Fishkill Highway Superintendent Scofield to retire after 50-plus years

Fishkill Highway Town of Superintendent Glenn Scofield is looking ahead - not to the first big snowstorm of the winter but to retirement. The longtime highway superintendent did not seek reelection this time. He will be retired as 2024 is ushered in and Carmine Istvan, a local business owner and Fishkill board member, will take over for Scofield. Istvan was elected to the Highway Superintendent position in November. Scofield first took office in 1970 after running for the elected position in November 1969. In all, Scofield has served in the town for 62 years (which includes his time before he became superintendent) in the Highway Department.

It was in 1969 that Scofield first ran for election. Scofield was elected to the superintendent position after his father decided not to run for that post again.

"It was in my blood. My father had been superintendent since 1950 and he wanted to retire.," explained Scofield, who said he began going out on the jobs with his father then. The younger Scofield noted his father was "happy" that he decided to run for superintendent.

Scofield said, "When I was working for him (his father), the Town did not have much equipment. As the time they had to hire a bulldozer to come in and plow Beacon Hills. The state police escorted the bulldozer. When it stopped snowing the moon was out bright. I rode with the bulldozer telling him (the driver) where things were. That was one time [during a storm]."

When Scofield first ran for office, it was for a two-year term. Since then, the voters voted to make the highway super-

intendent term four years.

During Scofield's early years as highway superintendent, he said the Town fleet consisted of only a loader, a couple of pick-up trucks and a couple of plow trucks. There were five employees in the department at that time.


"We've probably tripled our fleet over time," noted Scofield. The department -Photo by Kristine Coulter

now has 13 employees. During the spring and summer months the workers in the department take care of drainage and pave approximately 7 miles

of road a year now, according to Scofield. Scofield said he had an opponent in

1969 when he was running for office, and again four years ago.

Goverman reflects on 20 years as leader of East Fishkill Community library

Gloria Goverman, the director for the East Fishkill Library District, is retiring after 20 years.

"I started in November 2003 a little more than 20 years ago. I had been the director of the Town of Pelham Public Library for 8.5 years and the commute was really getting to me, so when I became aware of this position being

On Monday evening, Dec 11, family, friends and colleagues gathered at the Poughkeepsie Grandview to honor District Attorney William "Bill" Grady for his 40 years of public service to the people of Dutchess County.

In his remarks Grady said, "It has been an honor and privilege to serve the people of Dutchess County as their District Attorney. My entire career has been dedicated to holding offenders accountable, ensuring that the needs of crime victims were met, as well as being proactive in creating and supporting programs for offenders which deal with the underlying causes of crime such as alcohol, drug abuse and mental health issues."

In order to address these unique needs, Grady mentioned the creation of the Special Victims Bureau, Violent Crime Bureau, and DWI Bureau, organization of the Dutchess County Drug Task Force, and played a significant role in helping to organize the County's Domestic Response Team.

DA Grady's career began in 1970 when he was hired as the first full time assistant DA by then DA Albert M. Rosenblatt. Grady said, "At that time, it was a small office with seven part time ADAs (Assistant District Attorneys). Since I was elected as DA in 1983, the size of the office has grown to 36 full time ADAs, including 20 women. Seven Bureaus were also created to deal with the complexity and increased numbers of various crimes."

East Fishkill Acting Police Chief: DiDato 'was everything First responders, that encompassed a great police officer and friend'

East Fishkill Police Officer Daniel P. DiDato began with the department in January 2005. It was while on duty, on December 18, that he was on the southbound side of the Taconic State Parkway, in a one-car crash near mile marker 36.2. He later succumbed to his injuries. DiDato served for 22 years, nearly 19 of which he served in East Fishkill. DiDato was posthumously made sergeant.

East Fishkill Acting Chief of Police Derrick Cuccia said in a statement: "The Town of East Fishkill Police Department is saddened to announce the line of duty death of Police Officer Daniel P. DiDato."

Cuccia said, "Officer DiDato was everything that encompassed a great police officer and friend; he was genuine, smart, courageous, tough and witty.'

