## 15 injured as explosion, fire destroy building in Wappingers Falls

They are tired and just happy to be survivors.

That was the prevailing outlook of neighbors in the Brick Row area of Wappingers Falls last week on Friday - one day after a ruptured gas line caused a massive explosion and fire that destroyed the apartment building at 4 Brick Row.

The explosion, which occurred at approximately 12:15 p.m. on Thursday, Nov. 2, injured 15 individuals, including five first responders. Eight adults and two children, who were in the apartments at the time of the explosion, were rescued and airlifted to the burn unit at Westchester Medical Center.

"The injuries to the first responders were minor and smoke inhalation," said Wappingers Falls Police Commissioner Paul Italiano.

"Central Hudson crews arrived at the scene of a building explosion today (Nov. 2) in Wappingers Falls shortly after reports of the incident, to secure the area and turn off natural gas and electricity in the immediate vicinity. Our thoughts are with those who were affected by this - including those who were injured as well as the contractors and first responders at the scene," said a statement posted to Central Hudson's Facebook page on Nov. 2nd.

Wappingers Falls Mayor Kevin Huber stated in a release, "We can confirm that there are serious injuries among our residents, and they are receiving the best possible medical care. Families affected by the explosion have been evacuated and

are being provided with shelter, food, and necessities. The Knights of Columbus provided a relief center for the community while the Red Cross remained on location and assisted the families with temporary shelter and provisions."

Governor Kathy Hochul stated, "have been briefed on the building collapse in Dutchess County and have deployed State emergency services personnel to assist in response efforts. As the situation devel-

ops, I urge all New Yorkers to follow the direction of law enforcement and other first responders working to keep the community safe. I join all New Yorkers in praying for the Village of Wappingers Falls."

On November 3rd, two residents, who asked for anonymity, who were affected were removing some items from their home.

"I was here (when the explosion

happened)," one of the residents said the day after the occurrence. "There was rubble and a lot of smoke."

They stayed with family that Thursday night.

Both stated they were "grateful for the response. A lot of people were pitching in to help. We're very thankful."

State Senator Rob Rolison (39th District) issued a statement after the

## New Veterans Memorial Park coming to East Fishkill

Coming to the town of East Fishkill is the new Veterans Memorial Park. The park is located off Route 376, near the East Fishkill Town Hall. The park will include a Memorial Garden, Flag Ceremony Plaza, Memorial Plaza, Donor Walk, Gold Star Plaza, and a water feature.

"We started a Veterans Memorial Committee with our Veterans Council. The (East Fishkill) Town Board allocated funds to hire an architect to design a new park. This has been adopted by the board," said East Fishkill Supervisor Nick D'Alessandro.

"The surveying of the property and drawing

up of some of the initial plans is the first stage of construction. Hopefully the highway department will do some of the grading," stated D'Alessandro.

The supervisor said the groundbreaking at this time is expected to occur in Spring 2024, with town officials "looking to do as much of the work in-house as possible."

Fundraising is being done, said D'Alessandro. Town officials recently sent a brochure about the park to corporations such as Pepsi Co and Amazon, which have facilities in the East Fishkill, seeing donations, said D'Alessandro. A \$150,000 check from a corporation will be used

towards the five-acre park, he explained.

"We have a very small Veterans Memorial Park at Beekman Rd. and Route 82. It's a tough configuration there and a bit dangerous when we hold our Memorial Day Ceremony there," stated the supervisor. "We want to have something truly befitting of our veterans."

"American Legion Post 1758 and all East Fishkill Veterans and their families are looking forward to the new East Fishkill Veterans Memorial Park...The existing small park at the intersection of Route 82 and Beekman Road was

explosion and fire.

"A number of first responders suffered non-life-threatening injuries while attempting to save lives," said Rolison, who joined local, county, and state first responders at the scene shortly after the

incident occurred.

