Community event expands to four days

Get ready for Carni'Fall' in the Town of Wappinger. The annual four-day long event will run October 6-9.

So, what will be new this year?

Jessica Fulton is the recreation director for the Town of Wappinger. "This year we are ramping up Monday," said Fulton, who explained in the past, it has been a "cool down day" as Carni'Fall'

came to a close. "But we've seen that we're getting just as much traffic on Monday as we are some of the other days; and we needed to step up to add more to that final day of the event to really make it just as full and important as the other three days."

This year on Monday, said Fulton, there will be an '80s-themed day with 1980s music trivia contest and an '80s

costume contest.

Wappinger began its Carni'Fall' a couple years ago and expanded Community Day from one day to four days.

"Right after COVID, we got some new carnival vendors who offered us the opportunity to expand [the number of days]," explained Richard Thurston, the



Five D.C. residents earn vehicles from 'Way to Work' program

Reliable transportation is critical to successful employment. A single mother and the sole provider for her child, Nicole, balances the responsibilities of a full-time job with the obligations being a full-time student. While Nicole studies to become an ultrasound technician, her work assignments often take her to Westchester County.

Without the benefit of a reliable vehicle of her own, Nicole must frequently pay a costly ride-share to get her to and from her job – an additional financial burden she can barely afford as she raises her child alone.

That all changed on September 28.

Nicole was one of five recipients who completed the "Way to Work" employment empowerment program – a partnership between Dutchess County's Department of Community & Family Services (DCFS) and the Dutchess County Workforce Investment Board (DCWIB) that assists people address their transportation challenges. The program participants earned a gently used vehicle to help them obtain and retain employment; acquire jobs with more hours or higher pay; gain access to higher education; increase their wage potential or take their children to and from school. Today's recipients included several single mothers, as well as a local young woman who was a foster child.

Dutchess County Executive William F.X. O'Neil, who presented each recipient


with the keys to their vehicle, said, "Today we give these deserving recipients more than keys to a car; we give them the opportunity to build a better future for themselves and their families. They have each earned this chance through their commitment to 'Way to Work' – attending the various trainings, seminars and workshops, and investing the time and effort needed to complete the program. They have earned this opportunity through their dedication to improving their lives, and we look forward to watching their future successes."

Established in 2001, the program, formerly known as "Wheels to Work," is designed to help low-income Dutchess County residents get and keep a job, providing them reliable transportation to and from work. Qualified participants must come from a family that receives Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) or whose family income is less than 200 percent of the poverty level.

"Way to Work" is dedicated to empowering program participants with transportation solutions. Program recipients are chosen based on their work-related need for transportation, have a temporary need of assistance and other specific program guidelines. In addition, they must display the perseverance and the commitment necessary to take steps towards financial independence. The program offers various components, including connections to public transit options, financial literacy and car care literacy seminars, a financial bootcamp workshop, a credit score workshop, vehicle registration services and vehicle insurance services.

DCFS's approach to help transition residents to work is a multi-faceted one that includes work skills training, daycare subsidies for eligible families, and the "Way to Work" program provided under contract by the DCWIB. "Way to Work" provides vehicles from local used car dealers to eligible individuals and provides participants training – such as car care and defensive driving – as well as assistance in obtaining a learner's permit or driver's license.

The recipients who earned vehicles recently were chosen based on specific program guidelines, including their work-related need for transportation. In addition, they have all displayed the perseverance and commitment necessary to continually

move forward toward financial independence. For every family that earns a car and avoids temporary assistance, Dutchess County saves \$1,614 a month. Within a year, that savings equals the cost of a new car. Since the program's inception, 90 percent of vehicle recipients have remained independent from temporary assistance.

DCFS Commissioner Sabrina Jaar Marzouka said, "For more than 20 years, this program has been a success, empowering Dutchess County residents who are looking for a better life and who commit to making it a reality. 'Way to Work' is just one way our department offers a hand up to Dutchess County residents in need of assistance, and we celebrate every success story our dedicated staff helps write

each day."

DCWIB Executive Director Louise McLoughlin said, "Reliable transportation plays such an important role in one's independence – whether getting to and from a job, taking children to school or doctor's appointments or simply getting to the supermarket – and the 'Way to Work' program connects participants with community partners in a circle of support to make that a reality. We are proud to collaborate with Dutchess County on this vital program, which helps those searching for self-sufficiency reach that goal."

