

## Helen Murphy first woman to receive Hometown Heroes honor in Pougkeepsie

Near the roundabout at Raymond Ave., outside of the Juliet Quad, across the street from Vassar College hangs a Hometown Heroes banner. The banner recognizes late Poughkeepsie resident and veteran Helen Murphy, who died at the age of 94 in 2016. Helen joined the Women's Army Corp (WAC) in the U.S. Army in 1942 at the age of 20. This is the first banner to recognize a female veteran in Poughkeepsie.

"She worked for the NY State Army Ordinance Division with an office at IBM," said Helen's youngest daughter Patricia Maio. "In 1942, she joined the Women's Army Corps in the US Army. She was an Air WAC," remarked Maio. Helen's four brothers also served in

Helen's four brothers also served i the military, Maio noted.

While in Boot Camp, Helen was one of the women selected to be the first contingent of WAC's to go west of the Mississippi River. She was stationed at Santa Ana Air Force Base in California, noted Maio. While stationed in California, she was taken to Hollywood.

"When they first were at Boot Camp, they picked the prettiest ones to model the uniforms," explained Maio. Helen appeared in a recruiting film star-

Helen appeared in a recruiting film starring Eleanor Parker, Faye Emerson and Nina Foch, said her daughter. Helen made recruiting appearances on the radio show "Queen for a Day." She even made recruiting appearances on the stage with singer and actor Frank Sinatra.

Helen was transferred to an Air WAC

Psych Center Veterans Memorial transferred to new home

Over the years, organizations across United States placed memorials to their people who had served in individual conflicts or served their country across many periods.

The Hudson Valley, with a long martial history predating even the founding of the United States, has been home to memorials that ranged from the simple to the ornate. They can be found in every village and town, as well as on many buildings and institutions. Sometimes progress or the march of time takes away the site for one of the memorials. People have to decide if it's time to move on or if the memorial should be saved and find a new home.

For decades, the Hudson River State Hospital (later the Hudson River Psychiatric Center) displayed a bronze plaque honoring the men and women of the facility who had served. Founded in 1873, the center was finally closed in 2012. With the closure came a question among local veterans what should be done with the memorial?

Members of the Poughkeepsie American Legion Post 1466 realized that their post was geographically closest to the site of the Psychiatric Center and thus might be a good home for the memorial.

The Commander of the American Legion Post, Colin Reilly, led the effort to ensure the memorial to countless staff at the Psychiatric Center would be available to future generations.

Making the transition happen and designing an appropriate monument was the effort of several years. Joseph Alves of "Joe's Masonry" arranged the foundation to create an impressive monument.

## **City of Poughkeepsie names Karen Williams** first Director of Youth Services

City of Poughkeepsie Mayor Rob Rolison announced that Karen Williams has been named Director of Youth Services, a new position and division that will nurture and focus on child development in the city.

Williams will be tasked with the analysis, development, promotion and coordi-nation of programs related to the needs of local youth, and she will represent the municipality in matters concerning their protection and welfare.

Williams is a human services and public administration professional with par-ticular expertise in youth services. She is a former program supervisor for Hudson Valley Community Services, supervisor of the Dutchess One Stop: Level Up Dutchess Program, Case Manager for the Dutchess County Regional Chamber of Commerce Workforce Connections and for Dutchess County Healthy Families.

"Karen Williams brings with her considerable experience and a firm knowledge of the City of Poughkeepsie and sur-rounding areas," said Rolison. "We are pleased to have on her board and know she will contribute greatly to the work we have been doing centered around positive youth development."

The mayor said creating the Director of Youth Services position was key to the city's overall strategy, which has included

teaming up with the Poughkeepsie City School District Superintendent Dr. Eric Rosser to create a Children's Cabinet to bring together school districts, government agencies, child-serving community organizations and other local stakeholders to improve the lives of youth and families. The Cabinet was formed in recognition of the fact that children spend 80 percent of their time out of the classroom and in the broader community.

The mayor also pointed to the tremendous growth in the city's Youth Activities & Opportunities Grant program. This ini-tiative, created in 2018 with \$140,000 in seed money, has grown each year, with the mayor identifying nearly \$500,000 in funds for this program in his 2023 budget proposal. The youth grant awards assist local nonprofits by providing funding to support clubs and leagues, other activities and educational initiatives.