"While on the scene today I observed once again the selfless courage of our brave first responders as they worked to save lives and comfort victims. Thank you from the bottom of my heart; please continue to keep the victims in your prayers," noted Rolison's comments, in part.

"We are committed to supporting those involved in any way we can. Gas service, as well as impacted electric service, has been restored to nearly all customers in the vicinity. We will continue to work with authorities during the ongoing investigation of this incident," said Central Hudson's statement last week.

Kevin Van Tassel Jr. stated his mother-in-law was at his apartment at the time of the explosion.

"The door blew in. All my windows got blown in," said Van Tassel. The Red Cross got a hotel for him and his family, Van Tassel said.

Wappingers Falls Fire Chief Jason Enson, who was in command on the scene, said during a news conference, "I've never seen anything like this." He remarked the firefighters did a remarkable job.

**Rescuers respond and help injured**  
"Responding officers from the Wappingers Falls Police Department reported a large explosion at 12:16 p.m. and arrived on scene at 12:17 p.m.," said Italiano in a press release on November 3. "Upon arrival initial responding officer encountered two children and a mother with severe blast injuries and burns. Additional victims who were working at the location were located in the immedi-

ate area."

Italiano stated, "In total ten victims suffered blast and burn injuries from the scene. Additionally, five first responders were treated and released from area hospitals. One firefighter suffered a hand injury, one officer suffered a minor burn and smoke inhalation, two additional officers suffered smoke inhalation and one suffered a dog bite while rescuing a dog."

According to Italiano, the victims are as follows:

- 9 Males ages 8-59 years old
- 1 Female age 35

A male, age 46, a female, age 35, and her two male children aged 8 & 11 are residents of Brick Row and as of press time were at Westchester Medical Center.

Italiano stated: "A landing zone was established at Veterans Field a few blocks from the scene," said Italiano.

Out of the 15 victims, seven had been treated and released, said Italiano. On November 3rd, eight were still at Westchester Medical Center.

The row of apartments across from the blast "the structure is fine," Italiano told Southern Dutchess News on November 3. The residents had no gas heat, he noted, that is why they were taking items out of the residences that day.

The incident was contained to 1-7 Brick Row. A multiple unit dwelling, according to the commissioner.

"Although there is no reason to believe there is any criminal aspect to this case, the Wappingers Falls Police Department Detective Division is conducting the investigation with the assistance of the New York State Police BCI and the Dutchess County Sheriff's Department Drone Unit," he said. here is no danger to the public, he added.

### Central Hudson investigates

Joseph Jenkins, a spokesperson for Central Hudson, said, "This is under investigation. No root cause has been determined." He said what was known is that a contractor employed by Central Hudson appears to have struck a ¾ service line. "Striking this [seems] to be the

cause, but it is still under investigation," said Jenkins.

Generally speaking, the pipes that are being replaced, said Jenkins, are from the early to mid-1900s.

"I think the most important thing we can inform our customers is Central Hudson employees and all subcontract employees are all trained to standards to work," said Jenkins.

Officials noted that displaced residents have been housed at hotels by Central Hudson.

"At this time, we'll provide hotels as long as they're needed," said Jenkins.

Italiano noted the Wappingers Falls Police and Fire departments were assisted at the scene by 10 additional police agencies and 15 fire departments and EMS Units.

"We understand that this is a difficult time for our community, and we appreciate the outpouring of support from neighboring communities and organizations. The Village Police Station and the PBA will handle the distribution of them," said Village of Wappingers Falls Mayor Kevin Huber in a statement last week.

The Wappingers Falls PBA is collecting monetary donations for families who were affected by two fires which occurred within the past month. One fire was located at Brookside and the other at Brick Row, according to the PBA's Facebook page.

For those who would like to make a donation, one can use the app Venmo. Search for the department's account, @wappfallsbpa, or scan the QR code to go to the department's profile. One may also donate in per-

son at the police station, where one can drop off monetary donations or gift cards.

