Wappinger sets four days of Carni'fall' and community

“Wappinger Community Day 2022 will span over the entire four-day Columbus Day Holiday weekend (October 7, 8, 9, and 10). Known as Carni“fall,” our activities will be provided for all ages at our Brexil-Schlathaus Park located at Myers Corner Road and All Angels Hills Road,” explained Town of Wappinger Supervisor Richard Thurston.

“So many favorite events will be back this year, as well as some new ones,” said the supervisor.

Among those favorites activities will be:

- Friday night Bonfire beginning at 7 p.m.
- Four days of carnival rides for young and young at heart
- Concerts performed by favorite bands
- Saturday afternoon parade along Myers corner Road (2 p.m. step off).
- Fireworks on Saturday night starting at 8:30 p.m.
- Food and crafts vendors

“Don’t forget that right across the street from Schlathaus Park is Meadowbrook Farm that will be selling cider, apples, delicious donuts and other Fall favorites,” suggested Thurston.

This year, the parade’s Grand Marshal will be Denise Doring VanBuren, a Wappinger resident and the 45th President General of the National Society Daughters of the American Revolution.

“I was surprised and delighted to be honored with this opportunity -- especially because I am so happy to be home again!” said VanBuren. “My three-year term as President General of the National Society of the Daughters of the American

Revolution ended in early July - I had been living in Washington, D.C., for the past three years and traveled about 167,000 miles during my term in office to visit all of the states and several foreign countries. How wonderful it is to return to Wappinger and Dutchess County to rediscover hometown life and reconnect with friends. I’m just thrilled to be the Grand Marshal of this year’s celebration to mark that homecoming.”

As for what Wappinger means to her, VanBuren said, “My family moved from the City of Beacon to the Wappinger hamlet of Chelsea 21 years ago to restore an 1840 farmhouse that was once a dairy farm. We love it here -- we’re close to the river, and the hamlet is a charming little place on the Hudson and one that few

Wappinger’s Ralph Holt was ‘always there to help those in need’

Wappinger resident Ralph Holt, who made an impact on the Town of Wappinger by leaving a legacy with the Town’s Recreation Department and Little League, is being remembered. He also played a big part in the Dutchess County Sports Museum, which is located in the town. Holt died on September 24 at the age of 93.

Joseph Cavaccini is the historian for the town of Wappinger. He also represents Wappinger residents in the Dutchess County Legislature. He had known Holt for years.

“We have lost a true legend in our community,” said Cavaccini. “Ralph was a dear friend and mentor to many, the epitome of a good person. I will never forget all the memories we shared from planning events, meeting with business owners to support recreation programs, talking about golf and his travels, and all of the meals we shared in almost every restaurant in Wappinger.”

Cavaccini remarked he would be “forever grateful to him for his guidance, support, counsel, and most of all our friendship.

“I considered Ralph as a grandfather figure to me; he was there when I needed it and I was there for him. With his thick Boston accent, firm handshake, and selfless personality; Ralph was always there to help those in need. Whether it was a senior or a veteran or a child learning how to throw his first curveball, he truly left his mark on so many and in so many ways; and I am fortunate to have shared as much time as I did with him,” said Cavaccini.

Holt served in the U.S. Navy after he graduated from high school in Massachusetts. After his service, he enrolled in Northeastern University where he earned a degree in Finance, states his obituary.

Holt and his wife, Sylvia (who predeceased him) moved to Dutchess

Relative of Marist student dies in shooting at Poughkeepsie hotel

The relative of a Marist College student died and two individuals are in police custody after a shooting on Sunday morning at the Courtyard Marriott hotel on South Road in the Town of Poughkeepsie.

According to statements from the Town of Poughkeepsie Police Department, they received a 911 call of a disturbance at the Courtyard Marriott at 7:30 a.m. During the phone call, it was reported that shots had been fired. Two male suspects were located and taken into custody. One male victim was located inside the hotel. The victim was transported to a local area hospital where he

was later pronounced deceased. No other injuries were reported.

