Annual event set for September 23

Clear one's calendar for this year's East Fishkill Community Day. The annual event is set for September 23. A parade kicks off the event at 2 p.m. from Trinka Lane, down to Main St. to Church St. The rain date is September 24.

"There will be some new entertainment this year - a clown, magician and 'a bigger car show,'" said Bill Green, the

recreation director for East Fishkill.

At Hopewell Recreation Park, 392 Route 376, in East Fishkill, there will be live music, plus vendors, food, animals and fireworks.

Green said, "3,000-5,000 usually attend, with the biggest crowd around fireworks time 7:30 p.m."

The band Sugarush will perform.

"The crowd young and old can expect

Sugarush to cover the Top 40 dance hits from the 1970s, '80s, '90s, and today. Sugarush plays an amazing mix of classic and adult contemporary rock and dance - perfect for all ages. Sugarush plays the songs you know and love that make you want to crank up the volume, dance and sing along," said band member Kenny Chiocchi.

Playoff time! Renegades face Jersey Shore

The Hudson Valley Renegades finally have an opponent for the playoffs that start this week. It will be Jersey Shore.

Hudson Valley lost to Jersey Shore on Sunday, 10-9. Coupled with Brooklyn's loss on Sunday, Jersey Shore wins the second half North Division title in the South Atlantic League and hosted the Renegades in Game One of the best-of-three divisional series on Tuesday night.

Game Two, and Game Three if necessary, will be at Heritage Financial Park on Thursday and Friday.

It came right down to the bitter end as Hudson Valley lost four of six games to Jersey Shore, including a split of a doubleheader on Saturday that was necessitated by a rainout on Friday.

The BlueClaws jumped in front early after a pair of errors in the first inning scored Gabriel Rincones against pitcher Brock Selvidge. In the second, Otto Kemp singled and stole second to start the frame. Caleb Ricketts then singled and Erick Brito hit a sacrifice fly to center to score Kemp and double the Jersey Shore lead to 2-0.

Hudson Valley rallied back, scoring a run in the second on a Jared Wegner RBI single that scored Ben Cowles. Hudson Valley tied the game at two on a run-scoring single from Cole Gabrielson in the bottom of the fourth.

The Renegades took their first lead of the contest in the fifth inning against Cam Wynne. After Wynne retired the first two hitters of the frame, Cowles and Antonio Gomez collected back-to-back two-out singles to bring up Spencer Henson, who doubled both runners home to give the Renegades a 4-2 lead.

Jersey Shore responded with a five-run top of the sixth to retake a 7-4 lead. Selvidge started the inning and yielded a pair of doubles to Leandro Pineda and Otto Kemp before Shane Gray entered out of the bullpen. With Jersey Shore now trailing just 4-3, a single to centerfield from Erick Brito scored Kemp and tied the game at four. An error, a wild pitch, and an RBI single from Rincones polished off the scoring in the frame.





What is going on in the Village of Fishkill?

To the Editor:

I was dismayed to learn that the Village of Fishkill planning board was considering such a large complex in the center of the Village. What are these officials thinking to even consider this size and scope of development with scarcely a word to existing tax-paying residents?

I love the Village. We've lived here for almost 20 years and chose to live in the Village of Fishkill specifically to raise a family in a small, safe, walkable community. I do not agree with permitting a 56-unit apartment complex with office and storage buildings and 105 parking spots on the corner of one of the busiest intersections of our community. As it is, the traffic is at such an absurd volume you cannot turn onto Main Street without the aid of a traffic light, not to mention the motorists who don't care about our pedestrians and neighbors. The current situation is such that the Village has had to put in flashing crosswalk signs and even these get ignored as hundreds and possibly thousands of cars shove daily through our small downtown. Imagine what Main Street will look like after filling up these apartments with families and their multiple cars. I live on a one-way street; getting to and from work or picking my kids up will become nearly impossible.

The height and size of this construction and laughable amount of parking with an additional "buffer reduction" are all beyond the current regulations. The Planning Board does not have to permit that buffer reduction, nor the 38.5' high building design. They have every right, and in fact have a responsibility, to the existing residents (many of us with longevity that makes my two decades look paltry) to deny these variances and scale this project back to fit within the existing codes.

I WILL be going to voice my concerns at the Public Hearing at Fishkill Village Hall on September 21 at 6 p.m., and I hope other common-sense neighbors join me.