Jackie Muller, who is the president of the Wappingers Falls Business & Professional Association, wrote in part on November 2nd to the membership, "As business leaders, it is essential that we come together and show support for our community during these challenging times."

"It is during times of crisis that our community can demonstrate its strength and resilience. By working together, supporting one another, and assisting those in need, we can help the Village of Wappingers Falls overcome this challenge and emerge even stronger. Please stay tuned for updates on our collaborative efforts and initiatives. Together, we can rebuild, and together, we will overcome this crisis," said Muller. Muller noted that the First Saturday event in Wappingers Falls continued and businesses which offered raffles donated a percentage of the proceeds to the victims and their families of the explosion and the families of the Brookside fire as well.

### Assemblyman writes to airlines about expanding service to New York's Stewart International Airport

#### To the Editor:

I am writing to underscore the significance of enhancing transportation options for residents of the Hudson Valley region. Please consider the expansion of your services to encompass New York's Stewart International Airport (SWF) in New Windsor, New York. Such an expansion would significantly enhance the accessibility and viability of transportation for the inhabitants and businesses in the Hudson Valley.

The Hudson Valley remains a sought-after destination for tourists and is a vital economic driver. Travelers are drawn to our region by attractions such as the renowned Woodbury Common Premium Outlets, abundant historical landmarks, and some of New York's finest cultural establishments. ## County Clerk's office announces upgrades to appointment system in Dutchess' DMV

The Dutchess County Clerk's office recently announced upgrades to the DMV Appointment systems for satellite offices in Beacon and Millbrook will be complete by December 1.

In late 2022, the County Clerk's office installed the Q-Matic appointment system in Poughkeepsie and Wappingers Falls DMV offices. These systems fully integrate appointments made online at [www.dutchessny.gov/countyclerk](http://www.dutchessny.gov/countyclerk) or [www.dutchessny.gov/dmv](http://www.dutchessny.gov/dmv). The system also allows for walk-in transactions but prioritizes those customers who have made appointments.

The expansion of the Q-Matic system to Millbrook and Beacon will provide a seamless experience to all our customers in Dutchess County.

Customers with existing appointments at Beacon and Millbrook will be automatically transferred to the new appointment system when it is operational.

All CDL, Car and Motorcycle permits require appointments.

Walk-in customers will be accommodated but appointments are strongly recommended.

## Apply for Home Energy Assistance Program

Qualified customers can apply for Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) grants, a federally funded program that provides regular and emergency assistance to help pay heating and utility bills beginning November 1. HEAP grants are available through local Department of Social Services (DSS) offices, at Offices for the Aging and online at [mybenefits.ny.gov](http://mybenefits.ny.gov).

"Inflationary pressures continue to have an impact on residents of the Hudson Valley – especially our most vulnerable neighbors – and we are pleased that additional assistance is available for those families in need," said Anthony Campagiorni, Senior Vice President of Customer Services and Gas Operations. "We encourage all customers who are eligible for these benefits to apply."

The amount of the HEAP grant depends on family income and size guidelines. For example, a family of four with natural gas heating and an annual income of \$70,056 would qualify for a \$400 grant. Central Hudson customers who receive HEAP grants or qualify for other assistance programs will also receive additional bill credits for up to 12 months on their Central Hudson bill.

Campagiorni added, "Households receiving a HEAP benefit for non-utility

heating fuels such as oil, propane, wood/wood pellets, kerosene, coal or corn are also eligible for a monthly credit on their electric or non-heating gas bill."

Customers who heat with non-utility heating fuels should email their current Notice of Decision letter to Central Hudson at [careunit@cenhud.com](mailto:careunit@cenhud.com) to be enrolled and receive the bill credit.

Regular HEAP grants for the fall and upcoming winter are available between Nov. 1, and March 14, 2024, or until funding is exhausted. Emergency HEAP grants will be available between Jan. 2, 2024, and Mar. 15, 2024. These benefits are designed to meet an eligible household's immediate energy needs. The Heating Equipment Repair or Replacement (HERR) program is also available to assist customers who have primary heating equipment that is either inoperable or unsafe. HERR grants are currently available and will remain so through Sept. 30, 2024.

