Democrats take control of County Legislature for first time since 2008

In a win of historic proportions, Dutchess County Democrats flipped the County Legislature in unofficial results from the Dutchess County Board of elections and now own a 15-10 majority of the county's 25 district seats. The last time the Democratic Party held a majority in the County Legislature was in 2008 and prior to that was in 1977.

Yvette Valdés Smith, current minority leader in the Legislature, commented, "We are thrilled to hold the majority in the Dutchess County legislature. We are ready to get to work on Day One for the people of Dutchess County. I have been the minority leader of the Democratic caucus of the Dutchess County Legislature for two terms, and I am honored to have been re-elected by my constituents in the town of Fishkill and the City of Beacon for a third term. Representing our community and making people's lives better is my priority."

She added, "We were able to flip the legislature with incredible candidates who have a wealth of experience and because we really listen to our neighbors. And we will deliver results to make their lives better. Issues of affordability, the housing and EMS (Emergency Medical Services) crisis and mental health have consistently been top of mind for Dutchess County residents."

Michael Dupree, chairman of Dutchess County Democratic Party said, "We won because we started reaching out to voters in July with an extensive field operation. Using past data on voting patterns, we selected different districts to try to flip and made sure we had volunteers to knock on doors, make phone calls and

texts. The committee also raised more funds than we ever have in the past, so we were able to devote more resources to digital ads and sent volunteers into all the districts where we had candidates. By last Monday, we had hit 58,000 doors and

made 55,000 phone calls."

He added, "That's the mechanics that enabled us to take advantage of the dissatisfaction across our county with the actions of the Republicans at the national level to post such large wins in our county-wide races and to pick up the five seats in the legislature. But more importantly, we had great candidates. Smart and all willing to go to the voters we targeted as potential supporters, as well as an understanding of the top issues facing our county: housing and affordability crisis, lag times for EMS in the eastern, rural

portions of Dutchess and insufficient mental health resources, especially for younger people. They walked the walk and talked the talk which can be a winning formula."

With the victory, the Democrats will be welcoming six new legislators: Trevor Redl (District 1), Emma Arnoff (District 2), Anna Shah (District 5), Alix Winsby (District 14), Molly Rhodes (District 18) and Eric Alexander (District 25). They will join incumbents Brendan Lawler (District 4), Lisa Kaul (District 6), Craig Brendli (District 8), Barrington Atkins (District 9), Randy Johnson (District 10), Brennan Kearney (District 11), Valdes-Smith (District 16), Chris Drago (District 19) and Kristofer Munn (District 20).

Democrats win 2 board seats in Fishkill

There were four names on the ballot for two seats on the Fishkill Town Board. Democrats Jacqueline Bardini and Don Przytula won the seats. The following are the unofficial results from the Dutchess County Board

Incumbent Bardini was on the Democratic and Working Families lines. She received 2,780 votes in total, 28.92%.

Don Przytula ran on the Democratic, and Working Families lines. He received 2,493 votes in total, 25.94%.

Current board members John Forman, ran for a seat on the Dutchess County Legislature, and Brian Wrye, was not on the ballot.

Aymar-Blair tops Truitt for County Comptroller

Incumbent Democrat Aymar-Blair withstood the challenge of current Republican Legislature Chairman Will Truitt in the race for Dutchess County Comptroller in last week's election. In unofficial results from the Dutchess County Board of Elections, Aymar-Blair received 40,358 votes to 32,297 for Truitt.

"The voters of Dutchess County are hungry for transparency and information in these uncertain times and I'm honored that they chose me to provide that," said Aymar Blair. "By having the opportunity to show the voters what I'm about and how I do this work, I think the contrast between the two candidates was clear.'

He added, "Next year, you'll see a continued focus on transparency and accountability from the Comptroller's office. And we'll be looking for new ways to center the people in our work, particularly our reporting."

Aymar-Blair defeated Gregg Pulver in the 2024 race for **Dutchess County Comptroller and** served the final year of the fouryear term of Robin Lois, a Democrat who resigned to become the state's deputy comptroller for local government and school accountability.

