertainty, I request that the commission review Central Hudson's rate case and take into account the well-being of the residents of Fishkill. Appropriate utility rates are vital to safeguarding the interests of our community and we simply cannot afford such a rate increase.

If you require further information, please do not hesitate to contact me. I appreciate your attention to this matter and trust that you will give due consideration to the concerns from the residents of Fishkill.

Continental Commons: The truth has finally come out

To the Editor:

The Friends of the Fishkill Supply Depot, who claimed Continental Commons was the Largest American Revolutionary War Soldiers' Cemetery, have acknowledged the property was not the site of a mass burial nor did they identify soldiers buried there.

After the soldiers' cemetery allegations were made, which are now known to be false, the group received charitable contributions and government grants as well as filed litigation against the Town of Fishkill to stop Continental Commons.

In a statement to the Fishkill Town Board last week, the group's president acknowledged that archaeological studies have not identified a soldiers' cemetery nor remnants from the military complex. Finally, the facts of this fight as provided by the most ardent opponents have proved that what I have been saying from the beginning is in fact the truth.

Since the Continental Commons project was proposed in 2015:

- The New York State Historic Preservation Office concluded that the Continental Commons property has been extensively studied and disturbed over many years, and its archeological information has in all probability been exhausted.
- A four-year State Environmental Quality Review, which included analysis by state, county and local archeologists, planners and engineers determined that the project would not adversely impact history nor environment.
- The New York Supreme Court denied a Friends of the Fishkill Supply Depot's lawsuit, and concluded their concerns such as archeological and environmental impacts, inconsistency with the Town's comprehensive plan, and Planning Board bias were without merit.
- The New York Supreme Court blasted the 2019 Fishkill Town Board for ignoring facts included in engineering studies when it wrongly denied Continental Commons sewer and water.

As always, I am committed to developing the 18th century colonial village of restaurants, shops, an inn, visitor's center, and a living revolutionary war museum.

Rolison applauds Hochul for signing Save the Hudson Bill

State Senator Rob Rolison (R-39th District) issued the following statement on August 18 after Governor Kathy Hochul signed S. 6893, also known as the "Save the Hudson" bill, into law. Rolison co-sponsored the legislation which unanimously passed the Senate in June.

"Today is a victory for the more than 100,000 people who derive their drinking water from the Hudson and the countless oth-

ers who use the river as a resource for recreation and outdoor activities. This was the right move by Governor Hochul. Not only does the law prohibit the scheduled radioactive-water discharge in late September or early October, it also protects our river town residents from future harm associated with possible contamination. Bipartisan common sense and evidence-based conservation won today," said Rolison.

What makes something historic?

Lou Hobson and the historic family business

How do you know if a building is historic? Or the actions of persons and families?

There is an easy answer in the form of a question: "Is it worth remembering?" Are there stories, lessons and insights that perhaps reflect a particular common, classic feature of the period that is of interest? Can we learn something to aspire to, or avoid? Connecting a point in the past with the present can give an indication of a future trajectory.

This is a particularly good question as the Dutchess County Historical Society moves for the first time in 50 years from the 1765 stone house built by Udney Hay in Poughkeepsie into a building built for a business in the 1950s by George Louis (known as "Lou") Hobson.

The power of local history was best described at a DCHS membership meeting in 1927 at Amenia's Troutbeck when Lewis Mumford said, "Because local history is relatively accessible and immediate, because it deals with the concrete and the commonplace, it is necessary to vitalize the teaching of general history. The things that we can see and touch are those that awaken our imagination."

Hobson family memories

Here's why we think the story of Lou and Beatrice (Jacoby) Hobson, and the building that housed the family business for over a half century a mile south of Rhinebeck Village center, is a story worth remembering.

We are just a few years away from the 100th anniversary of Lou Hobson joining the Navy in 1926. From that point, you can trace a trajectory of his taking those skills,

combined with good business sense, and the determination of he and his wife to have a close-knit family at home and in business, that resulted in three generations of successful local businesspersons.

Lou Hobson was born in Hyde Park in 1909 and grew up in a farming family. His father was the son of English and Irish immigrants. His mother was a Stoutenburgh, the earliest settlers of thousands of acres of land south of Crum Elbow Creek.

Too young to be involved in World War One, Lou joined the Navy in 1926 for what turned out to be seven years of service, during which time he became a radio specialist on US warships, like the USS Arkansas and USS Pittsburgh.

