

## Renegades advance to league championship series

This is getting to be second nature. The Hudson Valley Renegades were crowned champions of the South Atlantic League North Division on Friday night for the second straight year, taking down the Greensboro Grasshoppers 4-1 in a deciding Game 3 at FNB Field. Hudson Valley has now reached the league championship series five times in the last eight seasons. The Renegades are now looking for their first South Atlantic League Championship in franchise history. Hudson Valley started the best-of-three championship series against Bowling Green on Sunday in Kentucky and lost the opener by a score of 5-1. Game 2 and, if necessary, Game 3, were scheduled for Tuesday and Wednesday in at Heritage Financial Park in Wappingers Falls.

Roc Riggio started Sunday's game with a bang, cracking a leadoff solo home run off Brody Hopkins to put the Renegades in front 1-0. But that was all the runs Hudson Valley could muster. In the bottom of the first Bowling Green answered against Baron Stuart when Colton Ledbetter walked, stole second, and scored on a Mac Horvath double to tie the game. Horvath touched up Stuart (0-1) for a solo home run in the bottom of the third to give the Hot Rods a 2-1 lead. The right-hander finished his day after 2.1 innings, allowing two runs on seven hits, walking two and striking out four, exiting after being struck on the hand by a comeback line drive from Noah Myers. Bowling Green extended its lead to 4-1 in the fifth when Horvath tripled before Aidan Smith hit a pinch-hit two-run homer off Joel Valdez. They tacked on

another in the seventh off Yorlin Calderon when Kamren James reached on a fielder's choice in and came home on a Hunter Haas RBI double to make it 5-1. In the third inning in the deciding game against the Grasshoppers on Friday, an Antonio Gomez walk and Roc Riggio single put runners at first and second. Josh Moylan drove in Gomez with an RBI single down the left-field line to make it 1-0. Brendan Jones doubled and scored in the fifth on a Riggio single that was mis-played by second baseman Duce Gourson to extend the lead to 2-0. Starter Kyle Carr was on point in an elimination game. The left-hander tossed 4.1 scoreless innings, allowing just two hits while striking out five. He didn't allow a hit until the fifth and just four batters reached base safely against him. In

The parade celebrating community in East Fishkill steps off at 2 p.m. on Saturday, Sept. 21. Also, during the annual East Fishkill Community Day, there will be live music, a car show, vendors food, inflatables, outdoor activities, animals and fireworks, at the Hopewell Rec Park, 392 Route 376. The event starts at noon. What will make this Community Day unique? Bill Green, the recreation director for the Town of East Fishkill replied, "Our community and its ability to come through during difficult times and "fun times" makes us super unique!" Green was asked if there will be anything new during this year's Community Day? "We're honoring farmers in East Fishkill and in addition to music we'll have some belly dancers performing." The organizers of the annual day expect between 4,000-5,000 to attend the festivities throughout the day and for fireworks. "We'll have about 90-100 vendors and 6-8 floats, plus many cars and trucks and 200-300 marchers," said Green. One of the organizations that will be in attendance this year is the Hi Hopes Thoroughbred Rescue Inc. "We will be bringing 2 mini ponies (tiny horses) for people to interact with, pet, feed treats, etc.," stated Shawna Anderson, Executive Director for Hi Hopes Thoroughbred Rescue Inc., a non-profit equine rescue registered as a 501(c)3 Charity with the IRS.

## EPA selects Hudson Valley Council to receive \$3M to cut climate pollution

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has selected the Hudson Valley Regional Council to receive \$3 million through the Climate Pollution Reduction Grant program as part of the Biden-Harris Administration's Investing in America Agenda and funded under the Inflation Reduction Act. Regional Administrator Lisa F. Garcia, Hudson Valley Regional Council Executive Director Carla Castillo and County Commissioner of Planning & Development Eoin Wrafter gathered with local leaders Friday, Sept. 13, at the Hudson Valley Regional Airport, overlooking the closed municipal landfill, to celebrate the project that will curb methane emissions in the Mid-Hudson Region of New York. "Across the nation EPA is funding projects to reduce greenhouse gases and empower community-led solutions to succeed in the fight against climate

change," said Garcia. "We are so pleased to bring that funding to local efforts right here in the beautiful Hudson Valley of New York State. Under this project, innovative and sustainable clean energy solutions will go into effect at over a dozen closed landfills in the area to improve air quality." The Hudson Valley Regional Council will use the grant to install bio-filters that will reduce the amount of methane emitted into the air from closed landfills in the Mid-Hudson Valley region. The grant will also be used to promote the installation of solar arrays and battery storage systems, installation of native pollinator gardens, and to create long-term ecosystem stewardship plans at former landfills. HVRC will provide technical assistance to municipalities interested in leasing their landfill for community solar and/or battery

## EPA selects Hudson Valley Council to receive \$3M to cut climate pollution

storage installations. Of the 14 closed landfills targeted for this project, half are in historically disadvantaged communities.