## Snow ordinance in effect Dec. – April in Village of Wappingers Falls

This is a reminder to the residents of the Village of Wappingers Falls that the Snow Ordinance is in effect from December 1st to April 1st, 2024, according to the ordinance from the village clerk.

During this period, no person shall park a vehicle on any public street within the village between the hours of Midnight and 7 a.m. the next morning.

It shall be the duty of the owner of every parcel of real estate adjoining a public sidewalk, weather the parcel of real estate is occupied by a structure or not, to keep such sidewalks adjoining such property free from snow and ice for the full paved width of such sidewalk.

Snow and ice shall be removed within 24 hours after the end of a snowfall. In addition, sidewalks in front of commercial establishments and commercial parking lots shall be kept free of snow and ice at all times between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.

No person, firm or corporation shall deposit, throw, place or strew, nor shall any person, firm or corporation cause to be deposited, thrown, placed or strewn, any snow or ice upon any street, avenue or roadway within the Village.

Any person in violation of this law shall be subject to a fine.

### Veterans Day--more than just another patriotic holiday



Veterans Day is rapidly approaching and as we prepare, it brings to mind questions I hear from people wondering why there are so many patriotic holidays. They often say they understand July 4th – some will even call it Independence Day. Memorial Day they understand because, “Freedom isn’t Free,” but when it comes to Flag Day, Armed Forces Day, Veterans Day, etc., their interest starts to wane or there is at least some confusion as to what each holiday stands for. Don’t get me wrong: I know the American public genuinely supports our veterans and will generously give their time and money to promote causes that recognize and assist the veteran community.

To those who have served in the United States Military, however, each day of recognition has a special meaning. In fact, that’s exactly what the Veterans Day holiday is all about. Veterans Day honors all American troops who served honorably—whether they did so during wartime or peacetime. The holiday was created to honor the nearly 40 million men and women who have served in the military regardless of whether they have fought in battle or not.

That may seem like a large number, but the latest research from the Defense Manpower Center shows that only about 1.4 million people, or about 0.4 percent of the American population, are presently serving in the U.S. military, and only about 7 percent of all living Americans have ever served in the armed forces.

National Guard Military Historian and Engineer, Captain Sean Daily, who has served in many humanitarian missions and was once assigned to lead a platoon of 33 combat engineers into Afghanistan with the primary focus of sweeping roadways for improvised explosive devices (IED’s), which have reportedly killed more American warriors than any other military action, summed it up this way:

“In my opinion, a Veteran is someone who has served our nation and represents the less than one percent of the population who have chosen to put on a uniform to serve and protect. It’s not just the front-line troops who are out there making it happen, it’s all the support troops behind

them who also get the job done.”

This speaks to why every holiday is important to the veteran community. We are a relatively small group of people who choose to do our part to make sure the freedoms we have, which have been protected through great loss and struggle, are not ever taken away.

Just a little background for those who may be unaware: The peace agreement with Germany that officially ended World War I took place on the “eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month” in 1918. Hence, Veterans Day was first observed on November 11, 1919, the anniversary of the signing of the treaty that ended the war and was originally called Armistice Day. The name of the holiday was officially changed from Armistice Day to Veterans Day in 1954 by Pres. Dwight D. Eisenhower to recognize and account for all veterans in all American wars.

Even over a half-century before the end of WWI, Pres. Abraham Lincoln, during his second inaugural address, called upon Americans “to care for him who shall have borne the battle, and for the widow, and his orphan.” It’s a theme that has run through history, and I hope with the utmost humility, that we try to emulate this every day in our work at the Dutchess County Division of Veterans’ Services.

As Veterans Day approaches, I have listed some suggestions below that veteran’s groups identify as a way to thank those who have served.