The 1930 census took note of which households had a radio, and Lou Hobson's widowed father was among the roughly one third of local households that did not yet have a radio. But that would soon change when Lou returned from the Navy in 1933.

Upon leaving the service in 1933, Lou attended Coyne Electrical School in Chicago. He returned to Rhinebeck at a time when most rural, local farms did not yet have electricity. He started a radio repair business out of a shed.

It was 1936 when Lou and Beatrice were married and wanted to start a family in Rhinebeck. They found themselves in the middle of a global economic depression, and did not know it at the time, but were just a few years away from World War Two. That is a tough environment in which to start a family.

The radio business was successful, and Lou then moved first to locations on East

Market Street, then just south of the ultimate site, before purchasing a large lot in a location he thought would see a good deal of business growth that ended up materializing north of the village.

He was obviously skilled because in World War II the family moved to New Jersey for several years so that Lou could work for the Navy as a civilian.

Lou and Beatrice had five sons: Donald W., James D. Gary W., and Glenn S. Hobson, and two daughters: Judith Grimes and Phyllis Heywood. Donald Hobson passed away in 2020 at the age of 83. All five sons worked in the business as salesmen and repairmen until 2013 when all but Dale retired. He continues with his own business, Hobson Appliance Service, LLC. Glenn's son Steven Hobson owns and operates Hobsons Window, Inc. in Red Hook.

Reflecting their orientation to new and emerging technology, the Hobson store phone number in the 1940s was a spoken request to an operator for "Rhinebeck 1." This evolved to the spoken "TRinity 6-3102" in the 1950s. Still used at Hobson

Appliance Service today, the addition of an area code and the conversion of "TR6" to "876" gives us the more familiar 845-867-3102.

This is the story of the parallel growth of a family and business that continues today. Starting during a global economic depression, and interrupted by war, each generation embraced what at the time was a radical, emerging technology. In the 1930s the fact that someone got a radio was worthy of a newspaper notice!

Today, our "rural broadband" programs echo the "rural electrification" programs of a century ago. Today, we install solar panels to generate electricity locally the way "Delco-Light" power packs (gasoline powered generators) were installed a century ago.

What will be the equivalent in a century?

Keenan's unselfish approach provides role model for team

As the high school football season begins, it is the fourth season for the return of head coach Sean Keenan to his alma mater, Our Lady of Lourdes.

It is also the third anniversary of Keenan doing something highly improbable and certainly unselfish.

He donated one of his kidneys to a man he never met before.

The man, Emiliano Guerriero, owns a pizzeria in Poughkeepsie. He is the brother of one of Keenan's former teaching colleagues at Gayhead Elementary School in East Fishkill. When Keenan heard about his flight and heard that he was one of nearly 100,000 people on the waiting list across the country, he did sixth months worth of testing to determine if he was a match.

He was a perfect match.

"It was the right thing to do," he said. "That's how we were raised."

Neither man has had any complications from the surgery and Keenan actually prefers to talk about his team and football. Remember, this is the same man who actually stopped practice one day and took his entire Millbrook football team

and loaded them onto busses to a short ride for a September 11th memorial

The unselfishness, and the concept of relying on your fellow man, spills down to his team.

"He leads by example," says longtime friend and assistant coach Jim Fedigan, "however unspoken it might be."

Keenan and Fedigan were teammates at both Our Lady of Lourdes and Marist College going back more than 40 years now. They are more like brothers, even though Keenan has three actual blood brothers.

Fedigan knew about the kidney donation long before anybody else did. In fact, word only leaked after Keenan came home from the hospital.

"It didn't surprise me," Fedigan said. "Nothing he does ever faces me."

As the new season dawns, Keenan will be going after his fourth sectional championship. He won a pair of Section 9, Class C championships in his 15 years as the head coach at Millbrook. He won a Section 9, Class A championship last year with OLL, stunning multi-time state champion Cornwall in the process.

'Phase Two' renovations begin at Heritage Financial Park

The evolution of Heritage Financial Park, formerly Dutchess Stadium, home of the Hudson Valley Renegades, continues.

What the team is calling "Phase Two" of the major renovations to the facility, as per the Collective Bargaining Agreement with Major League Baseball, is underway.

The construction, notably a new clubhouse down the left field line and an events facility, is being funded by Dutchess County Government, the Renegades, and franchise owner Diamond Baseball Holding. The events facility can be rented out.