East Fishkill Supervisor Nicholas D'Alessandro said about DiDato to Southern Dutchess News, "He was an exceptional employee, police officer, at community relations and a person. He was a good man and a very decent person."

According to Cuccia, "On December 18, 2023, at approximately 6:30 p.m., Officer DiDato was involved in a serious one-car motor vehicle accident on the Taconic State Parkway while responding to Westchester Medical Center to continue an investigation with an accident victim. He was transported to Mid-Hudson Regional Hospital where he later succumbed to his injuries and was pronounced dead."

Matthew Orsino is a former police chief for the police department in East Fishkill. Orsino told Southern Dutchess News: "Officer DiDato was an excellent Police Officer who fearlessly protected the residents of the Town of East Fishkill and the greater Dutchess County community as a whole. He was a dedicated professional, with a wonderful family and sense of humor, who will be profoundly missed by everyone he interacted with."

Bill Green, the recreation director for East Fishkill, in an email, stated to Southern Dutchess News: "Dan DiDato was a friendly, hard-working, conscientious, and truly dedicated police officer who was always available to assist all ages at all times. Dan was a loyal partner to the Recreation Department who could always count on him when needed. He will be missed by all.'

D'Alessandro, who said DiDato's brother is a retired detective with the East Fishkill Police Department, was asked about what he has heard from the community about the tragic loss.

'There has been a tremendous outpouring from the community. Not only from law enforcement, but from residents he would be helping on certain

cases, and people he was dealing with, are calling crying, and saying what a great person he was to deal with,' D'Alessandro remarked.

Assemblyman Anil Beephan, Jr. commented in a statement, "As a former East Fishkill councilman and current assemblyman, I express my heartfelt condolences to the DiDato family and the East Fishkill Police Department. Officer Daniel P. DiDato was a dedicated law enforcement officer and a caring individual who served our community with pride and diligence. Let us honor his memory by embodying the commitment and character he demonstrated in his service to East Fishkill.'

Gov. Kathy Hochul said in a state-ment, which partially read: "Officers across New York serve and protect their neighbors and communities, and we feel this loss deeply. I extend prayers and condolences from all New Yorkers to the loved ones of Officer DiDato." Hochul ordered flags to be lowered at half-staff on State buildings on December 20 in honor of DiDato.

NYS Senator Rob Rolison said in a statement, "Our Hudson Valley community feels the pain of East Fishkill Police Department's loss. As a former member of law enforcement and the father of a police officer, I understand that the job of keeping others safe always carries with it the potential for tragedy. Sadly, our worst fears were realized last night. Our hearts go out to

Officer Daniel DiDato's family, his colleagues, and the East Fishkill community as they mourn the loss of one of their own. I stand ready to assist in whatever way I can, and I will continue to pray for those whose lives have been suddenly and traumatically altered by this devastating event."

The supervisor thanked area law enforcement for assisting the police department at this time. He offered special thanks to the City and Town of Poughkeepsie police departments.

DiDato's empathy for people, said D'Alessandro, went above that of the average police officer and regular person.

DiDato began his law enforcement career with the NYC Department of Environmental Protection in December 2001, said Cuccia.

"The Town of East Fishkill Police Department expresses its deepest sympathies to Officer DiDato's family and friends, and mourns the loss of one of our own," remarked Cuccia.

DiDato's parents still live in East Fishkill, said D'Alessandro. A wake was held at John Jay High School, from which DiDato graduated in 1994, on December 22. The funeral mass took place at St. Columba on December 23 in Hopewell Junction.

DiDato leaves behind his parents, Robert and Edvige DiDato, and his brothers, Robert and Mark.

East Fishkill Police Officer Daniel P. DiDato died in the line-of-duty on December 18 after succumbing to injuries from a one-car accident on the Taconic State Parkway. He was on his way to talk to a victim of a separate accident. DiDato was posthumously made sergeant.

influence. Community service is always her priority. She's introduced countless programs and services that go far beyond books, such as the Library of Things, the Little Free Library, and the Little Free Food Pantry," said Suppa.