“Two individuals that are in custody are known to law enforcement, having no association with the parent of the student that we are aware of, and we do not believe that it is affiliated or associated with activities at Marist,” Dutchess County Executive Marc Molinaro said.

Charged in the incident were: Roy A. Johnson Jr., 25, was charged with one count of murder in the 2nd degree class A-1 felony and one count of criminal possession of a weapon in the 2nd degree C felony. Johnson was remanded to Dutchess County Jail with no

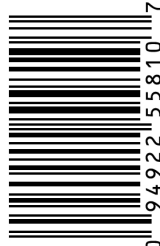
bail. Devin M. Taylor, 26, was charged with two counts of criminal possession of a weapon in the 2nd degree class C felony. Taylor was remanded to Dutchess County Jail on \$500,000 cash, \$1 million bond or \$5 million dollars partially secured.

Dutchess County Emergency Response and Red Cross responded to the scene to assist with the guests who were staying at the hotel. Dutchess County Emergency Response and Marist College assisted with transporting guests from the scene. All guests and staff were relocated and it has been determined that there is no active threat to the public.

# Library vote set for Oct. 6 in East Fishkill

The annual vote of the East Fishkill Public Library District is scheduled for 12 p.m. to 9 p.m., Thursday October 6 at the Library, 348 Rte 376, Hopewell Junction. The Library Board is seeking an increase in compliance with the New York State Tax Cap law bringing the levy amount up to \$1,057,522 which works out to a few dollars for the average home in East Fishkill.

The Library is looking to expand programming for adults and children as attendance reaches pre-pandemic levels. "Attendance has been increasing as more people are comfortable going back to their old routines and we're seeing more interest in story time and craft programs for children and DIY programming for adults," stated Library Director Gloria Goverman. "We're happy to see the positive energy and want to meet the increase in demand."

Running for three-year terms as Library

trustees are incumbents Robert Miller, Seth Jacobs, and Michael Nolan. Miller is on the ballot and Jacobs and Nolan are running write-in campaigns.

For those who are unable to vote in person due to school, business, illness, or vacation, absentee ballot applications are available at the library and as a download on the library webpage. After receiving an absentee ballot application, the completed ballot must be returned to the library by 9 p.m. on October 6, the day of the vote. Eligible East Fishkill voters who are registered with the Dutchess County Board of Elections as permanent absentees have automatically received a ballot mailed to their home.

County when he began working for I.B.M. in Poughkeepsie. Ralph and Sylvia were parents to five sons. Their son, Brian, predeceased him.

Town of Wappinger Supervisor Richard Thurston said, "Ralph Holt's earthly departure has left a large void in our community. A truly remarkable "gentle giant" of a man, Ralph left an indelible impression on all with whom he came into contact over his 93 years."

Thurston told of when he first met Holt in 2018.

"Quickly, I came to learn and deeply appreciate that he was the heart and soul of all aspects of our Town's recreation and sports activities. And his love and caring became the persona of our Town's many other activities most especially our veterans-related activities and our annual Community Day celebrations. This year, I will leave an empty seat for Ralph on the reviewing stand of the Community Day Parade. I know he will be watching," remarked Thurston.

Town of Wappinger Recreation Director Jessica Fulton said, "Ralph dedicated his life to the mentoring of children and the members of this community. Everything we do in the Recreation Department is thanks to the foundation that he built over a decades long career of service to the Town of Wappinger."

Holt's obituary states that he and his wife put their sons in the Town of Wappinger Little League (TOWLL) because they needed to keep their sons busy. He volunteered is time to Little League.

