Traffic and overdevelopment continue to be our biggest problems. I have enforced zoning laws and stopped 1,400 high density housing units from being built. This mitigates traffic by not making

Candidates were asked the following questions: (1) List your qualifications as they apply to this position in the legislature. (2) What do you see as the key issues in your district and the county in general?

Candidate responses are given per the areas covered by the Southern Dutchess News and Beacon Free Press.

(Responses from incumbents are given first. With two new candidates, alphabetical order is followed.)

District 1 - Town of Poughkeepsie

Incumbent – Democrat Giancarlo Llaverias

Background/qualifications - As a county legis

Background/qualifications - As a county legislator, I have consistently held Republicans accountable for their actions that negatively impact county resi-

Dear Voter,

I am Robin Licari, and I am running for Town Supervisor of the Town of Wappinger. I am a lifelong resident of Dutchess County and I have lived in the Town of Wappinger for 24 years. I attended our local schools and

graduated from Roy C. Ketcham High School, DCC, SUNY New Paltz. and received my master's degree from Adelphi University. I understand this community and its needs, hopes and dreams.

I was a businesswoman with stores in Wappinger, Beacon, and Fishkill. We sold our family business in 2012. We provided good jobs to residents for decades. I understand the problems of small businesses and their contribution to our community.

Developers should not determine zoning in this Town. Zoning is the purview of the Town Board, and it is about building what this community needs in an appropriate place within the Town.

If a problem is defined as too big, then it feels insurmountable. We do not have to resolve all the international and national problems to find answers to problems in this community. We need to break down our problems into solvable units and work on fixing these issues for instance, providing housing for seniors and young people so they don't have to leave their Town of Wappinger community to find housing, preserving our green spaces, maintaining access to clean drinkable water, decreasing taxes and the cost of utilities, and repairing our needed infrastructure.

I have life and work experience. Vote for someone who knows what your life is like in this community - working a full-time job, paying bills. You do this while raising children, caring for elderly parents, participating in faith-based communities and charitable organizations. Your days are long and working full-time is not an option, but a necessity.

Please vote for me on Election Day on November 7th. I will be your voice in this Town of Wappinger.

The Go Red for Women Luncheon is set for November 16, from 11 a.m. – 2 p.m. at The Culinary Institute of America, 1946 Campus Drive, in Hyde Park. For tickets, and more information, go to HudsonValleyGoRed.heart.org.

"The American Heart Association is working to create a Nation of Lifesavers – people who are trained in Hands-Only CPR. Only 70 percent of Americans feel comfortable performing CPR if they see someone suffer sudden cardiac arrest. We all saw that the quick reaction saved Damar Hamlin's life when he suffered sudden cardiac arrest during the January Buffalo Bills football game. We want everyone to be comfortable starting CPR if necessary, because that doubles or triples the chances of survival," said Monique Corcoran, Director of

Operations, Nuvance Health, and chair of the 2023 Hudson Valley Go Red for Women Celebration.

The Go Red for Women luncheon are held annually to bring attention to ending heart disease and stroke in women, according to the AHA.

"The Go Red for Women Celebration is an uplifting, heartwarming event that brings women together to change the statistic that cardiovascular disease is the No. 1 killer of women in America," said Corcoran.

The Festival of Red, from 11 a.m. to 12:30 p.m., is when guests may bid on silent auction items, including the popular "Purse-Onalities," and learn Hands-Only CPR thanks to Laerdal.

"Nuvance Health will be doing blood pressure checks. High blood pressure is known as the silent killer, so knowing if you have a healthy blood pressure can save your life. We'll have a Go Red selfie station, and a Tribute Wall where people can honor those they've lost to heart disease, or those fighting heart disease. We'll also have a Survivor Gallery that showcases the people who live with heart disease. And of course, people can enjoy culinary delights from the CIA," Corcoran remarked.

The program begins at 12:30 p.m.