The board president continued: "But on a larger scale, Gloria has grown the library's collection over the years, overseen necessary renovations, and managed the budget responsibly. She shepherded the library through its transition from an Association Library to a Library District in 2006, and more recently worked to ensure the library served the community through the Pandemic."

How has being a library director changed over the years?

"Technology!" Goverman exclaimed.

"When I started library school, we used dot matrix printers on bulky computers with no monitors! We'd do research by printing out reams and reams of abstracts and try to get more computer time to print the articles. Some years later, when I started my first directorship, we had fancy computers with color monitors. The Internet was just taking off and we were learning about browsers, email, operating systems and so much more, all of which seemed exotic and cutting edge. Now, not only is all that taken for granted, the bar is constantly being raised as we integrate more technology into our lives and as part of our service. Back in the day, being a "book person" was enough, but now we all have to be that and more."

It was two years ago, according to Goverman, that she decided to retire to do other things.

"I have interests that I haven't been able to explore as fully as I would like; knitting, baking, gardening included. And I also plan to get a puppy and that's a fulltime job in itself," she explained. "The Board is probably going to be able to make an announcement soon about the new director. Whoever it is, I am confident that they will be wonderful and will be loved by the staff and patrons alike." Goverman does not know the date of her exact last day because she will be staying on board to assist the new director until the end of January probably.

As for who will be the next director, Suppa stated, "The Board of Trustees is still in the hiring process, but we plan to appoint a new director by the end of December."

Suppa noted, "While Gloria leaves big shoes to fill, our Board of Trustees is committed to finding a new director to continue innovating the library and the

"I have a great team to work with trying to build upon the legacy of Mr. Scofield." services it provides the community. One of our priorities is introducing more programming for adults and kids. This effort is already underway, actually. I recommend people take a look at the library's calendar of events on the website (eflibrary.org) to see what's on offer."

Goverman was asked if there is one specific thing, she is most proud of accomplishing. Goverman replied, "The single most important accomplishment was working with the Library Board in 2006 in creating the library district. By becoming a district library, everything changed internally but most impactful was the annual vote in which East Fishkill could choose trustees and vote on the budget. She continued, "It has allowed the voters to have a voice – and they've used that voice consistently in favor of the library's budget. With the right budget, we can provide services - such as increased programming - that library users have asked for. While it's been very gratifying to make other improvements such as reorganizing the layout of the library to separate the children's and adult areas or installing LED lighting, without funding, none of those, or any other, improvements can happen. A financially secure library returns that investment to the community and enhances the lives of its residents."

The development, designed to pay homage to the rich history of Fishkill and County during Dutchess the Revolutionary War, aims to blend modern commercial spaces with a respectful nod to the past. A ground-breaking new concept, it will embrace and honor the historic nature of its surroundings and provide visitors a renewed perspective on the meaning of the Fishkill Supply Depot during the American Revolution. 'As I pledged in June 2015, when I first presented my plan to the Planning Board, my commitment to honoring the Depot has guided the intensive archaeological studies completed during the state and local review process as well as the meticulous planning and design of this commercial development project," said owner Domenic Broccoli. The lifestyle village will serve as a dynamic, interactive learning experience complete with informative plaques, a Visitor's Center and Barracks Museum, complementing other historic attractions in the area. Drive Sober, or Get Pulled Over' enforcement now until January 1

Governor Kathy Hochul announced recently that the New York State Police will participate in the national enforcement initiative to crack down on impaired driving this holiday season. The New York State Police will participate in the national "Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over" campaign, which runs from Wednesday, December 13, 2023,

through Monday, January 1, 2024. The Have a Plan app can help. The free app from the Governor's Traffic Safety Committee and the NYS STOP-DWI Foundation allows you to designate a driver, call a cab or ride share, and to review the consequences of impaired driving. You can even use the app to report a drunk or drugged driver. The app is available for Apple, Android, and Windows smart phones.