"Ralph was a great long-time supporter and contributor to the Town of Wappinger Little League. Ralph never missed an Opening Day and a chance to speak with the players. He was a very knowledgeable man and a great mentor of the game. Ralph will be missed by all of us in the TOWLL," said Jeff Tomlins, current president of TOWLL,

# Judge orders water, sewer extension for Continental Commons; requires health department approval

A State Supreme Court judge ordered that the extension for water and sewer by Continental Commons be remanded and the Fishkill Town Board is directed to grant the petitions. The order was handed down by Judge Christi Acker on September 19. The denial of the application for water and sewer was in 2020.

Continental Commons is a proposed project to be across from The Home Depot, off of Route 9D, in Fishkill. The project is described as “an 18th century colonial village of restaurants, shops, inn, and a living museum,” by its applicant.

GLD3 LLC and Snook-9 Realty, Inc. petitioned the court seeking an order to annul and vacate resolutions from September 16, 2020 and to approve the extension of Blodgett Water District Extension #1 and Blodgett Sewer District #1, according to the Decision and Order documents. At the time, Fishkill Supervisor Ozzy Albra and council members, Jacqueline Bardini, Kenya Gadsden and Louise Daniele voted to deny Continental Commons’s water and sewer petitions. According to the 17-page court documents, the Water Extension resolution stated that the “Town Board determined that the Petition is “not otherwise sufficient” and that it “is not in the public interest” to grant the Petition.

Domenic Broccoli, petitioner for the project, said in a statement, “Albra has put partisan politics ahead of the rule of law. A[n] illegal water and sewer extension decision, on property that already has

water and sewer infrastructure, and went through a 4- year State Environmental Quality Review, must, and should, be based on the facts, property rights, and the law, not petty partisan politics.”

The DCDOH (Dutchess County Department of Health) comments contained in a June 3, 2020 memo “do not identify any issues that implicate public health or safety concerns related to the extension of the Water and Sewer Districts,” it states in the court documents.

“This memo shows that DCDOH was tasked with the responsibility to review the water and sewer infrastructure for the Project for health and safety. It was actively doing so when the Town Board denied Petitioners’ application. In short, the Board’s conclusions that it was not in the public interest to grant the Water and Sewer Extension applications are not supported by substantial evidence because the Board relied upon a document which was silent about public interest concerns,” the documents from the court state.

“It is clear from the record that the sewer and water connections would not be made without DOH approval. In short, the Board’s conclusions that it was not in the public interest to grant the Water and Sewer Extension applications are not supported by substantial evidence because the Board relied upon a document which was silent about public interest concerns,” according to the court document.

Albra said recently about the ruling by the Ackert, “I’m very satisfied that the judge is

protecting the town.” He said the judge wants DOH approval before water and sewer are connected. The town will not take over the maintenance of the lines, but the town will own the district, noted Albra.

The Court also found that “there is “no proof at all” that the proposed extension of the Blodgett Water and Sewer Districts is contrary to the public interest,” court papers read. The court document reads that “While the record is rife with public opposition to the Project in general, there is no evidence that the approval of the Water and Sewer Extensions would be contrary to the public interest.”

Broccoli stated, “As I have said in the past, I am committed to developing the 18th century colonial themed village of restaurants, shops, an inn, visitor’s center, with a design that integrates architectural features of Revolutionary War buildings throughout Dutchess County. We look forward to construction, and further honoring the birth of our Nation. Like the American Revolutionary War patriots that fought at the Fishkill Supply Depot, my opponents tried to deprive me of my property rights, but they underestimated me. Hussah!” added Broccoli.”

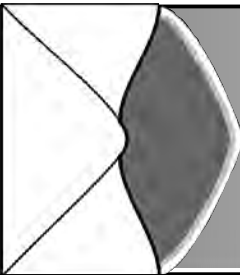

This past May a group of candidates ran for Wappingers Central School board, none of whom had children in the public school system. Two of the three had no children at all. I will remember this on Election Day.