The participating local municipalities are: Town of Amenia, City of Beacon, Dutchess County, Town of North East and Town of Rhinebeck City of Beacon

Mayor Lee Kyriacou told Southern Dutchess News via email, "The City of Beacon recently completed a Climate Action Plan to reduce the greenhouse emissions from our local government, and reduction of methane emissions from the former landfill at Dennings Avenue was highlighted as one of the most important actions the City could take to become even more environmentally sustainable. We appreciate the Regional Council's leadership in applying for this grant and look forward to working with them on implementing this important initiative."

"With the Hudson Valley experiencing yet another historic heat wave, the health of our families and climate can't wait any longer. We have to act now to reduce greenhouse gas pollution," said Representative Pat Ryan (NY-18). "I'm proud that this funding from the landmark Inflation Reduction Act will help the Hudson Valley Regional Council fight methane pollution - among the most potent greenhouse gasses - right here at home. That's cleaner air for our families now and cooler air for future generations. I'll keep fighting for the clean air, water, and soil that every American deserves."

"Dutchess County continues to be a leader of environmental stewardship and sustainability efforts and this Climate Pollution Reduction Grant, one of just 25 awarded nationwide, is a testament to that," said Dutchess County Executive Sue Serino. "We thank the EPA for funding this important bio-filter project and we extend our gratitude to the Hudson Valley Regional Council for including us in this innovative work. HVRC has been a vital partner in many of Dutchess County's sustainability efforts and we are pleased to work together to set an example for communities across the nation demonstrating how practical goals and actionable plans can lead to meaningful impact and ensure a sustainable and healthy future for our children and generations to come."

"This is a significant win for the region," said Castillo, executive director of the Hudson Valley Regional Council. "With this funding, more residents in the Mid-Hudson Region - especially residents in historically disadvantaged communities - will be able to breathe cleaner air while enabling the Region to significantly reduce its share of GHG emissions. By taking a cohort approach to the landfill methane reduction issue, we can make a significant impact to climate change mitiga-

tion. Thank you to the Biden-Harris administration and the EPA for this Inflation Reduction Act opportunity, all our local leaders and Congressional delegation for their support, and our partner municipalities across the region for their collaboration."

"The Town of North East has been in the forefront of efforts to clean up our environment and to reduce greenhouse gas emissions," said Town of North East Supervisor Christopher Kennan. "We are proud to be part of a cohort of Hudson Valley communities that are focused on mitigating GHG emissions from our closed landfills. We are deeply grateful to the Hudson Valley Regional Council and to the EPA for this initiative, and for the recognition that there are practical and affordable technologies to accomplish this goal."

Specifics about the \$3 million EPA Climate Pollution Reduction Grant in relation to Dutchess County:

- Dutchess County's portion of the project will be focused on the closed landfill located along Rte. 376 in the Town of Wappinger that once served several local municipalities.

- According to Dutchess County's recently completed Greenhouse Gas (GHG) Inventory for County Government operations, that landfill represents more than 20% of County Government's total GHG emissions, using estimates from the EPA's Landfill Gas Emissions Model.

- The project will begin with initial monitoring conducted to determine the

landfill gas flow rate and the concentration of methane emitted from each gas vent. This information will be used to determine the number, location and size of the bio-filters at the landfill.

- The biofilters use a particular mulch that contains micro-organisms, bacteria, that digest methane from the landfill gas and are estimated to be able reduce methane by as much as 90%.

- Dutchess County already has a 1.6-Megawatt solar array, which began operations in 2020, at the airport, across the street from the landfill, which exemplifies the County's commitment to harnessing renewable energy and reducing emissions via practical solutions. The clean energy produced by these panels is applied to the County's utility accounts, reducing the carbon footprint while also helping to stabilize electricity costs.