The following is a letter from Senator Kirsten Gillibrand and some members of the NY Delegation (Representative Adriano Espaillat (D-NY-13) is leading this effort in the House of Representatives). Additionally, Representatives Jamaal Bowman (D-NY-16), Grace Meng (D-NY-6), Paul Tonko (D-NY-20), Ritchie Torres (D-NY-15), Nydia Velázquez (D-NY-7), Dan Goldman (D-NY-10), and Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez (D-NY-14) joined Gillibrand and Espaillat in calling on the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) to waive the filing fee.

Gillibrand asks filing fee for Application for Employment Authorization to U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services be waived

To Director Jaddou:

We write to request that the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) waive the filing fee for the Application for Employment Authorization (I-765) for parolees in order to expedite the work authorization process and provide these individuals the ability to legally and safely work. We appreciate the Administration's attention to this urgent humanitarian issue.

Since the spring of 2022, approximately 110,000 migrants have arrived in New York City. Today, about 60,000 of them remain under the City's care. While we anticipate many of these migrants will apply for asylum, those with parolee status are already eligible to apply for a work permit, which would give them legal work authorization ((c)(1) category) for the duration of their parole. However, the I-765 filing fee poses a significant barrier to many potential parolee applicants.

Currently, the filing fee for I-765 application is \$410. Many parolees have fled their countries of origin for urgent humanitarian reasons - fleeing oppression, violence, poverty, or persecution. As these individuals are unable to work legally or safely without a valid work authorization, the filing fee is simply unattainable for many, leaving them in limbo under the City's care. Reducing barriers to applying for employment authorizations will allow parolees to achieve self-sufficiency and reduce the strain on the city's resources.

We therefore respectfully request that USCIS waive the \$410 filing fee for all I-765's filed by parolees in order to provide parolees access to work permits without any financial burden. Lastly, as you consider our request to waive the fees of all I-765 forms for parolees, we further ask USCIS to consider making I-912 fee waiver forms available to submit online, to reduce the burden of having to mail these forms to USCIS. The United States has a responsibility to provide an orderly and legal pathway to work for those who are seeking safety and protection from the circumstances they fled from in the countries of origin. Comprehensive immigration reform is long past due. However, we can make these critical changes now that can provide immediate relief to this vulnerable population.

'Faithless Electors' bill sponsored by Jacobson, Skoufis signed into law

Governor Kathy Hochul has signed into law a bill sponsored by Assemblymember Jonathan Jacobson (D-104) and State Senator James Skoufis (D-42) (A928/S438) requiring New York's electoral voters to cast their ballots for the presidential and vice-presidential candidates who win the state's popular vote in the November general election.

Jacobson said, "It's common knowledge that voters don't vote directly for Presidential and Vice-Presidential candidates. Instead, they vote for electors representing each party's candidate who are entrusted with the responsibility of casting their ballots in the electoral college in accordance with the popular vote. In most states, including New York, 100% of the electoral votes are to be cast for the candidate who wins their state's popular vote."

In 2016, according to a press release from Jacobson and Skoufis, electors in four different states did not vote for the candidate who won their state. Some did not vote for Donald Trump where he won, and some did not vote for Hillary Clinton where she won. While these faithless electors did not affect the outcome of that year's presidential election, this new law will make sure that this does not happen in New York.

In the release, Jacobson said in part, "When it comes to presidential elections in New York State, this means that the candidate who gets the most votes for president actually receives all of New York's electoral college votes. This new law will outlaw fake electors so that New York does its part to protect America's increasingly fragile democracy."

Students born with heart defects named local Youth Heart Ambassadors for Kids Heart Challenge

The American Heart Association has selected two 10-year-olds and one 6-year-old from the Hudson Valley to serve as volunteer local Youth Heart Ambassadors for the 2023-2024 school year. They are from Farley Elementary School in Stony Point; George Fischer Middle School in Carmel; and Minisink Elementary School in Slate Hill.

Chase Teichmann of Stony Point, Sophia Pinto of Carmel and Hank Bobrick of Westtown, will work closely with the American Heart Association's in-school programs, Kids Heart Challenge™ and American Heart Challenge™ to actively and passionately champion other children to establish healthy habits to better mental and physical well-being.

The American Heart Association accepted nominations from young people who have been affected by heart disease or stroke either through a personal diagnosis, diagnosis of a loved one, or has made a personal lifestyle change, to serve in the Youth Heart Ambassador role.