## East Fishkill leaders following Constitutional amendment

To the Editor:

A recent letter chided East Fishkill officials for not banning the group, Moms for Liberty (MFL), from the E.F. Community Day event. The writer cited a petition calling on the officials to “not allow a group whose members of its national organization are permitted to make racist, homophobic, transphobic comments to attend their Community Day.” Very often, racism, homophobia and transphobia are inferred, not implied. Those terms are thrown around loosely by people who otherwise have difficulty defending their agenda.

The very first amendment to our Constitution states emphatically that “Congress shall make no law ... abridging the freedom of speech ...” Courts have interpreted that to include all of government. Had East Fishkill officials banned the group based on their speech, they would have been in violation of the First Amendment and the New York Constitution.

The writer also accused MFL of wanting to “ban books.” The website of the group the writer said he is associated with, i.e., “Defense of Democracy” says, “We support our educators who are trained to make decisions regarding which books would be appropriate on their shelves.”

Obviously, such “decisions” would include deeming some books not appropriate. In other words, they don’t have a problem with “banning books” as long as it is “trained educators” doing the banning. MFL believes parents should have a say in those decisions.

For the record, I have no affiliation whatsoever with “Moms for Liberty.”

## Police: Shots fired into pizzeria in Fishkill, suspect arrested

The New York State Police, Town of Fishkill, and Village of Fishkill Police Departments responded to Antonella’s Pizza located on State Route 9 in the village of Fishkill for a report of shots fired into the business on Oct. 2 regarding a shooting. Responding officers safely located six individuals that were in the building at the time of the shooting, none of which were injured, according to a press release from NYS Police.

State Police personnel in conjunction with the Town of Fishkill and Village of Fishkill Police Departments immediately began searching for the suspect, who fled the scene. According to law enforcement, the suspect was identified as, Gary P. Bonventre Jr., 42, of Fishkill. He was taken into custody soon after without further incident. Investigators recovered a Rohm .22 short caliber revolver.

According to State Police, Bonventre was arrested for six counts of Attempted Assault in the 1st degree, Criminal Use of a Firearm in the 2nd degree, Criminal Possession of a Weapon in the 2nd degree, all class C felonies, and six counts of Reckless Endangerment in the 1st degree, a class D felony.

Bonventre was arraigned before the Honorable Judge Wolfson of the Village of Fishkill Court and remanded to the Dutchess County Jail in lieu of \$100,000 cash bail, \$100,000 secure bond, or \$1,000,000 partially secure bond. Bonventre is scheduled to reappear before the court on October 17, according to law enforcement.

# Wappinger suffered losses of special residents, structure in September

In many respects, September was a painful month for Wappinger in that we experienced several significant losses. Following are some thought in memory of a couple of our dear departed friends and a devastating fire in Highsonville.

• **Eileen P. Ennesser** - Eileen and her husband loved life. More especially, the Ennessers loved giving to our community. On September 10th Eileen passed peacefully from this world to be with her husband Joe (who had pre-deceased her in January 2020 at the young age of 85). While working in the library at John Jay High School, Eileen joined her husband in volunteer work for our Wappinger Little League, both baseball and softball. We would not have our amazing Sports Museum of Dutchess County without their dedicated support over the years. In fact, they co-founded the Museum now located at the Town's Carnwath Farms. Eileen also played a key role in supporting Joe in the establishment and maintenance of our Town's Greenway Trails. • **Ralph Joseph Holt** - The gentle giant of a human being, Ralph Holt, left us on September 24th. Ralph's love for our youth and for baseball impacted our community in so many different ways. Ralph started his dedication to the sport of baseball at Lowell High School, MA., and then on to the U.S. Navy, and finally to our Little League organizations. After moving to Wappinger with Sylvia, the love of his life, in 1956 (he worked in Finance at IBM), Ralph went on to manage many Wappinger Little League teams, both baseball and softball. I first met Ralph upon becoming Supervisor: at the time he chaired our Recreation Committee. Never a day went by when he did not care for and seek to help our community and especially our youth. While Ralph proudly recalled and often talked about all of their accomplishments, both on and off the field, according to his son Dennis, "one of his proudest moments for his teams" was the 1970 NY State All-star team that he had managed. For all that he accomplished, especially for our youth, he is an inductee of both the Dutchess County Old Timers Baseball Association Hall of Fame and the hall of fame of the Sports Museum of Dutchess County. As Chairperson of the former Wappinger Recreation Commission and later the Recreation Committee, Ralph played an instrumental role in the establishment and maintenance of our ball fields at