- With the solar array already in place, Dutchess County will pursue expanding biodiversity with native plantings to attract and benefit pollina-

tion. Population of important pollinators has declined in the United States and internationally, and this would help reverse that trend.

September is National Preparedness Month and Dutchess County is helping residents to ThinkDIFFERENTLY about being ready for an emergency when people have autism or other neurodevelopmental challenges. Dutchess County's ThinkDIFFERENTLY team has organized an event this month to help prepare families with a Sensory Sensitive Open House at East Fishkill Department, open to all County residents, on September 28. Registration is required for this event.

County Executive Sue Serino said, "Every second matters in an emergency and being prepared can make all the difference – especially for families with autism or other neurodevelopmental challenges. First responders need to be prepared to handle emergencies involving residents on the autism spectrum with speed, sensitivity and understanding. These events help build stronger connections between first responders and the families they serve, improving the safety and well-being of our community. We encourage responders and families to take advantage of these opportunities!"

On Saturday, September 28, residents with disabilities and their families are invited to a sensory-sensitive First Responder Meet & Greet from 10 a.m. to noon at the East Fishkill Fire Department, 2502 Route 52 in East Fishkill. This is a great opportunity for families to meet first responders in a sensory-sensitive environment, with no flashing lights or sirens, to get familiar with the equipment, gear

and vehicles that first responders utilize in an emergency. Capacity is limited, and registration is required; families can register at <https://bit.ly/47B080x> by September 27.

Dutchess County All Abilities Programs Director Dana Hopkins said, "Understanding first responders, their vehicles and practices is crucial for families with children on the autism spectrum. We hope this event enhances safety during emergencies and fosters smoother interactions with emergency personnel, and we invite families to attend."

Residents with disabilities and their families are also reminded to sign up for the Dutchess County Access & Functional Needs Registry – a voluntary, confidential list of residents who may need extra assistance, transportation or a place to stay if a major emergency or disaster requires evacuation. Registering before an emergency allows response agencies to plan more effectively. Residents who are eligible can sign up at [dutchessny.gov/afnregistry](http://dutchessny.gov/afnregistry) to help first responders understand any special assistance they may need during an emergency or evacuation.

Not acceptable: Paint materials, chemicals, tree limbs, engine oil, lawn/garden chemicals, cleaning chemicals, pressurized tanks, turpentine, shellac, sealers, drums, fuel containers, propane tanks, tree stumps/limbs, auto batteries, oil cans, railroad ties, construction debris, computer monitors.

## IBM had military focus during World War II

Many people know that the single biggest economic driver in Dutchess County in the 20th century occurred with the arrival of the computer technology giant International Business Machines (IBM) in Poughkeepsie in 1941. IBM went on to be the county's largest employer. By the 1980s there were 31,000 IBM employees in Mid-Hudson Valley and another 15,000 working for IBM suppliers.

What many people don't realize is that the wartime arrival of IBM required its business to focus on immediate wartime needs, not its core computing technology business. As war seemed to be emerging in Europe in 1938, the US Army requested that the ordnance department develop a "light rifle" or carbine. The formal requirement for the weapon type was approved in 1940 and there was peak demand by 1944. Companies like the car company General Motors, Underwood typewriters, and IBM Poughkeepsie were involved in their manufacture.

1944 was emerging as a critical year. American troops landed in France on D-Day, June 6. President Franklin Roosevelt was campaigning for his unprecedented (and never to be repeated) fourth U.S. Presidential election. Of course, no one

knew at the time, but the war would not end until 1945 with victory in Europe in May and victory in Asia in September. But all that was unknown and victory was uncertain.

IBM's arrival in Poughkeepsie was launched when the "Munitions Manufacturing Corporation," a subsidiary of IBM, purchased the former Delapenha factory in south Poughkeepsie in April of 1941. The building eventually became IBM Plant No. 4 (see photo).

While IBM was manufacturing the metal components, it partnered with the local window sash and blind woodworking company, Lumb Woodworking, to create the wooden stocks. Founded locally in 1866 Lumb Woodworking remained a family-owned business as it grew, handed from father to son.