Sophia's three open-heart surgeries


Sophia was born with Hypoplastic Right Heart Syndrome, which means the right-sided structures of her heart are underdeveloped or not formed. Sophia also has pulmonary atresia with intact ventricular septum and tricuspid atresia.

She has had three open-heart surgeries, the first when she was one week old; the second when she was four-and-a-half months old and the third one -which she hopes will be her last – when she was three-and-a-half.

"I want to be an ambassador because it's important to keep your heart healthy, and to spread awareness," Sophia said. She was also a Youth Ambassador during the past school year.

Chase Teichmann loves to play

Chase is a fan of Roblox and loves to play hockey and baseball. He has coarctation of the aorta, which means that a part of his aorta was narrower than usual at birth. In his first days of life, Chase's mother noticed that her son slept a lot and had trouble eating. At 10 days old, he had heart surgery. Through frequent, ongoing pediatric cardiology care Chase has been able to live an active life. When he was eight, he started to have difficulty moving and walking. He had his second heart procedure to help maintain heart health. Now, he has a stent and feels great. Chase said these moments have helped him feel strong, and by being

a Youth Ambassador, he hopes he can help others.

"I have met a lot of people that have been kind and helpful to me," Chase said. "I want to be kind and helpful to them. Maybe I can give them the advice and courage to be strong like I was."

Hank's heart story

Hank was also born with hypoplastic right heart syndrome, criss-cross heart and double outlet right ventricle. He likes things to do with farming, Scouts, and playing guitar. Hank's mother explained that he's proud of his story, and wants to give a little courage to other children with similar situations.

The Youth Heart Ambassadors serve a one-year commitment as a volunteer of the American Heart Association assisting the organization to be a relentless force for healthier lives for all. The position gives youth a voice to encourage, advocate and underscore the need for to raise critical funding as they share the impact cardiovascular disease has had on their life.

"It's exciting to see two of our local youth share their voice and experience to help others live heart healthy" said Alex DiCicco, Academic Quality Analyst, Johnson & Wales University and chair of the Hudson Valley Board of Directors for the American Heart Association. "Chase and Sophia have incredible stories to share and we are excited to see the impact

they will make in our local schools and in our community."

This clinic is open to dogs, cats, and domestic ferrets 3 months of age and older. Advance registration is required. Residents can register at DCSPCA.org or by calling the DCSPCA at 845-452-7722 ext. 425.

There is no charge for Dutchess County residents; non-residents will be charged a fee of \$10 per pet vaccinated. All dogs must be on leash, and cats and domestic ferrets must be in carriers. Vaccinations will be good for three years for pets with proper proof of a prior immunization. For those without proof, the vaccination will be good for one year.

Rabies vaccinations are required by New York State law for all cats, dogs, and domestic ferrets by the age of four months of age. Pet owners are required to revaccinate

on a regular schedule to keep the animal properly immunized against the rabies virus. Owners can be fined up to \$200 if they fail to get their pets vaccinated and keep them up to date.

DBCH is available 24/7 to assist with any questions or concerns regarding potential rabies exposure to people or domestic animals. Pet owners should report to DCBH any incident in which their pet has been bitten by or has an open wound exposed to the saliva or nervous tissue of a domestic or wild animal. Staff will investigate and advise the pet owner of any necessary steps they should take to ensure the safety of their animal.

Residents who see an animal acting strangely are advised to contact their local police agency. If a person has been bitten, or a domestic pet is bitten or is in contact, with any animal, they're to contact DBCH immediately at 845-486-3404 Monday through Friday 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., or 845-431-6465 on nights and weekends.

According to FHS information: "In the colonial era, market days were an opportunity for craftspeople, farmers, and friends to come together for fellowship and to stock up on needed goods."

Mackenzie said, "In addition to housing the Van Wyck Family for several generations, the homestead had a significant role during the Revolutionary War as it was the Officer's Headquarters for the Fishkill Supply Depot." She told Southern Dutchess News, "The museum building was used by George Washington's Continental Army as the officer's headquarters of the Fishkill Supply Depot. The nation's 250th birthday is coming up fast and the Van Wyck Homestead Museum is

a venerable location to learn Fishkill's massive role to keep the Continental Army strong enough to gain our independence from Britain."

The depot supported the operations of the Continental Army and the New York State militia throughout the Revolutionary War. Maintaining this historic site to tell Fishkill's story is the mission of the historical society, according to information from FHS.