All construction is slated to be completed by opening day of April, 2024.

The goal is to turn the stadium into a multi-use venue for the Hudson Valley.

"The best way to describe this project is dynamic. The project will deliver player and staff accommodations along with expanding the experience that we are able to provide our fans on gameday, and it will grant us the opportunity to be open and welcoming to the communities we serve for 12 months a year," said Tyson Jeffers, General Manager of the Renegades, in a statement. "This project solidifies our goal of making Heritage Financial Park the premier sports and entertainment venue in the Hudson Valley."

Dutchess County Executive William F.X. O'Neil said, "For nearly three decades, Heritage Financial Park (formerly Dutchess Stadium from 1994 to 2023) has provided countless local families with wholesome entertainment and long-cherished memories. Even before the first pitch was ever thrown at the stadium, Dutchess County has invested in this gem of a County park to

enhance the fan experience. This latest project continues our commitment to residents and visitors alike who enjoy this park and will do so for decades to come."

The centerpiece of the player-facing aspect of the project is a new home clubhouse located on the ground level of the new building. The clubhouse exceeds Major League Baseball's requirements and will provide a valuable facility for the New York Yankees to develop their current and future stars in the Hudson Valley, including current Yankees star Carlos Rodon's rehab start at the Fishkill ballpark in July.

As part of the new construction, the Renegades will have a weight room and enclosed batting tunnels. The clubhouse will be outfitted with brand-new lockers and a player lounge. There will also be dedicated locker room spaces for all field staff and private accommodations for female staff.

With the home clubhouse being constructed in left field, the Renegades will shift to the third base dugout coinciding with the opening of the building in 2024. Players will enter the field through an

entrance tunnel into left field, near where the current visiting team bullpen is located. The visiting team will move into the right field clubhouse building, which currently houses just the Renegades.

The upper level of the new building will contain a new club level and event space which will be utilized both for games and events during the offseason.

For games, the Renegades will sell season-long memberships, group tickets, and a limited number of single-game tickets for the club. Inside, the club will feature a full-

service kitchen and bar, climate-controlled indoor seating with TVs.

It will serve as another source of revenue for the team. It will be able to accommodate 200 people. The new space will be able to be rented out for weddings, baby showers, bar and batman's fist and other private catering events.

In addition to the clubhouse and club level, the construction project is adding several new, unique seating options including a rooftop bar that can hold up to 300 people.

In total, the expansion is expected to increase the capacity of Heritage Financial Park by approximately 1,000 people. The facility currently seats about 5,000 fans.

Renegades, Cyclones locked in tight 2nd-half division race

Instead of coming home to start their penultimate regular season homestand, the Hudson Valley Renegades instead showed just how tight the race is in the North Division of the South Atlantic League.

Hudson Valley, the first half champion of the division, went on the road to play the likely

second-half champion in Brooklyn. The Renegades won the season series with a 7-1 win on Sunday, but there are only four games separating the two teams from the top spot in the division.

Hudson Valley opened the series 1

ast Tuesday with a 4-2 victory at Maimonides Park.

The Renegades took an early lead in the top of the second when Ben Cowles laced an opposite-field home run off Robert Colina to put Hudson Valley in front 1-0. It was Cowles' 10th homerun of the season, the first time in his career that he reached double digits in home runs in a season.

Baron Stuart worked around traffic on the bases and did not allow a run throughout the first five innings thanks to his defense turning two double plays behind him. Stuart (2-1) allowed no runs on six hits while walking four and striking out

one across 5.0-plus innings of work.

Hudson Valley added some insurance in the top of the sixth, when Anthony Hall led off with a double and scored on a two-run home run by Jesus Rodriguez. It was his first round-tripper with the Renegades and his seventh overall on the season. After Alexander Vargas and Antonio Gomez laced back-to-back singles to chase Colina (3-3) from the game, Joshua Cornielli allowed an RBI single to Cowles to grow the lead to 4-0.

Rodriguez is just one of many new faces who have been called up to the Renegades in roster moves in recent weeks.

On Wednesday, pitching was king again

for Hudson Valley in a 7-1 victory. Three different pitchers combined to throw a one hitter, the team's third of the season.

Thursday night brought a nail-biting 6-5 victory for the Renegades. Hudson Valley led from start to finish, including 5-0 at one point, before having to hang on for the win.