"We'll celebrate the Women of Impact, three women who participated in a peer-to-peer fundraising campaign last winter. Karen Turvey, NP, of Nuvance Health, will be our keynote speaker, who will talk about ways women can improve their health. Penny Schouten of Wappingers Falls will share her story of surviving a heart attack. Schouten had symptoms for a week, which were first misdiagnosed as anxiety. We will also acknowledge two Youth Heart Ambassadors from local

schools. Attendees will go away with a deeper understanding of heart disease in women, and how they can live hearthealthy lives," said Corcoran.

Penny Schouten, a resident of Wappingers Falls, will be the survivor speaker.

"She is a very healthy woman who lived an active lifestyle and ate well. While visiting a friend's mother in the hospital, a nurse heard her talk about chest pains, and insisted she go to the emergency department. Penny was stunned to learn she'd had a heart attack," stated Corcoran.

This will be the second year that Corcoran is the chair for the Go Red for Women Celebration.

The Dutchess County Drug Task Force has been continuing to aggressively investigate drug dealers who sell poison in our communities. On October 25, during the early morning hours the Dutchess County Drug Task Force, Dutchess County Sheriff's Office Emergency Service Unit and the City of Poughkeepsie Police Neighborhood recovery unit executed search warrants at the residences of Kenyatta Jackson and Zaccia Curtis who both reside in the City of Poughkeepsie at separate locations. Zaccia Curtis is currently on Dutchess County Probation as result of a weapons conviction earlier this year. These raids are the result of an ongoing DTF investigation into Fentanyl and narcotic sales in the City and Town of Poughkeepsie. Upon executing both warrants, a quantity of Fentanyl, cocaine, and other narcotics were seized at both addresses and both Jackson and Curtis were taken into custody without incident. Both suspects are being held pending arraignment in the City of Poughkeepsie Justice Court later

The Dutchess County Drug Task Force is warning residents of Dutchess County that Fentanyl and drugs like crack cocaine that are mixed with Fentanyl, are not just deadly to individuals struggling with drug addiction, but are dangerous to everyone that may incidentally have contact with this poison.

They also reduced money that was allocated to the YOU center in Poughkeepsie and decided to spend \$5 million to retro-fit the jail as temporary housing for the homeless. At the same time, five mental health facilities were closed in the Hudson Valley because of a lack of staffing.

Our neighbors have shared my concerns about a lack of mental health care for our young people since COVID, a lack of affordable housing, and a lack of oversight in development that harms our natural resources. We need to work with MHA and DCC to promote these jobs so that our children and community get the care they need. In addition to this, we need to craft legislation that is committed to ensuring that our children have affordable housing that does not harm our natural resources so that our children can grow their own roots in Dutchess County.

District 14 Towns of Wappinger and Poughkeepsie Republican Lynne Miele-Versaci

Background/qualifications – I am a lifelong Wappinger resident who lives in the house I grew up in. I have worked under Sue Serino for seven years and in the


Republican Ron Davis

Maybrook Line. This should be a County park and be fully integrated into the existing rail trail network. The County has a fantastic park program, which includes Dutchess Stadium and we need a legislator who will support it and not oppose it. Having baseball, especially the New York Yankees, right here in Fishkill is an opportunity that few in the nation enjoy. This is a huge asset from full-time jobs to part-time high-schooler work, to generating positive annual revenue and affordable family fun.

District 17 – Town of Fishkill Incumbent Republican Doug McHoul (unopposed)

Background/qualifications - I'm a lifelong resident of Southern Dutchess, small business owner, and previously served Fishkill residents as a Town Board Member for six years until I was elected to the County Legislature in 2019. I began my first term as Legislator in January 2020, just two months prior to the worldwide shutdown. As a result, a vast majority of my first term, and much of the second, was devoted to our county's recovery from the pandemic. Through the use of federal funding and other resources, Legislature distributed more than \$4 million to local youth programs. Although we faced countless limitations, the county continued to provide much-needed services to our senior citizens, Veterans, and recipients of social services. With that said, we held ourselves fiscally accountable by reducing county property taxes for the ninth consecutive year and utilizing fund balance to pay off debt, saving taxpayers \$1.6 million in interest.