In his Facebook post on the day after the election, Truitt said, 'Serving Dutchess County over the last 10 years in the Legislature has been the utmost privilege and deepest honor of my life. I owe everything I've been able to accomplish to the people of Hyde Park & Poughkeepsie, who took a chance and believed in me as I knocked on their doors as a 20-year-old kid.

Edwards re-elected to a second term in Town of Poughkeepsie

Town of Poughkeepsie Supervisor Rebecca Edwards, who was on the Democratic and Working Families lines, was re-elected to a second term. She was challenged by Larry Sheehan, on the Republican and Conservative lines.

The following are the unofficial

results from the Dutchess County Board of Elections.

Town of East Fishkill supervisor Nick D'Alessandro and Town of Wappinger Supervisor Joseph Cavaccini have been re-elected. D'Alessandro who ran on the Republican and Conservative lines had no opponent in this election. Cavaccini, who was on the Republican line, was unopposed as well. The following are the unofficial results from the Dutchess County Board of Election.

D'Alessandro received 4,939 votes, 97.59% He had 4,011 on the Republican line and 928 on the Conservative line.

Standing with survivors beyond Domestic Violence Awareness Month

To the Editor:

Domestic Violence Awareness Month may have come to a close, but it's important to remember that protecting survivors doesn't stop in October. For too many New Yorkers, domestic violence is not a statistic—it is a daily reality.

In the State Senate, I've worked to strengthen laws so survivors are fully protected and abusers are held accountable. Melanie's Law, which I co-sponsored, allows courts to issue orders of protection for immediate family or household members of victims, regardless of age, but there is more work to do.

Senate Bill S.6835 increases penalties for violations of court-ordered supervision, including absconding while under electronic monitoring. Senate Bill S.6836 ensures repeat violations of aggravated criminal contempt carry real consequences. Protective orders are only as strong as the system enforcing them.

The Lethality Assessment Program, used in only a few counties, helps first responders identify victims in immediate danger and connect them with lifesaving services. Expanding it statewide could save countless lives.

As a former police officer, I know public safety is more than enforcement—it's the security every person deserves at home. Strengthening protections for survivors strengthens our communities.

Even though Domestic Violence Awareness Month has ended, our work must continue. Every bill I support represents a person who deserves safety, dignity, and peace and that fight doesn't stop with the calendar.

Debate challenge: My evidence vs. Lance Ashworth's fake facts

To the Editor:

In a letter dated Nov. 4, Lance Ashworth, Chairman of the Friends of the Fishkill Supply Depot, once again claims that Revolutionary War soldiers are buried on the Continental Commons property. That claim is false and directly contradicted by years of evidence, professional review, and even Mr. Ashworth's own sworn testimony.

Mr. Ashworth continues to play loose with the truth when not under oath. Under oath, when asked whether the Friends contend that the burials on the site are those of Revolutionary War soldiers, he admitted, "We don't know because we weren't there during the Revolutionary War." In other words, even Mr. Ashworth acknowledges there is no definitive evidence that Revolutionary War soldiers are buried on the property - only speculation.

That speculation has been thoroughly reviewed and rebuked by every credible authority, because there is no evidence whatsoever that the Continental Commons property contains Revolutionary War soldiers' burials. The New York State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO), the Town of Fishkill's archaeologist, and more than a dozen professional archaeological studies have all reached the same conclusion. SHPO even clarified in a 2015 letter to the Town - which Mr. Ashworth is fully aware of - that a prior staff statement suggesting soldiers were buried on the property was mistaken.

Furthermore, the New York State Supreme Court upheld the Town of Fishkill Planning Board's four-year environmental review and dismissed all of Mr. Ashworth's claims. Neither he nor anyone in his group has formal training as an archaeologist, historian, or environmental professional. The qualified experts who do have those credentials - and whose work has been accepted by state and local authorities - have consistently verified the project's integrity.

Mr. Ashworth, let's stop hiding behind falsehoods and face the facts. I challenge you to a public debate, at any time and place you name - your "evidence" against my evidence. Don't bail on this challenge again. Let's finally put your fake facts to rest and show the community who's telling the truth.