Williams will oversee the operations and management of the youth grant awards, in addition to seeking supplemental funding from other sources to help sus-tain and grow the program.

Williams also will create and maintain a centralized directory of all youth services available in the area in such a way that the public can easily access information regarding available programs for eligible city youth.

## East Fishkill looks at license plate readers for police department

**By Kristine Coulter** East Fishkill Police Chief Christopher Bellino offered a presentation to members of the East Fishkill Town Board regarding license plate readers (LPR) by Flock at the October workshop meeting.

"The purpose is real simple, to help the community and reduce crime," stated Bellino. He said this technology would allow East Fishkill police to stay on the "same path" as other municipalities in the area.

The chief noted that Central Hudson Gas



& Electric does not need to be called regarding installation. Flock comes and does the installation, he said, and it is powered by solar. The information is stored for 30 days and encrypted, he said. If there is a reason to save certain footage, it will be downloaded. He said it does not invade people's privacy because it is taking photos of what it is looking at and information is not being gathered. The data would not be sold for profit or collected, said the chief.

"It's pictures of backs of vehicles," remarked Bellino.

He noted the usefulness of the LPRs if an Amber Alert, when a child is missing, would be put out to the community.

The LPRs, said Bellino, are "super cost-effective - in fact Flock will come at the end of the year and take it back" if the technology is not liked.

Bellino remarked to the board members, "We can limit who has access." He said he was going to limit the access to lieutenants in the department. One would also have to have the case number, and a code as to why one is doing the search, and who is doing the search. "It is traceable," said the chief. "That's good to know," commented East

Fishkill Supervisor Nicholas D'Alessandro. A discussion would be had as to where the

cameras would be mounted. Council member Anil Beephan said, "I

understand why this would be a beneficial piece [of equipment] for the department." Bellino noted that one would still have to

have evidence to prove a case and to arrest someone.

She also will serve as liaison between the City of Poughkeepsie, the City of Poughkeepsie School District, Dutchess County and external stakeholders and nonprofit organizations, among other

duties. Williams said, "I am looking forward to seeing the growth and changes, and how this position will evolve and benefit the City of Poughkeepsie youth in a positive, tremendous way.

The mayor said creating and filling this position now is important, as Dutchess County continues work to convert the former YMCA site on Montgomery Street in Poughkeepsie into a new Opportunity Union. Youth

The city also has dedicated more than \$6 million for park improvements, including renovated basketball courts, new benches, mini soccer pitches and other

amenities for youth, families and all those who make use of these key green and recreational spaces to enjoy.

"As the city's financial picture has steadily improved, we have been able to turn our attention to expanding local government's capacity to provide services and focus on quality of life issues affecting our community, and these efforts must include doing everything we can to better the lives of our youth," said City Administrator Marc Nelson. "This administration has spent considerable time and resources on youth-related issues and activities. Having someone who will be devoted and focused on these services will be a great benefit to the youth of our community — and to the community at large

# State Police issues warning about phone scams

The New York State Police in Westchester County are warning citizens of a phone scam after receiving multiple calls on what is known as an "Imposter Scam." These scams usually involve someone calling and claiming to be from a trusted source such as law enforcement. The caller will claim to be an officer, possibly even using the real name of a local police officer, and could utilize technology that displays the fake name or a number matching the police disguise on your caller ID.

The caller will attempt to convince the victim that they are in violation of the law, have an outstanding warrant, or have a relative involved in an emergency. They will then state money is needed for fines, medical payments, or bail. These scams ask for large sums of money transferred in unusual ways devoid of any face-to-face interaction. Once these thieves have extracted money they may also call back and try to get more.

The New York State Police offer the following tips to protect against the Scams:

- Take a pause. Scammers create a sense of urgency to prey on victims' emotions and their love for family members. - Verify any supposed emergency by calling friends and family before sending money. This is especially important if a potential victim has been warned not to do so by the caller.

- If the caller purports to be a bail bondsperson, ask where the relative is being held and contact the facility directly.

- If the caller purports to be a law enforcement officer, get the exact agency name, hang up, and call that department directly.

- Be suspicious of anyone who calls unexpectedly asking to be sent money.

- Never send cash through the mail.