County Drug Task Force has been instrumental in bringing several drug-dealing murderers to justice. With the Town of Fishkill's recent enrollment in the task force, our participation will help save lives, mitigate the stigma and bring awareness to this epidemic. As the liaison to the Board of Health, I will continue to bring whatever resources I can to this issue, along with other local health concerns, especially the increasing waiting times that our residents have faced at local hospitals.

Additionally, the county is currently considering the formation of a Veteran cemetery, which would offer our local heroes a free plot and headstone. I have, and will continue to lead the charge for the rights of our Veterans' spouses to be interred alongside their loved ones. I am also developing a program for young women, grades 8 through 12, to learn self-defense tactics from law enforcement to defend themselves against aggressors.

I am grateful to the Fishkill residents for their trust and support and look forward to serving them another term as County Legislator.

it worse. I worked with the county on building a new Washington Ave bridge and now with the state to build a new overpass on Rt.9D by the Newburgh-Beacon Bridge.

What do you hope to accomplish if elected as supervisor?

I will continue to place the citizens quality of life over the developers. The developers are spending lots of money to try to oust me. I am the only candidate fighting for you and I will never stop.

What experience will help you to be an effective supervisor?

I stayed open during COVID and the town was rewarded with being 8 million richer. The developers know that for the first time in 50 years, they don't run the Town of Fishkill. For 50 years previous Supervisors allowed developers to run the town when they threaten a lawsuit. I challenged them and in the historic case that the town won. It established that every town in NYS has a right to enforce its zoning laws. Developers hate that and are working to reverse all of it. No one in 50 years has controlled developers in this town. You as a citizen have that power. You have a supervisor that works for you not the developers, please keep it that way.

John Forman What are the 2 most important issues the Town of Wappinger is facing?

Traffic and overdevelopment. Traffic on Rte. 9D (in the vicinity of the Beacon-Newburgh Bridge). Heavy volume coming in at rush hour (mostly from the Beacon train station), causes major backups. The residents who live on 9D and Van Ness Road deal with this situation every workday. It is a dangerous situation and the accidents in this area alone should be enough to get the attention from the NYS DOT (Department of Transportation). Strong support from State Senator Rolison and State Assemblyman Beephan will be required to help convince NYS DOT (Department of Transportation) to make this problem a high priority,

The Rte. 52 (Main Street) portion in the Village is and has been a heavily traveled area. The Town and Village government need to collaborate with State Senator Rolison and State Assemblyman Beephan to again, work with the NYS DOT. At the very least, conducting a professional traffic study which would include offering some options on how to offer some relief to the congestion we see in this area every workday from 4-6 p.m. If it's an issue in the Village, it's an issue in the Town.

What do I hope to accomplish if elected Supervisor?

I have 12 years of experience as a member in the Dutchess County Legislature. That experience has given me a front row seat on how representatives, with different views, debate on the floor, and how they treat each other, even if they don't agree. (Something we might want to work on in Fishkill).

Our budget process is severely flawed. As Supervisor, the budget process for the following year will begin in January. There needs to be more involvement with the position of Supervisor and the Department Heads. And the way to fix this is to revert back to scheduling periodic Department Head meetings. Too many times, small problems turn into big problems due to a lack of communication. Even with the adoption of the 2024 budget, raises were inconsistent. Employee raises ranged from 2% to 4% to 6% and some even received 8%. There are no employee evaluations being conducted by the Department Heads to justify these raises, because the Department Heads are not being required to conduct them.

There's a saying, "Show me your checkbook and I'll show you what's important to you." The same can be said about our budgets in the Town of Fishkill. In 2019, the budget for legal fees were \$125,000. In 2023, the budget for legal fees have ballooned up to \$340,000. I think taxpayer

money can be better spent being spread around to each department benefiting our residents, rather than being tied up in law-suits and legal fees. Over the first 2 years under the current administration, our Town Board made poor decisions which cost the taxpayers money. That practice has stopped with the makeup of our current Town Board.