- Write a personal note to a vet.
- Send a care package.
- Treat a veteran to a meal.
- Offer to help with household chores.
- Make a commitment to volunteer.
- Donate to a cause that supports veterans.
- Invite a veteran to speak at your child’s school.
- Support veteran-owned companies.
- Fly a Flag - Correctly.
- Ask Someone About Their Service.

# New Veterans Memorial Park coming to East Fishkill

established decades ago when East Fishkill was a rural farming community with little traffic along those roads. The current Memorial Park is small and it's difficult to have a memorial service or a quiet place to honor and remember our veterans due to the volume of passing traffic," said Jim Reynolds, Manny Bacon Post 1758 Commander.

As for the feedback town officials have received from the town residents and veterans, D'Alessandro said, "We have received tremendously positive words of feedback from the community. They're so happy and engaged." He noted town officials have received so many emails and calls praising the project.

"They're proud that we're doing this," he said.

"The park will be a tribute to the men and women who have served and those continuing to serve in the United States military. It will be a place set aside to honor, remember, and reflect on those who have served. Within the park will be a memorial garden with benches where friends and family can spend quiet

moments remembering those veterans who we have lost. It's important to remember our past and a teaching "walking path" with reminders of past conflicts will provide that history. Ample parking will be available, something we do not have currently. Personalized pavers will lead to the American Flag and service flags which will be the focal point of the park. Hometown hero banners will be on display year around," said Reynolds.

In 2022, a Dutchess County microgrant for \$15,000 was given for "[b]uilding a war monument that will complement the town's new Veterans Memorial Park and will help represent the commitment and sacrifices performed by service members."

Reynolds remarked, "The park will serve as a place of solemn repose for veterans, their families, and loved ones to honor fallen brethren and members. It's time that we really honor Charles "Manny" Bacon, William Wright, Raynard Hansen, Eugene Gamba, and all the other veterans of East Fishkill who have served throughout the years."

On YouTube, once may see a 3D conceptualization of the park by Saratoga Associates. "Join us as we reshape East

# State legislators, domestic violence groups call to close loophole by passing Melanie's Law

Led by Assemblymembers Brian A. Cunningham (D-Brooklyn) and Anil Beephan, Jr. (R,C-East Fishkill) in the Assembly and New York State Senator Michelle Hinchey (D- 41st Senate District), a bipartisan group of elected officials, joined service providers for survivors of domestic violence to support the passage of Melanie's Law (S.6288/A.6026). This bill would close a loophole related to orders of protection, allowing courts to extend such orders to all of the named victim's family and household members.

The legislation is named after Melanie Chianese, a 29-year-old mother and health coach from Dutchess County, who was brutally murdered in 2022 by her mother's ex-boyfriend following a pattern of stalking and harassment. While a judge granted an order of protection to Melanie's mother Cheryl and Melanie's son, Melanie's request was denied because she was not a minor.

The press conference on October 26, addressed wider issues of domestic violence in New York during Domestic Violence Awareness Month, with host organization Neighbors In Action providing resources for survivors, families, and community members.

Melanie's Law is the result of a bipartisan partnership between Beephan, who was Melanie's representative in the New York State Assembly, and Cunningham, who introduced the bill as a member of the Assembly majority conference. The bill's supporters emphasize the importance of collaboration across party lines to implement life-saving policy changes.

Beephan (R-East Fishkill) stated, "My heart goes out to those impacted by domestic violence. Raising awareness about domestic violence has been at the forefront of my focus during my first year in the New York State Assembly. Through working with Assemblyman Cunningham on Melanie's Law, I remain committed to addressing existing loopholes that only exacerbate the danger faced by those impacted by domestic violence. I call on the New York State

Assembly to pass Melanie's law when we return to Albany and thank the Senate for their unanimous support of the bill."

Senator Michelle Hinchey said, "Melanie's Law, championed by her courageous mother Cheryl and developed in her memory, will provide a critically needed expansion to orders of protection to shield more family and household members from dangerous individuals. This common-sense legislation will close a glaring loophole in law, and I am committed to working with my colleagues to get it passed this session so we can better protect victims of domestic violence and abuse."