- Never purchase pre-paid debit cards or gift cards for the purpose of transferring money.

- Develop a secret code or "password" with family members that can be used to verify the identity of family members over the phone.

- Ask a question that only the real family member would know the answer to, such as "what was the name of your first pet?"

- Set Facebook and other social media settings to private to limit information available to scammers, such as the names of relatives.

## Poughkeepsie resident arrested for possession of controlled substance with intent to sell near Dutchess Community College

The Dutchess County Drug Task Force reports the arrest of Charles Faircloth, 08/19/45, a Town D.O.B. of Poughkeepsie resident, for Criminal Possession of a Controlled Substance in the third-degree with intent to sell, a class B Felony, on November 3. Task Force Agents executed a search warrant at Faircloth's residence located within the Pendell Commons apartment complex in the Town of Poughkeepsie, according to law enforcement officials. This apartment complex is in close proximity to Dutchess Community College.

Task Force Agents seized narcotics and U.S. currency as a result of this investigation, according to Task Force officials. Faircloth was ordered to appear in the Town of Poughkeepsie Justice Court on November 7 for arraignment.

The Dutchess County Drug Task Force was assisted by the Dutchess County Sheriff's Office Patrol Bureau. As with any criminal case the charge described above is merely an accusation and Faircloth is presumed innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.

She remembers how it was difficult for her sister, Julie, to get around. Julie's Jungle is inspired by a girl who loved to be around people. What better place than a playground? Having special needs made it difficult for Julie to play. An all-inclusive park for children is being developed in her memory for all individuals regardless of their abilities and needs."

The playground was initially supposed to be 6,000 square feet, said McHugh, but it is now 16,000 square feet. The four-year plan became a 10-year plant, she said. The Julie's Jungle Garden Dedication Ceremony will take place from noon – 2 p.m. on November 12 at 5 Old Lime Kiln Rd. in East Fishkill. The event will remember Clare and celebrate the completion of the Julie's Jungle Garden.

"Our board of directors over the years have become like family. Losing Clare was like losing a family member. We were all so much a part of each other's lives," said McHugh.

Steve Caswell is a Julie's Jungle board member and treasurer. He said via email, "Clare put her heart and soul into the entire Julie's Jungle playground project. It's only fitting that we dedicate a portion of the playground to Clare."

## Molinaro releases 2023 Executive Budget with 12% County Property Tax rate cut

Dutchess County Executive Marc Molinaro has released his 2023 Executive Budget, with continued focus on tax relief for residents and businesses while improving the services on which county residents depend.

The 2023 budget proposal features a 12 percent property tax rate decrease for 2023 and the lowest property tax levy in 14 years. As proposed, since 2015, the County property tax rate has been cut 32 percent and the property tax levy reduced by more than \$8.1 million with the Molinaro administration's unwavering commitment to conservative fiscal management.

The 2023 Executive Budget documents are available online for review at dutchessny.gov/2023budget.

Additionally, the County Executive will hold two in-person town hall forums about the 2023 Executive Budget proposal:

• Tuesday, November 29th at 6pm at the East Fishkill Town Hall, located at 330 Route 276, Hopewell Junction

"At a time when costs are going up all around us, Dutchess County Government remains committed to cutting costs for county residents and businesses, with our eighth consecutive property tax rate decrease and our ninth straight county levy decrease," said Molinaro. "I have always been committed to returning tax dollars to taxpayers whenever possible and we do this once again with this 2023 budget proposal while expanding our commitment to provide compassionate care for our most vulnerable residents - our older adults, veterans, those of all abilities and those living with mental health and substance use issues - and continue to plan a

brighter future for our young people." Gregg Pulver, Chairman of the Dutchess County Legislature, said, "Having worked closely with County Executive Molinaro for years, I know his dedication to Dutchess County residents, and this Executive Budget carries on his record of putting taxpayers first, again delivering tax relief. Together, we have been committed to prudent economic planning and conservative financing and this has served us well to be strongly positioned Dutchess County to face the historic inflation we are currently seeing. As we begin our scrutiny of this budget proposal, our goal continues to be serving the best interests of the residents we serve.