During my tenure as a member on the Fishkill Town Board, I was immediately asked to be a representative from the Town Board, as a leader (not a chair) on the Comprehensive Plan Update committee. We held Zoom meetings at first and eventually went to live meetings. Similar to the County Legislature, and Fishkill Town Board, there were a variety of different ideas that were tossed around and discussed. Even though this "update" was a tweak, to the overall Comprehensive Plan, it addressed many issues that we are facing today including:

- Traffic
- Open SpaceDevelopment

Several months ago, this "update" was unanimously approved by the Fishkill Town Board. Moving forward, our Town Board can rely on this new document to review any

new projects that are being presented.

Many people have come up to me saying there is a disconnect between the Town Board and our First Responders. As you should know, "Fire Districts" are their own governing body. They each have 5 elected Commissioners. They present a budget, hold public hearings, and ultimately vote on their annual budget. Take a look at your property tax bill

There is a breakdown between every taxing authority which ultimately adds up to what is your final property tax bill. I have scheduled and met with representatives from our Fire Districts. The Fishkill Town Board voted to provide our active firefighters the largest tax credit available in New York State. Earlier this year, Mobile Life (which had been our commercial provider for

Advanced Life Support) went our of business and the town of Fishkill is currently working with Empress. I have had meeting with both representatives from Empress and our friends from BVAC.

The relationship with the town of Fishkill Police Department and our Town Board is in much better shape today than it had been in 2020 and 2021. Most of it is because I have stepped up and invested some time meeting with our Chief, the Command Staff and members in the department. The Police budget takes up a large chunk of our overall budget. Similar to a marriage, partnership or even a Head Football Coach and Ouarterback, communication is essential to achieve any positive outcomes. The investment I have made as a member of the Town Board will help me continue to improve my understanding of what it takes for this department to function effectively for the residents of Fishkill.

What experience will help you to be an effective supervisor?

I have successfully been dealing with people my entire life: Past President of W H Mase Hook & Ladder Fire Company, former Director Beacon Little League, member Knights of Columbus, former Vice-Chairman, Beacon Housing Authority.

I work with people every day in my profession as an independent insurance agent. Customers expect a high level of service, offering the most comprehensive coverage for a reasonable price. People come to me all the time with issues and problems they are experiencing.

Politically, for 12 years I represented the City of Beacon and parts of the Town of Fishkill in the Dutchess County Legislature. That experience has opened up doors for me.

Having close relationships with our County Executive, County Clerk, Sheriff and District Attorney can only benefit the residents in Fishkill should I be elected Supervisor.

forging of deals that permit detrimental projects within our community. What are the 2 most important issues the Town of Wappinger is facing?

Holocaust survivor: 'My most important advice: Don't get fooled by words'

When greeting a friend (or even someone he's never met), Tibor Spitz, a 95-yearold Holocaust survivor and talented artist, prefers bear hugs over handshakes.

There were plenty of people to meet and hugs to go around when Spitz discussed his thoughts, experiences, and advice on October 15 at Mount Saint Mary College.

"We Remember: Songs of Survivors" is a PBS documentary celebrating the lives of four Holocaust survivors, including Spitz. Screened before a panel talk with Spitz and the filmmakers at the Mount, "We Remember" follows four talented singersongwriters from SageArts in the Hudson Valley. Through a program offered by Jewish Family Service of Orange County (JFS), they visited local Holocaust survivors to create original songs based on their conversations. The culminating concert was performed at the Mount's Aquinas Hall Theatre in May of 2019.

Spitz told the more than 100 students, staff, and community members present that in order to make a better future, we must never forget the past.

"My most important advice: Don't get fooled by words," said Spitz. "If somebody tries to convince you to do evil with a very kind, nice voice and nice waving flags, even calling it humanity or democracy...be very critical of what you hear and look at the consequences of those speeches."