State of Emergency declared in Wappingers Falls

Wappingers Falls Mayor Kevin Huber declared a state of emergency in Wappingers Falls on Nov. 3. According to the declaration, the state of emergency is "due to unsafe travel conditions by motor vehicles on Reservoir Place because "... excavation and construction" and "such conditions threated the public afety of the citizens and residents of the Village of Wappingers Falls."

The state of emergency will be in effect for 30 days or until Huber rescinds the declaration.

Huber states in the declaration, he directs "all departments and agencies in the Village of Wappingers falls to take whatever steps necessary to protect life, property, public infrastrucand deemed necessary."

City qualified residents pick up cards for groceries

The Beacon City Council voted to approve emergency municipal funding to help mitigate difficulties for residents whose Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) have been interrupted by the federal government shutdown on Nov. 3.

Qualifying Beacon residents picked up one of three grocery card options at the City's Recreation Center on Nov. 6-8.

Thanks was given to Key Food Marketplace, Beacon Natural Market, and the Beacon Farmers Market for partnering with the City of Beacon to provide this food security intervention. According to City officials, each organization offered discounted rates to the City for the cards, so that the allocated local funding goes further in supporting the City's vulnerable families while federal benefits are delayed.

In order to receive a card, one had to being a photo identification, proof of residency and one's SNAP card.

All 4 Town of Wappinger Ward board seats were on the ballot on Nov. 4.

The following are the unofficial results from the Dutchess County Board of Elections.

Ward1 will once again be represented by William Beale. Beale ran on the Republican and Conservative lines. He received 716 total votes, 50.85%. He had 117 on the Conservative line and 599 on the Republican line.

Beale posted in part on social media on Nov. 5, "Since 2005, when I first ran for public office, I have been Blessed to represent the residents of our Great Town of Wappinger. It certainly would not have been possible last night without support from every single one of you, regardless of your political affiliation.'

Beale was challenged by Samtreo Tucker, who was on the Democratic and Working Families lines. Tucker had 692 total votes 49.15%. He earned 607 votes on the Democratic line and 85 on the Working Families line.

Ward 2 will be represented by

Heather O'Dell, who was on the Democratic and Working Families lines. She received 640 votes on the Democratic line and 94 on the Working Families line for a total of 734 votes, 51.44%

O'Dell told Southern Dutchess News, via email, about the election results, "I'm deeply humbled and honored to represent the people of Wappinger. Thank you for trusting me with this responsibility. Together, we'll keep building a community that reflects our shared values: respect, transparency, and progress for every resident. I look forward to listening, learning, and serving—side by side—with all of you."

Sara Sheehan was on the Republican and Conservative lines for Ward 2. She received 690 total votes, 48.35%. She had 105 votes on the Conservative line and 585 on the Republican line.

Christopher Phillips retains the seat for Ward 3. He ran on the Republican line and received 1,108 votes, 51.27%.

Phillips posted to social media, "Thank you, [t]o the residents who elected for me to serve them, from the

Partnership creates collaborative effort with new family day care in Poughkeepsie

A groundbreaking collaboration between a hospital, housing group, bank, and nonprofit is tackling the region's child care crisis head-on. Last week, these four partners gathered with elected officials and community members to celebrate the completion of renovations at The NEST on Young Street in Poughkeepsie.

(Nurturing Early Success Together), marking a major milestone for a new, fully renovated home that will serve local families while creating a path to business ownership and homeownership for a local early educator. The innovative partnership between Vassar Brothers Medical Center, Hudson River Housing, DAY ONE Early Learning Community, and NBT Bank, is creating Dutchess County's first 24-hour child care model.

During the ribbon cutting, the partners announced a \$100,000 grant from the Dutchess County-Poughkeepsie Land Bank that will fund the renovation of an adjacent property, making round-the-clock care a reality. The NEST will help hospital workers and other essential employees whose shifts don't fit traditional care hours, while also serving families throughout the community.