In an effort to ease travel during the busy holiday weekends, temporary lane closures for road and bridge construction projects on New York State highways will be suspended beginning Friday, December 22 at 6 a.m. through Tuesday, December 26 at 6 a.m. Construction will also be suspended from Friday, December 29 at 6 a.m. through Tuesday, January 2 at 6 a.m. to ease travel for motorists.

Motorists are advised that some work may continue behind permanent concrete barriers for emergency repairs. The construction suspension aligns with New York State's Driver's First Initiative, which prioritizes the convenience of motorists to minimize traffic congestion and travel delays due to road and bridge work.

The Thruway Authority reminds motorists that 12 service areas are closed and under construction as part of the \$450 million private investment and modernization project.

Fuel services remain open at all locations. Motorists can view the service areas and plan their stops on the Thruway Authority's website and on the free mobile app.

During last year's crackdown, as reported by the GTSC, law enforcement statewide issued 94,372 tickets. Of those tickets 18,222 were for speeding, 3,028 were for distracted driving, 2,684 were for seatbelts, 472 for the "Move Over Law" and 3,139 individuals were arrested for impaired driving. 66,827 motorists were ticketed for other infractions.

If you drive impaired and break the law, you will face consequences and be held accountable. New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services data shows that felony and misdemeanor arrests for operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol or drugs result in a conviction in approximately 90 percent of cases.

The New York State Police and National Highway Traffic Safety Administration also offer tips to make the holidays safer for all:

- Plan a safe way home before the celebrating begins;

- Before drinking, designate a sober driver; - If you're impaired, use a taxi or ride sourcing service, call a sober friend or family member, or use public transportation;

- Use your community's sober ride program;

If you happen to see a drunk driver on the road, don't hesitate to contact local law enforcement;

If you know someone who is about to drive or ride while impaired, take their keys and help them make other arrangements to get to their destination safely.


was the recipient of two lifesaving awards and was a field training officer.



Whenever my father comes into the restaurant in the morning, he always turns on his battered radio with a coat hanger as an antenna that he keeps by his worktable. It is always tuned into talk radio. Many a morning I hear the daily news or Rush Limbaugh and Curtis & Kubie coming from Pop's worktable. This particular morning, as he listened to the radio, President F.D. Roosevelt's famous speech from Pearl Harbor Day was playing in honor of the 75th Anniversary of the attack.

I asked him if he remembered when the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor. He was a little boy in Italy at the time, but he remembered. Everyone prayed for the servicemen who had died and hoped that the United States would enter the war. Everyone in his town knew that once the US joined, they had a chance.

I asked him what life was like during the war. Though his memory has started to fail him, he vividly remembered what it was like. He remembers the Germans stealing all their livestock and all the vegetables from the garden. He remembers that salt and tobacco was rationed. They would have to steal ocean water in order to have salt to cook with. He remembers the huge bombers and the sound of their engines as they flew over his town. He remembers the day that his town was bombed and that most of the shells didn't explode. He remembers sleeping outside for a month for fear that the Germans would be blowing up the munition dump in a cave in the side of a mountain. He remembered the day the munition dump was actually destroyed, lighting up the sky and

watching the mountain collapse onto itself and saving his town from debris raining down on them. Feeling the earth shake and watching the buildings in the town collapse from the man-made quake.

Finally, he remembered the day the American forces liberated his town. He remembers the parade of people walking behind the American forces as they drove into his town. Cheering for them. He remembers the cans of food that they distributed to feed him and his fellow towns folk who were starving. He remembered the feeling that they were safe. He also remembers knowing at that moment that he wanted to come to America.

As we celebrate this Christmas season, let us remember the people who came before us, who sacrificed so much so that we would be able to celebrate the holidays as a free nation. To appreciate our family and friends.