Suicide prevention: Reach out and learn how to help

To the Editor:

September is National Suicide Prevention Month, so this is a good time to reflect on the depth of the problem as well as ways to help. In recent years, suicide rates have reached an all-time high, with a death by suicide occurring every 11 minutes. Suicide is mostly linked to depression which affects an estimated one in 15 adults in any given year. Suicidal thoughts can affect anyone regardless of age, gender, or background – one in six people will experience depression at some time in their life. Fortunately, suicidality and depression are treatable, and people can get better. In fact, statistics show that people who survive a suicide attempt usually don't try again. There are also very effective treatments for depression including medication and therapy, though medication and therapy together are most effective.

But what should you do if you feel a family member or loved one is at risk? Familiarize yourself with the warning signs of suicidal thoughts, including extreme mood swings, withdrawal from activities that previously brought the individual joy, isolation from friends and family, and sleeping too much or too little. Many people who may be struggling with thoughts of suicide do not seek help, so listening to them and helping them get connected to support, treatment, and crisis hotlines is important.

People tend to feel less depressed and anxious when they know there is someone who will listen to them without judgment and be present. If you continue to have concerns, no matter how small, do not take chances. Reach out to us at Coordinated Behavioral Health Services (CBHS); we have treatment providers throughout the Hudson Valley region who can help. You can also call or share 988 for the Suicide & Crisis Hotline. Do not hesitate to find help for yourself or someone you care about. There is hope and people who can help!

Jasson Dominguez, who briefly played with the Hudson Valley Renegades last year, made his Major League debut with the New York Yankees this month and even homered off three-time Cy Young winner Justin Verlander in his first big league at-bat.

But on Sunday the 20-year-old, nicknamed the Martian because of his rapid rise through the Yankees' system, was diagnosed with a torn ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow that will require surgery, ending his 2023 season and likely costing him the first half of 2024.

"It's definitely very shocking news,"

Domínguez said through an interpreter. "You're never expecting for this to be the result. Now understanding what happened, we have to look forward and go through it."

Domínguez, who was signed by the Yankees in 2016 for \$5.1 million and has had a highly anticipated career, hit his second career home run last week. The Dominican Republic native was just 16 when he was signed to his first contract.

He appeared in 40 games for Hudson Valley last year before being promoted to Double-A and then played in just nine games at Triple-A before being called up to the "bigs" by the Yankees.

After a pair of RBI singles from Gomez and Jesus Rodriguez in the sixth trimmed the deficit to 7-6, Henson and Kyle Battle clubbed a pair of solo home runs in the seventh off Carlos Betancourt to hand the lead back to Hudson Valley at 8-7. The home run by Henson was his 24th career as a Renegade, passing Everson Pereira and Grant Richardson for the most home runs in franchise history.

The Renegades stretched their advantage to 9-7 in the eighth after a wild pitch from Jason Ruffcorn (4-1) scored Gomez. Osiel Rodriguez tossed a scoreless eighth and came back out for the ninth. Pineda and Kemp notched a pair of one-out singles, before a two-out throwing error by Jesus Rodriguez scored both runners to tie the game at nine.

After neither side scored in the 10th inning, position player Juan Crisp (0-1) entered out of the bullpen for the top of the 11th. A flyball from Felix Reyes advanced Rincones, the automatic

runner, to third base, and Kemp brought in the go-ahead run with a sacrifice fly to make it 10-9. Gabriel Cotto tossed a scoreless bottom half of the frame to secure the victory for Jersey Shore.

In the doubleheader on Saturday, Hudson Valley split. In Game One, Jersey Shore had the early chance to strike first. Cam Schlittler retired the first two batters of the third inning before Justin Crawford and Bryan Rincon hit back-to-back singles. After Gabriel Rincones was hit by a pitch to load the bases, Leandro Pineda struck out swinging to end the inning and keep the game scoreless. Hudson Valley

had an attempt to score the game's first run in the bottom half of the frame. Marcos Cabrera reached on an error and Kyle Battle walked to place two runners on base with one out. However, Mitch Neunborn struck out Jared Serna and Alexander Vargas to end the inning.

The Renegades broke through in the fourth inning against Neunborn (3-4). Antonio Gomez and Jared Wegner worked a pair of walks before Cole Gabrielson singled to left field to load the bases with two outs. Cabrera hit an infield single to score Gomez and give the Renegades a 1-0 lead. After Spencer Henson led off the sixth inning with a single, he advanced to second on a wild pitch from Matt Russell and later scored from second base on an infield single from Gabrielson to extend the Renegades lead to 2-0.