the Robinson Lane Complex (where the Town named the road within the grounds "Ralph Holt Way"), Martz Field, and Rockingham Park, to name a few. We will dearly miss Ralph during the months and years ahead. The family is noting that donations may be made to the Brian H. Holt Scholarship at Siena College.

• **Historic Hughsonville Building Lost to Fire** - During the early morning of September 22nd our beloved "Red Barn" succumbed to a devastating fire ignited by an auto accident. This 1865 structure, located at Route 9D and Marlerville Road, had become a landmark for the Hughsonville Hamlet and the greater Wappinger Community. Recently the owners, Peter and Rebecca, had completed significant interior and exterior renovations, hoping to reopen the building as an antique shop. While the building had to be demolished because of the extensive structural fire damage, Rebecca and Peter hope to salvage as much as possible from the rubble to be incorporated into a new building and for fund-raising donations to help to rebuild the Red Barn. Fortunately, our Town's first responders were able to arrive at the site within minutes of the crash to contain the fire to the immediate structure. Also, our Town's Fire and Building Inspectors along with the Town Supervisor arrived promptly on the scene. Highway Superintendent Mike Sheehan helped with the demolition project, while Central Hudson arrived to install a new utility pole also damaged during the car accident. The young driver of the car was rescued quickly by NY State Troopers from their near-by barracks located in the Town's Emergency Services Building on Middlebush Road. The driver has survived the accident.

# 'Ready Dutchess' mobile app can help families plan for an emergency

The Dutchess County Department of Emergency Response (DER) is helping residents plan ahead for emergencies with new tools, including the "Ready Dutchess" mobile application for planning and updates, and a new voluntary Access & Functional Needs (AFN) Registry for those who may need additional assistance leaving their home in the event of an emergency evacuation.

County Executive Marc Molinaro said, "Before, during and after an emergency, it's important to know how to keep yourself and your family safe. It's even more important for first responders to be aware of residents who may need additional assistance in an evacuation. Our Department of Emergency Response continues to provide tools and resources for residents and emergency responders to be as prepared as possible and recover quickly."

The "Ready Dutchess" app provides anyone with a smartphone or tablet the latest information during an emergency – from push notifications about local road or facility closures and severe weather updates, to planning tools and checklists. The app provides users various resources and links, including:

- A "My Emergency Plan" tool for building a plan to know what to do before, during and after any kind of emergency;
- Live traffic updates from New York State's 5-1-1, which provides up-to-the-minute transit information from the State's Department of Transportation;
- A map that will display countywide emergency shelters and cooling/warming centers, when open;
- Links to local closing and delay information for local school districts, businesses and events;
- Links to electric companies NYSEG and Central Hudson Gas & Electric Corp for updates on power outages;
- Calendar and registration information for upcoming Citizens' Preparedness and Medical Reserve Corps of Dutchess County trainings open to the public;
- A link to the County health department's HELPLINE application; and
- Information on emergent health issues, such as the COVID-19 pandemic or

monkeypox.

The app also includes a link for users to register for the County's new Access & Functional Needs (AFN) Registry. Residents who have a physical or mental disability and would need assistance leaving their home quickly in the event of an emergency are encouraged to sign up so resources can be planned accordingly during an emergency event. The AFN registry is intended for those who live independently or without live-in support who would require additional assistance such as transportation, mobility support or a place to stay if a major emergency or disaster required evacuation.