So, what will one find at this annual market?

There will be more than 25 vendors selling a variety of arts and crafts. Among some of the items available will be jewelry, knit clothing, quilted bags, wooden pieces, resin art and more.

The FHS members will also have food available for purchase. Some of the available food items will be homemade soups, chili, baked goods and hot dogs. FHS members are known for the made-to-order fritters, which will also be on the menu.

"We are lucky to have East Fishkill resident Bruce Beard demonstrating 18th century style woodworking at the event as well as musician Cara Schuman playing 18th-century tunes on the patio," said Mackenzie.

who performs a notable act of distinction while in the performance of duty.

Lifesaving Commendations are presented to a Town of Wappinger first responder who is directly responsible for saving a human life, meeting specific defined criteria.

This year, first responders and agencies were recognized for responding to a variety of critical incidents including

serious injury motor vehicle accidents, a mass casualty incident, an armed robbery, reviving a patient in cardiac arrest, and preventing a female from jumping from a bridge.

In one notable instance, New York State Troopers James P. Flynn-Kocourek and Michael J. Winkelman earned Lifesaving Commendations for their actions at a motor vehicle accident on Route 9D during the

early morning of September 22, 2022. Upon arrival, troopers discovered a vehicle into a building with a utility pole and live power lines down. Both the vehicle and the building were on fire. The troopers worked together to pull the unconscious 17-year-old driver out of the front passenger window as the vehicle and building became completely consumed in flames.

Notes from the Town of Wappinger Supervisor

A most critical budget

Town of Wappinger Proposed 2024 Budget

The Town's 2024 Budget will be the most important budget in many years. Thanks to our well-managed spending during 2023, we increased an already strong fund balance. My Tentative 2024 Budget is designed to use wisely our strong fund balance in order to enable Wappinger residents to weather a very challenging 2024.

On October 4th, the Town Board received my 2024 Tentative Budget. I built into this budget certain assumptions of deteriorating U.S. economic conditions, including:

- U.S. Congress spending legislation deliberations will continue to remain contentious and, consequently impacting economic conditions;
- Inflationary pressures will remain strong, continuing well into 2024;

- Interest and mortgage rates will remain high, at least until mid-year 2024, while housing values will decline. Availability of an affordable housing inventory in Wappinger will be non-existent;

- Retail sales will cool, forcing more small businesses to close their doors, thus resulting in a declining local tax base under growing recessionary pressures;

- The labor market may face even greater pressures as inflation continues and recession looms; and last but by no means least

- Beyond the control of the Town Board, your TOW real property assessments increased significantly for the fiscal year 2024. Based on our estimates it is an average increase of 10.30% (\$30,000+) (subject to verification).

All of the above conditions will place heavier burdens on each of us, most especially our senior residents who have limited, if any, discretionary spending ability. The financial stress we will experience, especially as family savings are depleted further, will impact us as we struggle under the weight of rising energy prices and borrowing costs and

small income growth.

I have calculated those anticipated conditions into my Tentative 2024 Budget, thereby intentionally lowering both the actual and "effective" 2024 tax rates. In summary, the 2024 Tentative Budget:

- Reduces Town departmental capital expenditures. We may need to consider further reductions, such as in our highway budget. NB - the Town Board has not yet determined how/when to use the \$2.2 million in COVID-ARPA funds (to be earmarked for water/sewer infrastructure improvement).

- Incorporates a continued low level of mortgage tax revenues;

- Maintains the same level of sales tax revenues, although I fear that our projections may be too high;

- Maintains no growth in Parkland Trust funds (historically used for improvements to Town parks/facilities);

- Builds in significant growth in the costs for medical coverage, insurance and pensions for Town employees because of inflationary pressures;

- Adds a \$137,000 cost increase for our ambulance services (Empress has delivered notice of these huge increases) and \$50,000 for police services - in order to maintain the 2023 level of services;

- Draws down the Town's A Fund by nearly \$400,000 (no revenue growth is projected). Upon further discussion, we could draw down even further;

- Draws down the Town's B Fund by nearly \$300,000 (no revenue growth is projected). Upon further discussion, we could draw down even further; and

- Draws down the Town's DB (Highway) Fund Balance by nearly \$150,000. Upon further discussion, we could draw down even further. And, major winter storms may require additional drawdown;

The tax rate impact under my Tentative 2024 Budget would be:

- Village Residents - \$0.54 per \$1k assessed value (2023 = \$0.74) / -27.51%
- Town and Village Residents - \$1.43 (\$1.83) / -22.61%

Maintaining a responsible tax rate is a critical responsibility of our Elected Officials. Accordingly, our Town Board must ensure that we provide basic services within the budgetary constraints required by ever-changing economic conditions. All the while, the Town Board must focus on a fair, open, and responsive budget that incorporates greater efficiencies and cost-effective programs.