The 2023 property tax levy, the amount the County collects in property taxes, proposed in the Executive Budget is \$99.45 million, a reduction of nearly \$369,000 from the 2022 levy and is the ninth straight county levy decrease. The tax rate, which is calculated by dividing the property tax levy by full value assessments, will decrease from \$2.85 to \$2.50 per \$1,000 of true value assessments as a result the tax levy reduction, as well as the continued growth in true value assessments (tax base). The County's tax base has grown to nearly \$40 billion thanks to continued focus on economic development and job growth, evidenced by the County's commercial vacancy rate in Dutchess County

remaining the lowest in the region as Dutchess attracts new investment from companies from Amazon and Pepsi Frito Lay among others.

Clothing and footwear items less than \$110 per item will continue to be sales tax free in the 2023 budget, providing savings for families. Sales tax revenue, which represents 45% of total County revenue, is forecasted at \$250.5 million for 2023, a 1% increase over 2022 projected sales tax receipts. The conservative sales tax growth projections are based on inflation rates forecasted between 1.6% and 3.5% in 2023 and minimum consumer spending growth. \$43 million in sales revenue is budgeted for distribution to local municipalities based on the sales tax agreement announced earlier this year.

2023 appropriations Total equal \$560,369,932 compared to 2022 modified budget (actual spending) of \$601 million. In 2022, county spending was notably higher as the County seized the opportunity to pay down debt and avoid future indebtedness by utilizing fund balance. Paying off debt created \$1.6 million in interest savings and by paying for several capital projects up front instead of bonding for them, the County avoided approximately \$10 million in future interest payments based on expected rates. The 2023 Executive Budget focuses on

several key areas:

Creating A Safer Community

The 2023 Executive Budget prioritizes public safety with commitment to ongoing police reform and modernization as well as mental health and opioid use response.

The budget proposal includes two new Deputy Sheriffs serving as additional School Resource Officers, expansion of the Drug Task Force with new participation from the Town of Fishkill, and a full year of the new Law Enforcement Assisted Diversion (LEAD) program, an evidence-based program of street outreach in partnership with People USA where case managers work 'without walls" to connect with individuals who have unmet behavioral health needs.

Funding for body worn cameras is also included in the 2023 budget proposal as a continuation of Police Reform and Modernization initiatives. The Dutchess County Sheriff's Office as well as nine other municipal law enforcement agencies and the New York State Police, will be equipped with body worn cameras that are on the same interoperable system. With this investment, all police agencies in Dutchess County will now have a body worn camera program. Body worn cameras, along with other best practices, are important tools for increasing public trust and protecting officers. Dutchess County Acting Sheriff Kirk Imperati said, "In Dutchess County, we are never satisfied with the status quo and we are always working collaboratively to improve and enhance how we protect and serve our community. We are doing groundbreaking work here in Dutchess and it is a team effort among law enforcement, county departments, community agencies and many others. I appreciate County Executive Molinaro's ongoing support of our law enforcement officers and our collaborative efforts to ensure public safety and get help for those in need."

The 2023 Executive Budget also supports local fire and police agencies with \$500,000 funding for the Municipal Investment Grant Program (MIG) to award grants for building agency capacity and capability. Additionally, the budget proposal includes the purchase of a fire simulator vehicle to provide a safe training tool for vehicle fires and auto accidents for use by agencies across Dutchess County.

The multi-year Public-Safety Radio Network System project continues with funding in the County's Capital Plan to establish a common radio network to provide

interoperability and countywide coverage for all public safety radio users. The initial \$10 million funding was approved by the Dutchess County Legislature in February 2022, and the Capital Plan includes a \$20 million commitment over the next five years. That commitment, however, is expected to be offset by grants totaling up to almost \$7 million.

Serving Our Families - Youth, Veterans and Seniors

Dutchess County continues its commitment to its older adults, veterans and young people, and the 2023 Executive Budget bolsters that pledge with enhanced services and new programs to serve each group

The budget includes funding for several new programs through the Office for the Aging (OFA) to protect older adults throughout Dutchess County, including a partnership with local financial institutions to raise awareness of elder financial exploitation, which continues to rise nationwide. A new "Friendly Calls" service will alleviate the feelings of loneliness and isolation some seniors feel, connecting them with volunteers who will call them weekly, speaking with the older adults for 20-30 minutes and providing all-important social interaction. A new Hoarding Task Force will be developed to tackle the mounting issue of amassing clutter and the physical and mental impact such behavior has a on a senior; and the OFA will offer an evidence- and web-based caregiver education and support platform, at no cost, to any unpaid caregiver in the County to help families build skills to manage care at home for loved ones of any age.