This voluntary list will only be shared with local municipalities, County, State and Federal agencies involved in emergency response efforts to identify who is in need and where to focus resources. Registration and additional information are available online at [dutchessny.gov/AFNRegistry](http://dutchessny.gov/AFNRegistry) or by calling DER at 845-486-2080.

DER Commissioner Dana Smith said, "The 'Ready Dutchess' application offers our department a better way to alert, inform and prepare the public in the event of an emergency. The Access & Functional Needs registry is a vital tool to helping coordinated response efforts, providing emergency response agencies an accurate map of where vulnerable individuals are located to best direct resources in an emergency."

The "Ready Dutchess" mobile app is available for free download through the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store, and the app complements the Dutchess County HELPLINE app, designed to help people recognize warning signs of suicide and provide numerous behavioral health resources, information and assistance for those struggling with addiction, substance use issues and/or mental illness.

Molinaro said, "[D]ownload and use the 'Ready Dutchess' app, and we urge those who may need help leaving their home quickly in an emergency to complete the Access & Functional Needs Registry form. A few minutes of preparation before an emergency strikes may be the difference between life and death."

Local resident Donna Thomas said she is a mom with a cause. Her cause is to bring attention to her son James's life through James's Warriors.

"James's Warriors was built out of love from my son, James Thomas, who died by suicide on 10/19/2018. He was just 19 years old. James was never diagnosed with a mental health illness," said Donna recently.

The 3rd Annual James's Warriors Memorial Car/Bike Show will be held on October 16. Cars will be admitted at 9 a.m., spectators admitted at 11 a.m., and the show will be until 4 p.m. at Dutchess Stadium, 1500 Route 9D, in Fishkill. Prices to have one's car in the show are pre-register for \$20, at [www.carshow-pro.com/event/1122](http://www.carshow-pro.com/event/1122), or the price is \$25 at gate. Admission price for spectators is \$5. The ";" in "warriors," explained Donna, "is a symbol of hope for those who are struggling with mental health and thoughts of suicide." On the website, [Jameswarriors.com](http://Jameswarriors.com), it states that "It helps serve as a reminder that your story isn't over yet and you can share your story without shame. A semicolon is used when a writer could have chosen to end their sentence but chose not to. You are the writer and the sentence is you. Your life can continue. Your life matters and you are someone's blessing."

Donna said about James, "If you ask anyone to describe James, they will say he was really funny. No one really knew how bad he was struggling. On the outside, he looked good. He was handsome, a barber at the Imperial Barber Shop in Wappingers Falls." Her son had bought a new car and had a beautiful girlfriend and family and friends who loved him, said Donna.

"Shortly after James died, I realized quite quickly there are many people who suffer from mental illness but in silence. They believe they are alone," remarked Donna.

That is how Donna decided she would try to change the stigma associated with mental illness and suicide.

"I am extremely grateful that Dr. Jaimee Arnoff of Beacon (BFF Therapy) who decided to join me in developing a Mental Health Awareness and Suicide Prevention Program," Donna stated. "We present in schools, colleges and for community-based programs. I tell James's story and Dr. Jaimee presents the clinical side of the presentation. We teach our students some simple coping skills and give out coping kits at our presentations."

Donna said, "This is our big fundraiser for the year. James loved cars and what better way to raise money for our not-for-profit organization."

As for why the annual fundraiser is held

in October, Donna explained, "We do it on the Sunday close to the anniversary of his death. It helps us get through the anniversary knowing we are raising money to save lives. This is a family fun day. Besides the cars we have award winning food trucks, exceptional music performers, vendors, bouncy house, face painting, 50/50 and raffles. The proceeds from this car show helps us to carry out our mission to save lives."

Donna said, "The bottom line is I never want another family to endure the pain of losing someone to Suicide. Our motto is "No One Walks Alone!" and we hope, with the help of the community, no one will feel alone in their struggles again."