Brooklyn finally got on the winning side of the scoreboard with an 8-5 win on Friday night. A five-run bottom of the eighth inning turned the trick for the Cyclones.

On Saturday night, Hudson Valley jumped ahead 3-0 but lost 8-5. Christopher Familia had a two-run home run for the Renegades in the second inning.

Selling the new 'event space' and discussing roster moves

In your mind, what does the new facility with "Phase Two" and event space do for the franchise?

It's an impactful piece that's been missing. I mean, we've done a lot of transformative things to the ballpark this year. But yes, this can be a game-changer. I mean, to build a whole new structure? It's going to be a truly high-end experience for people on that club level.

You will now be competing with

other event and catering sources across the county and beyond.

Well, they will definitely have an advantage on us (laughs). That would be like us asking them to come in and operate a baseball game. There will be lots of lessons for us to learn. We have to get people to learn how to make the right decisions and to sell that space, because it is a different space. There will be overlooking a professional ballpark. Not too many people can offer that. That will be pretty cool on its own. And there are plenty of baseball fans out there who maybe want a baseball-themed event. We might be behind the curve in terms of experience and what these other facilities can do but

we definitely offer something different. So we'll try to use our unique niche in the market to sell that space.

Back to baseball. The team has had close to 40 roster moves this year. But that's not necessarily a higher number, is it?

Definitely not. Not at this level. It's really a testament to the Yankees who are willing to test their guys and move them around. I mean, Somerset (Class AA) won a championship last year and almost all of the guys were members of the Renegades. We've seen a couple of guys who came up from Tampa who are already gone. So like I've said in the past, we want them to have fun here but we also want them to move on.

Beephan, Rolison announce \$503,911 in State Aid for library construction in District 105

Pawling Free Library has been allocated \$151,377 in state library construction funds to construct a Children's wing to their building.

Beekman Library has been allocated \$167,215 in state library construction funds to create a multipurpose meeting room.

LaGrange Library Association has been allocated \$177,108 in state library construction funds to renovate a children's recreation area.

Mid-Hudson Library Association has been allocated \$8,211 in state library construction funds to install EV charging stations at their headquarters.

Beephan states, "Today, we celebrate a resounding victory for knowledge, community, and progress. The allocation of over \$500,000 in state grants to our local libraries amplifies our dedication to fostering spaces of growth and exploration. These funds will renovate buildings and transform lives, providing avenues for learning, collaboration, and imagination. Our libraries stand as pillars of opportunity, and this investment ensures they remain beacons of enlightenment for all." "Libraries are repositories of eternal

knowledge. I am pleased to announce this critical state funding providing our Dutchess County libraries with the resources they need to continue their mission of literacy and community outreach. By supporting community libraries we invest in the next generation of educated readers and, therefore, well-rounded citizens," said Rolison

The funds are from \$34 million in capital funds for public library construction and broadband infrastructure projects provided in the FY2022-2023 State Budget.

A recent survey showed a documented need for public library construction and renovation projects totaling more than \$1.5 billion. Many of New York's local public libraries are unable to accommodate users with disabilities, are energy inefficient, and cannot provide Internet and computer, and other electronic technologies to users because of outdated and inadequate electrical wiring. Many need more space to house the library's expanding collection, address the need for adequate meeting rooms, or provide public computer access.

Project activities and expenditures eligible for funding from the State Aid for Library Construction Program include financing the construction of new library buildings, construction of additions to existing buildings, and the renovation and rehabilitation of living space. Projects may include roof replacement, purchase and installation of alternative energy resources, new HVAC systems, windows, doors, light-

ing systems, electrical upgrades, EV charging stations, standby generators, and construction of new or replacement parking lots. Broadband infrastructure projects are also eligible. New furniture, shelving, and computer equipment may be purchased for newly reconfig-

ured or renovated space. Renovations designed to provide accessibility for patrons with disabilities are a high priority.

In the FY2023-2024 State Budget, the Legislature provided \$34 million for projects announced in the Summer of 2024.

His actions "were critical" in saving the life," read Wrye.

The Town Board wants recognize employees who go above and beyond for the residents of the town of Fishkill, it was stated.

Councilman John Forman read the proclamation for Officer Anderson.

Councilwoman Louise Daniele read the proclamation that was given to four EMTs.