The County's Division of Veterans' Services continues to ensure Dutchess County's heroes receive the benefits, services, and programs they've earned through their service to their country; and the 2023 Executive Budget again supports events for County veterans - including, among others, appreciation gatherings and movie days, as well as annual commemorations on Memorial Day and Veterans Day - and funding for ongoing programs. The budget appropriates \$350,000 for a full year of Mental Health of America of Dutchess County's (MHA) Housing, Employment, Re-integration, and Outreach (H.E.R.O.) program, which provide services to homeless veterans or veterans in danger of becoming homeless by finding permanent housing. An additional \$230,000 will fund MHA's Joseph P. Dwyer Veterans' Peer Services Project, Vet2Vet, which offers support groups, social activities, assistance in finding housing and/or employment for homeless veterans and advocacy for benefits. The Tommy Zurhellen Fund, which increases veterans' access to opportunity and self-sustainability, receives an additional \$20,000 in the 2023 Executive Budget; and \$150,000 will be directed to fund another year of the popular Veterans Microgrants Program.

ThinkDIFFERENTLY

The Budget expands the scope of the County's successful ThinkDIFFERENTLY initiative of inclusiveness for residents and visitors of all abilities with \$160,000 in funding for several short-term objectives of the forthcoming All Abilities Action Plan, which Molinaro will release in its entirety in early 2023.

This budget invests \$50,000 to support expansion of Taconic Resources for Independence's (TRI) Special Education Advocates program, including parent workshops to equip families with the tools needed to advocate for their loved ones in the education system. This funding will more than double the staffing resources devoted to TRI's advocacy program, while also creating the opportunity to renew educational workshops for parents and families.

Through a \$50,000 investment in the 2023 budget, the County will support municipal recreation programs, such as local Challenger athletics leagues and life-changing all abilities groups, such as the Red Hook Public Library's All Abilities Group.

With a \$20,000 investment in the 2023 budget, the County will contract with the Anderson Center for Autism to host supportive workplace trainings to teach employers about the many benefits of hiring those with disabilities, break down barriers and misconceptions, while increasing awareness about simple accommodations and supports including job coaches - all a continuation of the County's efforts to educate businesses and employers, building on Think Jobs framework.

America's first national veterans organization: The Grand Army of the Republic

The United States is home to many veterans organizations. There are organizations of specific groups of veterans: Jewish veterans, Catholic veterans, Navy Officer veterans and others. The largest groups, though, are national in scope and welcome veterans of any age or any rank. They are the American Legion and the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW). Predating them all as the first national veterans organization was the Grand Army of the Republic (GAR). It was formed for Civil War Veterans of the Union side. (There was also a Confederate Veterans organization, the United Confederate Veterans, which was finally dissolved in 1951.) The GAR was founded April 6, 1866.

As a first truly national veterans organization the GAR played a major role, both socially and politically. They hosted annual reunion encampments of their membership to give the members an opportunity to reconnect with comrades.

The GAR became among the first organized advocacy groups in American politics, supporting voting rights for black veterans, promoting patriotic education, helping to make Memorial Day a national holiday, lobbying Congress to establish regular veterans' pensions, and supporting political candidates. Its peak membership, at 410,000, was in 1890.

Today's celebration of Memorial Day as a national holiday can be credited to the GAR's efforts.One of the first orders issued by General John A. Logan as Commander in Chief of the GAR put Memorial Day on the calendar nationally.

In his General Order No. 11, dated May 5, 1868, first GAR Commander-in-Chief, General John A. Logan declared May 30 to be Memorial Day (also referred to for many years as "Decoration Day"), calling upon the GAR membership to make the May 30 observance an annual occurrence. Although not the first time war graves had been decorated, Logan's order effectively established "Memorial Day" as the day upon which Americans now pay tribute to all their war casualties, missing-inaction, and deceased veterans. For many years General Logan's Order, as it was called, was often read aloud at community Memorial Day Ceremonies along with Lincoln's Gettysburg Address.