As for her son, Donna said, "James was a good son and brother. He had the most beautiful smile, which I miss every day."

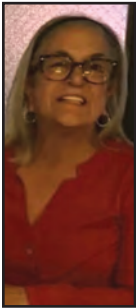
## Ralph J. Holt

long love of baseball. After graduating from Lowell High School, he enlisted in the Navy and was able to continue to play the game he loved. He was stationed on Quonset Point, RI. and along with his other duties, played baseball for three years. After being discharged from the Navy, Ralph went back to school, enrolling in Northeastern University in Boston, MA. He would go on to graduate in 1956 with a degree in Finance. He was the first in his family to graduate from college. While at Northeastern, Ralph married the love of his life, Sylvia (nee Lanthier) in 1953. Upon graduating in 1956, he accepted a job with IBM in Poughkeepsie, NY, and along with Sylvia, he moved to Wappingers Falls to begin their life together. Ralph and Sylvia would have five sons together. Needing to keep his boys busy, Ralph returned to the game he loved and became a manager within in the Town of Wappingers Little League. This would also mark the beginning of his love for community service. Over the ensuing years, Ralph's teams would win numerous championships at the various levels of competition, but the one championship that stood out over them all was the All-Star team he managed in 1970. This "very special" group of boys made the summer of 1970 an unforgettable one in Ralph's life. Working together in the true sense of the word "team", this group went on to capture the New York State title. Even though they fell short of their goal of playing at Williamsport, history had been made. Ralph would always speak fondly of this team, their work ethic and how much fun they were to be around. Ralph went on to coach teams at the Little League, Senior League, and Big Boy League level. He also coached teams in the Wappingers girls' softball league. Ralph also served as President of the Town of Wappingers Little League. For all of his efforts and contributions he made to the Little League, he was inducted into both he Dutchess County Sports Museum Hall of Fame and the Dutchess County Old Timers Baseball Association Hall of Fame. ## Sheriff's Office warns residents about scams

The Dutchess County Sheriff's Office is warning the residents of Dutchess County and surrounding areas about scams that once again seem to be on the rise. Scams are ways in which criminals will attempt to get money from people by contacting them and making up elaborate stories. In some cases, the perpetrators have tried, sometimes successfully, to use the victim's emotions about a loved one in trouble to get money. It's common for the perpetrators of these scams to try to get money by telling people that one of their relatives has been seriously hurt or is in jail, and that they need money right away. In many cases they will pose as a law enforcement official or another relative to try and convince the victim that it's legitimate. The latest scam involves the perpetrators posing as representatives of law enforcement. In a recent case, the perpetrators identified themselves as "Dutchess County Sgt. Cook," and attempted to get money from the victim by claiming that they needed to pay money to avoid pending criminal charges. The Sheriff's Office would like to offer the following tips to help people avoid these scams:

- Legitimate law enforcement would not attempt to satisfy a warrant or make promises to avoid prosecution by soliciting money.
- If you receive an email about an order you didn't place or asking you to send money call the company using a legitimate number. DO NOT follow the instructions in the email, click on any links in the email, or call the number provided in the email.
- If someone asks you to purchase merchandise, transfer money, provide bank information, or enter a code given to you by them, use caution as it is likely a scam.
- Do not meet up with someone that you don't know; if you're asked to do this it is surely a scam, and it is very dangerous as well.
- If you're contacted by someone you don't know asking for money, for any reason, that's a signal that it's most likely a scam.
- If someone calls you and tells you that a

relative has been hurt or is in jail, confirm it first before sending any money. Call other relatives or a legitimate law enforcement agency for confirmation before any money is sent. If they're posing as a relative, try and contact that relative for confirmation.