The 1944 wooden gunstock manufactured in Poughkeepsie (see photo, DCHS Collections) was manufactured during this period of peak demand. The demand can be understood by looking at local newspaper help wanted ads in the Poughkeepsie Journal. The Lumb woodworking factory was operating day and night and employing men and women. May 1944: "Men to work night shift on gun stock machines. Lumb Woodworking company. 61 Main Street."



Built in 1912 for the Delapenha fruit and vegetable canning company in south Poughkeepsie, the building was bought in 1941 by a subsidiary of IBM. Initial work at the factory involved the manufacture of combat-ready light rifles or carbines. This small footprint launched IBM's massive post-war growth in the region for the next 40 years.

July 1944: "Women to work on power sanding machine gun stock division. Apply Lumb Woodworking Company, 61 Main Street."

**Factory building's prior wartime history**

The factory that IBM bought had a history of wartime use a generation earlier during WWI. The four-story factory was designed by the well-known local architect Percival Lloyd in 1912 at a time when the Delapenha Company, which canned local fruits and vegetables, consolidated its operations. You can still find references to the area in south Poughkeepsie as "Rudco" on maps. This stems from the name formally given to the neighborhood based on "R. U. Delapenha Co." owned by Rudolph Delapenha.

The impact of the war was pressure to greatly amplify the volume of canned food they were producing. At the time of America's involvement in World War One in 1917, the factory had grown to have a capacity of a quarter of a million cases of canned goods annually. Tomatoes, corn, and beans were the particular focus.

In 1918 Delapenha expanded into the practice of growing its own food stocks on its 240-acre site to complement what it pur-

chased from local farmers. They had 1 million tomato plants of their own land and 150 men and women including 22 Vassar College students tended to their growing. Again, unusual for the time, women were called into factories for wartime service.

One ad appealing to women promised that they could come in late morning after doing their housework and leave by early afternoon having made an important patriotic contribution.

Rudolph Delapenha regularly took annual trips to Europe. By 1933 he was warning Americans that Europe feared it was approaching another World War, which of course turned out to be true. By 1941 he had sold the factory, and the next generation of use was begun.

## Legislature passes local law protecting aquifer and public water supply sources

At its September Board Meeting, the Dutchess County Legislature unanimously adopted a local law seeking to protect the public water supply from known contaminant sources. The law expands separation distances between specifically identified contaminant sources and public water supply wells, wetlands, and aquifers.

"This law represents a bold step forward in protecting our drinking water," said Legislator John Metzger, the prime sponsor of the legislation. "Many in Dutchess County rely solely on public water supply wells or individual wells for clean and potable water. This legislation will ensure that our public water supplies are protected by requiring greater buffers between the source of contamination and any public water supply wells, wetlands and aquifers within Dutchess County."

The recently adopted local law requires that any new contamination sources, such as gas stations, car washes, and dry-cleaning establishments maintain at least 1,500 feet

from the point of contamination to the nearest public water supply, wetland, or aquifer.

"As our communities continue to develop and grow, groundwater sources become more vulnerable to contamination from potentially hazardous and harmful pollution sources," said Legislator Tony D'Aquanni, the Chairman of the Legislature's Environment Committee. "The enactment of this new law is a measured and necessary response to combat this problem."

"We live in a beautiful corner of the world with an abundance of natural resources" said Dutchess County Legislature Chairman Will Truitt. "Protecting our environment, and more specifically, the water that we drink must, always be a top priority for those of us in public office. I thank Legislator Metzger for bringing forward this legislation, which I believe to be an effective piece of environmental protection."

The local law will now go to the County Executive for approval.

No DMV or legal related business will be accepted. Free parking will be available in the lot adjacent to the County Office Building will be available as space permits.

# Officials speak out on incident with 30-40 motorcyclists, ATV operators in WF NYS Police announce arrests

New York State Troopers responded to State Route 9D in the village of Wappingers Falls for a Dutchess County 911 report of around 30 to 40 motorcycles and or motorized off-highway vehicle operators on Sept. 8 around 4 p.m.

According to law enforcement officials, Troopers located the group operating recklessly in the roadway and on sidewalks. Members of the group began circling the marked state police patrol vehicle revving their engines and shouting profanities, according to a release from the State Police. The release stated, an operator of a 2024 Yamaha dirt bike crashed into and caused injury to a fellow group member, who police identified as John Robinson, 25, of Poughquag.