The organization also worked at healing the wounds of the Civil War and bringing their former foes back into a construc-



The largest of the encampments sponsored by the GAR was the 50th Anniversary Reunion of the Battle of Gettysburg, in 1913. The event included Confederate Veterans, as well. The reunion was seen as a major step in healing the divisions between the former combatants. The Dutchess County GAR was well represented by veterans as well as by widows and families of the 150th New York Volunteers, the "Dutchess Regiment." They had this group photo taken in front of the Gettysburg Battlefield monument to the 150th men who fought and, too often, died there.

tive membership in American society.

A high point of this activity took place in 1913 at the reunion for the Fiftieth Anniversary of the Battle at Gettysburg. Despite official concerns "that there might be unpleasant differences, at least, between the blue and gray," the peaceful reunion was repeatedly marked by events of Union-Confederate camaraderie. There are many photos of veterans of both sides shaking hands on the day Pickett's charge was re-enacted. President Woodrow Wilson's July 4 reunion address summarized the spirit: "We have found one another again as brothers and comrades in arms, enemies no longer, generous friends rather, our battles long past, the quarrel forgotten except that we shall not forget the splendid valor." The members of the GAR produced five presidents of the United States: Ulysees S. Grant, Rutherford B. Hayes, James A. Garfield, Benjamin Harrison, and William McKinley. The last member of the Grand Army of the Republic, one Albert Woolson, died in 1956 at 109 years of age. He was the sole officially listed survivor of the approximately 3 million men who had served in the armed forces of the Union. After Woolson's death the GAR was formally dissolved. Many of their records were handed over to local American Legion or VFW Posts. There were 11 GAR Posts in Dutchess County after the Civil War. The best documented to date is likely the one in Millerton, the Henry Gridley Post 617. It existed from 1887 to 1933. The GAR

naming posts after deceased local soldiers created a model that is followed to this day by American Legion and by some Veterans of Foreign Wars Posts.

Millerton Post 617 was named in honor of 1st Lieutenant Henry Gridley, who was born on September 17, 1836. His father was a successful businessman who owned large amounts of real estate. He was also engaged in significant mining and iron manufacturing in the Harlem Valley.

When the Civil War broke out in 1861, young Gridley was in his third vear at Amherst College in Massachusetts. His family and friends worked hard to convince him to stay until graduation rather than leave college and enlist immediately. They succeeded and he finished his studies. Following graduation he quickly responded to the opportunity to join in recruiting a company for the "Dutchess Regiment" that had only recently been authorized. This company would later be designated as Company A of the 150th New York Volunteer Infantry. It was in that Company that Gridley was commissioned as a First Lieutenant. The 150th was first sent to help protect Baltimore, but in July of 1863 they were ordered north to a little town in Central Pennsylvania. The regiment saw its first combat at Gettysburg from the 1st to 4th of July in 1863. At Gettysburg the 150th lost 45 men, most of them on the third day of the battle when they were on the right flank facing General Pickett's epic charge. went on to take part in many of the largest and bloodiest battles that ensued, first at Chattanooga and then, starting in May of 1864, as part of Sherman's campaign to move from Eastern Tennessee to capture Atlanta. The move on Atlanta was a bloody slog with 128 days of nearly unbroken combat. Atlanta was captured on the second of September. Along the way, though, Lt. Henry Gridley and his men were used by Sherman wherever and whenever they were needed.

On the 22nd of June, said to be the

first sunny day in some time, Gridley was commanding Company A and directing their fire at oncoming Confederate troops. In the fire fight that day, Gridley's war came to an end. He was killed by a bullet to his heart. He died there and was buried near where he fell. Later his remains were recovered for his family and brought home to Dutchess County. Lt. Henry Gridley now rests in his family plot in the South Amenia Cemetery along with other members of his family, including his mother and father.





Another GAR veteran, Pvt. Edward Horton, served in Company A under Lt. Henry Gridley. Just over 30 years old when he enlisted, Horton was one of the older recruits in the company. The day Gridley was killed near Kennesaw Mountain, Horton would have been nearby and could have had a hand in moving his body to safety. Unlike too many, Pvt. Horton went home safely and lived well into the 20th century. He is buried in what was then called the Presbyterian Churchyard but is now the Pleasant Valley Cemetery.

recruiting office on Hollywood Boulevard, where she was Secretary and Chaufferette, "I love the word 'chaufferette,' said Maio, to the Commander of that unit. Helen would accompany him to various civic and publicity agendas. She would then model the uniform and make recruiting appearances.