State Senator Rob Rolison (R-Poughkeepsie) said, "After the legislation cleared the Senate earlier this year, I said I would continue to work with my colleagues on both sides of the aisle to get this critical measure to Governor Hochul's desk. Together, we can enhance the safety and well-being of our residents by permanently fixing a dangerous legal loophole."

"Domestic Violence offenders want their victims to endure a lifetime of pain and suffering. Melanie Chianese lost her life at the hands of my offender because of WHO she was, my daughter. Melanie's Law NEEDS to be passed so that everyone in the household is protected regardless of age. This will close a dangerous loophole so this horrific tragedy, which shook our community, NEVER happens again," said Cheryl Chianese-Cavalli in a release.

"Melanie Chianese's murder was a tragedy that not only devastated her family; it exposed the deficiency in our courts' ability to impose restraining orders in domestic violence cases. Melanie's Law will allow orders of protection to extend to all members of a victim's household — whether or not they are related, and regardless of age. It is a necessary correction to our criminal and family court laws, and will protect innocent New Yorkers," said Assemblymember MaryJane Shimsky (D-Tarrytown).

# O'Neil releases 2024 Executive Budget Plan

Dutchess County Executive William F.X. O'Neil has released his 2024 Executive Budget plan, cutting the County's property tax rate by 10.6 percent while maintaining and enhancing the County's high-quality services and programs.

The balanced spending plan, which reduces the property tax levy for the 10th consecutive year, includes \$599.9 million in appropriations to deliver the multitude of County programs and services residents rely on. Among the highlights of the 2024 Executive plan are resources to enhance public safety and emergency response, address homelessness, mental health and addiction, and create affordable housing, while augmenting long-standing support of children, families, older adults and veterans.

The Executive Budget plan reduces the County property tax levy to \$99.4 million, the lowest levy in 15 years. The lower property tax levy, combined with Dutchess County's growing tax base, reduces the property tax rate from \$2.49 to \$2.23 per \$1,000 of assessed value. This will be the 11th consecutive year that property owners will see a reduction in the County tax rate on their tax bill.

County Executive O'Neil said, "For years, Dutchess County has compiled a proven track record of fiscal responsibility

and conservative fiscal stewardship. Many factors outside of our control are driving up costs for 2024, including national inflation and Albany's reckless spending and continued cost shifting. This budget plan attempts to cushion these impacts and continues Dutchess County's careful watch of each tax dollar collected while investing in the areas our community has prioritized. We remain vigilant in serving our residents in the most efficient and cost-effective manner possible, while providing exemplary service and property tax relief for our residents."

To ensure recurring revenue is available to fund critical programs and services, the 2024 Executive Budget calls for the County sales tax rate to increase from 3.75 percent to 4 percent, effective June 2024 with County and State legislative approval. Dutchess is currently one of just six counties in the state with a sales tax rate under 4 percent. With County and State legislative approval, this change will generate an additional \$8.3 million in County sales tax revenue in 2024 and annually \$17.1 million.

The sales tax rate adjustment will also provide added support to local municipalities, as Dutchess County shares its sales tax revenue with municipalities. Additional revenue to local municipalities is forecasted to be \$1.7 million in 2024,

then nearly \$3 million annually.

Sales tax revenue is also generated through Dutchess County's tourism industry, with 18 percent of sales tax revenue coming from visitors. Dutchess Tourism recently reported visitor spending reached record levels in 2022, with \$706 million generated through travel-related expenses from lodging, food, beverages, transportation and retail.

Capitalizing on the strong visitor interest, the Executive Budget increases the County's hotel tax from 4 percent to 5 percent, a move estimated to bring \$4.8 million in revenue in 2024.

Dutchess County will continue its exemption on clothing and footwear items under \$110 in its 2024 budget, remaining one of the few counties to ensure these needed items are tax-free for families.