That's the way the game ended and Hudson Valley dropped the nightcap, 8-5.

On Tuesday, Hudson Valley opened the critical series by coming out swinging in a 13-0 victory. Brock Selvidge and Clay Aguilar combined on a four-hit shutout. The Renegades opened up the scoring with a three-run bottom of the first inning against Gabriel Cotto. After a one-out double by Jared Serna and a walk to Jesus Rodriguez, Antonio Gomez doubled home both runners to give the Renegades a 2-0 lead. The next batter, Alexander Vargas, then lashed a double down the left field line to score Gomez and extend the Renegades' lead to 3-0 and that was all the team needed.

Jersey Shore won the next two games, 2-0 and 6-1, prior to Friday night's rain out.

Hampton named Top Pitching Prospect in South Atlantic League

Pitcher Chase Hampton of the Hudson Valley Renegades has been named the Top Pitching Prospect in the South Atlantic League in 2023 in Baseball America's annual Best Tools Survey. Joining him in recognition in the survey were pitcher Drew Thorpe and infielder Jared Serna.

Hampton becomes the first Renegade to be named a league's top pitching prospect since two-way player Brendan McKay was named the New York-Penn League Top Prospect in 2017.

Hampton began the season with the Renegades and posted a 2-1 record with a 2.68 ERA and 77 strikeouts in 47.0 innings pitched across nine games before he was promoted to Double-A Somerset. Hampton struck out an incredible 40.5 percent of the batters he faced with the Renegades while limiting opponents to a .179 batting average.

A sixth-round pick in the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of Texas Tech, Hampton is ranked as the No. 2 prospect and top pitching prospect in the Yankees organization by Baseball America, and No. 53 overall in baseball.

Thorpe was tabbed as having the Best Changeup and Best Control of all pitchers in the SAL. His record-setting season with the Renegades includes setting the team's single-season wins record (10), single-game strikeout record (13) and single-season strikeout record (138). A second-round pick in the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of Cal Poly, BA ranks Thorpe as the No. 10 prospect in the Yankees system, and No. 100 overall in baseball.

A newer member of the Renegades, Serna was tabbed as the Best Defensive Second Baseman and Most Exciting Player in the Florida State League for his efforts with the Single-A Tampa Tarpons.

Are you able to gauge the excitement for the playoffs?


I think now that it's under a week and it's only days away that it's much more palpable. People are realizing that there are a couple of playoff games here.

Joe is also survived by his longtime partner, Amara Kea, along with her daughter, McKenna.


Joe was predeceased by his grandparents on both the Bitil and McDonough sides; and his cousin, Barbara Cardaropoli.

Best of both worlds

Take advantage of September's transitional nature with local produce that blends freshness and comfort.

September is a great month and I don't think it gets enough love. It kind of has it all: still some warm, balmy summer weather and, if we're lucky, some chillier fall days and cooler nights, too. That means we can not only keep grilling and dining al fresco but can also dust off some of our favorite comfort foods, the best of both worlds in my opinion.

It's a transitional time with lots of local produce still to be found at farmers' markets and orchard branches are laden with apples, pears and late peaches. You can still find some of summer's vegetables, like melons, zucchini, basil, eggplant, peppers and green tomatoes. Cool weather vegetables are also making the scene: broccoli, Brussels sprouts, squash, beets, cauliflower, onions, radishes, turnips, grapes, garlic and Swiss chard to name a few. And when else could you make fresh peach, rhubarb and apple pies all at the same time, like I'm about to do, with just-picked rhubarb from my mother's garden, peaches from a friend's tree and apples from my own front yard!?

Unless you're hosting a party, three pies at once is a lot, so instead I give you three recipes that use some of this transitional local produce in other ways, both savory

and sweet.

BRUSSELS SPROUTS with SAUTEED APPLES

When it comes to local apples available this time of year, opt for those best suited for cooking without extra sweetness like Cortland, Golden Delicious and Empire. I used Fuji because my apple tree produced VERY well this year and I had to come up with creative uses for all that bounty.

INGREDIENTS

2 1/2 lbs Brussels sprouts
Salt and pepper to taste
1/4 cup butter, divided
1 medium onion, diced
1/4 cup apple juice
1-2 apples, depending on their size, cored and diced
1 clove garlic, minced
1 teaspoon brown sugar
1/2 cup walnuts or pecans, chopped
2 teaspoons lemon zest
1/8 teaspoon nutmeg

METHOD

Place Brussels sprouts and a little salt in a large saucepan and add enough water to cover. Bring to a boil, cover and reduce

heat. Simmer until tender, 5-10 minutes. Drain and keep warm.