During the Town Board budget meetings/public hearing, the four other Town Board members will review my Tentative Budget. Throughout the process, please remember that the **2024 budget IS YOUR BUDGET**. And, throughout the Fall 2023 election campaign, challenge the candidates on where they stand on your taxes. And, always, sift out factual misrepresentations.

Please turn out for our Board meetings, share your concerns and opinions, and

then hold your Town officials and staff accountable throughout 2024.

Until soon, stay safe and remain well.

Role-play scenarios offer DCFS staff insight into the clients' situations

Staff from the Dutchess County Department of Community and Family Services (DCFS) couldn't pay their bills on time, struggled to figure out transportation to work, faced unexpected health issues and much more.

It was all part of an immersive poverty simulation designed to help them better understand the complex needs many of their clients have – with the ultimate goal of reinforcing empathy and compassion for the County residents they serve each day to offer even better service. The training, held at the MJN Convention Center in Poughkeepsie, took place throughout the day in two sessions, allowing staff from each of DCFS' various departments to take part and benefit.

During the September 27th simulation, DCFS employees assumed the roles of individuals and families living on limited incomes. They had to navigate a variety of real-life scenarios, such as finding employment, securing housing and accessing essential services, all while trying to meet their basic needs. This hands-on experience provided DCFS staff a firsthand perspective on the challenges many clients encounter while allowing them to develop a deeper appreciation for the complexities of poverty – all to better serve residents who come to DCFS for assistance.

DCFS Commissioner Sabrina Jaar Marzouka said, "Understanding the experiences of our clients and the challenges they have as they navigate our systems is essential for providing effective support and assistance. Today's poverty simulation training underscores our County's commitment to empathetic service and

our dedication to improving the lives of our residents."

In 2022, DCFS delivered services to more than 1 in 10 Dutchess County residents, reaching over 30,000 unduplicated individuals across all programs, including temporary assistance, child and adult protective services, youth services, foster care, Medicaid and child support, among others.

Poverty is a complex issue that affects individuals and families in numerous ways, and DCFS is committed to equipping its staff with the knowledge and understanding needed to better serve the community. Today's poverty simulation training offered a unique opportunity for staff members to gain insights into the daily struggles and obstacles faced by residents living in poverty.

The poverty simulation is a highly interactive experience designed to help participants understand what a typical low-income family experiences trying to survive from month to month. In today's simulation, DCFS staff assumed the roles of family members in poverty who interacted with volunteers playing the roles of service providers and other community resources, including a bank, employer, supermarket, health clinic, landlord, school, child care, social services department and utility company.

Poverty simulations are powerful exercises designed to help human service providers deepen their understanding of the day-to-day challenges faced by those living in poverty and how current systems, policies and practices create barriers.

DCFS is committed to supporting its

workforce to better address the unique needs of the individuals and families it serves. The department's ongoing commitment to professional development ensures staff members are equipped with the knowledge and skills necessary to make a meaningful difference in the lives of Dutchess County residents.

Commissioner Marzouka said, "Residents who seek assistance from us

do so during challenging times in their lives, when they need the most compassion from the staff serving them. Today's training reinforced the difficulties our clients often face, allowing our workers to see things from the client's perspective and incorporate this experience when helping residents."

In addition to her parents and husband, she was predeceased by her sister, Rose Garnot and her brothers, Morris and Frank Garnot.



Housing Authority for 30 years prior to his retirement. Edwin enjoyed fishing, especially in the summer months. More than anything, he loved spending time with his grandchildren.



that's italian!



My grandfather was a fisherman, growing up on a tiny island off the coast of Italy called Ischia. Because of that, fishing has always been in my family's blood. I can remember during the summer, my family would travel to Norwalk, Connecticut and rent a small wooden skiff with a small outboard motor and go fishing in the Long Island Sound. My grandmother would usually accompany us on these trips and sing old Italian songs while we fished.