During the incident, stated law enforcement, the Trooper attempted to render aid, members of the group allegedly interfered until additional police units arrived on scene. The group allegedly took the trooper's hat from his vehicle then fled the scene. Robinson was left behind and later transported to Vassar hospital with non-life-threatening injuries, according to NYS Police.

In response to the incident, Wappinger Town Supervisor Joseph D. Cavaccini, New York State Senator Robert G. Rolison, New York State Assemblyman Anil R. Beephan Jr., Village of Wappingers Falls Mayor Kevin Huber, and Dutchess County Legislator Robert Faust spoke out on the incident in front of Wappinger Town Hall on Sept. 9.

"Over the past few months, has seen a number of horrific accidents and horrific acts around our town. Let me be perfectly clear - - we will not tolerate any of this disgusting behavior that we saw yesterday (Sept. 8) or that we've seen in the past few weeks," said Cavaccini.

Rolison said, "I want to commend the state police for showing great restraint" in what they were up against being surrounded. Rolison said what happened was "absolutely horrible."

Rolison introduced S.7717A, legislation to crack down on reckless driving that threatens pedestrians and other motorists.

"My legislation is simple: it provides discretion to prosecutors and judges to

charge a suspect with aggravated reckless driving, a felony. Individuals driving uninsured or unregistered cars, trucks, motorcycles, dirt bikes or ATVs, or guilty of three reckless-driving violations, would face forfeiture of their vehicles and other penalties," explained Rolison in a social media post.

"The only way it is going to stop is when people are held accountable," Rolison added during his remarks.

Wappingers Falls Mayor Kevin Huber said he will "continue to work with police to stop this from happening."

"It's time to restore law and order to the state," said Beephan. Beephan continued stating he has reached out to NYS Police and the trooper involved is doing well.

He said he was supporting the banning of masks

Faust said he has more than two decades of law enforcement career.

"It's an absolute disgrace what went on yesterday (Sept. 8)," said Faust.

"We have zero patience for these actions," said Cavaccini. He noted they will not tolerate the speeding up and down of Route 9. He added they support law enforcement.

On September 9, the New York State Police Troop K Bureau of Criminal Investigation arrested John Horton, 26, of Danbury, CT, for Assault in the 2nd degree, a class D felony, Tampering with Physical Evidence, a class E felony, Criminal Possession of Stolen Property in the 5th degree, Petit Larceny, and Conspiracy in the 5th degree, all class A misdemeanors, according to NYS Police.

This arrest stems Horton's involvement in the incident and the alleged theft of the trooper's hat in the village of Wappingers Falls, according to law enforcement, according to a release.

According to state police, Horton was arraigned in front of the Honorable Judge Fiorile of the Village of Wappingers Falls Court and remanded to the Dutchess County Jail in lieu of \$20,000 cash bail, \$40,000 bond, or \$80,000 partially secured bond. Horton was scheduled to reappear in the Village of Wappingers Falls Court last week.

This investigation remains ongoing according to officials. If anyone believes they may have information regarding this



Larry will be remembered as a devoted partner, father, grandfather, and friend. He appreciated the beauty of the world





He was preceded in death by his parents and brother, David P. Carroll.



# Vaccines: Make mine a 'double shot'

I just got my annual flu and Covid vaccines and I feel good about it. Here's why: Vaccines have come a long way since they were first used to prevent smallpox. Injections now contain additives, which enhance and keep them functional and free of contaminants. Vaccines also undergo extensive development before they are approved.

**Many safeguards**

The FDA requires that vaccines are thoroughly developed in the lab. They undergo animal studies and human clinical trials. Highly trained scientists and physicians evaluate the research. The vaccines that are determined to be safe and effective are approved and continuously monitored after approval for safety. The safety protocol doesn't stop there. Like other medical devices such as pacemakers, intravenous lines, and implants, immunizations are tested for toxins.

**Testing for toxins**

Toxins are produced by certain harmful microbes. Diseases caused by microbial toxins include tetanus, botulism, typhoid, and cholera. From the mid-twentieth century, medicines sold in the US have been legally required to be tested for those and other contaminants.

That testing was once done by injecting those medicines into rabbits and observing their temperature response. Hundreds of thousands of the animals were euthanized annually, as a result of the process. In the 1980s, testing on rabbits was replaced by the LAL test. The LAL test uses the blood of horseshoe crabs.