Spitz was born in Slovakia in 1929. At 10 years old, he was kicked out of school and forced to wear a yellow star. When Slovakia was taken over, he and his family survived for more than 200 days hidden in a snowy forest. The experience would impact Spitz's outlook for the rest of his life, he said.

"The human race — and not only the human race, but whatever is alive — is fighting for survival at the expense of others," said Spitz. "[I learned] not to get emotional about it, not to get angry about it, not to be upset about it. Try to survive and help others who are weaker."

He added, "I'm not really a proper person to answer questions about suffering, because I refuse to suffer...don't cry over a spilled milk; bring a cat. If you bring a cat, you can do at least something positive about spilled milk."

The panel talk also featured Tim Miller, Ilene Cutler, and Tim Guetterman from Big Chief Entertainment, the creators of the "We Remember: film; Colette Ruoff, founder and president of SageArts; Kelleigh McKenzie, a songwriter and performer who was part of the original Holocaust survivor song project; and Nicoletta Ronsini, codirector of JFS of Orange County. Pippa Carey, a local student, also presented her poem "A Letter to Emma Lazarus."

SageArts works with elders in the com-


munity, such as the Holocaust survivors featured in "We Remember," to both document their unique experiences and to share their wisdom with younger generations, Ruoff explained.


"I truly believe that life experience is valuable and that there's sometimes missing connections between the generations," she said. "Anything we can do to make it available in a way that's compelling [is Sage Arts' mission]."

After the panel talk, the Aquinas Hall Atrium hosted works of art reflecting the theme "Survive and Thrive" by Spitz and students living in Orange County. Organized by Janet Kass of JFS, this part of the event was a collaboration between JFS, the Orange County Human Rights Commission, the National Alliance on Mental Illness, the Jewish Federation of Orange County, the Stop the Hate Campaign, and more.


The film screening and panel talk were part of the Mount's Samuel D. Affron Memorial Lecture Series. Jerome S. Affron, a former college trustee, established the Samuel D. Affron Memorial Lecture Series in honor of his father in 1982. A native of Kingston, Samuel D. Affron was deeply interested in education and served on the Board of Education in Beacon, for years. He was a man of many talents and interests. He pursued a variety of careers, including an automobile dealership, and served bravely in the armed forces during World War I.







Pop: He told me howa to puta my head down and looka ata the ball.

Me: Oh no. What did you say? Pop: Ia tolda hima to teach me some-

thing I don'ta know! **Me**: Then what happened?

Pop: Itsa no my fault. **Me**: What happened?

Pop: Hea startsa to cry and he says he no want to teacha no more. He gave me my money and hea left.

Me: Geez Pop. Golf is supposed to be relaxing. It's not the restaurant. You can't yell at people.

Pop: Oh come on. I no yell.

Me: Pop, you have to go say you're sorry. Maybe bring him something.

Pop: (sigh) Okay, Ima gonna go and bringa him some caponata and soma mya wine.

Me: Good.

After I got off the phone with him, I was actually scared about what I would hear from the state of Florida regarding my father. In the meantime, enjoy this recipe for caponata.

Caponata **Ingredients**

5 tablespoons olive oil

1 1.5-pound eggplant, peeled, cut into

1/2-inch cubes

1 medium onion, cubed

4 large garlic cloves, chopped

1 32 oz. Jar Coppola's Tuscan Sauce

3 tablespoons red wine vinegar 2 tablespoons drained capers

1/3 cup chopped fresh basil Toasted pine nuts

Method

Heat olive oil in a large pot. Add eggplant, onions and garlic and sauté until the eggplant is soft, about 10 minutes) Add Coppola's Tuscan sauce, vinegar and capers and simmer for 15 minutes longer stirring occasionally until the eggplant is soft. Stir in the basil and pine nuts. Serve over pasta, with Italian bread or with both.

'Growing Up Roosevelt' release set November 4