Fund balance and reserve fund appropriations total \$20 million in 2024, keeping Dutchess County's fund balance well within the County's policy of maintaining one to two months of general fund operating expenditures in unrestricted general fund balance.

Among a few of the highlights of the 2024 Executive Budget:

- Enhanced public safety with the addition of two new Deputy Sheriffs specially trained as Community Resource Officers to enhance safety and policing services in

the City of Poughkeepsie; continued funding for the Dutchess County Drug Task Force, continued trainings for law enforcement officers, including implicit bias and crisis intervention; as well as a full year of the ECHO mental health program supporting the well-being of law enforcement officers.

- The new Dutchess County Justice and Transition Center, operational in 2024, will generate significant savings while expanding the County's innovative programming to reduce recidivism. The 2024 budget plan reflects more than \$1.8 million in overtime savings and \$5.5 million gained by staffing efficiencies and policies adopted by Sheriff Kirk Imperati.

- Addressing homelessness with a multi-faceted plan that includes eight new positions, including Shelter Director, case managers and program specialists to provide necessary wrap-around services as the County works toward establishing a permanent Emergency Housing Facility for single individuals.

Funding is also included for an additional Housing Navigator position through Hudson River Housing (HRH) to help residents facing housing instability as well as funding for a vehicle to enhance HRH's street outreach to homeless individuals.

## County to host 2 workshops on applying for grant programs

Whether it's improved physical, mental, emotional or social outcomes, youth sports have repeatedly been shown to have a positive impact on the young people who take part. Playing sports is linked to decreased stress, anxiety, and depression; improved social skills and ability to work well with others; and reduced risk of engaging in substance abuse and other risky behaviors.

Looking to expand the positive impact of athletics on young people, the Dutchess County Department of Community and Family Services (DCFS) is seeking applications for a new grant program that will provide awards to support youth team sports programs for underserved youth under the age of 18. Through New York State's new Youth Team Sports (YTS) grant program, DCFS will fund awards of \$132,594 to eligible local community-based organizations and nonprofits; funding is available in grants ranging from \$5,000 to \$50,000.

Eligible applicants should be either a 501(c)(3) nonprofit or another community-based organization operating in Dutchess County with a federal identification number and charity registration number that is able to meet the County's insurance requirements. The grant program, created under the New York State Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS), and will run during the program year Jan. 1 through Sept. 30, 2024. The grant may provide general operating support to give agencies the flexibility to administer quality programming; this may include the educational instruction needed to

prepare youth to participate in team sports.

The ability to fund activities that support youth development aligns with the domains of the County's "Path to Promise" initiative, the goal of which is to help provide the young people in Dutchess County the resources they need to reach their potential, including team sports. For the purposes of this funding opportunity, a "team sport" is defined as an organized physical activity in which groups of two or more individuals are in competition with two or more opposing individuals.

There will be two workshops to learn more about the grant program and the specific eligibility and application requirements to help encourage successful submissions. DCFS strongly encourages interested agencies to attend one of two virtual workshops on:





But Sydney is world famous for its New Year's Eve fireworks (mainly because they take place at 8 a.m. New York time, so they're shown on T.V. All day). • "Don't go to Antarctica." It's the ulti-

• "Don't take a zip line ride in Dubai." I love zip lines, but this one is terrifying. Instead of lovely trees and wildflowers, you're flying over the city, around towering skyscrapers and only inches above the

bustling traffic. A warning sign said not to get on if you are scared of heights, but they forgot to ask me.

• "Don't walk down Nigeria Street in Addis Ababa." Wherever we go, people advise us not to walk somewhere in their city. Naturally Mark immediately heads to that spot. On Nigeria Street in Ethiopia, three guys grabbed Mark and went for his wallet. Were they ever surprised when I clobbered one of them in the head, and they all went running.

• "So, Sarah, aside from these few adventures, create your own and have a great 40th year. I lived through mine."