**Our horseshoe crabs**

Atlantic horseshoe crabs have survived nearly unchanged for at least 445 million years. That goes farther back than when dinosaurs existed. Horseshoe crabs tend to be found lower toward the mouth of the Hudson River and other coastal areas.

Horseshoe crabs have been prized by the pharmaceutical industry because special cells in their blood were found to coagulate in the presence of toxins. This reaction is the basis of the LAL test. The transition from laboratory testing on live animals to the LAL test was a significant advancement.

However, to create the LAL test, horseshoe crabs must be removed from the water to extract a portion of their blood in the lab. Although the arthropods are released alive back into the water from where they were collected; a portion of those crabs die from the procedure. **Ecological concern**

In addition to mortality from their use in the biomedical field, horseshoe crabs

are also used by commercial fisheries as bait. As a result, their population has been declining and the International Union for the Conservation of Nature has listed them as vulnerable to extinction in our region. The decline in the horseshoe crab population impacts many marine animals, including shorebirds, whose survival is dependent upon an abundance of horseshoe crab eggs.

**A synthetic alternative**

In 1997, scientists used biotechnology to create a synthetic alternative to the LAL test. In contrast to LAL, the synthetic alternative utilizes a single protein cloned from a horseshoe crab as its active ingredient. The alternative test, called rFC, has not yet been universally adopted, due to concerns over its efficacy.


**Vaccine manufacturers**

Pfizer, Sanofi, and Moderna are among the pharmaceutical companies that produce widely available vaccines in our area. When reached for comment about the use of LAL in vaccine testing, the following response was received:

"Pfizer is committed to the development and use of scientifically sound alternative testing methods that are acceptable to regulatory authorities and do not compromise patient safety or the effectiveness of our medicines. For more than 10 years, we have been exploring the use of recombinant Factor C (rFc) for the bacterial endotoxin test (BET) as an alternative to the Limulus amoebocyte lysate (LAL) method, which utilizes horseshoe crab blood. Based on our internal studies and the recent approval of rFc by the United States Pharmacopeia ('Chapter <86> Bacterial Endotoxins Test Using Recombinant Reagents'), Pfizer has begun implementing rFc for GMP testing of pharmaceutical water systems at some of our clinical supply manufacturing sites. Changes to commercial testing strategies require global regulatory approval and must be undertaken carefully to continue to assure product quality and supply. Pfizer is evaluating pathways for minimizing use of LAL reagent and introducing rFc in place of LAL in the commercial manufacturing network."

**The 2024 Covid and flu vaccinations**

Given that the regulatory process is ongoing, LAL testing continues to be used with vaccinations and medical devices. Though I am happy that all humans benefit from vaccines being tested so thoroughly, I also hope that the scientific process moves swiftly so that the negative impacts on global food webs, including horseshoe crab and shorebird populations, improve. 
The Bannerman Castle Trust, (BCT) and Bannerman Island Gallery, at 150 Main Street in Beacon, is presenting A 30th Anniversary Exhibition and Celebration featuring artwork, photographs, antiques & artifacts from historic Bannerman Island and Castle.

The Bannerman Castle Trust organization has existed and operated as a not-for-profit "Friends" group comprised of dedicated volunteers and staff for over 30 years. Working with the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation & Historic Preservation, the BCT has made incredible advances on Bannerman Island, taking it from an abandoned and over-grown island of historic ruins (dating back to 1900) to the incredible public destination it is today.

Since 1994, the BCT has been working to find resources and funding to stabilize the island's historic structures and has made it their mission to educate the public on the value and history of Bannerman

Island (originally known as Pollepel Island), to make it a safe and welcoming place for the public to enjoy as an educational, cultural, historical and recreational facility, promoting heritage tourism in the Hudson Valley.

Military Antiques dealer and amateur architect Francis Bannerman worked and resided on his island from 1900 until his death in 1918 and had built several structures including the iconic "folly" castle (arsenal) to store surplus militaria, and a summer residence that resembled a small castle where he and his wife Helen Boyce Bannerman would stay during weekends and summer months away from their city residence at the Hotel Margaret in Brooklyn Heights. Bannerman's restored roll-top desk that was gifted by Gordon Bannerman Colby and his wife Lili will be featured in the show. 19th century paintings by artist Francis William Loring (found in the Bannerman residence) were donated by Jane Bannerman and will also be on exhibit.