At the heart of this project is Day One, a local nonprofit that helps com-

munity members become high quality early childhood educators and business owners through its paid Teacher Apprenticeship Pathway (TAP). TAP participants earn while they learn, gaining hands-on classroom experience and graduating with the credentials and confidence to lead their own programs. Day One TAP graduate Danielle McClinton will own and operate the licensed Group Family Day Care at 2 Young Street, live on-site in the renovated home, run her own business, and work toward eventual homeownership. "I never imagined owning my own business was possible in early education. Day One believed in me and gave me the tools to do this. Now I get to welcome families into this beautiful space and give their children the joy and learning they need during the most important years of their lives. I'm so proud to be doing this work right here in my community," said Danielle McClinton, DAY ONE TAP Graduate and Business Owner Day One brought the partners to the table, and each one played a critical

role. Vassar Brothers Medical Center owns the property and is leasing it to Hudson River Housing, which renovated

the vacant home. NBT Bank and loan funding by the Leviticus Fund provided seed funding for the work completed by Hudson River Housing, and their general

contractor, Gutierrez Building Corp. The newly announced \$100,000 grant will now allow the partners to renovate the adjacent property at 6 Young Street.

Town of Poughkeepsie receives design grant for woodland trail at Sunnyside Park

The Town of Poughkeepsie has received a \$27,500 grant from the Greenway Conservancy Trail Program of the Hudson River Valley Greenway, for the design phase of a woodland trail at Sunnyside Park. The proposed trail, crossing through Town-owned woods and wetlands adjacent to the park, would provide residents with a safe place to walk their dogs and enjoy peaceful woodlands. The trail would connect through to Malmros Terrace, allowing many more residents to access the park on foot rather than by car on Vassar Road.

Town Board member Barbara Laird, representative of Ward 2, said, "I am thrilled that the Town was able to get this grant! Building this trail and boardwalk over the stream at the end of Malmros Terrace will allow us to complete the walking trail behind Sunnyside Park and link two beautiful neighborhoods through the natural landscape. It adds to our overall goal of creating a more walkable town."

"We are so pleased to have received this grant," said Town of Poughkeepsie Parks

and Recreation Director Nate Smith. "Hopefully the design will help us expand the boundaries of the park to give the community greater pedestrian access to this beautiful park."

"This town-owned parcel of land has long been ignored and neglected," said Town of Poughkeepsie Supervisor Rebecca Edwards. "Thanks to the Hudson River Valley Greenway, we can begin a long-term process of expanding park amenities, giving residents access to more green space, and restoring wetland habitat."

The Hudson River Valley Greenway [https://hudsongreenway.ny.gov/overview-mission] provides grants with the goal of continuing and advancing New York State's commitment to the preservation, enhancement, and development of the scenic, natural, historic, cultural and recreational resources of the Hudson River Valley while continuing to emphasize economic development activities and remaining consistent with the tradition of municipal home rule.

There were 6 seats on the Beacon City Council on this year's ballot. All candidates on the ballot ran on the Democratic line. The following are the unofficial results from the Dutchess County Board of Elections.

Council At-Large incumbents Amber Grant and Paloma Wake were re-elected. Grant received 2,967 votes, 48.84%, all on the Democratic line. Wake had 3,050 in total votes, 50.21%, earning 2,292 on the Democratic line and 758 on the Working Families line.

Ward 1 will now be represented by Lastar Gorton. Gorton received 815 votes. She had 627 votes, 99.27%, on the Democratic line and 188 votes on the Working Families line.

Zack Smith will now represent Ward 2

voters in the city. Smith earned 748 votes, 99.20%, on the Democratic line.

Ward 3 has a new representative on the council. Sergei Krasikov received 687, 98.71%, votes. He had 515 on the Democratic line and 172 votes on the Working Families line.

Carolyn Bennett Glauda received 935 votes, 99.26%, and will represent Ward 4 residents. She had 726 votes on the Democratic line and 209 on the Working Families line.

Bennett Glauda stated, in part, on social media on Nov. 5. "You turned out big, you volunteered, you voted, and you told friends."