According to a release from the Department about the incident, "Upon arrival, officers quickly assessed the scene and attempted to clear the airway obstruction, but their efforts were unsuccessful. Observing the victim had become unresponsive, they checked her pulse and found no heartbeat. They immediately initiated CPR with attached defibrillator in an effort to maintain life support until EMS could arrive to assist."

Mobile Life Support Services EMTs arrived on the scene and cleared the obstruction from the victim's airway, said officials. She was able to breathe again on her own after the obstruction was cleared. She was then transported to a local hospital's emergency room, according to officials.

On the Fishkill Police Department Facebook page, in the release, it states:

"Exemplary work by all involved and a perfect example of what can be achieved through partnership with our local first responders."

Albra read a proclamation for Honorable Robert Rahemba who has served the Town of Fishkill and in public service for more than 20 years. His resignation took effect on August 1.

Pop: Oh, come on. Ima an olda man!

Luigi: They said a black beat-up Mercedes raced off with a grocery bag full of money.

Pop: Youa crazy.

Luigi: Yeah? How do you explain this picture then!

Pop: Holy crap! Howa dida you getta that picture.

Luigi: It was sent to me, Pop.

Pop: I wasa at the store, but I no steal anything.

Luigi: Yeah? Well now I've got to explain everything to the police. Why did you park at the curb, Pop?

Pop: I no Parka at the curb. "Peter" hea helps me.

Luigi: Peter?!

Pop: Yeah hea does the carts ata the store.

Luigi: Geez Pop, you have everyone do stuff for you.

Pop: Yeah, he evena helped me doa the shopping. Thena he puts the groceries for the car and helps me in.

Luigi: Man, Pop ... (laughing) You're good.

Pop: Youa makea the joke with me?

Luigi: Yeah, Pop. Nick sent me the picture.

Pop: You sonamagun. You had mea scared.

Luigi: Sorry, Pop. You've gotten me plenty of time. This one was my turn.

Pop: I wasa gonna makea you the wild mushrooms, now forget it. Youa getta nothing.

Shame was, those mushrooms were so good. I was only able to steal a quick bite before he took them away. Oh, well, a good joke is always worth it.

1/2 teaspoon dried red pepper flakes
3 ounces shaved Parmigiano-Reggiano
1 tablespoon minced onions

Directions

Cook the pasta in salted water and boil for 5-6 minutes for al-dente.

While the pasta is cooking, heat the pine nuts in a dry 10-inch skillet over medium heat. Toast the pine nuts, shaking and stirring frequently, until golden brown (about 5 to 7 minutes). Transfer the pine nuts to a small bowl and set aside.

Return the skillet to the stove and adjust the heat to medium-high. Melt the butter in the pan, then add the mushrooms, garlic and minced onions and sauté for 3 to 5 minutes, until browned.

Drain the pasta, making sure you leave the pasta generously wet and add it to the skillet. Toss well and season with extra virgin olive oil, black pepper and red pepper flakes. Transfer to a serving dish and garnish with the toasted pine nuts, and shaved Parmigiana-Reggiano

Serve at once. With a loaf of crusty Italian bread and nice Chianti

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



'The Magic of Castles' photographs by Linda Hubbard at Bannerman Island Gallery



The Bannerman Island Gallery located at 150 Main Street in Beacon, NY is pleased to present a new exhibition "The Magic of Castles" featuring spectacular photographs by Linda T Hubbard, from Saturday, September 9th – Sunday, November 5th. A public artist reception will be held on September 9, from 4-6 p.m. Come take a walk via photographs of castles, some ruins, some beautifully restored - but all holding secrets of a long-ago life.

Throughout her travels and through her lens, professional photographer Linda Hubbard has searched out castles: from the British Isles of England, Scotland, Ireland and Wales; to the European Countries of France, Portugal, Greece and Italy; to the shores of the Hudson River. Each castle has its own history, some built high on a cliff or an island, some with only a few walls remaining - and some beautifully restored with wandering gardens. The artist states "Whether looking up at a castle tower and walking down worn stone steps, I always wonder who built them and how, who has

lived here and what is their story? There is a certain magic about the old stone walls that continue to whisper to me."

Hubbard's love of photography started at an early age with a brownie camera, but it was not until after retirement from IBM that she had the time to devote to her camera and love of photography. Her second love is helping other artists. She is a former President of BeaconArts, Chair of Art Along the Hudson and co-owner of RiverWinds Gallery in Beacon.