- Sending money overseas is especially risky; use extreme caution.
- Ask the person for their call-back number and ask to speak to their supervisor to confirm the info; if it's a scam they will most likely hang up at this point and the number they give you will be bogus.
- If the person is telling you that a loved one is in the hospital or jail, find out which one and contact the institution yourself to confirm.
- If a loved one has recently passed away be wary; in some cases perpetrators have even preyed on victims by searching through the obituaries and calling surviving loved ones. If you get calls from people you don't know soon after someone passes away, be careful and confirm it before you send any money.
- In some cases someone will call and tell the victim that they've won money, but to "process the claim" they need to first send money. Beware this is most definitely a scam and don't send any money – you should never have to pay money to claim a prize. If it seems too good to be true, it most likely is.
- If there's any doubt about a phone call or email you've received contact the Sheriff's Office before sending any money.
- Scams tend to increase during the holiday season, be especially alert for them during those times.

It is very important to not send any money to anyone that you don't know until you've confirmed the situation through an independent source and feel comfortable with it. If it's a scam, once the money is sent it's very difficult, and most times impossible, to get it back. # DECODING DUTCHESS PAST

## Exhibition of Caroline Clowes’extraordinary animal paintings offer life lessons & beauty

Delayed by the pandemic, and the result of years of research and archival restoration, the Dutchess County Historical Society has assembled the first dedicated exhibition that focuses exclusively on the works and life of LaGrange artist Caroline Morgan Clowes.

Clowes was recognized internationally in the 19th century for her depictions of local farm and domestic animals, but her legacy was allowed to fade away.

“Fertile Ground: The Hudson Valley Animal Paintings of Caroline Clowes” will be on view at the Locust Grove Estate on South Road in Poughkeepsie from Nov. 4 to Dec. 30 (More info at [www.dchsny.org](http://www.dchsny.org)).

As visitors will see, Clowes had an exceptional ability to capture light and shading, and to connect the viewer in a very intimate way with the animal.

In 1878, the Vassar College newspaper, Miscellany, quoted Henry Van Ingen, the head of the then-fledgling Art Department at Vassar College, complimenting the character of her “transparently solid flesh tints.” Though seemingly contradictory, it is precisely this luminosity and the skill and detail involved in depicting both ani-

mals and landscapes that makes her work so powerful.

Clowes’ personal story is compelling. She had to overcome personal tragedy and loss early in life, and experienced push-back and barriers as a woman wishing to succeed artistically and commercially in a field dominated by men.

Through thousands of pages of letters and diaries, the exhibition tells the story of a woman of vision and drive. Growing up among a cadre of accomplished women at her family home, Heartsease, she would later be buoyed by the support of nationally-renowned artists and educators involved in the 1865 founding of Vassar College. With hard work, perseverance, and a little luck, Clowes was able to shed her remote childhood in the Sullivan County woodlands for the national stage.

The exhibition is presented in four chapters. The first chapter, “Early Life,” examines her early life and the story of Clowes losing her mother when she was only two years old. A profoundly moving deathbed letter penned by her mother and addressed to her is part of the exhibition. She and her older sister were raised by their single father in the remote wood-

lands in Sullivan County until Clowes was 13 years old and effectively adopted by her late mother’s brother and family in LaGrange.

The second chapter, “Becoming an Artist,” explains Clowes’ training in art, was launched by a highly accomplished member of the family who lived at the same house. Poughkeepsie was then known as the city of schools, well before Vassar College opened 1865, and Clowes took full advantage of that. She took instruction at the Poughkeepsie Female Collegiate Institute, and later took private lessons from the renowned French painter Frederick Rondel.

The third chapter, “Her Work,” presents 25 paintings, including some loaned by private owners, and a number of sketches on paper that represent her work as a mature artist.

The fourth chapter, “Later Life and Legacy,” looks at the period when she was involved in the community through the newly founded Vassar Brothers Institute, now the Cunneen-Hackett Center, and looks at why her reputation might have been allowed to fade prematurely.