"She was someone I had the utmost respect for. I'm massively appreciative of all the guidance and knowledge she was able to share with me, my daughter, and my granddaughter."




defend New Rochelle's screaming attacks. Cameron Clyde's hot hand and demonstrative kills further propelled the team to victory.

"It was a lot to face, but with an incredible medical team, the love and persistence of my family and friends, and a deep faith that kept me grounded, I made it through," she said.

As for her health now, Mannese said, "Today, I feel better than ever. My entire life has changed for the better — I'm doing what I love, surrounded by people who I love and who love me unconditionally. I even made my dream come true by opening my very own boutique, UnWrinkled. I feel better than I ever have! Every day truly feels like a gift, and most importantly, I don't take a single one for granted.'

The Go Red for Women Luncheon saves lives, remarked Mannese.

"The funds raised through Go Red support life-saving research, education, and advancements in care that most people don't even realize are happening quietly in the background. When I finally found the courage to go to the doctor, I received the most incredible care imaginable — care that was made possible by the awareness and funding from events just like this one,' said Mannese.

She noted, "By attending, you're not just showing up for an afternoon; you're helping countless women especially those who are scared or hesitant, like I once was — get the early detection, information, and support they need. Learning connections with food: Leaveners

There are many interesting connections to be made between biology and chemistry and a basic human need: Food. Lots of staple foods made from cereals and grains are leavened, meaning that a substance has been added – or a process has been performed – which incorporates gas to lighten and soften the dough or batter mixture. Commonly, that substance is a biological leavener. Yeast, a one-celled living organism (a fungus) is often added to recipes. Through fermentation, the yeasts make energy from sugar and release the carbon dioxide bubbles and alcohol that give the desired rise to baked goods.

In the culinary world, yeast and bacteria are considered biological leaveners, since they are organisms. But leaveners can come in other forms. They can also be chemical or physical.

Chemical leaveners

They may sound like something you wouldn't want in your kitchen, but chemical leaveners are ingredients that you are quite familiar with - baking powder or baking soda. They work through reactions. When baking soda comes into contact with an acid (such as yogurt or lemon juice) - or baking powder comes into contact with a liquid they produce carbon dioxide. The gas creates small bubbles that aerate batter or dough, causing rise.

Physical leaveners

Steam is a physical leavening agent. It is used to make croissants, cheesecakes, custards, and pastries. Baked goods created with multiple tiers of butter and dough

form puffed, flaky layers when the water within the butter turns into steam and increases the product's volume.

Other methods for introducing steam to baking include ovens which have built-in attachments for steam, setting a pan of water on the bottom of an oven during baking, adding a cover over what is being baked (such as a cloche, Dutch oven, or a metal mixing bowl). A water bath or double boiling pan can also be used to add moisture to an oven and surround the baking pan with uniform heat. Spraying the dough and the sides of the oven with water is yet another method of creating steam.

Air is another type of physical leavening created with a machine or a tool. This is also referred to as mechanical leavening. Mechanical leaveners are used to create light, fluffy baked goods such as soufflés, cakes such as sponge, angel food, and chiffon, mousse, frosting, meringue, biscuits, cookies, and marshmallows.

Mechanical leavening involves manipulating ingredients to create and trap tiny air bubbles which help baked goods rise. This form of leavening involves using a mixer, blender, or whisk. Ingredients which are used in mechanical leavening include cream, eggs, butter, and aquafaba. Kneading is another method of adding air through the folding and rolling of dough, causing it to rise.

A fun (and edible) investigation

As an alternative to the typical biological leavener (yeast) for making bread, use a mechanical and physical leavener for making soda bread and popovers. Recipes for both can be found online. Soda bread can be made with your favorite liquid (soda, milk, beer, etc.). Popovers rely on steam for leavening.