Now, fishing in my family was a little different than your average American families. For one, fishing usually centered around food. One of the dishes my mother would make was spaghetti pie, a sort of spaghetti quiche, that we would cut up and eat cold usually with some espresso, as we made our way out to our favorite fishing spot, which was in a little cove by a lighthouse.

Another thing that was different was our fishing poles, or rather a lack of fishing poles. My mother explained that growing up during the war, there was very little money, so fishing poles were out of the question. We would fish with drop lines wrapped around a scrap piece of wood with a large sinker weight that would bring our hooks to the bottom. Once on the bottom, we would feel for fish nipping on our bait. When we felt they were eating, we would yank on our line and set the hook and pull up our fish.

One day, my oldest brother Nick brought home a "ship"! In reality it was an old beat-up 15-foot Chris Craft, but to the eyes of an 8-year-old kid it was a huge "ship" on the scale of the Titanic. There was a lot of excitement in the air with everyone helping to fix and clean this huge "ship" that was parked on a trailer of death in our driveway in anticipation of our first fishing trip to Connecticut on Memorial Day.

On the day of the christening, mom made the Spaghetti Pie, the drop lines were packed, the ice chest filled with wine, sandwiches and snacks was ready to go. On the morning of Memorial Day, we all packed into our huge brown Oldsmobile station wagon land yacht, with our "ship" perched on the trailer of death hooked up behind it, and headed for Norwalk, Connecticut.

We were all anxious. My little brother Vinny and I were riding in the back and talked incessantly about how many fish we were going to catch. Everyone was happy and excited. My older brothers were even patient with Vinny and me and didn't yell at us for talking too much.

It was amazing how quickly that all changed.

Upon arriving at the boat launch, we soon realized that we had to back the boat into the water. For inexperienced boat people, this was no easy task, with many people screaming at us because we were taking so long and others offering to do it for us, just so we would get out of the way. Once we got our "ship" in the water and parked our land yacht with its trailer of death, we all piled into our "ship." My father decided he would take the boat out of the harbor because he was more "experienced."

Pop took the key, put it into the ignition, turned the key and ... nothing. He tried it again ... still nothing. We checked the cables to the battery. Okay, now that the battery was hooked up, he turned the key and ... It turned over but wouldn't start. We checked the gas tank ... No gas Okay, put gas in the tank. ... Pop turned the key. It turned over, sputtered a little and wouldn't start.

Now people are really getting angry, because we are taking a spot up on the dock.

My father decides to pull the boat out of the water and check it out on dry land. Now we must back up the trailer of death back into the water. Another group of angry stares and snarky remarks as we struggled to back the trailer of death into the water. Once we got the boat out of the water, my father decided to start the engine. He put the key in the ignition, turned the key and ... SNAP! The key broke in the ignition. Somehow, he gets the key out of the ignition.

He decides to go to a locksmith and get a new key made. Meanwhile, my mother, my brother Vinny and I decide to take in the parade that was just starting. Upon our return from the parade, we found my father in the boat, out of the water with the engine running. He flashes a big smile at us. Everything is set, we are going fishing.

We back up the trailer of death down the ramp and into the water again, remove the boat and park it at the dock, park the car with the trailer of death, and all pile into the boat again.

Now, it is important to note that my assigned seat in this "ship" is in the very back, next to the outboard motor. When I get to my seat, I notice that we have water coming into our ship. Titanic is going down. I yelled to my father that we were sinking. He told me to shut up and sit down. So, I sat down and shut up.

I poked my brother Anthony in the rib as

we pulled out from the dock and pointed to the water coming into our ship. Just then the engine gave out.

My brother Anthony yells out to my father that we were sinking. Pop jumps to the back of the boat and realizes that we were, in fact, sinking. Vinny and I put on our life jackets and waited word to abandon ship, 5 feet from shore. We pull out the oars and row back to the dock with water coming in through the drain hole, all the while people watching us on the dock.

Out comes the trailer of death again and out comes the boat, again. So, as the water drains out of the boat, my father goes to buy a large garbage pail. He is going to fill it with water and run the engine in the garbage pail. Genius! Once all the water drains out, we put the missing drain plug in the hole, Pop starts the engine and runs it with a huge crowd watching this family of idiots try to fix their "ship." Mom breaks out the Spaghetti Pie and we have lunch.