In a large skillet, melt 2 tablespoons of the butter over medium heat. Add onion and sauté until caramelized, 15-20 minutes. Add apple juice and cook another 2 minutes, scraping up any browned bits.

Add apple, garlic and brown sugar and cook, stirring often, until apple is tender, about 5 minutes. Add nuts, lemon zest, nutmeg, remaining 2 tablespoons butter and salt and pepper to taste. Continue to cook 4 minutes more, stirring constantly, before gently tossing in Brussels sprouts.

Serves 8

RUSTIC RATATOUILLE

Truly, I LOVE this dish! I urge you to not overcook the vegetables – they should maintain a slight pleasing crunch and their jewel-like color, which also ensures they retain many of their nutrients. Make this using the freshest vegetables and heirloom tomatoes when available for the best flavor. Traditionally this calls for herbs de Provence, a blend of basil, oregano, sage, rosemary, marjoram, thyme and lavender. I use a sprinkling of this dried blend but also add fresh oregano, thyme and basil at the end for heightened flavor and extra eye appeal. Using the dried herbs isn't necessary, but I like layering the mix of dried and fresh for more complexity.

INGREDIENTS

Olive oil (for skillet)
1 large onion, chopped
2 cloves garlic, minced
2-3 small-medium zucchini and/or yellow summer squash, cut into 1/4-inch slices
1 large eggplant, unpeeled and diced into 1/2-inch cubes
5 good-sized (preferably heirloom) tomatoes, chopped or 2 handfuls cherry tomatoes, halved (or a mixture of the two)
2 bell peppers (one red and one green), seeded and chopped
1 large can crushed tomatoes
Herbs de Provence
Fresh basil, oregano and/or thyme, chopped
Salt and freshly ground pepper to taste

METHOD

Heat olive oil (5-6 tablespoons) in a large skillet. Add onion and garlic and sauté over medium heat until onion is translucent, about 3 minutes. Add zucchini/squash and eggplant and sauté until starting to brown, about

5 minutes more. Add more olive oil if mixture looks dry. Mix in peppers and chopped tomatoes and a generous sprinkle of herbs de Provence and chopped, fresh herbs. Season with salt and pepper, stir through and add crushed tomatoes (I usually add a little red wine to the can, swirl it around and add it to the mix). Reduce heat to medium low, cover and continue to cook until vegetables are still al dente, no more than 20 minutes more. Spoon into bowls, sprinkle with fresh herbs and serve alone or over pasta or rice. Can be enjoyed hot, warm or at room temperature. It's also great left over since it benefits from the flavors being allowed to marry overnight. Serves about 4 as a main course or 8 as a side.

PEACHES AND CREAM PIE

You can make your own pie crust or use a purchased unbaked shell. This is about as easy as it gets!

INGREDIENTS

Unbaked 9" (one-crust) pie shell
5-6 ripe peaches (peeled if you prefer), halved and sliced
2/3 cup sugar
4 tablespoons flour
1/4 teaspoon salt
1 cup heavy cream

METHOD:

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Arrange peach slices in unbaked pie shell. In a large bowl combine sugar, flour, salt and cream. Pour cream mixture over peaches. Bake for 35 minutes. Reduce oven temperature to 350 and bake 10 minutes more. Serves about 8.

September really is a month that keeps on giving. It's a bountiful bridge between summer and fall with an amazing assortment of local produce waiting to be used in amazing and delicious ways so get some while you still can. Let's show September some love and savor the very best of the many gifts it's given us. Enjoy!

Thanks to your support, Sue and I and our team of growers will be ramping up production of the winning flowers. Here they are, along with some of the comments (note that even the winners get some negative reviews):

Last place went to Bidens Campfire Marshmallow. Not that it's a bad flower, just that the other samples rated higher. The new Bidens still got compliments like "cute, charming, so sweet." Voters reacted to the name, even though the flower Bidens has been around much longer than Joe Biden. The reactions to the name ranged from "We love Joe Biden" to "Make Flowers Great Again, Trump 2004."

I found out the hard way that flower survey participants sometimes vote for the name. A few years ago we ran a trial that picked "Coleus Dirty Martini" as the winner. After growing a few thousand of them, it turned out that people only liked the name.



The cocktail party will be held at the Roundhouse as both a friend- and a fundraiser for the Historical Society, which is