Baking becomes a scientific experiment when observations are made. Which recipe results in the highest rise, the chewiest crust, and the most satisfying taste? Grilled Sausage Burgers with Broccoli di Rabe

Ingredients

1 lb. Broccoli di Rabe

4 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil, plus more for brushing

6 garlic cloves, minced

1/4 cup of water

Salt and pepper

1 pound sweet or hot Italian sausages meat (no casing)

4 slices of provolone cheese

1/4 cup of pesto

4 tablespoons of mayonnaise

4 round ciabatta rolls, split and toasted

Method

In a large skillet, add olive oil and minced garlic. Once the garlic is brown add the broccoli di Rabe, salt and pepper to taste as well as ¼ cup of water. Cover and let simmer for 15-20 minutes on low heat. Remove and place in a bowl covered in plastic wrap.

Light a grill or preheat a grill pan. Using slightly moistened hands, form the sausage meat into four 4-inch patties, about ¾ inch thick. Brush the burgers with oil and grill over moderate heat until browned and crusty on the bottom, about 5 minutes. Carefully flip the burgers. Top with the cheese and grill until the burgers are cooked through and the cheese is melted, about 5 minutes longer.

In a small bowl place the pesto and mayonnaise and stir till blended. Spread the pesto on the rolls. Place the burger on the roll. Top with broccoli di rabe and serve.



The Dutchess Community College Foundation (DCCF) will host a lecture by John Schmitz, Ph.D., professor of history at Northern Virginia Community College, on Thursday, Nov. 20, at 7 p.m. in the James & Betty Hall Theatre on the College's main campus.

Part of the Distinguished Lecture Series to Perpetuate the Legacy of Franklin and Eleanor Roosevelt, the talk, titled "Enemies Among Us: Civility and Civil Rights During the Second World War," will explore how fear, prejudice and national security concerns during World War II tested Americans' commitment to civility and civil rights at home. The son and grandson of World War II internees, Schmitz brings both personal perspective and scholarly expertise to the subject.

While the internment of Japanese Americans is well documented, he sheds light on the lesser known stories of German and Italian Americans who were also relocated, interned or repatriated—often in greater numbers. His research examines how these policies arose, the conditions faced by those affected, and the long-term consequences for individuals and families. Schmitz is the author of "Enemies Among Us: The Relocation, Internment, and Repatriation of German, Italian, and Japanese Americans during the Second World War" and coauthor of "A Crisis of Identity: Good Aliens, Bad Americans, or Bargaining Chips?"



Attacca Quartet to perform November 16 in Beacon

The Howland Chamber Music Circle (HCMC) will host the two-time Grammy Award-winning Attacca Quartet. They will perform at the Howland Cultural Center on Sunday, Nov. 16, at 4 p.m. Following the concert, audience members can meet the musicians and enjoy complimentary refreshments. The Attacca Quartet won their first Grammy in 2000 for Orange, an album that was a collaboration with composer Caroline Shaw; their second Grammy in 2023 was for an album, Evergreen, featuring both compositions and vocals by Caroline Shaw. This quartet has been acutely described as living "in the present aesthetically, without rejecting the virtues of the musical past." (The Nation) Their repertoire ranges from the 18th century to the 21st century, having recorded Beethoven's complete cycle of string quartets, and the complete works for string quartets by John Adams. The Attacca has also recorded works composed by Vassar professor, Richard E. Wilson.

The Attacca Quartet was launched in 2003 when two of the current members were students at The Juilliard School of

Music. They have since been that school's Graduate Resident String Quartet, as well as the Quartet in Residence at the Metropolitan Museum of Art. They have played in great music halls throughout the globe.

For this concert, Attacca will explore the nocturne which was initially conceived as late night music and has evolved to evoking twilight. They will play nocturnes by Poulenc and Chopin, arranged by one of their violinists, Amy Schroeder, and by contemporary composer David Lang, as well as one by the 20th century composer Bela Bartok. Attacca will close their program with a quartet by 19th century composer Felix Mendelssohn.

Please note that Attacca will also play a concert for children, part of HCMC's Classics For Kids, at 1 p.m. on Nov. 16. It will be a musical adventure story-time. Children are invited for free, while their accompanying adults must purchase tickets for \$15.

HCMC now offers tickets to its main series at prices to include music lovers who may have been unable to afford our tickets in the past. A limited number of tickets will be available on a pay-what-you-wish basis. These tickets will be released one week prior to each main chamber series concert.