At 23 years old, Helen was honorably discharged at the rank of Staff Sgt. in 1945, said Maio. She went to work for the U.S. Veterans Administration in Poughkeepsie until 1947, said Maio. Helen married Lt. Warren Murphy, who was from East Fishkill, in 1947.

During her marriage, while raising her five young daughters (Karen, Linda, Maryann, Kathleen, and Patricia), Helen lived in California, Alaska, Japan and Germany, due to her husband's career.

"I think she liked Japan. She went there twice," said Maio. "Life was not easy for my mom at all in the service. Five girls; my dad often flying away (for work)."

Maio remarked, "My mother did enjoy being in the service and a service wife." She lived on three bases in California, said Maio. The family also moved every two years, Helen and her husband moved back to Poughkeepsie after his retirement in the late 1960s.

Maio stated that her mother "was really in her element at the American Legion Post.

"She was a veteran and she said 'I don't want to be in the Ladies Auxiliary," said Maio. Helen eventually ran for Commander of Arlington American Legion Post 1302, said Maio, and was the first Female Commander of that Post.

"She was very proud of that. She was very involved in the Legion until her

90s," said Maio. Helen died in 2016. Ann Shershin is with the Post.

"I was aware of the Town of Poughkeepsie's Hometown Hero banners and noticed that all the banners hung in the Arlington were of men. I knew Helen Murphy from the American Legion Auxiliary Post 1302. She has also a member of American Legion and proud of her service during World War II. I thought it would be lovely for Helen to be remembered with a hometown hero banner," said Shershin. "My Auxiliary unit agreed to sponsor the banner. I contacted Helen's daughter, Patricia Maio, and the Dutchess County Veterans Affairs, and they helped to get Helen's discharge papers. The American Legion supplied the picture We put everything of Helen. together and summite $\bar{d}$  the application to the Town of Poughkeepsie. It took a whole community to make the banner happen."

Shershin said a group went to see the banner and to have their picture taken with the banner that honors Helen.

"One of the other members, Eleanor Rolla, said that she had known Helen Murphy for many years and was proud to have been able to join us at the banner," remarked Shershin.

Maio said, "I absolutely love the banner." Maio stated she never considered having a banner for her mother "as an option."

"That is an example of how dedicated they (Ladies Auxiliary and American Legion members) are to the veterans."

The location of the banner is not lost on Maio either.

Helen used to take her daughters to what was then the Juliet Theater and she worked at Vassar College.

"She was very proud of herself and other servicewomen," said Maio.

# Three Red Hook brothers in the Civil War

Initially a day for observing the de facto conclusion of "The War to End All Wars," November 11th has expanded into a commemoration of the sacrifices made by individuals who gave up years of their lives to defend American freedoms. In consequence, Veterans Day is as much about the monotony of military life as it is about grand battles.

The service personnel who returned from far-away postings and conflicts often brought back engaging stories that lingered in their communities for the remainder of their lives. Sometimes, those stories were more about the inner workings of the military than battlefield exploits.

An example of both comes from the Civil War service of three brothers from Red Hook. All three enlisted in the 150th New York Volunteer Infantry Regiment, initially raised in 1862 in response to a threatened federal draft. This unit was also known as "The Dutchess County Regiment," since communities across the county in partnership with county government, worked hard to enlist the required number of recruits. Two of the brothers served for the entire war, while the third joined later, still managing to participate in one of General William Tecumseh Sherman's legendary campaigns. The twist in this story does not involve their military service, however, but the inability of officers to spell the brothers' names correctly.

The New York State Military Museum in Saratoga Springs maintains an excellent database of Civil War regimental data and is the starting point for this saga. The Adjutant General of the State of New York's report on the 150th NY, available on the museum's website, records three Showerman Brothers from Red Hook: Allen, Horatio and Peter.