Struffoli

Ingredients

2 cups flour, plus extra for dusting 1 large lemon, zested (about 2 teaspoons)

1/2 large orange, zested (about 2 teaspoons)

- 3 tablespoons sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon fine sea salt
- 1/4 teaspoon baking powder
- 2 ounces unsalted butter, cut into 1ounce pieces, at room temperature
- 3 large eggs

1 tablespoon white wine, such as pinot grigio

1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract

- 1 cup honey 1/2 cup sugg
- 1/2 cup sugar

1 tablespoon lemon juice 1 1/2 cups hazelnuts, toasted Vegetable oil cooking spray Sugar sprinkles, for decoration Powdered sugar, for dusting, optional Canola oil, for frying

Method

For the dough: In the bowl of a food processor, pulse together 2 cups of flour, lemon zest, orange zest, sugar, salt, and baking powder. Add the butter and pulse until the mixture resembles a coarse meal. Add the eggs, wine, and vanilla. Pulse until the mixture forms into a ball. Wrap the dough in plastic wrap and refrigerate for 30 minutes.

Cut the dough into 4 equal-sized pieces. On a lightly floured surface, roll out each piece of dough until 1/4-inch thick. Cut each piece of dough into 1/2-inch-wide strips. Cut each strip of pastry into 1/2inch pieces. Roll each piece of dough into a small ball about the size of a hazelnut. Lightly dredge the dough balls in flour, shaking off any excess. In a large heavybottomed saucepan, pour enough oil to fill the pan about a third of the way. Heat over medium heat until a deep-frying thermometer inserted in the oil reaches 375 degrees F. (If you don't have a thermometer a cube of bread will brown in about 3 minutes.). In batches, fry the dough until lightly golden, about 2 to 3 minutes. Transfer to a paper towel-lined plate to drain. (The rested and quartered dough can also be rolled on a floured work surface into 1/2-inch-thick logs and cut into equal-sized 1/2-inch pieces. The dough pieces can then be rolled into small balls and fried as above).

In a large saucepan, combine the honey, sugar, and lemon juice over medium heat. Bring to a boil and cook, stirring occasionally, until the sugar is dissolved, about 3 minutes. Remove the pan from the heat. Add the fried dough and hazelnuts and stir until coated in the honey mixture. Allow the mixture to cool in the pan for 2 minutes.

Spray the outside of a small, straightsided water glass with vegetable oil cooking spray and place in the center of a round platter. Using a large spoon or damp hands, arrange the struffoli and hazelnuts around the glass to form a wreath shape. Drizzle any remaining honey mixture over the struffoli. Allow to set for 2 hours (can be made 1 day in advance). Decorate with sprinkles and dust with powdered sugar, if using. Remove the glass from the center of the platter and serve.

Practice the Japanese first-writing writing of kakizome for the New Year

The new year is when one gives voice to hopes and desires for the future in the form of resolutions, wishes, and intentions going forward. The Japanese express this with *kakizome*, the ritualized first calligraphy writing of the year. Kakizome or "first writing," takes place within the first few days of the year, traditionally in a poetic calligraphic form expressing their hopes and aspirations for the coming year. The poems were later burned to seal the fate of the hope.

The *Kakizome* tradition continues, but these days practitioners write auspicious kanji (Chinese characters) rather than poems. Each guest chooses an idea or sentiment to carry with them into the New Year. For example, if one hopes for good health in the New Year, one would write a kanji for positive health; if one desires more patience, one would practice the kanji for tolerance or acceptance. Kakizome is about positive wishes for the New Year. It is a reflective practice based on the belief that practicing one kanji over and over helps the writer focus on the hoped-for theme.

Join attendees for *Kakizome* 2024 as they practice kanji to guide one into the New Year. Volunteers from the local Japanese community will be on hand, offering guidance in choosing and writing one's chosen kanji. Brushes, paper, and ink will be provided.

The Mid-Hudson Japanese Community Association (MHJCA) is a not-for-profit organization whose mission is to introduce Japanese culture to the local community, foster a sense of community among Japanese residents, and be a bridge for cultural exchanges between Japanese and non-Japanese residents of the Hudson Valley. MHJCA educational presentations and language classes are aimed at children and adults in the Hudson Valley area. The Association frequently collaborates with Arts Mid-Hudson to present interactive programs celebrating Japanese culture.