Once Pop is satisfied that our Titanic is ready and that it won't sink, we back the trailer of death down the ramp for a fifth time, remove the boat and park it at the dock. My father decides that he is going to take a spin around the harbor and get the motor warmed up. Pop pulls away from the dock and tears around the harbor like a bat out of hell.

There are signs everywhere around a harbor that reads "No Wake!" Let's just say that we didn't know what that meant. Pop returns to the dock satisfied that the engine is OK. Once we all get into our "ship," a police boat pulls up to us and proceeds to chew my father out for making waves all over the harbor. Very calmly, my father looks at him and says "Me no speaka the English." The harbor police takes one look at my father, figures out that he is Italian and then proceeds to chew my father out again in ... Italian.

We were in trouble.

After Pop gets a ticket, he goes to turn on the engine and ... Yup, it wouldn't start. Pop, slumps behind the wheel, a defeated man. It's over. We back up the trailer of death, again load up the boat and go home. As a final insult, on the way home, our old brown station wagon land yacht decides to overheat.

When we finally got home, my brother Nick fiddled with the boat and decided to

give it another try. Pop wanted nothing to do with it and decided to take a nap instead. We brought our "ship" down to the river, backed it down the ramp easily (we had a lot of experience with that). With my brothers and my mother in the boat, the engine turned over on the first try (new keys, new gas, new cables, new drain plug), and we would take the first and final trip around the river in our "ship."

So as the boating season is starting to come to a close, and you get the itch to buy yourself a little boat, remember my story and remember this one tip. Sea water and fresh water are two different things when it comes to a boat engine.

Enjoy this recipe for Spaghetti Pie. When you are eating it, make sure to share my story. Ciao!

Spaghetti Pie Ingredients

1 (6 ounce) package spaghetti
2 tbsp. butter
1/2 cup grated Pecorino Romano
2 eggs, beaten
1/4 cup diced prosciutto
1/4 cup diced ham
1/4 cup diced salami
1 clove garlic, minced
1 tspn. white sugar
1 tspn. dried oregano
1/2 cup shredded mozzarella cheese

Directions

Cook and drain spaghetti. Stir all ingredients while the spaghetti is hot.

Form spaghetti mixture in a non-stick, oven-safe skillet.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Bake for 30 minutes.

Let cool. Cut up into wedges and serve cold.

'Brazilian'!

The Smithfield Church in Amenia presents an intimate Brazilian jazz performance on Oct. 7

It's been five years since musician and composer Matt Finley has presented a Rio JAZZ concert. For three decades Finley's group, comprised of world-class players, was well-known in the area for their annual April concerts at Dutchess Community College to celebrate Jazz Appreciation Month. On Saturday, Oct. 7, Finley – who knows his way around a flugelhorn and several other instruments – is bringing a different iteration of Rio JAZZ to The Smithfield Church in Amenia for "Intimate Brazilian Jazz," a program of original music along with works by the likes of Antonio Carlos Jobim.

The concert, which is open to the public, will begin at 4 p.m. There is a suggested donation of \$20.

Finley is the director of the Smithfield Chamber Orchestra, which presents concerts at the historic Amenia church in late spring and around Christmastime. It's safe to say that he's had a longtime love of Brazilian jazz.

"I was a pioneer in the music of Brazil as interpreted by North American jazz players since I began playing gigs in 1963, just as the Bossa Nova wave hit the airwaves in the USA," Finley said. "This will be the first small-group concert for me in five years, since I am normally found directing the orchestra or composing and performing with area jazz big

bands, but I never stopped writing for small jazz groups."

Finley added, "During the pandemic, I completely overhauled my musical tools and skills and wrote many of the compositions that will be played at this concert, returning to the style popularized by my band of over 30 years, Rio JAZZ."

Joining Finley for Saturday's concert are Larry Ham, piano; Lou Pappas, bass; and Jeff Siegel, drums. Original compositions by Finley, Ham and Siegel are part of the program.

The concert is sponsored by the Bang Family Concert Series.

There is a lovely story behind the creation of the series. Before he died, Bill Bang, a one-time musician, asked his daughter, parishioner Susan Bang, what drew her to the Smithfield Church. She replied, "First, I came for the music at the annual Christmas Concert and Tea. Then, I realized the spiritual beauty of the church and its congregation. And finally, I became a member because I rediscovered my faith." Bill wanted others to be inspired by the power of music to embrace worship again, so he endowed the Bang Family Concert Series to draw visitors into the fold while providing the church with a new avenue for musicians in the region.