Allen and Peter enlisted in the 150th NY in August and September 1862, mustering into Company F commanded by Captain John L. Green. Both brothers made it through the war, participating in all of the regiment's engagements from Gettysburg through the 1865 Carolinas Campaign. Allen was 38 and Peter was 29 at their dates of enlistment. Horatio, their younger brother, enlisted at Fishkill in August 1864 to serve one year. He joined his brothers in Company F for Sherman's final march through the Carolinas. Peter and Horatio took part in the victory parade in Washington, D.C., in June 1865, while Allen ended the war in a military hospital in Troy, New York.

### Mystery of names

The name mystery begins with this report: In addition to their abbreviated records of service, the Adjutant General's Office noted that Horatio was also listed in the rolls by the surname of "Sherman" and that Allen appeared on some rolls with the surname of "Shorman." A look at the official muster roll of the regiment from October 11, 1862, (also available on the New York State Military Museum's website) records a Peter Sherman and an Allen Sharman in Company F. Sherman, nor Sharman in Red Hook's contingent. The book does record, however, an Allan Shamerhorn and a Peter Shamerhorn, both enlisted by John L. Green. No Shamerhorns appear on the official regimental rolls in Company F.

Finally, there are the gravestones, which mark the final resting places of Allan Showerman and Horatio Schowerman in the Red Hook Methodist Cemetery, Village of Red Hook, and Peter Showerman in St. John's Cemetery, Upper Red Hook. Peter was the first of the brothers to pass on: He succumbed to dyspepsia in 1869. Allen lived until 1892, while Horatio died in 1935. It is from Horatio, the longestlived of the 150th NY brothers, that the final twist in our story comes.

### Horatio's tale

In August 1920, a local reporter interviewed Horatio for an article that appeared in the August 16th edition of the Rhinebeck Gazette newspaper. Entitled "Horatio Sherman, 86, Never Was In School," the interview covered all aspects of Horatio's life. According to this youngest of the Sherman/Showerman brothers, his family was poor and could not afford to send him to school in his youth. He left home at the age of 10 to become a farm worker, which may explain why he enlisted at Fishkill.

His only break from agricultural labor came during his year-long service with the 150th NY. Horatio related that he was only in one battle, but that it last three days and nights-probably the Battle of Averasboro, North Carolina. He also vividly remembered the epic march from North Carolina to Washington, DC, to participate in the final victory parade and mustering out. Horatio reported making the march in 18 days, having "hoofed it every step from Raleigh to Washington." The article closed on a somber note, observing that Horatio was in ill-health and intended to move across the Hudson to live with his son in Rondout.

Could Horatio's tale of a missed education offer an explanation for how three brothers could be listed with such varying last names? Unable to write or spell their own names, were they left at the mercy of the phonetic spelling of the officers who recorded them on the official roles? In his "History of Education in Dutchess County, 1716-1959," Charles Donald King Jr. recorded that free public education came late to New York. It was only in 1867 that the State Assembly passed a law requiring universal public education for residents. While the one-room schoolhouse system predated that law, sprouting up in some villages as early at the 1790s, rural areas of the county continued to depend on private academies or chu'rch schools for most of the nineteenth century. In Red Hook's case, an academy opened in Upper Red Hook in the 1820s, but required private tuition. So it is possible that the three brothers did not benefit from formal education and the recording officers spelled what they heard.

## Cary Institute to present talk on 'zoonotic diseases' Nov. 10

Cary Institute of Ecosystem Studies will present a virtual science talk featuring Cary Institute disease ecologist Dr. Barbara Han in conversation with Cary President Dr. Joshua Ginsberg on November 10 at 7 p.m. Coronaviruses, Monkeypox, and Ebola are all examples of "zoonotic diseases" - those that spread from wildlife and domesticated animals to people. Zoonotic pathogens claim millions of lives each year, and outbreaks are increasing in frequency.

What if we could forecast pathogen spillovers and diffuse them before they harm people, other animals, or ecosystems? This question is at the heart of Han's research pro-

gram. Working at the intersection of ecology, computing, and global public health, she is developing new tools to predict and preempt zoonotic disease outbreaks.

Using machine learning, a form of artificial intelligence (AI), Han's models have revealed mammal species most likely to harbor COVID-19 and cause spillback transmission of harmful variants to people. She has also led research on global patterns of zoonotic disease in mammals, including Nipah and Ebola hotspots, bat species most likely to spread filoviruses, and rodent and carnivore species likely to serve as zoonotic disease reservoirs.
